IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Walpeup, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say: say :

This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government

- 2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the portion of the East Riding of the Shire of Walpeup in the area set out in clause 11 hereto.
- 3. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall cause the same to be used, for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.
- 4. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such paus to be kept under the seat aforesaid.
- 5. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

  6. The Coupeil shall at least one a week cause the
- 6. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day time, and the other pan to be left in its place.
- Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleaned by super-heated steam and tar painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.
- 8. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

- 9. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make on each occupier a charge for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.
- 10. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
- 11. The sanitary area referred to in clause 2 shall be as follows:—The township of Ouyen and that portion of the shire as is bounded on the east by the Mildura railway line, on the north by allotment 30, Ouyen, on the west by the water reserve, and on the south by the town boundary.

#### BY-LAW No. 13.

To Regulate Disposal of Night-soil at Fern Tree Gully.

A By-law of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully, made under the provisions of the Health Act 1890, and numbered 13, to regulate the removal and disposal of night-soil in the townships of Upper and Lower Fern Tree Gully.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890 and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully, in the name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, and do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately, after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the townships of Upper and Lower Fern Tree Gully, in the area set out in clause 11 hereto; but it shall cease to apply to any portion or portions of the said area that may from time to time be exempted from its operation by special order of the Council.

  3. The occupier of any premises in which there is a cluset or privy shall cause a space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the privy or closet to be kept in a fit state for such service. The said occupier or person having control of the premises shall cause the floor of the closet or privy to be constructed of impervious material, such floor to be at least six inches above the surrounding ground, and the occupier aforesaid shall provide easy means of access to the pan, and shall cause skids to be provided to permit of the easy removal of the pan.

  4. The Council shall cause each closet or privy to be
- 4. The Council shall cause each closet or privy to be supplied or kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.
- 5. The occupier aforesaid or other person having control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil deposited in the pan of such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposite thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

- 6. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day time, and another pan to be left in its place.
- 7. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleaned by super-leated steam and tar painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.
- 8. The occupier aforesaid, or other person, shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with the provisions of this By-law.
- 9. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.
- 10. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall, for every breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
- 11. The sanitary area for the townships of Upper and Lower Fern Tree Gully shall be as follows:—Commencing at a point on the Burwood-road opposite Crown allotment 55, parish of Scoresby, county of Mornington, such point being the junction of the western boundary of the lodged plan of subdivision No. 2465 with the said road. # PHARMACY BOARD OF VICTORIA.

#### REGULATIONS.

HEREAS by Part III. of the Medical Act 1890, the Pharmacy Board of Victoria (hereinafter referred to as the "Board") is empowered to from time to time make, alter, and rescind Regulations for the purpose of carrying the said Part into effect: And whereas the Board is desirous, subject to the confirmation of the Governor in Council, of rescinding the Regulations made under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act on the 3rd November, 1890, and all subsquent Regulations, and in lieu thereof, subject to such confirmation, is desirous of making under the powers so conferred, the Regulations following: Now therefore the Board doth make Regulations as set forth hereunder, and His Excellency the Governor in Council has, by Order made on the 13th day of May, 1914, confirmed the said Regulations, that is to say:—

#### General.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Pharmacy Regulations 1914," and they shall take effect as and from the date when after confirmation by the Governor in Council the same are published in the Government Gazette, whereupon all Regulations heretofore made under any of the provisions of Part.III. of the Medical Act 1890 shall be rescinded.
- 2. The words used in these Regulations in the singular shall be deemed to include the plural, and the words used in the plural shall be deemed to include the singular, unless the contrary is expressly provided.

# Election of Members of Board.

- 3. Appointment of Returning Officer.—The Board shall from time to time appoint (and may remove) some fit and proper person who is registered as a pharmaceutical chemist, and not being a member of the Board, to be Returning Officer, and to conduct the election of members of the Board in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf, and the Returning Officer so appointed may, by writing under his hand, subject to the approval of the Board, from time to time appoint and remove a Deputy Returning Officer.

