SHIRE OF MAFFRA.

BY-LAW NO. 20.

A By-law of the Shire of Maffra, made under the provisions of the Health Act 1890, and numbered twenty, for regulating the removal of night-soil, the construction of approved closets, and for the observance of general cleanliness.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, the President, Councillors, and Rate-payers of the Shire of Maffra do hereby make the tollowing By-law:-

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are

bereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation upon its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the Government

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in every township or portion of a parish within the Shire of Maffra where a system of pan service (whether double or single) is in force, or may hereafter become established.

4. The Council of the Shire of Maffra may by reso-

lished.

4. The Council of the Shire of Maffra may by resolution exempt any portion of the above-mentioned area from any particular clause of this By-law, or may bring under its operation any other portion.

5. The owner or occupier of any premises in which there is a closet shall cause the same to be prepared to suit either a double or single pan service, which may be instituted from time to time, and shall cause the floor space immediately; under the seat to be covered with either cement, asphalt, or other impervious material for the pan to rest upon. The space under the seat in which the pan is kept shall be made perfectly fly-proof, either with brick, cement, tim, iron, or close wood lining. The seat is to be provided with a close-fitting lid on hinges, which must be kept closed when the closet is not in use, and if a stink-pipe is used it must be protected at both ends with close wire gauze. Whether the closet is provided with a door at back or a lifting seat on hinges (latter is preferable) it must fit quite close, so that the space where the pan is kept shall be at all times fly-proof.

6. The owner, occupier, or manager of every premises as aforesaid shall cause to be posted in each closet a notice inviting attention to clauses 7 and 9.

7. The Council shall cause closet pans to be regularly emptied and cleansed once in each week, or other times as may be determined upon, and the occupier of every premises shall leave the closet accessible to the contractor on such occasions.

8. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil except as provided herein.

9. No person shall deposit in any closet pan any house

herein.

9. No person shall deposit in any closet pan any house slops or yard rubbish (except deodorants) other than night-soil, or shall damage such pans or lids in any manner whatsoever.

10. The Council, in lieu of making a rate, may make a charge upon each occupier for the removal of night-soil, for pans supplied, or for any other work entailed, in carrying out the provisions of this By-law; and the Council may cause to be made all necessary alterations to any closet where the occupier or owner neglects to do so, and may recover the cost of same in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. Any persons committing a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach he liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in like manner to a penalty of Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which the breach shall be committed or continued. Passed by the Council of the Shire of Maffra, 4th February, 1914.

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING SCHOLARSHIPS TO WORKING MINERS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fifth day of May. 1914.

IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of provisions contained in the Mines Act 1914, No. 2489, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

Scholarships for Working Miners.

(Section 52, Mines Act 1914.)

- 1. Conditional on moneys being placed by the Legislature at his disposal, twenty scholarships or less, each not exceeding Ten pounds value per annum, payable quarterly, may be awarded by the Minister of Mines to working miners employed in mines, subject to the provisions of the Mines Acts of Victoria, who desire to qualify themselves for obtaining certificates of competency as mining managers. petency as mining managers.
- 2. The scholars will be selected upon competitive examination conducted by the Board of Examiners for Mining Managers during November-December of each year, at such centres as may from time to time be notified by the Secretary in the Government Gazette, and in a newspaper published or circulated in the locality. A candidate shall compete for a scholarship allotted to the particular mining district in which he is employed.
- 3. Scholarships may be allotted as follows, or as may be determined from time to time by the Board of Examiners for Mining Managers:—

- If less than twenty scholarships be awarded in any year, a less number may be allotted to each district in proportion. Should the successful candidates in a district be less in number than the scholarships allotted to such district, the unallotted scholarships may be awarded to meritorious candidates in other districts.
- 4. A person desiring to present himself for examina-tion shall, not later than the 18th October, notify the Secretary for Mines, Melbourne, on an application form obtainable from the Secretary to the Board, and no person will be admitted to examination unless he is a

working miner in the State of Victoria. The notice shall be accompanied by a fee of 2s. 6d., which admits to one examination only.

