PROCLAMATION

"An Act to facilitate the Execution of Instruments and Powers of Attorney during the present War."

"An Act to make provision for Extending the Date of Redemption of Government Securities."

WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the *Country Roads Act 1912* (Act No. 2415) has represented to the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the deviation hereinafter referred to from the existing Main Neerim-road "C" in the shire of Buln Buln (declared to be a main road under the said Act which declaration was confirmed by the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-sixth day of May One thousand nine hundred and fifteen on page 1865) should be made by the said Board. And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said cited Act has caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said deviation is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation. And whereas on an inspection of the said map and plan and a consideration of the said estimate the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation. WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1086)*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind clauses 22 and 23 of Regulation XXI.—Scholarships—and make the following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION XXI.—SCHOLARSHIPS.

E.—Senior Technical Scholarships.

22. Fifty senior technical scholarships, or any less number, shall be awarded annually to candidates who have been in regular attendance for at least two years, at junior technical schools, technical schools, evening continuation classes, higher elementary classes, higher elementary schools, district high schools, or registered secondary schools, of which—

- Twenty shall be open to boys, and shall be tenable for the full length of approved day courses in technical schools, and shall entitle the holders to free tuition and to an allowance of £30 per annum;
- ten shall be open to girls, and shall be tenable for the full length of approved day courses, and shall entitle the holders to free tuition and to an allowance of £30 per annum;
- twenty shall be open to boys in employment, and shall be tenable for the full length of approved evening courses, and shall entitle the holders to free tuition and to an allowance of £10 per annum.

23. Senior technical scholarships under clause 22 above shall be tenable under the following conditions, namely:—

- (a) That the scholar shall become, at the commencement, or as soon as possible after the commencement, of the first term, and thereafter during the currency of the scholarship shall remain a student in an approved technical school;
- (b) that the scholar shall obtain satisfactory reports as to his attendance, conduct, and progress from the principal or director of the school he is attending;
- (c) that the scholar shall be recommended annually by the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools for a continuance of his scholarship;
- (d) that holders of scholarships in evening courses shall be in employment in the same kind of work as that in which the scholarship is granted.

And the Honorable T. Livingston, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE
CARISBROOK BOROUGH COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 3rd day of September, 1888, the managers of the Carisbrook Borough Common, having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miner's rights, business licences or carrier's licences, and farmers residing within 5 miles from the Common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle.

2. Holders of miner's rights, business licences, or carrier's licences shall produce their respective miner's rights, business or carrier's licences, to the managers of the Common for inspection immediately prior to requiring their stock to be registered, otherwise the managers may refuse registration.

3. No person shall depasture stock on the Common of which he is not the *bonâ fide* owner.

4. The managers of the Common shall be at liberty to appoint certain times and places for the registration or renewing registration of such stock, and shall give due notice thereof; and the herdsman shall attend at such times and places for the purpose aforesaid. Every person entitled to commonage shall before depasturing any stock on the Common give to the herdsman thereof a true and correct description of such stock and their brands or other distinctive marks, and shall obtain from the herdsman a certificate to that effect, and after having paid the prescribed commonage fees shall obtain from the herdsman the necessary number of badges and chains, which shall be at all times the absolute property of the managers. Every such person shall then be responsible and liable to be charged for stock equivalent to the number of badges and chains from the time of receiving such badges and chains until they are returned to the herdsman.

No person shall use other than the authorized or registered badge and chain in connexion with stock legally depasturing on the Common. In addition to the fee for

depasturing stock the sum of One shilling shall be paid to the herdsman at the time of registration for the hire of each badge and chain, but should any person cease to depasture stock on the Common the amount paid for each badge and chain shall be refunded to such person, provided the badge and chain be returned to the herdsman in good order and condition. Should any badge be from any cause removed or lost from any stock, every such badge so removed or lost shall be at once replaced by a new badge at the sole expense of the owner of the stock, and the sum of One shilling shall be paid to the herdsman for such extra badge, but no refund shall be made by the managers for any badge removed or lost.

No person shall place or allow to be placed or remain on any stock on the Common a lost badge or one removed from another animal without the authority of the herdsman, and any stock wearing or carrying a lost badge, or one feloniously removed from other stock shall be treated as illegally depasturing on the Common, and shall be liable to be impounded by the herdsman without notice to the owner.

5. The managers shall be at liberty from time to time to call upon the owners of stock on the Commons by advertisement in any newspaper circulating in the district to muster their stock at the appointed yards for the purposes of registration, or to see that all stock depasturing on the Common are duly registered and carrying the correct badges, and the herdsman shall give every assistance at every such mustering.