  A Expense of Elections—The Reard shall pay to the
- 4. Expense of Elections.—The Board shall pay to the Returning Officer for his own use, out of the moneys accruing under the Medical Act 1890, a fee of £2 2s. for each and every election conducted by such Returning Officer or his deputy, together with a sum of money sufficient to recoup him all expenses incurred for the purpose of holding and conducting such election.
- purpose of holding and conducting such election.

  5. Annual Election.—The Returning Officer or his deputy shall, in the month of February in each and every year, proceed to the election of as many persons to be members of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria as there are vacancies created (not being extraordinary vacancies) in each year; and the persons so elected at such annual election shall hold office for a term of three years then next ensuing from the date of such annual election, and no longer.

  6. Extraordinary Vacancies, how Filled.—If any vacancy shall occur from death, resignation, or a member being removed by the Governor in Council, it shall be called an extraordinary vacancy, and the Returning Officer or his deputy shall, upon being notified by the Board that an extraordinary vacancy has occurred, proceed to the election of a person being a registered pharmaceutical chemist to fill such extraordinary vacancy, and the person so elected shall hold office for the uncxpired portion of the term of office of the person whose vacancy created as aforesaid he has been elected to fill, and no longer.

  7. Returning Officer to gire Notice of Day of Election and Day of Nomination, Time, and Place when and where Nomination will be received.—At every election for members to serve on the Board the Returning Officer or his deputy shall give twenty-one days' notice, by advertisement in such papers as may from time to time be approved by the Board, of his intention to proceed on a certain day, to be named in such advertisement, to hold an election of fit and proper persons to serve as members on such Board; and he shall also in such advertisement name a day, being not less than four-teen days nor more than twenty-one days prior to the day named for holding such election, on or before which all candidates for election must be nominated as hereinafter provided; and he shall also in such advertisement name the time and place when and where such nominations shall be received, and shall sign such notice and affix the date it is given thereto.

  8. Who may Nominate, and how.—Any person registered are absurated as particular and places when the property is the provided in the such advertise.
- 8. Who may Nominate, and how.—Any person registered as a pharmaceutical chemist in Victoria desirous of nominating any other person as a candidate shall fill up a nomination paper in the form of the First Schedule hercto, stating therein the christian name and

surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required by such Schedule, and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than five persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also by the person named therein as a candidate, accepting such nomination, and agreeing to act as a member of the Board if elected. Such nomination paper must be lodged or delivered by post before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day fixed for nominations.

9. When Returning Officer may declare Members Elected without a Poll—When a Poll shall be taken.—
The Returning Officer or his deputy shall, in the event of there not being a greater number of persons nominated than are required to fill the vacancies created, make a return to the Registrar of the Board, and declare such person or persons to have been duly elected member or members of the Board; but if the number of persons nominated is greater than the number of persons required to fill such vacancies a poll shall be taken, and he shall cause voting papers to be printed in the form given in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall sign each of such papers, and shall cause one to be enclosed in an envelope not fastened, with the name and address of the Returning Officer or his deputy printed thereon, and one of such voting papers and printed envelopes shall be sent by post under a fastened cover to the address of each and every registered pharmaceutical chemist in Victoria and resident in Victoria.

10. Returning Officer to ascertain Number of Voters

10. Returning Officer to ascertain Number of Voters for each Candidate. in presence of Registrar and Scrutineers—Candidates Declared Duly Elected.—The Returning Officer or his deputy shall, on the day named in such advertisement for holding any election, proceed, in the presence of the Registrar and of any scrutineers appointed by any condidate, to open the envelopes with his address thereon, and which have been returned to him, and to take out the voting paners contained therein. When the Returning Officer or his deputy deems advisable, or by the request of a scrutineer appointed by any candidate, he shall compare the signature of the voter on any voting paper with the signature of the voter in the signature book kept by the Registrar, and if he is satisfied that each vote is properly given, he shall proceed to ascertain the number of such votes for each candidate; and as soon as conveniently may be after the day of holding such election, the Returning Officer or his deputy shall give public notice, by advertisement, of the number of votes given to each candidate, and shall declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to be duly elected as members of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, and if two or more candidates shall have received an equal number of votes the Returning Officer or his deputy shall in each case have the casting vote.

