COUNTRY ROADS BOARD.

DECLARATION OF MAIN ROADS UNDER COUNTRY ROADS ACT, IN THE SHIRES OF ALBERTON, BERWICK, CRANBOURNE, DANDENONG, FLINDERS AND KANGERONG, FRANKSTON AND HASTINGS, MIRBOO, MOORABBIN, MORNINGTON, MORWELL, NARRAGAN, POOWONG AND JETHO, AND TRARALGON.

Resolution of the Country Roads Board.

THE Country Roads Board incorporated by the *Country Roads Act 1912* (Act No. 2415), at a meeting now holden, being of opinion that the highways within the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written are of sufficient importance to be main roads, acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act doth by this resolution hereby declare such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Country Roads Act 1912*.

SCHEDULE.

Shire of Alberton.

1. Yarram-Port Albert road.—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 50, parish of Yarram Yarram, at its junction with the Carrajung-Gormandale road; thence southerly to the northern boundary of the township of Alberton; thence south-easterly to the north-eastern angle of Alberton Railway Station reserve.

2. Carrajung-Gormandale road.—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 50, parish of Yarram Yarram, at its junction with the Yarram-Port Albert road; thence westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 55; thence northerly, north-easterly, and northerly to the north-west angle of allotment 66, parish of Wonwron; thence easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 19c, parish of Boodyarn; thence north-easterly and generally north-westerly to the most northerly angle of allotment 7c, parish of Boodyarn; thence northerly and north-easterly to the most easterly angle of allotment 43, parish of Carrajung; thence northerly to the most southerly angle of allotment 40b; thence westerly, north-westerly, and northerly through the township of Carrajung to the south-east angle of allotment 22; thence north-easterly to the most easterly angle of allotment 51, parish of Willung; thence north-westerly and westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 17, parish of Willung; thence northerly and north-westerly to the most westerly angle of allotment 17a, parish of Willung, at Merriman's Creek, on the boundary of the shire.

3. Balook-Traralgon road.—Commencing at the most southerly angle of allotment 57a at its junction with the Carrajung-Gormandale road; thence north-westerly and northerly to the north-east angle of allotment 60a, parish of Wonwron; thence westerly and generally north-westerly to the north-east angle of allotment 15 of B, parish of Bulga; thence northerly between the boundaries of the Shires of Alberton and Traralgon to the north-west angle of allotment 1, parish of Bulga, on the boundary of the shire.

4. Yarram-Boolarra road.—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 55, parish of Yarram Yarram, at its junction with the Carrajung-Gormandale road; thence westerly and southerly to the north-east angle of allotment 78a, parish of Devon; thence westerly to the most southerly angle of allotment 74a, 1, parish of Binginwarri; thence north-westerly and northerly to the most easterly angle of allotment 71e; thence generally north-westerly and northerly to the most southerly angle of allotment 50a, on the boundary of the shire.

NOTE.—The route of portion of this road between the Shires of Alberton and Morwell is already set out in the description of the road routes in the Shire of Morwell.

5. Boolarra-Welshpool road.—Commencing at its junction with the Gonyah-road at the most southerly angle of an allotment south of allotment 13, parish of Wonyip, on the western boundary of the shire, being the continuation of the Boolarra-Welshpool road described in the Shire of Morwell; thence easterly, south-easterly, and south-westerly to the north-east angle of allotment 25 of D, parish of Woorarra; thence southerly to the south-west angle of allotment 20, section D; thence south-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 35a, parish of Toora; thence easterly by the boundary between the Shires of Alberton and South Gippsland to the most northerly angle of allotment 36a, parish of Toora, on the southern boundary of the shire.

Shire of Berwick.

1. Main Gippsland road.—Commencing at the most westerly angle of allotment 15, parish of Eumemmering, on the western boundary of the shire; thence easterly to the north-east angle of allotment 28; thence south-easterly, easterly, and south-easterly through the parish and township of Berwick to the most southerly angle of allotment 43, parish of Pakenham; thence north-easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 46 of the same parish; thence south-easterly through Pakenham

to the most westerly angle of allotment 43, parish of Nar-nar-noon; thence easterly, north-easterly, and generally easterly to the most southerly angle of allotment 84, parish of Nar-nar-noon; thence generally north-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 5, parish of Bunyip; thence southerly to the south-west angle of allotment 6 of the same parish; thence generally south-easterly, following the northern boundary of the Melbourne-Sale Railway reserve, to the south-east angle of allotment 28; thence southerly across the said railway and generally south-easterly by the southern boundary of the Melbourne-Sale Railway reserve to the shire boundary at the north-east angle of the parish of Koo-wee-rup East.

