By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

REGULATION OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

No. 60.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following Regulation in regard to the qualifications, selection, and examination of candidates for employment as Apprentices, and do hereby repeal all previous regulations relating thereto.

1. Every person desiring to become a candidate for employment as an Apprentice, must prepare, in his own handwriting, an application on the form prescribed, stating that he is an applicant for appointment to one of the vacancies specified in the public notice.

2. The age of each candidate shall be reckoned to the date fixed by the Commissioners for the opening of the applications, and shall not be less than fourteen (14) years nor more than eighteen (18) years, with the exception that every youth at present in the permanent or supernumerary employment of the Commissioners who will not have reached the age of twenty (20) years at the date fixed for the opening of the applications shall be eligible to become a candidate, provided that he has had continuous employment in the service of the Commissioners at least from the date of his eighteenth birthday. The appointment, however, to the position of Apprentice of any such candidate who has had permanent or supernumerary service shall be subject to the following conditions, viz.:-

- (a) That such previous service as a permanent or supernumerary employé, shall not be taken into consideration in determining the period of his apprenticeship; and
- (b) That the wage per day payable to him from year to year, during his term of apprenticeship, shall be at the respective rates prescribed hereunder, irrespective of the wage of which he was in receipt as a permanent or supernumerary employé prior to his appointment as an Apprentice.

3. The rate of pay of every Apprentice shall be as under:-

and thereafter the rate of pay in each case shall be in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in operation for the time being.

4. Any Apprentice who, owing to the requirements of the Department, may be obliged to reside away from his home, shall, in addition to his ordinary rate of pay, be granted an allowance toward his board and lodging expenses during such time as his wage continues to be not more than

5. Every candidate shall confine himself to one application for employment, and shall enclose such application in an envelope, which must be properly addressed, duly stamped, and posted, so that it will reach the Acting Secretary for Railways (hereinafter referred to as the "Secretary"), Spencer-street, Melbourne, not later than the time fixed by the Commissioners for opening and dealing with such applications.

6. Every candidate shall furnish with his application a certified extract from the register of his birth. In the case, however, of a candidate born outside of the State of Victoria, a statutory declaration by one of his parents or by a near elder relative as to the date of his birth will be accepted as temporary evidence of age; but every such candidate who is selected will be required to take immediate steps to obtain an official Birth Certificate from the State or country in which he was born.

7. Every candidate who has at any time been employed in any capacity in the Railway Department or in the Public Service, whether as a permanent or supernumerary employé, shall furnish particulars with his application as to the period of such employment, and, if he has left such service, the cause of his leaving.

8. Any person who has been dismissed from the Railway Department or the Public Service, or whose employment has been terminated for cause, or who has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanour, whether before or after selection or examination, shall not be eligible for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

9. The Secretary shall on the day and at the hour named in the public notice, proceed to open the applications, and shall cause the name and address of the writer of each of such applications to be then and there registered in a book provided for that purpose, hereinafter called the "Register," and a consecutive number, commencing with the number one, shall be placed in the Register opposite the name of each candidate.

10. The candidates, if not more than twice the number of Apprentices to be employed, shall thereupon be subject to the course of procedure, and the conditions, defined in Clauses 16 to 24 inclusive of this Regulation.

11. The candidates, if more than twice the number of Apprentices to be employed, shall be reduced by a Board of Selectors (which shall be

appointed within seven days prior to the date fixed for the selection) to a number equivalent to twice the number to be employed.

12. The members of the Board of Selectors shall not be informed of, nor acquaint themselves with, the names of the applicants, or any of them; and any candidate who either directly or indirectly attempts to influence any Member of the Board of Selectors in favour of himself, or in favour of or against any other candidate, shall be for ever disqualified for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

13. Every candidate shall be notified in writing by the Secretary of the place and time at which he shall present himself to the Board of Selectors.

14. Every candidate, immediately before presenting himself to the Board of Selectors, shall be furnished by the Secretary with a card bearing a number, by which number alone he shall be known to the Board of Selectors.