11. Voting Paper may become Invalid—Voting Paper to be Posted to Address of Returning Officer.—If any

shall in each case have the casting vote.

11. Voting Paper may become Invalid—Voting Paper to be Postad to Address of Returning Officer.—If any voter shall suffer to remain upon any voting paper a greater or less number of names not struck out than the number of members to be elected, or shall fail to attach his signature thereto, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect, and shall not be counted by the Returning Officer or his deputy. The voter shall enclose such voting paper in an envelope furnished to him with the printed address of the Returning Officer or his deputy thereon, and shall post or deliver the same so that it shall be received by the Returning Officer or his deputy before the day, fixed for holding such election, provided that the Returning Officer or his deputy may at his discretion accept as valid any voting paper enclosed in an envelope other than the printed envelope above referred to.

12. How Candidate may Retire.—If any person who

How Candidate may Retire.—If any person who shall duly have become a candidate for such election, and three of the persons having signed the paper nominating him, shall be desirous that he retire before the day of holding such election from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid, not later than twelve clear days before the day of holding such election, may sign and deliver a notice, in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires, and the Returning Officer or his deputy on receipt of such notice shall omit the name of such person so retiring from the voting paper, and if the number of candidates shall by such retirement be reduced to the number of members to be elected, the Returning Officer shall declare the remaining members duly elected.

13. Appointment of Scrutineers.—Each candidate shall be entitled to be present personally, and to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer, to be present when the Returning Officer shall open the envelopes containing the voting papers on the day of holding the election.

14. Election of President.—The President shall be elected at the first meeting of the Board after the term of office of the retiring President shall have expired by effluxion of time, or by death, resignation, or removal

from the Board by the Governor in Council. He shall be elected by a majority of the persons present, and if for want of a quorum, or from any other cause, a President shall not be elected at such first meeting, he shall be elected at the next meeting, a week's notice having been given by the Registrar to each member of the Board.

15. Meetings of the Board—Special Meeting.—The Board shall meet in the building of the College of Pharmacy or some other suitable place appointed by the Board, on the second Wednesday in every month (except where otherwise provided in Regulation 17) at the hour of Eleven a.m., and on such other days and at such times as the President or any two members of the Board shall desire by requisition, in writing, addressed to the Registrar, who shall thereupon summon the members of the Board to meet on the day at the time fixed by such requisition.

16. Meeting to Lapse when a Outpum not Present—

16. Meeting to Lapse when a Quorum not Present.—
If at the expiration of thirty minutes after the hour appointed for any meeting of the Board there shall not be a quorum of members present, no business shall be transacted, and the meeting shall lapse.

17. Meetings after Examinations.—If, in the months of March, June, September, and December, the quarterly examinations are not completed in time to allow of the examiners to furnish their reports by the second Wednesnesday in any of the months named, the Board shall meet on some subsequent day, to be fixed by the President, not being later than the third Wednesday in any of the months named.

18. Order of Business.—At every meeting of the Board the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings of the previous meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to the accuracy as a record of the proceedings; such minutes, when confirmed, shall be signed by the President or Chairman presiding at the time of confirmation.

After signing the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business at the meeting shall be as follows, unless altered by a resolution of the Board to that effect:—

Proceedings of Board.—At every meeting of the Board the business and proceedings and the conduct and management thereof shall be dealt with, carried on, and regulated as provided by standing orders from time to time, or in the absence or silence of such standing orders as the Board may from time to time determine.

20. Seal of the Board.—The Board may adopt by resolution a seal as and for the common seal of the Board. The Registrar shall have the custody of such seal, which shall be deposited in the office of the Board, and shall not be used except as hereinafter provided. The seal of the Board shall only be affixed by the Registrar, to any instrument or writing, when authorized by a resolution passed for that purpose and entered upon the minutes of the proceedings of the Board.