2. Woori Yallock-Pakenham-Koo-wee-rup road.—A Commencing at the north-western angle of allotment 11a, parish of Nangana, at Shepherd's Creek, on the northern boundary of the shire; thence generally southerly to the south-east angle of allotment 52a; thence south-westerly, north-westerly, and south-westerly to the north-east angle of allotment 48f; thence generally southerly to the south-east angle of allotment 48d, parish of Nangana; thence south-westerly and southerly to the Cockatoo Railway Station; thence generally south-easterly to the south-west angle of allotment A3, parish of Gembrook; thence easterly to the north-east angle of allotment A2; thence generally south-westerly to the south angle of allotment 80d. B. Commencing at its junction with the main Gippsland road at the most northerly angle of allotment 44, parish of Nar-nar-noon; thence south-easterly to the north-east angle of allotment 46; thence southerly to the north-east angle of allotment 65a; thence south-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 47, parish of Koo-wee-rup; thence southerly to the south-west angle of allotment 34, of the last named parish, on the southern boundary of the shire.

3. Gembrook-road.—Commencing at its junction with the Woori Yallock-Pakenham road at the south-east angle of allotment A, parish of Gembrook; thence generally north-easterly to the south-east angle of allotment A, 11, in the township of Gembrook; thence westerly to the Gembrook Railway Station.

4. Gembrook-Beenak road.—Commencing at its junction with the Gembrook-road at the south-east angle of allotment A, 11, parish of Gembrook; thence north-easterly, north-westerly, and northerly to the most southern angle of allotment 11 of the said parish.

Shire of Cranbourne.

1. Main Coast road.—Commencing at its junction with the main Gippsland road at the north-east angle of allotment 7, parish of Eumemmering; thence south-easterly through the township of Cranbourne and Tooradin to the south-east angle of allotment 7, parish of Koo-wee-rup; thence north-easterly, easterly, and further north-easterly to the most westerly angle of allotment 3, parish of Yallock; thence easterly and generally south-easterly to the most southerly angle of allotment 5, parish of Lang Lang; thence south-westerly and southerly to the most northerly angle of allotment 39b, parish of Lang Lang; thence south-easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 57, parish of Lang Lang, on the southern boundary of the shire.

2. Koo-wee-rup-Pakenham road.—Commencing at its junction with the main Coast road at the south-west angle of allotment 3, parish of Yallock; thence north-easterly crossing the Great Southern Railway to the northern boundary of the Railway reserve and the southern boundary of allotment 3a, parish of Yallock; thence westerly along the northern boundary of the railway to the south-east angle of allotment 7, parish of Koo-wee-rup; thence northerly to the south-east angle of allotment 34 of section J, parish of Koo-wee-rup, on the northern boundary of the shire.

3. Westernport-road.—Commencing at its junction with the main Coast road at the most southerly angle of allotment 5, parish of Lang Lang; thence north-easterly, easterly, and further north-easterly to the most northerly angle of allotment 30, parish of Yannathan, on the eastern boundary of the shire.

Shire of Dandenong.

1. Main Gippsland road.—Commencing at the most northerly angle of allotment 10, in the parish of Dandenong, on the northern boundary of the shire; thence south-easterly through the township of Dandenong to the north-east angle of allotment 15 of the parish of Eumemmering, on the eastern boundary of the shire.

2. Cheltenham road.—Commencing at its junction with the main Gippsland road in the township of Dandenong; thence westerly, south-westerly, and westerly to the south-west angle of allotment C, parish of Dandenong; thence north-westerly to the most northerly angle of allotment 2, parish of Moorabbin; thence westerly to the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 19 of the last-named parish, on the western boundary of the shire.

3. Point Nepean-road.—Commencing at the bridge over the Mordialloc Creek, at Mordialloc, on the western boundary of the shire; thence south-easterly following the western boundary of the Melbourne-Frankston railway to a point near the north-west angle of allotment 90, parish of Lyndhurst, on the southern boundary of the shire.

Shire of Flinders and Kangerong.

1. Mornington-Flinders road.—Commencing at a point on the southern boundary of the Mount Martha pre-emptive right, on the northern boundary of the shire; thence generally southerly to the north-east angle of allotment 1, section 2, parish of Kangerong; thence southerly, south-easterly, and southerly to the north-west angle of allotment 12a, parish of Kangerong; thence south-westerly to the south-west corner of allotment 11b; thence north-westerly to the south-west angle of allotment A of 10; thence southerly and south-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 3, parish of Flinders; thence further south-easterly to its junction with the Flinders-Hastings road at the most southerly angle of allotment 27, parish of Flinders.