- 5. The subjects of examination shall be-
 - (a) Compulsory subjects-

Arithmetic and simple mensuration. English (handwriting, spelling, and composition).

Drawing (simple, plane and solid geometry and dimensional sketching).

(b) Optional subjects (preference will be given to candidates who show knowledge in these subjects) —

> Elementary algebra. Elementary geometry. Elementary mechanics. Elementary geology.

- 6. No scholarship will be awarded to a candidate unless he complies with all the following:—
 - (a) He shall be not less than eighteen years nor more than thirty years of age upon the first day of January succeeding the examination.
 - (b) He shall produce satisfactory evidence to the Board that he has, at the foregoing date, completed at least one year's underground mining experience in mines under the Mines Acts in the State of Victoria, and that he is likely to proceed with the course of study for mining manager.
 - (c) He shall pass a meritorious examination (the conditions determining a meritorious examination shall be fixed from time to time by the Board).
- 7. Each scholarship shall be tenable for three years upon these conditions:—
 - (a) The scholar shall, at the commencement of the session following the award of the scholarship, and thereafter during the tenure of his scholarship, become a student and follow a course of study for mining manager in a School of Mines or educational institution where the curriculum, training, subjects for and mode of examination in such School of Mines or educational institution are approved by the Board.
 - (b) The scholar shall, upon making application for the quarterly payments of scholarship, submit to the Board a satisfactory report as to attendance, conduct, and progress, from the principal of the school which he is attending.
- 8. The Minister may at any time cancel a scholarship if the above conditions are not complied with, or if he is satisfied that the conduct of a scholar has been disorderly or immoral. Thereupon such scholarship shall cease and determine.
- 9. On the production of satisfactory medical evidence that the scholar is incapable for the time being of continuing his course of study, or on satisfactory evidence being furnished that exceptional circumstances make it obligatory for him to discontinue his course of study for a time, a scholar may, on the certificate of the Board, have his scholarship suspended by the Minister for the period or periods recommended by the Board.
- 10. On obtaining a certificate of competency as mining manager from the approved School of Mines or educational institution, the scholar shall, without fee, be entitled, on application to the Board of Examiners for Mining Managers under the Mines Acts, to the Board's corresponding certificate of competency as mining manager, provided he has attained the age of twenty-three years, for a second class certificate, or of twenty-five for a first class certificate, and further complies with the Board's regulations for granting certificates to mining managers of mines under the Mines Acts as to the nature and length of his practical mining experience.

And the Honorable James Drysdale Brown, His Majesty's Minister of Mines for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

- 1. The Board will issue first and second class certifi-tes of competency and of service as mining manager, and certificates of competency as battery manager, ranide works' manager, and chlorination works' manager.

Any person desiring to obtain a certificate shall notify the Secretary for Mines, Melbourne, on an application form, obtainable from the Secretary to the Board, the notice to be accompanied by the fee prescribed in regulation 12A or 12B, as the case may be. For competency certificates such notice to be given not less than twenty-one clear days prior to the date of the examination, or the sitting of the Board. Should the applicant pass the prescribed examination such fee shall in each instance go towards payment of the full fee for certificate. In the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination, the application fee shall be forfeited to the Consolidated Revenue.