21. Form of Certificate of Ouglification. The Board

21. Form of Certificate of Qualification.—The Board may adopt a design for the form of a certificate of qualification, to be issued to duly qualified pharmaceutical chemists, being persons who shall be qualified by examination under this Act, and such certificates shall be signed by the President and members of the Board, and shall have affixed thereto the common seal of the Board.

22. Committees.—The Board may from time to time appoint from amongst themselves such Committees as may be necessary, and may by resolution at any time abolish any. Committee so appointed. The President for the time being shall be ex-officio a member of every such Committee, and, if present, shall preside.

22. Seat of Member, how Vacated—If any member

such Committee, and, if present, shall preside.

23. Seat of Member, how Vacated.—If any member die, or by notice under his hand delivered to the President or Registrar, resign his office as a member, or be removed from the Board by the Governor in Council, or be declared ousted of such office by the Supreme Court, or be absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of the Board without leave obtained from the Board in that behalf, then in every such case the office of every such member shall become vacant, and every such vacancy shall be an extraordinary vacancy, and notified to the Returning Officer or his deputy by the Board.

24. Chairman Appointed during Absence of President.—If at the time appointed for holding a meeting of the Board the President shall be absent, the members present may appoint one of themselves to preside as Chairman at such meeting, or until the President shall be present, when such Chairman shall vacate the chair in favour of the President.

## Registrar and Registrations.

- Registrar and Registrations.

  25. Dutics of Registrar.—The Registrar shall be in attendance at his office at such hours as from time to time may be appointed by the Board for that purpose, and be present at all meetings of the Board and Committees. It shall be his duty to superintend the affairs of the Board under the direction of the Board and Committees. The Registrar shall keep the books in a neat and orderly manner; he shall conduct the correspondence, issue all summonses, and sign all informations, take the minutes of all meetings for business and read them, keep proper books of account, prepare the monthly and annual financial statements, and make a report of all matters that come under his cognizance for the information of the Board and Committees. He shall consult the President on any business requiring attention between the various meetings, and be responsible for the safe custody of all the documents and property belonging to the Board which shall be under his control, and shall find security in the sum of £100 in some fidelity or guarantee society, the premiums upon which to be recouped to him by the Board.

  26. Registrar to Receive Fees.—The Registrar shall
  - 26. Registrar to Receive Fees.—The Registrar shall receive all fees, fines, subscriptions, donations, and other moneys which may become due or payable to the Board, and give a printed receipt and no other for the same, retaining a block counterpart of such receipt. He shall pay all such moneys direct into the Board's banking account at intervals of not more than fourteen days.
  - 27. Certificates and Documents to be Prescreed.—The Registrar shall keep and preserve all certificates and other documents issued by the examiners signifying that examinations have been passed.
  - examinations have been passed.

    28. Form of Register for Pharmaceutical Chemists—Form of Register for Apprentices.—The Registrar shall from time to time make out and maintain a register in the form prescribed in the Seventh Schedule to the Medical Act 1890, of all persons admitted by the Board as pharmaceutical chemists. He shall also from time to time make out and maintain a register of all persons who have passed the preliminary examination prescribed by these Regulations for apprentices. Such register shall be in the same form as that prescribed for registered pharmaceutical chemists, inserting under the head of qualification, apprentice to A.B., registered pharmaceutical chemists, and there shall be column for the insertion of the date when such apprentice is admitted as a pharmaceutical chemist, when his name shall be transferred to the register of pharmaceutical chemists.

    29. Signatures of Registered Pharmaceutical Chemists.

    —The Registrar shall from time to time keep and maintain a signature book containing the signatures of each and every registered pharmaceutical chemist, which shall be arranged in alphabetical order, and he shall produce such book for the inspection of the Returning Officer appointed by the Board on the day of holding each and every election provided for by these Regulations.