2. Hastings-Flinders road.—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 81, parish of Bittern, on the northern boundary of the shire; thence southerly and south-westerly to the most southerly angle of allotment 27, parish of Flinders; thence southerly to the south-east angle of section 1 of the Village of Flinders.

Shire of Frankston and Hastings.

1. Point Nepean-road.—Commencing at the northern boundary of the shire near the north-west angle of allotment 90, parish of Lyndhurst; thence generally south-easterly, following the eastern coast of Port Phillip Bay, through the township of Frankston to the north-eastern angle of allotment 13, parish of Frankston; thence generally south-westerly to the most westerly angle of allotment 1, section 5, parish of Frankston, on the southern boundary of the shire.

2. Frankston-Flinders road.—Commencing at its junction with the main Point Nepean-road in the township of Frankston; thence generally south-easterly to the most westerly angle of allotment 26, parish of Frankston; thence easterly and south-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 41, parish of Tyabb; thence generally southerly through the township of Hastings to the north-east angle of allotment 81, parish of Bittern, on the southern boundary of the shire.

Shire of Mirboo.

1. Mardan-road.—Commencing at the north-east angle of section 1 of the township of Mirboo North; thence generally south-westerly to the north-east angle of allotment 54, parish of Mardan; thence southerly to the south-east angle of allotment 63, parish of Mardan, on the southern boundary of the shire.

NOTE.—The route of portion of this road between the Shires of Mirboo and Woorayl is already set out in the description of the road routes in the Shire of Woorayl.

2. Mirboo South-road.—Commencing at the north-western angle of section 2, township of Mirboo North; thence southerly and generally south-easterly through allotments 37, 46, 47, 49c, 71, 72, 70, and 105; and thence across the Tarwin River through the township of Mirboo; thence southerly to the most northerly angle of allotment 12a, parish of Mirboo South; thence south-westerly to the northern boundary of allotment 10, parish of Mirboo South, on the southern boundary of the shire.

3. Mirboo-Allambee East road.—Commencing at the north-east angle of section 1, township of Mirboo North; thence westerly and north-westerly to the south-east angle of allotment 110, parish of Allambee East; thence generally north-westerly to the Tarwin River at the north boundary of allotment 90c; thence westerly across the Tarwin River, and northerly to Carter's Bridge over the Tarwin River, at the northern angle of allotment 78a, parish of Allambee East.

4. Foster-Boolarra-road.—

NOTE.—The route of portion of this road between the Shires of Mirboo on the west and Morwell on the east is already set out in the description of the road routes in the Shire of Morwell.

Shire of Moorabbin.

1. Point Nepean-road.—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 38, parish of Moorabbin, at South-road on the shire boundary; thence south-easterly through the township of Mordialloc to the bridge over the Mordialloc Creek on the southern boundary of the shire.

2. Centre Dandenong-road.—Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 53, parish of Moorabbin; thence easterly to the north-east angle of allotment 2 of section 18 of the said parish, on the eastern boundary of the shire.

Shire of Mornington.

1. Point Nepean-road.—Commencing at the most westerly angle of allotment 1, section 5, parish of Frankston; thence south-easterly and south-westerly to the most southerly angle of allotment 48, parish of Moorooduc; thence southerly to the north-east angle of allotment 36, parish of Moorooduc; thence further southerly to a point on the southern boundary of the Mount Martha pre-emptive right at the southern boundary of the shire.

Shire of Morwell.

1. Main Gippsland-road.—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 63, parish of Narracan, near the western boundary of the shire; thence generally easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 41, parish of Maryvale; thence southerly to the north boundary of the Melbourne-Sale Railway reserve; thence south-easterly by that boundary to the north-west angle of the Morwell Railway Station reserve; thence southerly across the railway, and easterly by its southern boundary, to a point on the northern boundary of allotment 11, parish of Maryvale; thence generally north-easterly crossing the railway to the south-west angle of allotment 60c, parish of Traralgon, on the eastern boundary of the shire.

2. Boolarra-Foster road.—Commencing at the Boolarra Railway Station reserve; thence south-easterly, southerly, and easterly to the north-east angle of the Boolarra Recreation reserve; thence south-westerly and south-easterly to the south-west angle of allotment 18, parish of Mirboo; thence generally southerly to the most westerly angle of allotment 64a; thence south-easterly along the boundary between the Shires of Morwell and Mirboo to the most northerly angle of allotment 64a; thence further south-easterly and southerly to the south-west angle of allotment 129c; thence further southerly, easterly, and southerly to a point on the eastern boundary of allotment 70, parish of Gunyah-Gunyah, at its junction with the Gunyah-road on the southern boundary of the shire.

