WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the sixth day of April One thousand nine hundred and fourteen the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1912* (Act No. 2415) being of opinion that the highways in the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same, were of sufficient importance to be main roads and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid: And whereas the said Act among other things provides that the Governor in Council might by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such resolution should be a main road: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore I the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same do hereby confirm such resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such resolution of the Country Roads Board main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1912*.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1914.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Talbot, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a Water Rate for the year 1914 upon all lands and tenements liable to be rated within that portion of the municipality of the Borough of Talbot, which has been proclaimed a Water Supply District; also for the purpose of determining the charges to be made for the sale of water within such district:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1914 in respect of water supplied within the aforesaid district:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds municipal value and under, the sum of One pound (£1).

2. For every house or tenement of above Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound.

3. For every hotel, a rate of Six pounds per cent. upon the annual municipal value of such property.

4. Government Departments, railways, and other properties supplied by meter, a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made. Post Office, Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 20,000 gallons per annum. Police Station, Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 30,000 gallons per annum. State School, Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 15,000 gallons per annum.

5. The charge to be made for loads of water from stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each load of 400 gallons, or less.

6. For every water trough connected with hotels, Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons.

7. For every factory, mill, or other tenement where machinery is attached and working, the rate shall be Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal value of such property, or the water may be supplied and charged for by measure at Sixpence per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

8. For market gardens, where water is supplied by meter, the charge shall be Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 100,000 gallons per half-acre, and 200,000 gallons per acre.

9. For water supplied to market gardens and orchards, a charge of Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 150,000 gallons per acre when supplied from the open race.

10. For water supplied to syphon pumps, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be made.

11. For water supplied to mining companies, dredges, &c., a charge of One penny per 1,000 gallons shall be made; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 120,000 gallons per week.

The before-mentioned rates shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1914, and the 1st day of July, 1914; and the charges for water shall be half-yearly, or as may be demanded.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1914.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) and upwards situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1914.
2. The minimum rate for such properties valued at less than Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings (20s.)
3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds (£5) sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum.
4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use or for the watering of private gardens or distribution otherwise on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.
5. For every steam boiler or engine using water the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.
6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge will be Ninepence (9d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the municipal charge shall not be less than equal to One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Shepparton for the year 1914 of the property so supplied.
7. Water supplied to Government Departments, public gardens, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show yards, cattle yards, sheep dips, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.
8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of Two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.
9. For a temporary supply during the laying down of any new works or the erection of new building, or repairs, or additions, the charge shall be by meter measurement at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000), which shall include supply of meter. The meter, with box enclosed, shall be supplied by the Trust, and shall be fixed by the Trust officer or officers, and the applicant for the temporary supply shall have all pipes and connexions to the main ready before the meter is so fixed. All persons requiring a supply of water under this clause shall first notify the Trust and shall not use any water for such purposes until authorized in writing so to do. The Trust officer or officers shall be entitled at any time to go upon the premises to inspect and supervise the meter and the supply and use of the water.

10. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the said year 1914. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act* 1905, on the evening of Tuesday, sixteenth day of December, 1913.

WHEREAS by section 55 of the *Closer Settlement Act 1904* (4 Edw. VII. No. 1962) it is provided that the Governor in Council may make regulations prescribing, amongst other things, the form and manner of application for allotments, and the issue of permits for immediate occupation of allotments, and the rates of registration permit and lease fees payable, and generally for fully carrying out the objects and purposes and guarding against evasions and violations of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additions to the Regulations made under the *Closer Settlement Acts*, that is to say:—

ADDITIONS TO REGULATIONS MADE ON 10th

CROWN GRANTS UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 60 OF THE CLOSER SETTLEMENT ACT 1904, AS AMENDED BY SECTION 27 OF THE CLOSER SETTLEMENT ACT 1912, FOR ALLOTMENTS WITHIN A PROCLAIMED TOWNSHIP UNDER THE LAND ACTS.

Crown Grants of land dated on and after 31st December, 1912, under the provisions of section 60 of the *Closer Settlement Act 1904*, as amended by section 27 of the *Closer Settlement Act 1912*, for allotments within a proclaimed township under the Land Acts shall be in the form prescribed in the Thirty-ninth Schedule hereto, and shall be subject to such other exceptions, reservations, covenants, and conditions as the Governor in Council may in any particular case direct.

1. 3. 5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of this contract, Melbourne will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office. The cost of all postage connected therewith however, shall be defrayed, and printed forms required under the contract shall be supplied, by the Education Department.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Director for Education or such other officer whom he may appoint.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. By-Law No. 11.—BUILDING REGULATIONS.

A By-law of the Borough of Oakleigh, made under Section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 11. For the following purposes:—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings.
- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections, or hoardings.
- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings erections or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to any such By-law or not pulled down or removed as required by or under any such By-law and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings erections or hoardings and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under such regulations and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Oakleigh order as follows:—

1. That By-law No. 9, of the Borough of Oakleigh, gazetted 16th October, 1912, and all By-laws and regulations of the City of Caulfield made under the provisions of Section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903* and Part 5 of the Thirteenth Schedule thereof so far as the same are applicable to the West Ward of the Borough of Oakleigh, are hereby repealed as and from the date of this By-law coming into operation.