- 30. Appointment of Honorary Treasurer.—The Board may from time to time appoint one of their number as Honorary Treasurer, who shall find security in the sum of £100, and may pay to such Honorary Treasurer, out of the moneys accruing under this Act, a sufficient sum to recoup him for any premiums he may have to pay to any fidelity or guarantee society for obtaining such security as aforesaid.
- security as atoresaid.

  31. Duties of Treasurer.—It shall be the duty of the Honorary Treasurer to see that all moneys received by the Registrar are lodged in some bank appointed by the Board, to the credit of an account headed, "Pharmacy Board of Victoria," and to pay by a cheque, signed by the Treasurer and two members of the Board, such accounts as the Board may from time to time order by a resolution which shall specify the sums of money to be paid and to whom.
- 32. Innestment of Funds.—The Board may from time to time direct the Treasurer to invest any surplus funds in his hands, over and above what is required for the working expenses of the Board, in such manner and upon such security as shall be authorised by a resolution of the Board.
- 33. Financial Statements.—The Treasurer shall present to the Board a monthly statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the past month, and he shall also in the month of January in each year present to the

Board a financial statement for the year, showing the exact financial position of the affairs of the Board as at the 31st December of the previous year.

#### Auditors

- 34. Appointment of Auditors and Term of Office.—
  The Board shall appoint annually two fit and proper persons as Auditors, who shall hold office at the discretion of the Board and until their successors are appointed, and the Board may pay out of the moneys accruing under the Medical Act 1890 such fees as they may deem expedient.

  35. Duties of Auditors.—The Auditors shall inspect the books and accounts of the Board, and examine the annual halance-sheet prepared by the Registrar, and shall certify to the same if correct, and they shall also investigate and examine all contracts, accounts, invoices, books, bills of parcels, and vouchers in any way relating to or concerning the same, which may be kept by or in the possession of the Treasurer and Registrar, and they shall also examine the bank pass-book and ascertain that it corresponds with the account of the Board in the bank, and they shall present an annual report to the Board staing the result of their inspection and examination. examination.

#### Examiners.

- 36. Appointment of Examiners.—The Board shall, as often as may be required, appoint fit persons to act as examiners, and may pay, out of the moneys accruing under the Act, such fees as they shall from time to time determine to any examiner other than a member of the Roard of the Board.
- 37. The Board shall from time to time fill up any vacancy in the office of examiner.
- 38. Duties of Examiners.—The examiners shall meet as often as may be required for the purpose of conducting examinations at such times as may be directed by the Board, and such examiners shall report the result of every examination to the Board at the next meeting immediately following the same.
- 39. Examiners may Grant or Refuse Certificates.—The examiners may grant or refuse to such persons as shall have tendered themselves for examination, as in their discretion may seem fit, certificates of competent skill, knowledge, and qualification; and such certificates shall be delivered by the examiners to the Registrar, and submitted at a meeting of the Board for its approval.
- 40. Registrar to Preserve Certificates.—The Registrar shall receive and preserve the certificates issued by the examiners signifying that examinations have been passed.

# Examinations.

- 41. Preliminary and Final Examinations.—The pre-liminary and final examinations shall be held in March, June, September, and December of each year.
- 42. Intermediate Examination.—The intermediate examination in chemistry, practical chemistry, materia medica, and botany shall be held in June and December of each year.

# Preliminary Examination.

- 43. Subjects of Preliminary Examination.—Every person who is not entitled to be exempted under Regulation 44, before he enter into articles of agreement to be an apprentice, within the meaning of section 88, subsection 4, of the Medical Act 1890, shall pass a preliminary examination before an examiner or examiners appointed by the Board in the following five subjects:—Latin, English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra (the details of which are set out in Appendix A of these Regulations), and shall obtain a certificate from the Board to the effect that he has passed the preliminary examination in the prescribed subjects.