3. Boolarra-Welshpool road.—Commencing at its junction with the Boolarra-Foster road at the north-east angle of the Boolarra Recreation reserve; thence north-easterly and south-easterly to the most northerly angle of allotment 14a, parish of Budgerie; thence north-easterly and south-easterly to the most northerly angle of allotment 17; thence easterly and south-easterly through the Agricultural College reserve to the most westerly angle of allotment 52a, parish of Binginwarri; thence generally south-westerly by the boundary between the Shires of Morwell and Alberton to its junction with the Gunyah-road, south of allotment 13, parish of Wonyip, on the southern boundary of the shire.

4. Jeeralang West-road.—Commencing at its junction with the main Gippsland road on the northern boundary of allotment 11, parish of Maryvale; thence south-westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 1, parish of Hazelwood; thence easterly, southerly, and south-easterly to the most southern angle of allotment 23 of A; thence southerly to the south-east angle of allotment 32; thence south-easterly, easterly, and south-easterly to the most southerly angle of allotment 10, parish of Jeeralang, on the eastern boundary of the shire; thence generally southerly and south-westerly by the boundary between the Shires of Morwell and Traralgon to the most easterly angle of allotment 39; thence south-westerly along the shire boundary to the most westerly angle of allotment 52a, parish of Wonyip, being the junction with the Boolarra-Welshpool road.

Shire of Narracan.

1. Main Gippsland-road.—Commencing at the most easterly angle of allotment 11a, parish of Darnum; at the Moe River on the western boundary of the shire; thence easterly and north-easterly following the southern boundary of the Melbourne-Sale railway to the south-east angle of the Moe Railway Station reserve; thence northerly across the said railway, and south-easterly by the north boundary of the railway, to the north-west angle of allotment 5f, parish of Narracan; thence generally south-easterly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 5f of the said parish near the eastern boundary of the shire.

2. Yarragon-Leongatha road.—Commencing at its junction with the main Gippsland road near the Yarragon Railway Station; thence south-easterly, southerly, and south-westerly to a point on the southern boundary of allotment 13, parish of Moe, near its south-west angle; thence south-westerly and generally southerly through the township of Allambee to the most northerly angle of allotment 10, parish of Allambee East; thence south-easterly to the most northerly angle of allotment 11, parish of Allambee East, on the southern boundary of the shire.

3. Trafalgar-Willowgrove road.—Commencing at the south-western angle of the Trafalgar Railway Station

reserve, at its junction with the main Gippsland road; thence north-westerly across the Melbourne-Sale railway, and northerly to the north-east angle of allotment 37, parish of Yarragon; thence generally northerly and north-easterly, crossing the Latrobe River to the north-eastern angle of allotment 11, parish of Tanjil; thence generally north-westerly to the most southerly angle of allotment 14, section C, parish of Neerim East.

4. Yarragon-Shady Creek road.—Commencing at the south-western angle of the Yarragon Railway Station reserve, at its junction with the main Gippsland road; thence northerly across the railway, easterly and northerly to the most southerly angle of allotment 60, section 15; thence north-easterly and northerly to the north-west angle of allotment 107, parish of Darnum.

Shire of Poowong and Jeetho.

1. Korumburra-Leongatha road.—Commencing at the most easterly angle of section 3, township of Korumburra; thence south-westerly and south-easterly and generally southerly, crossing Coal Creek; thence easterly, north-easterly, and easterly through McIntyre Village Settlement to the north-east angle of allotment 9, of section 2, of the McIntyre Village Settlement.

2. Korumburra-Drouin road.—Commencing at its junction with the Korumburra-Warragul road at the most southerly angle of allotment 36, parish of Poowong East; thence north-westerly to the south-east angle of allotment 33A; thence north-easterly and northerly to a point on the southern boundary of allotment 28, parish of Poowong East, at the Lang Lang River, on the northern boundary of the shire.

5. Nyora-Poowong road.—Commencing at the eastern boundary of the Nyora Railway Station reserve; thence easterly to the most easterly angle of allotment 115A, parish of Lang Lang East; thence generally north-easterly and easterly through the Mount Lyell Trig. reserve to a point on its eastern boundary; thence south-easterly to the north-east angle of allotment 24, parish of Jeetho West; thence north-easterly and easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 6, parish of Poowong.

6. Loch-Wonthaggi road.—Commencing at the southern boundary of the Loch Railway Station reserve; thence southerly and generally south-westerly to the north-west angle of allotment 45A, parish of Jeetho West; thence southerly between the boundaries of the Shires of Poowong and Jeetho and Phillip Island and Woolamai to the most northerly angle of allotment 1, parish of Jeetho West; thence south-easterly and south-westerly to a point on the western boundary of allotment 1, parish of Jeetho West, near its south-west angle on the western boundary of the shire.