15. A list of the names of the candidates selected by the Board of Selectors shall be compiled and certified to by the Board of Selectors, and every candidate whose name has been enrolled on such list shall be entitled to present himself for examination by the Railways Medical Officer.

16. Every such candidate shall pass an examination by the Railways Medical Officer, and for such examination shall pay a fee of 5s.

17. Every such candidate shall, if certified as free from any physical infirmity, and as up to the standard prescribed in respect of vision, colour-sense; and hearing, present himself for an examination by the Educational Examiners duly appointed for that purpose at such time and place as may be notified to him by the Secretary.

18. Every such candidate shall be required by the Examiners to pass an educational examination equivalent to the examination prescribed for the State School Exemption Certificate.

19. Every such candidate shall produce to the Educational Examiners satisfactory written testimony that he is of respectable character; and shall furnish the name or names of any person or persons or firms with whom he may have been employed during the preceding two years, and every such candidate who has had previous employment in the service of the Commissioners shall produce a statement of such service and a certificate of competency and good conduct from the Head of the particular Branch in which he is or may have been employed.

20. The Educational Examiners shall thereupon examine the selected candidates who have passed the physical, &c., examination, at such time and place as may be notified to such candidates respectively.

21. The Educational Examiners shall, immediately after the completion of the examination, forward to the Secretary the examination papers of every candidate so examined, together with a certificate as prescribed hereunder:—

We, the undersigned duly appointed Examiners under the "Railways Acts," do hereby certify that on the * 191, we examined † for the position of _____ in the _____ Branch, and allotted him _____ marks, and accordingly certify that he is ‡ for such employment.

Examiners.

22. After examination by the Educational Examiners the successful candidates, if not in excess of the number of Apprentices required, will be employed forthwith, and their relative seniority for future promotion, &c., shall be determined by a ballot conducted in the manner prescribed hereunder; but if in excess of the number required, they shall be called together at a place and time of which due notice shall be sent them in writing, and shall then and there in the presence of the Secretary draw lots in accordance with the following method to determine the order of precedence in which their names shall be recorded for appointment, viz. :—

Two ballot boxes shall be provided, numbered 1 and 2 respectively, in each of which shall be deposited as many numbers in arithmetical progression, commencing with the number one, as shall correspond with the number of successful candidates.

Every such candidate shall then draw first from No. 1 box, and afterwards from No. 2 box in the numerical order ascertained by the drawing from No. 1 box. For instance, the candidate drawing No. 4 out of No. 1 box shall be the fourth in order for drawing out of No. 2 box, and the number drawn from No. 2 box shall fix his order of precedence for appointment, and in the event of two or more such candidates being appointed on the same day such drawing shall, all other things being equal, determine the relative seniority of each candidate for future promotion, &c.

23. Every successful candidate in excess of the number of Apprentices required by the Commissioners shall, in the order so decided, be eligible for appointment during the twelve months next ensuing from the date of the ballot without further or other examination.

24. Every appointment shall be on probation for a period of six months, and at the expiration of that period the appointment may be confirmed by the Commissioners, provided that the conduct, capacity, and industry of the probationer whilst in the service of the Commissioners have been satisfactory. No probationer, however, shall have his appointment confirmed until he has effected in one of the prescribed Life Assurance Companies an assurance of his life in accordance with the regulations of the Commissioners.

25. Every appointment shall be made on the distinct understanding that the services of the employé shall without previous notice be liable to be dispensed with either during or after the period of probation, or either during or after the period of apprenticeship, and without his having any claim whatsoever against the Commissioners if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

26. Every Apprentice shall, immediately after appointment, attend the classes of instruction at the Working Men's College appertaining to the trade to which he may be apprenticed, or such other classes as the Commissioners may direct, at such hours of the day and night as may be prescribed during the complete course of training, which, subject to the provisions of Clause 32, shall continue until the end of the year 1918.

27. Every Apprentice shall provide the books, drawing instruments, &c., required at the College at his own expense, but the Commissioners will

pay the College fees, as well as the wages of the Apprentice for such portion of the ordinary hours of duty as he may be required to be in attendance at the College.