  44. Exemption from Preliminary Examination—Any
- examination in the prescribed subjects.

  44. Exemption from Preliminary Examination.—Any person who has passed the Junior or Senior Public Examinations, or some equivalent examination, of the Melbourne University, or of some other University recognised by the Board, in any or all of the prescribed compulsory subjects of the preliminary examination, shall, on production of a certificate to such effect signed by the registrar of such university, be exempted from passing the corresponding subjects of the preliminary examination.
- tion.

  45. Preliminary Examination, where held.—The preliminary examination shall be held at the College of Pharmacy, Melbourne; the School of Mines, Ballarat and Bendigo; and at such other centres as may be approved by the Board. Candidates desirous of being examined elsewhere than in Melbourne, Ballarat, or Bendigo, must forward the name of some suitable person, such as a clergyman, schoolmaster, solicitor, to the Board for approval, and such person must personally write to the Board intimating his willingness to supervise the candidate during the examination. Any extra

expenses incurred in holding the examination at places other than Melbourne, Ballarat, and Bendigo, must be defrayed by the candidate.

- 46. Duties of Supervisor.—Supervisors at examinations are required to carefully observe that neither books nor notes are introduced into the examination-room or used during the examination (except in the subjects of practical chemistry and practical dispensing). Candidates not observing this Regulation will be disqualified. The supervisor shall announce, before the examination begins, that an offence against this Regulation will entail disqualification.
- 47. Non-attendance at Examination.—Any candidate having paid the examination fee, and being prevented by illness or other causes from presenting himself at an examination, may be allowed to attend at the following examination without payment of another fee, provided that he makes a written application to the Registrar, accompanied by a medical certificate in case of illness, prior to the commencement of the examination. No refund of examination fees will be made.

#### Intermediate and Final Examinations.

- 48. Division of Examinations.—The examination prescribed by section 88, sub-section IV., of the Medical Act 1890, shall be divided into two sections, the first portion of which shall be called the intermediate examination, and the second portion the final or qualifying expiration. fying examination.
- 49. Intermediate Examination.—The intermediate examination shall consist of written and practical exercises in the subjects of chemistry, practical chemistry, materia medica, and botany, in accordance with the syllabus from time to time prescribed by the examiners. The details of the intermediate examination are set out in Appendix B of these Regulations.

- 52. Plates for Printing to be Locked up.—All plates used from time to time for printing the forms of certificates shall be held under the custody of the Registrar in a box having a lock and key.
- 53. No Print to be taken except by Order of the Board. No print shall be taken from any of the said plates without an express order of the Board. All prints taken shall be in the custody of the Registrar.
- 54. Honor Passes.—Any candidate who obtains at any examination eighty per centum or more of marks in each subject shall have the certificate indorsed "with
- .55. Notice of intention to be Examined.—Every candidate desirous of being examined shall, ten days previous to the day fixed for examination, give the Registrar written notice of his intention to present himself at such examination, and pay the prescribed fee.
- 56. Text-books.—The text-books recommended by the examiners are set out in Appendices A, B, and C.
- 57. Reports on Papers.—Any candidate who desires a report on any of the written papers submitted by him at any examination shall, within fourteen days of the publication of the results of such examination, lodge with the Registrar an application for a report on such papers, and shall pay the following fees:—

Preliminary examination, 10s. 6d. for any or all of such papers.
Intermediate or final examination, 10s. 6d. for each paper to be reported upon.

- 58. Fccs.—The fees prescribed in the Sixth Schedule of these Regulations shall be paid by the candidate when making application to be examined.
- 59. Examination Marks.—The marks awarded at examinations shall not be disclosed, but the Registrar shall inform the candidates of the subjects in which they have failed or passed, after the meeting of the Board to consider the reports of the examiners.