 3. Applications for certificates of service must be in
- 3. Applications for certificates of service must be in the hands of the Secretary to the Board before the 17th day of February, 1915, or in the case of holders of second class certificates of service applying for a first class certificate of service, before the 17th day of February 1916.
- 4. Examinations for certificates of competency will be conducted by the Board at such time and place as may from time to time be notified by the Secretary in the Government Gazette and in a newspaper published or circulated in the locality. Each candidate will be duly notified of the time and place of the examination.
- 5. If a candidate shall fail to pass the examination prescribed, he shall not again present himself until a period of not less than three months shall have clapsed from the date of his last examination.
- 6. The examinations may be conducted partly by means of written papers and partly viva voce.
- 7. Every candidate for a certificate shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has had experience as follows:—
 - (a) For a first class certificate of competency as mining manager—five years' practical mining

- ·(e) The Board will accept as evidence of satisfactory practical mining experience under (a) and (c)—
 - (i.) The degree of bachelor of mining engineering, University of Melbourne, two years.
 - (ii.) The diploma of mining engineering of any School of Mines or Technical School approved by the Board, two years.
- (f) For a certificate of competency as battery manager—one year in charge of works, or under a competent manager.
- (g) For a certificate of competency as cyanide works' manager—one year in charge of works, or under a competent manager.

 (h) For a certificate of competency as chlorination works' manager—one year in charge of works, or under a competent manager.
- 8. Every candidate shall produce to the Board testimonials in proof of the nature and extent of his practimomais in proof of the nature and extent of his practi-cal experience, sobriety, and general good character, and stating that he is not subject to any mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties, such testimonials to be signed by his pre-vious employers, and, in the case of a registered com-pany, by the legal manager or chairman of directors of the company.
- 9. Every candidate for a certificate shall make a statutory declaration that the testimonials he produces are genuine and true and correct in every particular; such declaration, together with copies of the testimonials produced to be retained by the Board. The original testimonials must be produced as well as copies, but the originals will be returned after perusal.
- 10. If a candidate attempt to obtain a certificate by means of false testimonials, he shall forfeit his application fee, and shall not be allowed to again present himself for examination until a period of two years has elapsed from the date of his last appearance before the
- 11. No person shall be eligible for a certificate under these regulations unless he has attained the age speci-fied in the following schedule:—
 - (a) For a first class certificate of competency or of service as mining manager—25 years.
 (b) For a second class certificate of competency or
- (b) For a second class certificate of competency or of service as mining manager—23 years.

 (c) For a certificate of competency as battery manager—21 years.

 (d) For a certificate of competency as cyanide works' manager—21 years.

 (e) For a certificate of competency as chlorination works' manager—21 years.

 12. The fees to be paid by an applicant for a certicate shall be as follows:—

 (a) Fee to be lodged with the application for a first class certificate of competency as mining manager—21.
 - (a) Fee to be longed with the application of a dirst class certificate of competency as mining manager—11.

 (b) Fee to be lodged with the application for a second class certificate of competency as mining manager, for any certificate of service, for any certificate issued without examination other than a certificate of service or for a certificate of competency as battery manager, cyanide works' manager, or chlorination works' manager—10s.

 (c) Additional fee to be paid after examination on the granting of a first class certificate of competency as mining manager—21.

 (d) Additional fee to be paid after examination on the granting of a second class certificate of competency as mining manager—21.

 (d) Additional fee to be paid after examination on the granting of a second class certificate of competency as mining manager or as battery manager, cyanide works' manager, or chlorination works' manager—10s.

 (e) Fee to be paid for a copy of a certificate—5s.

 (f) Fee to be paid for a reciprocal certificate—5s.
- 13. If in any case the Board does not deem as satis-13. If in any case the board does not deem as sans-factory the evidence submitted by a candidate as re-quired by the Regulations, it shall refuse to allow such candidate to present himself for examination, or to issue a certificate to such candidate. This will not dis-qualify him in any later application he may make to the Board.
- 14. The Board shall grant a certificate of competency to any person who has complied with Regulations 7, 8, 11, and 12, and who shall produce to the Board a certificate of having passed the requisite examinations from and under the seal of any School of Mines or educational institution whose curriculum, training, and subjects for and mode of examination are approved by the said Board, and every such certificate shall state that it is issued on the certificate of a School of Mines or educational institution approved by the Board, and also the name of such school or institution.