Shire of Traralgon.

1. Main Gippsland road.—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 60C, parish of Traralgon, on the western boundary of the shire; thence generally north-easterly following the northern boundary of the Melbourne-Sale railway to the south-east angle of allotment 5, parish of Traralgon, on the western boundary of the township of Traralgon; thence north-easterly, northerly, and north-easterly through the township of Traralgon, to the south-west angle of allotment A8, parish of Traralgon; thence north-easterly and by the northern boundary of the Melbourne-Sale railway to the most southerly angle of allotment 2A, parish of Loy Yang; thence generally north-easterly to a point on the eastern boundary of allotment 788, parish of Loy Yang, at Flynn's Creek, on the eastern boundary of the shire.

2. Traralgon-Gormandale road.—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 8, parish of Loy Yang, at its intersection with the Traralgon-Jeeralang road; thence generally south-easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 15U, parish of Loy Yang; thence easterly

and south-easterly to the most easterly angle of allotment 12, F, 2, at Flynn's Creek, on the eastern boundary of the shire.

3. Traralgon-Jeeralang road.—Commencing at its intersection with the main Gippsland road, at the north-east angle of section 7, township of Traralgon; thence generally southerly through the township of Traralgon to the south-west angle of allotment 13, township of Traralgon; thence easterly to the north-east angle of allotment 4A, parish of Loy Yang; thence southerly to the south-east angle of allotment 7, O, parish of Loy Yang; thence generally southerly and south-westerly, between allotments 49 and 51, to the south-east angle of allotment 22A of A, parish of Jumbuk, on the western boundary of the shire.

4. Callignee-road.—Commencing at its junction with the Traralgon-Jeeralang road at the south-east angle of allotment 7, O, parish of Loy Yang; thence generally south-easterly to a point on the southern boundary of allotment 16U, parish of Loy Yang; thence generally southerly through the township of Toomung, and south-westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 13, parish of Callignee; thence generally south-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 1, parish of Bulga, on the southern boundary of the shire.

NOTE.—The route of portion of this road between the Shires of Traralgon and Alberton is already set out in the description of the road routes in the Shire of Alberton.

COUNTRY ROADS BOARD.

DECLARATION OF MAIN ROADS UNDER COUNTRY ROADS ACT, IN THE SHIRES OF PHILLIP ISLAND AND WOOLAMAI AND SOUTH GIPPSLAND.

Resolution of the Country Roads Board.

The Country Roads Board, incorporated by the *Country Roads Act 1912* (Act No. 2415), at a meeting now holden, being of opinion that the highways within the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written are of sufficient importance to be main roads, acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act, doth by this resolution hereby declare such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Country Roads Act 1912*.

SCHEDULE.

Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai.

1. Wonthaggi-Loch road.—Commencing at the northerly angle of allotment 31C, parish of Wonthaggi, on the boundary of the shire; thence north-westerly to the most northerly angle of allotment 3, parish of Wonthaggi; thence north-easterly and northerly to the north-east angle of allotment 10A, parish of Wonthaggi North; thence westerly, northerly, and generally north-easterly to the north-east angle of allotment 93; thence easterly and north-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 80; thence generally north-westerly to the north-east angle of allotment 92, parish of Wonthaggi North; thence generally north-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 68, parish of Jumbunna; thence north-westerly and generally north-easterly to a point on the western boundary of allotment 1, parish of Jeetho West; at the eastern boundary of the shire.

NOTE.—The route of portion of this road between the Shires of Phillip Island and Woolamai and Poowong and Jeetho is already set out in the description of the road routes in the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho.

2. Almurta-road.—Commencing at the northern boundary of the Almurta Railway Station reserve; thence generally south-easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 142, parish of Corinella; thence easterly following the Tennent's Creek to its junction with the Wonthaggi-Loch road, at the north-east angle of allotment 69A, parish of Jumbunna.

Shire of South Gippsland.

1. Boolarra-Welshpool road.—Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of allotment 36A, parish of Toora, on the northern boundary of the shire; thence generally southerly and south-easterly to the most northerly angle of allotment 20, parish of Toora; thence

easterly and south-easterly and southerly to the south-east angle of allotment 12, parish of Welshpool; thence easterly and southerly, crossing the Great Southern Railway line, to the most northerly angle of allotment 16B; thence generally south-easterly to the north-east angle of allotment 44; thence easterly and south-easterly through the township of Welshpool to the south-western angle of section 12, township of Welshpool.

NOTE.—The route of portion of this road between the Shires of South Gippsland and Alberton is already set out in the description of the road routes in the Shire of Alberton.

