REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR
PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF
STRATFORD, KNOWN AS "THE KNOB."

WE, William Henry Carter, Thomas Sidney Knight, William Louis Jones, Alfred Ducret, and James Forsyth, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 28th August, 1906, as a site for Public Recreation in the parish of Stratford, known as "The Knob," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901 :—

REGULATIONS.

(1) The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Sixpence, may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

(2) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

(3) No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.

(4) No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or buildings, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

(5) No person shall carry any firearms in or through the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any wild or other fowl, or take, injure, or destroy any bird's nest or bird's egg in the Reserve.

(6) No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

(7) No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(8) No person shall hawk or sell, or offer for sale, any article in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(9) No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before such Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

1. 7. 8. SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON.**BY-LAW No. 43.**

A By-law of the Shire of Shepparton, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 43, for regulating and providing for lighting of vehicles.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Shepparton order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 41 of the Shire of Shepparton is hereby repealed.

2. No person shall, between sunset and sunrise, drive, ride, or propel any carriage, cart, vehicle, bicycle, or velocipede on any road within the said shire unless there is attached thereto at least one lighted lamp showing a bright white light, visible within a reasonable distance in the direction towards which such carriage, cart, vehicle, bicycle, or velocipede is travelling, such light or lights being sufficiently clear and strong to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such carriage, cart, vehicle, bicycle, or velocipede.