28. Every Apprentice shall present himself for such examinations as may be prescribed at the College, and shall pass in proper sequence the examinations for each year of such course, and, in addition, shall do satisfactory work and be of good conduct in the service of the Commissioners.

29. Subject to good conduct, regular attendance, zeal, and industry in the service of the Commissioners, the Apprentices who each year of the three-years' period of tuition at the Working Men's College may be adjudged first and second in order of merit and as possessing the highest qualifications amongst all Apprentices who are pursuing the course applicable to the particular year, shall be awarded the prizes applicable to their particular trades as specified in Clause 30 of this regulation, provided that they obtain not less than 75 per cent. of the possible marks.

30. The prizes shall be allotted in the following manner, viz. :—

First Year—

The two Apprentices who may be adjudged first and second in order of merit shall be awarded prizes of £5 and £3 respectively.

Second Year—

(a) The two Apprentices amongst those apprenticed to the trades of Blacksmith, Boilermaker, Moulder, and such other trades as may hereafter be determined, who may be adjudged first and second in order of merit shall be awarded prizes of £5 and £3 respectively.

(b) The two Apprentices amongst those apprenticed to the trades of Painter, Sailmaker, Upholsterer, Wood Machinist, and such other trades as may hereafter be determined, who may be adjudged first and second in order of merit shall be awarded prizes of £3 and £2 respectively.

Third Year—

(a) The Apprentice amongst those apprenticed to the trades of Blacksmith, Boilermaker, Moulder, and such other trades as may hereafter be determined, who may be adjudged first in order of merit shall be nominated as a Student in either Electrical or Mechanical Engineering (as may be determined by the Commissioners), and the Apprentice adjudged second in order of merit shall be awarded a prize of £5.

(b) The two Apprentices amongst those apprenticed to the trades of Painter, Sailmaker, Upholsterer, Wood Machinist, and such other trades as may hereafter be determined, who may be adjudged first and second in order of merit shall be awarded prizes of £3 and £2 respectively.

31. The Apprentice who is nominated as a Student in either Electrical or Mechanical Engineering shall be afforded facilities to attend for two years the full day course at the Working Men's College, and any such Apprentice who passes the prescribed examination and gains a diploma of the College in respect thereof shall thereafter be employed by the Commissioners as an Engineering Assistant. During such course of two years the College fees will be paid by the Commissioners, and in lieu of wages the Apprentice shall be paid at the rate of £7 per month.

32. Any Apprentice who fails to pass either the First or Second Year Course, after having studied such course for one year, will be allowed a second year in which to qualify in such course, and shall attend such additional night classes as may be deemed necessary by the Commissioners, and shall pay the fees imposed in respect of such classes, and any Apprentice who fails to pass either the First or the Second Year Course after having studied such course for two years, or who is adjudged guilty of continual, frequent, or repeated misconduct at the College, or to have neglected to make a proper effort to qualify in the work at the College, will render himself liable to the immediate termination of his services, and shall not have any claim if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

33. The term of tuition at the College at the expense of the Department shall in every instance be limited to the period specified in Clause 26, and any apprentice who fails to complete the Course of Instruction within that period, and who desires to continue his studies, shall be required to pay the fees therefor, and will not be allowed to absent himself from duty during working hours for the purpose of attending the College.

34. The term of apprenticeship shall be five years, and each year thereof shall be deemed to mean three hundred and thirteen (313) working days, and shall be inclusive of any proclaimed holidays on which the Work-shops may be closed, and any annual recreation leave of absence, as well as any other leave of absence which may be allowed for any cause whatsoever, provided that such other leave of absence does not during the five years exceed sixty-five working days in the aggregate. In the event, however, of such other leave of absence to any Apprentice during the five years exceeding sixty-five working days in the aggregate, the term of his apprenticeship shall be extended beyond the five years for a period equivalent to the period of such excess leave of absence.

- (a) The residence of such pupil shall be beyond 4 miles of the school which he is attending;
- (c) the total amount, as evidenced by a statutory declaration on a prescribed form, of the net profits, income, and emoluments received by the parents or guardians of such pupil during the preceding year shall be less than £150.