2. Toora-Gunyah road.—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 12A, parish of Toora; thence northerly to the north-west angle of allotment 7, parish of Toora; thence north-westerly and generally northerly to the north-east angle of allotment 18 of B, parish of Toora; thence generally north-westerly and northerly to the north-west angle of allotment 43, parish of Woorarra; thence north-westerly to the north-east angle of allotment 7, on the northern boundary of the shire near Mount Fatigue; thence generally north-easterly following the boundary between the Shires of South Gippsland and Alberton to the most northerly angle of allotment 15B, parish of Gunyah, on the northern boundary of the shire.

3. Falls-road.—Commencing at the most northerly angle of allotment 25A, parish of Doomburrin, near the Fish Creek Railway Station; thence north-easterly, northerly, and north-easterly to the most easterly angle of allotment 6, parish of Doomburrin, at the White-law's track.

4. Stoney Creek-Dollar road.—Commencing at the most westerly angle of allotment 39C, parish of Nerrena; thence north-easterly and easterly along the shire boundary to the south-western angle of allotment 104, parish of Dumbalk; thence generally easterly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 42; thence generally northerly through the township of Dollar to the most southerly angle of allotment 37B, on the northern boundary of the shire.

5. Boolarra-Foster road.—Commencing on the northern boundary of the shire at its junction with the Gunyah-road on the eastern boundary of allotment 70, parish of Gunyah-Gunyah; thence southerly between the Shires of South Gippsland and Woorayl; thence further southerly past the Bullarong Public Hall to the most northerly angle of allotment 1, parish of Woorarra; thence south-easterly across the Little Franklin River; thence south-westerly to the most southerly angle of allotment 5, parish of Woorarra.

1. Where a licensee under section 187 of the *Land Act 1901* has, with the consent of the Minister, enclosed with a substantial fence the land which is the subject of his licence, he may impound any cattle, sheep, or other animals found trespassing thereon.
2. Where the licensee holds land under the said section which is unfenced, he may, in any Court of competent jurisdiction, sue the owner of any cattle, sheep, or other animals for damages arising from trespass by such cattle, sheep, or other animals.

A By-law of the Shire of Mornington, No. 23, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and providing for—

- (a) regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings;
- (b) requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections, or hoardings;
- (c) authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to such By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under any such By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, or hoardings, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof;
- (d) appointing fees that may be received and charged by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under such regulations, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.
- (e) In this By-law a building shall include any building, erection, tent (not being a tent wholly constructed of canvas or similar material and ropes), or premises used, intended or proposed to be used for or in connexion with a dwelling-place or place of business or place of resort.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mornington order as follows:—

1. No person shall commence the erection of any building, or shall commence the erection of any addition to any building, until he shall lodge with the Shire Secretary a plan and specification of the same, showing the exact site on which it is intended to erect such building, and the manner in and the material of which it is proposed to erect the same, and until the Shire Council shall, in writing, approve of such plan and specification, and no person shall erect any such building except in accordance with the plan and specification as approved.

2. No person shall commence to erect any hoarding for advertising or other similar purposes until he shall have lodged with the Shire Secretary a complete plan and specification showing the exact site upon which it is intended to erect such hoarding, and the manner and

materials of which it is proposed to construct the same, and until the Shire Council shall, in writing, approve of such plan and specification, with such modification or additions thereto as are in the opinion of the Council considered necessary in the interest of public safety, and no person shall erect such hoarding except in accordance with the plan and specification so approved.

3. No person in the construction of the internal or external walls, roofs, floors, ceilings, or any part of any building to be erected shall use any material which in the opinion of the Shire Engineer or Clerk of Works shall be unsound.

4. No person shall, without the written consent of the Council of the said Shire, place or erect on any land within the portion of the said Shire to which this By-law is made applicable, any building or portion thereof which has been removed from without the Shire or from another part of the same. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundary of the land in the same possession in which it stands, provided that such alteration is carried out in strict conformity with the general provisions of any building regulation of the said Shire.

5. If the Shire Engineer or Clerk of Works shall certify, in writing, that any building is in such a dilapidated, ruinous, insanitary state as to be dangerous to public safety or health, or that any hoarding is in such a state as to be dangerous to public safety, the owner of such building, erection, or hoarding, upon receiving notice from the Council requiring him to pull down or remove such building, erection, or hoarding, shall pull down such building, erection, or hoarding within the time limited by such notice, not being less than three days from the service thereof.