15. Every holder of a certificate as second class mining manager under these Regulations must produce such to the Board previous to his being granted a higher certificate, and such certificate shall be surrendered and delivered up to the Board.

16. Whenever any person proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he has, without fault on his part, lost or been deprived of any certificate previously granted to him under these Regulations, such Board may, on payment of the fee specified in Regulation 12 (e) cause a copy of the certificate to which the applicant appears to be entitled to be made out and certified to by the Secretary to the Board and delivered to the applicant, and any copy so made and certified to, as aforesaid, shall have the effect of the original certificate. The fee herein referred to shall be paid to the Secretary for Mines in cash or post-office order, and shall by him be paid into the Consolidated Revenue.

17. Any person holding a certificate under these Regulations and who is charged with any offence or misconduct likely to be detrimental to the efficient discharge of his duties, may render himself liable to have his certificate altered, suspended, or cancelled by the Board.

SYLLABUS OF SUBJECTS FOR EXAMINATION.

18. Mining Managers: First Class Competency.—Candidates for examination for a first class certificate of competency as mining manager must pass in all the following subjects under the heading of Group "A," and also in all the subjects of one at least of Groups "B" and "C." depending upon the certificate applied for and the nature of the practical experience. The details specified are intended to serve merely as a guide to candidates:—

Group "A."-General.

* Arithmetic.--Elementary rules and simple mensuration.

Surveying.—Construction, adjustment and use of instruments, theodolite, dumpy level, miner's dial, compass, elinometer, optical square, chain, barometer, and thermometer.

Ranging of lines, traversing with prismatic compass and theodolite. Checking by use of latitude and departure tables and logarithms. Reduction and location. Computing bearing and distance between two points connected by survey.

Booking by various methods. Plotting the survey.

Levelling and earthwork—reduction of staff readings from levelling book; plotting contour lines; preparing longitudinal and cross sections; measurement of earthwork.

Calculating areas of squares, rectangles, triangles, circles.

Obtaining areas of figures with irregular boundaries by planimeter and by plotting and scaling.

Determination of the true meridian (simple methods), declination of the needle, dip and local attraction.

Mine surveying—survey of vertical and inclined shafts and mine workings. Connexion of underground and surface survey.

Mining problems. Graphical and trigonometrical solution of problems involving dip, strike, pitch and intersection of lodes. Preparation of plans and sections of mine workings; assay plans.

Measurement of ore bodies.

Curves; laying out curves for train lines with chain, and with theodolite and chain.

Mining Geology.—Methods of testing useful minerals. General principles of geology. Knowledge of the more common country rocks. Modes of occurrence of lodes, beds, leads, and other mineral deposits. Location of shafts. Effects of faults.

Mining.—Breaking ground—Description of tools and their use, pick, shovel, hammer, gad, wedges, plug and feathers, auger, rock-drills, channelers, steam navvy. Motive power for tools, steam, compressed air, electricity—their relative advantages. Driving, cross-cutting, rising, and sinking.

Support of excavations; description of timber used in mines, seasoning of timber, dressing of timber, round and square timber, slabs, scantlings, adze, axe, auger, special machinery.

Timbering in firm, loose, and running ground, of walls, adits, chambers, stopes, junction of roads, and working places, underground lines, false sets, and pillars. The various types of square set timbering, substitutes for timbering, e.g., masonry, concrete, iron, steel, &c.

Precautions to be taken when sinking.

Special methods of shaft sinking under difficult conditions.

Ventilation.—The gases met with in mines, determination of quantity and quality of mine air: construction of airways and effect of friction; furnaces and ventilating ampliances: theory and practice of the various methods of ventilation: dust suppression, sanitation.

Machinery.—The principles of action; methods of inspection and testing and the care of winding and pumping machinery, condensing and non-condensing; air compressors, boilers; electrical appliances. The construction and use of safety cages, detaching hooks, apparatus for preventing overwinding, and other safety appliances. The strength of ropes, chains, timber, and other materials.