WHEREAS by notice in writing dated the 15th day of February 1915 and duly served upon the councils of the borough of Carisbrook and the borough of Majorca and of the Shire of Tullaroop respectively on or about the 16th day of February 1915 the Honorable Frederick William Hagelthorn His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works in and for the State of Victoria and the Minister of the Crown of the said State for the time being administering the Local Government Acts of the same (hereinafter referred to as the "Minister") notified such councils of his intention to proceed to obtain an Order uniting such boroughs to the shire of Tullaroop the municipal district of which together with that of the said boroughs form one continuous area by reason (as the case in fact is) of the territory of the said boroughs respectively not containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof estimated under the provisions of the Local Government Acts a sum of Three hundred pounds particulars of which notice were published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th day of February aforesaid and respectively in three consecutive issues of the *Argus* a newspaper generally circulating in Melbourne and the *Maryborough Standard* a newspaper generally circulating in the several municipalities of Carisbrook Majorca and Tullaroop (that is to say in the *Argus* of the 17th 18th and 19th of February 1915 and in the *Maryborough Standard* on the 18th 20th and 23rd of the same month): And whereas the said Minister has given to the councils of the municipalities of Carisbrook Majorca and Tullaroop (no creditor of either of them within the period of three months from the 23rd day of February now last past or at all having notified the Minister of his or its desire so to do) full opportunity of showing cause why an Order in Council uniting the borough of Carisbrook and the borough of Majorca to the shire of Tullaroop should not be passed: And whereas the Minister having entertained inquiries into and decided upon all the representations made by or on behalf of such councils respectively has recommended that the borough of Carisbrook and the borough of Majorca should as on and from the first day of October now next be united to the shire of Tullaroop and become part of the same and that the territory of the said boroughs should thenceforth form portion of the Tullaroop Shire by being constituted a separate riding thereof: And whereas such recommendation has been duly considered and approved: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State being satisfied that all conditions precedent to the making hereof have been fulfilled and observed and acting under the authority conferred by the *Local Government Acts Amendment Act 1914* and under all other powers him enabling in that behalf doth hereby order and direct as follows (that is to say):—

1. That on and from the first day of October now next the borough of Carisbrook incorporated under the style or title of "The Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Carisbrook" and the borough of Majorca incorporated under the style or title of "The Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Majorca" shall by virtue of these presents be and become united with the shire of Tullaroop incorporated under the style or title of "The President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Tullaroop" and that thereupon and thenceforward the territory constituting the said boroughs with the territory constituting the said shire shall together form one shire the boundaries of which are set out and defined in the First Schedule hereto with the assigned name of the "Tullaroop Shire" and that the inhabitants thereof shall be and become incorporated under the style or title of "The President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Tullaroop."

2. That from and after union the new shire of Tullaroop shall consist of four separate Ridings namely the North Riding, the East Riding, the West Riding, and the Borough Riding which several Ridings shall have the boundaries set forth and described in the Second Schedule hereto under their respective names.
3. For the purpose of the annual election to be held next after the 1st day of October 1915 and of the government of the municipality constituted by the union but without prejudice to the operation of the provisions of section 24 of the *Local Government Act 1903* it is hereby declared that the council of the new shire of Tullaroop will in accordance with the terms of section 11 of the said Act consist of twelve members being produced by three councillors being returned by each of the four Ridings into which the new shire is by this Order divided.

which are set out and defined in the First Schedule hereto with the assigned name of the "Grenville Shire" and that the inhabitants thereof shall be and become incorporated under the style or title of "The President Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Grenville."