6. All fees as hereinafter set forth shall be paid on registration of stock, and unless the prescribed fees are paid for renewal of registration within seven days from the due date the unregistered stock remaining on the Common shall be liable to at once be impounded by the herdsman.

7. The financial year of the Common shall commence on the first day of August in each year, and all registrations shall be made and fees paid within seven days from the said first day of August. No rebate shall be made in the fees for registration of stock for a portion or portions of the said financial year.

8. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall be as follows, and shall be paid quarterly in advance on the first day of August and on the first day of each succeeding quarter in every year:—For large cattle (4) Four shillings per annum, for small cattle (2) Two shillings per annum, and for horses (4) Four shillings per annum.

9. No bull, entire horse, or swine shall be allowed to depasture on the Common without the special permission in writing of the managers, and all such animals not duly authorized and sheep found on the Common, except sheep depasturing in such portion thereof as is set apart for the purpose, will be impounded.

10. All unregistered stock found on the Common without badges shall forthwith be impounded.

11. The licence to depasture stock on the Common and the badges shall not be transferable. Substitution licence may, however, be granted in respect of stock placed on the Common in lieu of stock permanently removed therefrom, but only in cases in which the owner shall give notice in writing to the herdsman of such removal as well as the full descriptions and brands or marks of the new stock.

12. Whenever the managers have reason to believe that any animal on the Common is affected with any contagious disease the owner of such animal shall within (12) twelve hours after receiving notice in writing to that effect from the managers or herdsman remove such animal from the Common, and in case of neglect or refusal to so remove such animal, the managers shall be at liberty to order its immediate destruction and burial (if necessary) at the expense of the owner thereof; and the managers shall be at liberty to refuse registration of any other stock of such owner until he shall have paid the expenses. No compensation shall be allowed for the destruction of any diseased animal.

13. No dead animal shall be allowed to remain on the Common, and if a carcass be not removed after (12) twelve hours' notice has been given to the owner thereof, the managers shall be at liberty to cause such carcass to be removed and buried (if necessary) at the expense of the owner thereof, and to refuse the registration of any other stock of such owner until the expense so incurred has been paid.

14. Owners of registered stock will be required to give immediate notice in writing to the herdsman of any stock permanently removed from the Common.

15. The managers shall not be responsible for the safe custody of stock depasturing on the Common, or for loss or damage sustained through neglect or mistake of the herdsman, or from any other cause whatsoever.

16. No person shall unnecessarily disturb any stock depasturing on the Common.

17. The herdsman shall give notice to the owner (if known to him) of stock impounded in any pound (where the Common badge is registered) within (24) twenty-four hours after receiving such notice; but the cost of releasing impounded stock shall in all cases be paid by the owner thereof.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE IN THE TOWNSHIP OF TULUM FOR THE RECREATION, CONVENIENCE, OR AMUSEMENT OF THE PEOPLE.

WE, Robert Stanley, John Davies, Valentine Helli-car, David Buckley, Louis Joshua Berryman, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land in the township of Tulum, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 16th March, 1914, as a site for the recreation, convenience, or amusement of the people, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK AND RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE CITY OF FOOTSCRAY KNOWN AS "FOOTSCRAY PARK."

WHEREAS by section 200 of the *Land Act 1901* it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever; or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of such Act, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of the section specified: And whereas a Crown grant has issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray in respect of the reserve for a Public Park and Recreation purposes in the city of Footscray known as "Footscray Park": Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said reserve for a Public Park and Recreation purposes in the city of Footscray known as "Footscray Park."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall interfere with or damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Park, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb upon or jump over the trees, fences, or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut or in any way damage the trees, fences, gates, or seats, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance in the Park, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

5. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency in the Park shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom and to prosecution for an offence against these Regulations.

6. No person shall bring into the Park any dog unless led by a chain or cord, and no person except those in the employ of or authorized by the council shall put into the Park any vehicles or any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals. The owner of any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals (except dogs led as provided) found in the Park shall be liable to be prosecuted. Stray dogs found in the Park will be destroyed.

7. No person shall ride a bicycle in the Park, except by permission of the council.

8. No person shall engage in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, or any other like game in the Park without the authority, in writing, of the council, unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play therein.

9. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Park any intoxicating liquors, goods, or articles of any description without having previously obtained written permission from the council.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who so offends and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer or servant, or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall spit, or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
12. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