#### Registration of Indentures.

- 60. Registration of Indentures.—Every person who shall have obtained a certificate of having passed the preliminary examination hereinbefore prescribed, and who shall have entered into articles of agreement as an apprentice with a registered pharmaceutical chemist, shall, on production of such certificate and of such articles of agreement, and upon payment of the fee of One guinea, be entitled, upon application to the Registrar within three months of the date of such articles, to have his name placed upon the register of apprentices.
- 61. Indentures to be in the Form of the Fifth Schedule.—From and after the first day of June, 1914, all apprenticeship indentures and agreements whereby any apprenticesing intentifies and agreements whereby any person shall agree to serve as an apprentice within the meaning of section 88, sub-section IV., of the Medical Act 1890, shall be in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, with such variations as circumstances may require. Apprenticeship indentures in the prescribed form may be obtained from the Registrar on payment of is. per copy, or three copies for 2s. 6d.
- 62. Indentures to be in Triplicate.-Apprenticeship in-62. Indealures to be in Triplicate.—Apprenticeship indeatures shall be signed in triplicate, and shall be produced by the apprentice to the Registrar of the Board for registration within three calendar months of the execution thereof. The Registrar shall indorse apprenticeship indeatures produced to him for registration as aforesaid with a number, together with the date of production, and shall sign such indorsement. One indeature shall be retained by the employer, another by the apprentice, and the third shall be filed and retained by the Registrar.
- 63. Cancellation or Assignment. Cancellation mutual consent and assignment of apprenticeship indentures shall likewise be produced to the Registrar within three calendar months from the execution thereof, or within such extended time as the Board may allow.
- 64. Entry in Apprentices' Register.—Upon registration of an indenture of apprenticeship as aforesaid the name of the apprentice shall be placed by the Registrar upon the register of apprentices.
- 65. Prescribed Form may be dispensed with.—The Board in its absolute discretion may accept for registration any indenture or agreement of apprenticeship, or any cancellation or assignment thereof, notwithstanding that it is not in the prescribed form, or is not produced for registration within the prescribed time, or if any other prescribed formality has not been complied with if the Board is of opinion that under the particular circumstances of the case it is desirable to do so.

# Certificates of Qualification.

- 66. When Certificate of Qualification may be issued to an Apprentice.—No certificate of qualification shall be issued to any person who is by the Medical Act required to be apprenticed until he shall have furnished the Board with a declaration, to be approved by them, that he has faithfully, and without any unreasonable intermission, served his apprenticeship for the term required by the said Medical Act 1890, and also a like declaration by the person to whom he was apprenticed.

  —In any case when any person shall have duly made application to be registered as a registered pharmaceutical chemist, and the Board shall require any declaration for further evidence which cannot for the time being be obtained, the Board may, on being restificate as to the bond fides of the application, and that the applicant is possessed of competent knowledge and skill, grant to him a certificate in the form A to these Regulations; and the person to whom such certificate is granted shall thereupon be enabled to be registered as a registered pharmaceutical chemist for any period not exceeding twelve months.

When such Certificate of Qualification shall become Void.—If any person who shall have obtained such certificate as in the last Regulation mentioned does-not, within the time for which certificate is granted, furnish the Board with the declaration of evidence required by them, the said certificate shall become void and of no effect and the person named therein shall be struck off the register.

#### Miscellaneous.

69. Duties of Executors and Trustees.—The executors, administrators, or trustees of the estate of a deceased registered pharmaceutical chemist, shall, within three months of the death of the said registered pharmaceutical chemist, send their name or names and addresses to the Registrar, to be entered into a book kept for that purpose. that purpose.

70. Notice of Carrying on the Business of a Deceased Chemist.—Any registered pharmaceutical chemist carrying on the business of a deceased registered pharmaceutical chemist for the executors, administrators, or trustees of the estate of a deceased registered pharmaceutical chemist, shall, forthwith on assuming the management of the said business, send notice to that effect to the Registrar and have his name entered in a book to be kept for that purpose. Any person neglecting to do so shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £10.

71. Restoration of Name to Register.—Any registered pharmaceutical chemist whose name has been removed from the register, in accordance with the provisions of the Medical Act 1890; Part III., and who applies to have his name replaced on the register, shall pay a registration fee of £1 ls.

72. Penalty.—The penalty for any breach of these: Regulations, where a special penalty has not been provided, shall not be more than £10 for each offence.