2. - That on and from the first day of October now next the Shire of Epping incorporated under the style or title of the "President Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Epping" shall by virtue of these presents be and become united with the Shire of Whittlesea incorporated under the style or title of the "President Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Whittlesea" and that thereupon and thenceforward the territory constituting the said Shire of Epping with the territory constituting the said Shire of Whittlesea shall together form one shire the boundaries of which are set out and defined in the First Schedule hereto with the assigned name of the "Whittlesea Shire" and that the inhabitants thereof shall be and become incorporated under the style or title of the "President Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Whittlesea."
- That from and after union the new Shire of Whittlesea shall consist of four separate ridings namely the Whittlesea Riding the Yan Yean Riding the Morang Riding and the Epping Riding which several ridings shall have the boundaries set forth and described in the Second Schedule hereto under the respective names.

- For the purpose of the annual election to be held next after the 1st day of October 1915 and of the government of the municipality constituted by the union but without prejudice to the operation of the provisions of section 24 of the *Local Government Act 1903* it is hereby declared that the council of the new Shire of Whittlesea will in accordance with the terms of section 11 of the said Act consist of twelve members being produced by three councillors being returned by each of the four ridings into which the new shire is by this Order divided.

For the purposes of the annual election to be held next after the 1st day of October 1915 and of the government of the municipality constituted by the union without prejudice to the operation of the provisions of section 24 of the *Local Government Act 1903* it is hereby declared that the council of the new shire of Glenlyon will in accordance with the terms of section 11 of the said Act consist of twelve members being produced by three councillors being returned by each of the four ridings into which the new shire is by this Order divided.

WHEREAS by notice in writing dated the 15th day of February 1915 to and duly served upon the councils of the borough of Raywood and of the shire of Marong respectively on or about the 16th day of February 1915 the Honorable Frederick William Hagelthorn His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works in and for the State of Victoria and the Minister of the

Crown of the said State for the time being administering the Local Government Acts of the same (hereinafter referred to as the "Minister") notified such councils of his intention to proceed to obtain an Order uniting such borough to the shire of Marong the municipal district of which together with that of the said borough form one continuous area by reason (as the case in fact is) of the territory of the said borough not containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof estimated under the provisions of the Local Government Acts a sum of Three hundred pounds particulars of which notice were published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th day of February aforesaid and respectively in three consecutive issues of the *Age* a newspaper generally circulating in Melbourne and the *Bendigo Advertiser* a newspaper generally circulating in the several municipalities of Raywood Borough and Marong Shire (that is to say in the *Age* of the 17th, 18th and 19th of February 1915 and in the *Bendigo Advertiser* on the 18th, 19th and 20th of the same month): And whereas the said Minister has given to the councils of the municipalities of Raywood Borough and Marong Shire (no creditor of either of them within the period of three months from the 20th day of February now last past or at all having notified the Minister of his or its desire so to do) full opportunity of showing cause why an Order in Council uniting the borough of Raywood to the shire of Marong should not be passed: And whereas the Minister having entertained inquiries into and decided upon all the representations made by or on behalf of such councils respectively has recommended that the borough of Raywood should as on and from the first day of October now next be united to the shire of Marong and become part of the same and that the territory of the said borough should thenceforth form portion of the Marong Shire and such territory shall also form part of the North-East Riding of the said shire: And whereas such recommendation has been duly considered and approved: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State being satisfied that all conditions being precedent to the making hereof have been fulfilled and observed and acting under the authority conferred by the *Local Government Acts Amendment Act 1914* and under all other powers him enabling in that behalf doth hereby order and direct as follows (that is to say):—

1. That on and from the first day of October now next the borough of Raywood incorporated under the style or title of the "Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Raywood" shall by virtue of these presents be and become united with the shire of Marong incorporated under the style or title of "The President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Marong" and that thereupon and thenceforward the territory constituting the said borough with the territory constituting the said shire shall together form one shire the boundaries of which are set out and defined in the First Schedule hereto with the assigned name of "The Marong Shire" and that the inhabitants thereof shall be and become incorporated under the style or title of "The President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Marong."
2. That from and after union the new shire of Marong shall consist of three separate Ridings namely the South Riding the North-East Riding and the North-West Riding, which several Ridings shall have the boundaries set forth and described in the Second Schedule hereto under their respective names.
3. For the purpose of the annual election to be held next after the 1st day of October 1915 and of the government of the municipality constituted by the union but without prejudice to the operation of the provisions of section 24 of the *Local Government Act 1903* it is hereby declared that the council of the new shire of Marong will in accordance with the terms of section 11 of the said Act consist of nine members being produced by three councillors being returned by each of the three Ridings into which the new shire is by this Order divided.