2. On and after the coming into force of this By-law no person shall erect or construct or commence to erect or construct or cause or suffer to be erected constructed commenced or placed upon any land or street within the Borough of Oakleigh any building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection without first obtaining a permit or licence from the Council to such building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection and submitting to the Council an application in writing for the same together with a properly prepared plan drawn to scale and complete specification together with an estimate of cost of the proposed building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection and the location and dimensions of the land on which such building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection is proposed to be erected or constructed and leaving a copy of ground plan of same showing the position of the building on the allotment together with the position of proposed closets outhouses and other

erections with the Council and any person offending against this part of this By-law shall on conviction forfeit a sum not exceeding £20.

3. Any person having obtained a permit or licence under Clause 2 hereof who fails to commence such building or having commenced to erect or construct such building and in the opinion of the Council fails to complete such building with all convenient despatch shall forfeit such permit or licence.

4. And if any building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection be commenced erected constructed or placed upon any land or street within the Borough of Oakleigh without having first made the application in writing and obtained the permit or licence of the Council as aforesaid or if any building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection be not erected constructed or placed in accordance with the permit or licence of the Council as aforesaid the Council may by notice in writing signed by the Town Clerk given to such person or placed on some conspicuous part of the building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection require such building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection to be forthwith pulled down and removed and if such person does not begin to pull down and remove such building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection within seven days after such notice has been given or placed as aforesaid and complete the pulling down and removal of such building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection as speedily as the nature of the case will permit or within a date to be fixed by the Council he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding £20.

5. And in case any such building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection be not pulled down and removed within the time aforesaid the Council may with all convenient speed cause such building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection to be pulled down and removed and for that purpose may break down any fences surrounding the land on which such building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection is situate and may enter upon such land and the Council may sell the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses incurred in or connected with the pulling down or removal of such building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection and any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof and the Council shall restore any overplus arising from such sale to the owner on demand.

6. No person shall commence erect construct or place or cause or suffer to be commenced erected or constructed or placed upon any land within the Borough of Oakleigh any building or dwelling having a distance between the floors and ceilings thereof of less than ten feet any room of the main building used or intended to be used as a dwelling containing not less than 700 cubic feet of space but skillion roofs may have a height of not less than eight feet from the floor to the lowest part of the roof or the ceiling provided that the average height be not less than nine feet.

7. No person shall commence erect construct or place or cause or suffer to be commenced erected constructed or placed upon any land within the Borough of Oakleigh any building or dwelling of less dimensions or area on the ground floor in any street within the Borough which is specified in the following list, viz:—

Provided always that nothing herein contained shall do away with the right of the Council to refuse its permit or licence to the erection of any building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection under Clause 2 of this By-law.

8. No person shall commence erect or construct or place or cause or suffer to be commenced erected or constructed or placed upon any land within the Borough of Oakleigh any building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection constructed of wood unless the same shall be distant at least five feet from any street and four feet from any part of the boundary line of the allotment on which it is erected constructed or placed and any building dwelling verandah hoarding or other erection erected constructed or placed contrary to the provisions of this Clause may be dealt with by the Council in the manner provided in Clauses 4 and 5 of this By-law.

9. No verandah upon or across any street or foot-way erected or constructed under these regulations shall be of less height in every part thereof from the ground than nine feet.

10. Two or more buildings or dwelling houses may be erected in one block on land belonging to the same owner, and shall then be separated from each other by a wall of brick or stone at least eight and one-half inches in thickness and carried up to at least one foot above the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same and projecting at least one inch beyond the face of the woodwork or spouting.

11. In every building constructed under these regulations proper ventilation shall be provided of not less than 9 inches x 6 inches inlet for every 12 feet x 12 feet room and a free air space of not less than 6 inches between the ground and any part of the building excepting in the case of shops which shall be subject to the direction of the Council by resolution.

12. No privy shall be attached to any dwelling wash-house or room used for domestic purposes nor shall it be constructed within ten feet of such dwelling wash-house or room and every such privy whether already built or hereafter to be built must have a door and be properly enclosed screened and fenced from public view.

13. Subject to the provisions of Clause 8 of this By-law any privy may abut upon any right-of-way at a distance of not less than five feet from any street and four feet from the adjoining allotment.

14. This By-law shall not apply to any fence green-house fern-house or to any outhouse not being a privy abutting on any right-of-way and being not less than five feet from any street and four feet from the adjoining allotment or to any Government buildings works or operations.

15. No building shall be erected in the Borough unless such building be in every part constructed of sound material approved of in writing by the Surveyor.

16. The Building Surveyor at all reasonable times during the progress and during fourteen days next after the completion of any building or addition to any building affected by any of the provisions of this By-law may and he is hereby authorized to enter and inspect such building or addition and the owner or builder thereof shall produce to the Building Surveyor for the time being for inspection the original plans and specifications of the building approved by the Council when demanded by him.

17. No fowl houses stables nor manure bins shall be erected in front of any building used as a dwelling nor at a less distance than 25 feet from any such building.

18. For the purpose of this By-law "Building Surveyor" shall mean the person appointed in that behalf by the Council for the time being or such other person as the Council may from time to time authorize to carry out any of the provisions of this By-law.

19. Any person erecting any building of less dimensions than those shown in the plans and specifications submitted or with timber of less scantling or making any other material departure from such plans and specifications shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 or more than £20 for each such offence.

20. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained the Council may under special circumstances by resolution exempt any proposed building or dwelling from any of the provisions of Clauses 6, 7, and 8 of this By-law.

21. The fees to be paid to the Council for inspection of any plan shall be Two Shillings (2/-) per square of 10 feet x 10 feet and shall be lodged with the application for the permit or licence. The maximum fee to be £2.

22. This By-law shall come into operation as from the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