74. Conditions of Registration.—Any person who shall

76. Recognition of Lectures of Schools of Pharmacy.—

GEOMETRY,-Euclid, Books I. and II.

The marks for a pass in any of the compulsory subjects of the Preliminary Examination shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the maximum marks of 100, and an aggregate of 60 per cent. Any candidate failing to obtain a pass in not more than two subjects shall be entitled to present himself in either or both of the subjects in which he failed at any subsequent examination on payment of the prescribed fees, provided he obtains not less than 25 per cent. of the maximum marks of 100, in either or both of the subjects.

# APPENDIX B.

THE INTERMEDIATE EXAMINATION FOR THE CERTIFICATE OF THE COLLEGE OF PHARMACY, MELBOURNE

(As recognised by section 88 of the Medical Act 1890.)

For students who have attended the compulsory course of lectures in Chemistry, Practical Chemistry, Materia Medica, and Botany.

The Intermediate Examination is held half-yearly in June and December of each year before Examiners appointed by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, and covers broadly the subjects dealt with in the syllabus of lectures.

The Intermediate Examination consists of three subjects, viz., Chemistry, Materia Medica, and Botany, and includes a written and practical examination in each subject. A candidate must obtain not less than 50 per cent. of the total marks awarded in each of the three subjects in order to secure a pass. Any candidate obtaining 60 per cent. of marks in any two subjects and not less than 40 per cent. in the remaining subject shall be eligible to present himself at any subsequent examination for the subject in which he failed.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the Education Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say :--

#### REGULATION XLI .- ESTABLISHMENT OF SUBSIDISED SCHOOLS

1. When a subsidised school is at any time established in a sparsely populated locality where there are not fewer than four (4) children of five (5) years of age and over who reside more than six (6) miles from any existing school, and where, in the opinion of the Department, the case cannot be met by the system of conveyance, a teacher, approved by the Minister and engaged by the parents applying for a subsidised school, may be paid a subsidy at the rate of £5 per pupil per annum on the net monthly enrolment; such subsidy not to exceed the sum of £50 yearly.

A room suitable for teaching purposes shall be pro-

A room suitable for teaching purposes shall be provided by the persons applying for the establishment of the subsidised school.

Subsidy shall be paid only on account of children five years of age and over.

All children five years of age and over in the locality unable to attend existing schools shall be entitled to attend a subsidised school.

Such payment as may be mutually agreed upon by the promoters of the school and the teacher shall be paid by the said promoters to the teacher in addition to the subsidy granted by the Minister.

The subsidy shall be granted to a single family only when it is too remote from any other family to combine for the employment of a teacher.

Secular instruction only shall be given during school hours. Five hours of each school day, in accordance with a time table approved by the District Inspector, shall be given to the instruction of the pupils in accordance with the Course of Free Instruction.

Subsidised schools shall observe the ordinary school vacations and holidays. If the prescribed instruction is not given on any school day, and such omission has not been sanctioned by the Department, deduction will be made from the amount payable as subsidy to the teacher.

Records shall be kept and returns furnished as required by the Minister.

The school shall be subject to inspection by any officer authorized by the Minister.

The teacher shall not be required to render any service for parents other than that connected with his teaching duties unless special and separate payment is made for such service.

Suitable accommodation shall be provided for the teacher on terms agreed upon by the promoters of the school and the teacher.

The subsidy may be withdrawn for breach of any of the provisions of this Regulation, or if the character of the instruction or the attendance of the pupils be considered by the Minister to be unsatisfactory.

Persons employed in subsidised schools shall not be regarded as teachers within the meaning of the Public Service Act 1890 and the Teachers Act 1805.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and in conformity with the Pure Food Act, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more cr less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

3. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

4. The Melbourne District will include places within a radius of six miles from the General Post Office, with the exception of places for which separate contracts are provided; williamstown includes supplies for s.s. 5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheads, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. 9. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulet as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.

In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations or stores are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply

A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10.