WHEREAS by the Tramways Act 1890 it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except in the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge), when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the council of the municipality in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Tramways Act 1890 was amended by the Melbourne to Burwood Tramways Act 1914, No. 2488, extending the powers contained in the Tramways Act 1890, so as to allow of tramways being constructed within the cities of Melbourne, Richmond, Hawthorn, and Camberwell: And whereas the Hawthorn Tramways Trust in pursuance with the powers vested in it under the provisions of the Melbourne to Burwood Tramways Act 1914, No. 2488, has now made application in accordance with the said Acts and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal districts of the municipalities of the cities of Melbourne, Richmond, Hawthorn, and Camberwell: And whereas the Governor in Council being satisfied that the requirements of the said Acts and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said Trust and that notice of the intention of the said Trust to make the said application in which notice the route proposed to be followed was described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the said Acts in that behalf, and that no objection to the said application has been lodged within the time provided in the said Rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting with by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following (that is to say):—

That the Hawthorn Tramways Trust shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the municipal districts of the cities of Melbourne, Richmond, Hawthorn, and Camberwell.

ROUTE.

Commencing at the intersection of Boundary-road and Norwood-road, in the municipal district of the city of Camberwell, and proceeding westerly along Norwood-road to Camberwell-road; thence north-westerly along Camberwell-road to Burke-road, in the municipal district of the city of Camberwell; thence westerly along Riversdale-road, in the municipal district of the city of Hawthorn, to Power-street; thence northerly along Power-street to Wallen-road; thence westerly along Wallen-road across a bridge over the Yarra Yarra River to Swan-street, in the municipal district of the city of Richmond, to Punt-road; thence westerly along Batman-avenue (late Yarra Bank-road), in the municipal district of the city of Melbourne, to St. Kilda-road.

GAUGE.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be four feet eight and one-half inches (4 ft. 8½ in.), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from 1 to 16 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications, except in so far as the same may be varied by these presents, are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order; and to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

MOTIVE POWER.

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be electricity.

MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway, with hand-brake equipment on the cars, shall be at the rate of 15 miles per hour, and with magnetic, air, or other approved power-brakes and life guards, the maximum speed shall be at the rate of 20 miles per hour.

TIME OF COMPLETION.

That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic within a period of two (2) years from the date of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of the tramway.

TRAFFIC.

That the tramway shall be used for the carriage of passengers and such parcels or packages as they may have in their possession

NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the Hawthorn Tramways Trust.

STOPPAGES FOR TAKING UP AND SETTING DOWN PASSENGERS.

That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of such streets as are indicated by notice-boards or other sufficient devices erected at such intersections to be stopping points, and at such other points upon the route of the tramway as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the charges to be made upon the said tramway shall be One penny for each passenger on each of the following sections or part thereof:—

- (a) From Prince's-bridge to Richmond Railway Station.
- (b) From Melbourne Cricket Ground entrance on Swan-street to intersection of Burnley and Swan streets.
- (c) From Richmond Railway Station to corner of Wallen-road and Power-street.
- (d) From Burnley-street to Glenferrie-road.
- (e) From corner of Wallen-road and Power-street to Auburn-road.
- (f) From Glenferrie-road to Burke-road.
- (g) From Auburn-road to Bowen-street, Camberwell.
- (h) From Burke-road to Hartwell Hill-road.
- (i) From Bowen street to the intersection of Camberwell and Norwood roads.
- (j) From the intersection of Camberwell and Norwood roads to Boundary-road.

CONTINUOUS SECTIONS.

That the charge to be made for continuous section shall be—

- From Glenferrie-road to the Melbourne Cricket Ground, 2d.;
From Prince's-bridge to the terminus at Boundary-road, 5d.;

and for each child under twelve (12) years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), a fare of Three-pence (3d.).