6. In default of compliance with any such notice to pull down or remove any such building, erection, or hoarding, the Council may immediately on the expiration of the time limited therein, pull down or remove such building, erection, or hoarding, and may sell any of the materials thereof, and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down, removing, and selling such building, erection, or hoarding, or materials, and shall pay into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

7. The internal walls of all wooden buildings shall be properly framed with studs and plates, and covered with lath and plaster, tongued and grooved boards, steel plates, or any other similar lining, which has been approved of by the Shire Engineer or Clerk of Works. The outside walls shall be similarly framed with sufficient studs and plates, and covered with sound boards or material approved of by the Shire Engineer or Clerk of Works, who shall be the sole judge as to the necessary sizes of studs and plates; but no studs or plates shall be of less thickness than $\frac{1}{4}$ inches.

8. The following fees shall be payable for the several services hereunder set forth, and such fees shall be payable to the Shire Secretary before the performance of any act for which such fee is payable:—

For permission to erect hoarding, £1.

For permission to erect any building to be used as a dwelling, per room, 2s. 6d.

For permission to erect any building intended as a place of trade, for each square of 100 superficial feet, 2s.

For any addition or alteration to any existing building, per square of 30 feet or portion of a square, 2s. 6d.

For inspection of any dangerous or ruinous building, a sum not exceeding £2.

For any special inspection not set forth above, £2.

9. Any person wilfully offending against or committing any breach of this By-law shall, for every such offence or breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

10. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the area enclosed within the following boundaries, and including the Township of Mornington, viz.:—Commencing at the north-east corner of Crown allotment 9, and extending along the centre of the Belurn-road to the centre of the Nepean-road; thence along the Nepean-road to centre of Strachan's-road; thence along Strachan's-road to the foreshore; thence along the foreshore, to the starting point; but shall not apply to any Government, railway, or municipal buildings, nor to any building in course of removal through and beyond the said area.

THE Council of the Shire of Tungamah, in the State of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Local Government Act 1903* and every other power enabling them in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Council, hereby makes the following By-law, being By-law No. 29 of the said Council:—

Building Regulations for the Town of Cobram.

(1) Where any person proposes to erect any building, or to alter by way of addition any building already erected, he shall submit to the Council (a) a plan of the land upon which he proposes to build, showing the proportion of such land which is occupied by existing buildings (if any), and the proportion which will be occupied by buildings proposed to be erected; (b) a plan and specification of the proposed building, showing its height, design, structure, building line, arrangements for sanitation, and the materials proposed to be used in its construction; and (c) an application for the approval of the Council of such plans and specifications, giving particulars of the proposed situation.

(2) The plans to be submitted shall be the usual working drawing, comprising plan, section plans, elevation plans, block plan, copy of specification, and the application shall also state the estimated cost of the building, such plans to be drawn to not less than $\frac{1}{4}$ -in. scale.

(3) The plans to be submitted shall, if approved, be stamped by the Council's officer as being approved, and shall be returned to the applicant, but shall be produced to the Council's officer whenever required by him.

(4) At least a fortnight's notice must be given by the applicants for permission to build.

(5) The minimum size of allotments on which dwelling-houses may be erected shall be 33 feet frontage x 105 feet deep, or equal area, with lane 10 feet wide at rear, or, if there be no lane at rear, the frontage must be 44 feet, and a side entrance or right-of-way 10 feet wide must be provided. If practicable, the lane must be provided. At least 6 feet of frontage must be left unbuild upon, viz., 3 feet 6 inches on one side of the dwelling-house and 2 feet 6 inches on the other side.

(6) No dwelling-houses shall be erected within 15 feet of the building line, the distance being calculated from the nearest part of the building or the verandah.

(7) No shop shall be erected with less than 16 feet frontage. The minimum inside height of shops from floor to ceiling to be 12 feet. If no entrance be provided from the rear, a side entrance of at least 4 feet wide must be provided. All shops shall have open spaces to the full width of the shop for at least 100 feet in depth at the rear of the shop where practicable. No external walls to be built of wood or inflammable material without special permission from the Council.

(8) In cases of less frontage than above specified, special application must be made to the Council, and such application must be accompanied by a fee of 2s. 6d.

(9) All buildings to be brick, stone, or other approved material in single story brick; walls to be not less than 9 inches. If single story wood, not less than 5½ inches in thickness; internal walls not less than 4 inches if built of weatherboard; studding to be not less than 4 in. x 2 in. No unpaperedessian to be used.

(10) In three-story brick buildings the walls at the bottom story shall be at least 14 inches in thickness, the second story 14-in. walls, the third 9-in. walls, with approved 18-in. piers. In four stories, the walls of the bottom story shall not be less than 18 inches, the second 16-in. walls, with approved 18-in. piers, the third 14-in. walls, and the fourth 9-in. walls. Cavity walls to be connected by approved ties. In two-story buildings, the walls at bottom story to be 12 inches in thickness at least, and the second story to be 9 inches. In case of any other material being used, the thickness of the walls to be approved of by the Council.