For each child under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), One penny for any one of the above sections, or for any two continuous sections; provided, however, that for any one or more sections the fare to be charged for two children travelling together under the age of twelve years shall not exceed the fare charged for one adult.

With power to the Trust to make a charge of Two pence (2d.) for a continuous journey over any three continuous sections of the said tramway, or *vice versa*, and for each child under twelve (12) years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), a fare of One penny for any three continuous sections referred to.

With power to the Trust to make a charge of Three-pence (3d.) for a continuous journey over any four continuous sections of the said tramway, or *vice versa*, and for each child under twelve (12) years of age (other

SPECIAL TICKETS TO SCHOOL CHILDREN.

That the charge to be made for return tickets to school children under the age of eighteen years over any two sections shall be One penny, for any four sections Twopence, and for any six sections Threepence, subject to such conditions as to the days on and the hours between which such return tickets shall be available as the Trust may by regulations determine, also in such regulations to limit the right of travel in respect of such return tickets to a portion only of the car.

SPECIAL TICKETS TO STUDENTS ATTENDING TECHNICAL COLLEGES.

That the charge to be made for students up to 21 years of age attending technical colleges and training classes shall be one-half of the ordinary fare chargeable upon such tramway.

MINIMUM OR THROUGH FARES FOR ANY SPECIFIED DISTANCE.

That power is hereby given to the Trust to run cars at minimum or through fares upon the said tramway for any specified distance, provided that the amount of such minimum or through fare shall not exceed the total sum of the sectional fares upon such tramway or such parts of such tramway over which the cars shall be run. Every such car shall have a notice or notices plainly exhibited on the outside of such car indicating its destination and the minimum fare chargeable thereon.

SPECIAL CARS.

That the charge to be made—

- (1) For the hire of a special car, with a seating capacity not exceeding thirty-six persons, 1s. 6d. per car mile between the hours of 6 a.m. and midnight, and 2s. 6d. per car mile after midnight.
- (2) For the hire of a special car, with a seating capacity exceeding thirty-six persons, 2s. 6d. per car mile between 6 a.m. and midnight, and 3s. 6d. per car mile after midnight. The car mileage shall be the mileage run by the car from the time of its leaving the depot until its return thereto. Provided always, however, that a minimum charge of £1 1s. may be made for the hiring of any special car between 6.30 a.m. and midnight, and £2 2s. between midnight and 1 a.m., and the sum of 5s. per hour per car for detention during the journey for which such special car is hired.

FARES IN CASE OF COMBINED TRAM AND RAILWAY PASSENGERS.

Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Trust from entering into any arrangement with the Railways Commissioners to sell through tickets to travel over both tramway and railway, and in that case charging or providing for the payment of fares at a lower rate than those specified in this Order in respect of passengers travelling over both tramway and railway.

TRAMWAY WHERE PASSING UNDER THE CAMBERWELL RAILWAY LINE AT RICHMOND AND THE OUTER CIRCLE RAILWAY LINE AT BURWOOD.

That in respect of the tramway passing under the Swan-street railway bridge at Richmond and the Norwood-road railway bridge at Burwood any wires and other attachments which require to be fixed to the bridges shall be so fixed and subsequently maintained at the expense of the Trust and to the satisfaction of the Commissioners.

TRAMWAY WHERE PASSING OVER THE CAMBERWELL RAILWAY LINE AT BURNLEY.

(a) That the tramway upon so much of the route as crosses the railway line from Melbourne to Camberwell by the overhead bridge at Swan-street, near Burnley, shall be constructed in such a manner as may be determined by the Victorian Railways Commissioners to meet railway requirements.

(b) That all costs and expenses of and incidental to the laying and maintaining of the tramway, including overhead equipment on and over the said bridge and the approaches thereto, including the cost of any structural alterations, shall be paid and borne by the Trust.

COST OF ALTERATION TO POSTAL WIRES INCIDENTAL TO USE OF ELECTRICITY.