(11) The walls of cellars must be brick, cement, or approved material, with vertical damp-courses.

(12) Between the under-side of every joist in dwelling-houses and the ground surface there shall be a ventilated space of not less than 12 inches, and this space shall be thoroughly ventilated by suitable and sufficient air-bricks. Ground surface shall be considered same as the fixed level of the footpaths at the building line, or the crown of the roadway opposite the proposed building. In case of shops, the under-side of the joist shall be level with the ground surface.

(13) There shall be a damp-course in all the walls of brick, stone, or similar material of lead, slate, or other material approved by the Council's officer. Such damp-course to be placed underneath level of the ground floor-plate to the full width of all walls.

(14) No material considered by the Council's officer to be dangerous to health will be permitted to be used in erection or repair of any building. Any person desirous of using material for buildings other than new material shall acquaint the Council's officer with the locality whence it came, and a sworn declaration may be demanded by the Council's officer if considered necessary.

(15) No living room shall contain less than 1,000 cubic feet of air space. In cases where same is covered with skylion roof, the back wall shall not be less than 9 feet high from floor to ceiling. All rooms in the main building shall not be less than 10 feet high from floor to ceiling.

(16) Each habitable room shall have one or more windows, each to be at least 4 ft. 2 in. x 2 ft. 10 in., opening directly to the external air, and two 9 in. x 6 in. air bricks or similar openings under the ceiling line.

(17) No first or second floor joists shall be less than 9 in. x 2 in. for a span of 14 feet, and for every additional 5-ft. span the joists shall be 1 inch deeper, with a row of herringbone struts not more than 7 feet apart.

(18) All ground-floor piers shall be not less than 6 feet, centres and bearers not less than 5 in. x 4 in., joists not less than 5 in. x 2 in. Damp-courses must be inserted in floor piers under bearers.

(19) Ceiling joists shall not be less than 4 in. x 2 in., and rafters not less than 4 in. x 2 in. Ceiling joists to be spaced not more than 2 feet apart; rafters not to be spaced more than 4 feet apart.

(20) In iron flat roofs the rafters shall be not more than 2 feet centres, and bearers not more than 7 feet apart.

(21) Where roofs are covered with slates, shingles, or tiles, the rafters and ceiling joists shall be spaced not more than 18 inch centres. No roof in any class of building to be covered externally with wood or any inflammable material.

(22) Every dwelling-house shall have a bathroom, dimensions not less than 7 ft. x 4 ft., or equal area, fitted with the usual water-service pipes, and one tap and shower. The floor of such bathrooms shall have a tray or approved covering, and the walls shall have a cemented or approved dado of 5 feet high. This clause shall not apply where the town water supply is not available.

(23) Portions of Punt-road, Main-street, High-street, and Station-street to be brick areas.

(24) All fences to be approved of by the Council's officer. Verandahs on streets to be of approved design and a width to be fixed by the Council.

(25) The Council may refuse permission to build on lands which may be considered unsuitable for building on.

(26) Applications for permission to erect fowl-houses, stables, and out-houses shall be made to the Council for approval, but no fees shall be charged for such permission.

(27) No building shall be removed and re-erected without the consent of the Council.

(28) All footpaths shall be made uniform to the satisfaction of the Engineer.

(29) A fee of 2s. 6d. shall be paid to the Council before approval will be given to any plans and specifications for the erection of a building or the erection of additions to existing buildings.

(30) Provided always that notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided to the contrary, the Council reserves the right to order what class of building, either in material or design, shall be erected in any particular locality within the area, and also under special circumstances and for special causes, and at a meeting, at which due notice of the business has been given to each Councillor, declare that the provisions of these Regulations, either in whole or in part, shall not apply to any particular building.

(31) Any person offending against or not complying with any provision of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not less than £1 or more than £50; and the Council may, by notice signed by the clerk, order that any building which is commenced or erected in contravention of these Regulations be altered to comply therewith, and may, where deemed advisable, in like manner order that all other operations on such building be discontinued until such first-mentioned order has been complied with to the satisfaction of the Council.

(32) Application forms for permission to erect cottages, villas, shops, other buildings, or alterations or additions to existing buildings, may be obtained on application to the Shire Secretary.

The above By-law was passed at a meeting of the Tungamah Shire Council, held on Monday, 6th October, 1913, and confirmed; and the seal of the Council attached at a meeting of the said Council, held on Monday, 3rd November, 1913.