In the event of the Postal Department demanding any special alteration of its wires in consequence of the introduction of a high-tension or other electrical cur-

rent in connexion with the tramway, the cost of any special arrangement of or provision for the wires because of such current shall be paid and borne by the Trust.

ELECTRIC WIRES CROSSING LINES OF RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS TO BE CONSTRUCTED SO AS NOT TO INTERFERE.

Any electric line or lines in connexion with the said tramway which would cross under or over any wire of the Commissioners, or which would, in the opinion of the Commissioners, be in a position likely, if special precautions be not taken, to prejudicially affect the operation of the trains when electrified, or the maintenance of telegraphic or telephonic communication, or the transmission of signals on adjacent wires of the Commissioners, shall, to the satisfaction of and without any expense to the Commissioners, be so placed, constructed, guarded, and maintained as not to be capable, in the opinion of the Commissioners, of injuring or coming into contact with any wire of the Commissioners, or of prejudicially affecting or interfering, either mechanically or electrically with the proper use of any such wire.

GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with, or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order, and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the *Tramways Act 1890*, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If upon report to the Governor in Council by the referee, made under the said clause 25 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Hawthorn Tramways Trust shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the Hawthorn Tramways Trust finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than that provided for in this Order, the said Trust shall take upon itself all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government, or upon the Board of Land and Works, for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure, or to provide funds therefor.

And the Honorable James George Membrey, for and on behalf of His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RACING, RECREATION, AND PUBLIC PARK PURPOSES KNOWN AS THE CAULFIELD RACE-COURSE.

WE, William Pitt, George Woodforde, James Grice, Herbert Power, Norman Wilson, Herbert Edward MacDowell, Arthur Dunbar, Thomas Edward King, Percival St. John Hall, and Hugh Thomson, being a majority of the duly appointed trustees of the land and premises, being allotments A and B, in the parish of Prabran, county of Bourke, the subject-matter of a Crown grant dated the 31st day of August, 1888, and known as the Caulfield Racecourse Reserve, have in the exercise of the powers conferred on us by the said Crown grant and by the *Land Act* 1901, and of any and every other power enabling us so to do, made the following Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

XXI(A). On any day on which a race meeting is held any person who, in the opinion of the Committee of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club in any of the divisions of the said land as set out in Regulation 2 of these Regulations—

- (a) behaves in a riotous, indecent, offensive, threatening, or insulting manner; or
- (b) uses any threatening, abusive, or insulting words,

or any person who has been convicted in a court of competent jurisdiction of any of the offences set out in (a) and (b) of this Regulation on the said land, may be refused entrance to the said land, and may be expelled therefrom after being warned off by or on behalf of the Committee of the said Club, notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission to the said land, and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the said land or any part thereof.

No person who after having been informed of the decision of the said Committee to refuse the said person admission to the said land under the power given by this Regulation shall enter the said land or remain on the said land or any part thereof.

XXI(B). On any day on which a race meeting is held any person who, in the opinion of the Committee of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club, is not a desirable person to be admitted, shall not be admitted to any of the divisions of the said land as set out in Regulation 2 of these Regulations, and may be expelled therefrom after having been warned off by or on behalf of the said Committee, notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the said land or any part thereof.

Any person who has been proved, to the satisfaction of the Committee of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club, to be a defaulter in payment of any bets, or to have been guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connexion with racing, or who has been disqualified by virtue of any Rules of Racing under which the said Club races, may be warned off the said land or any part or division thereof by the said Committee or by any person duly authorized by the said Committee

in that behalf, notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission or is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the said land or any part thereof.

PENALTIES.

Every person offending against any of the above Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the trustees or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such officer or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

THE land is situated from 4 to 10 mines north from Manangatang Railway Station.



Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE JAM TRADE BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of—

Manufacturing jam, fruit jelly, pickles and sauces, or

- (a) preparing, canning, or preserving lemon or other peel, fruit, or vegetables ;
- (b) preparing or putting up any of such articles for sale,

has made the following Determination, namely :—

APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

"Apprentice" means any person under twenty-one years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over twenty-one years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship.

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over twenty-one years of age, or who, being over twenty-one years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver.
