3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates

For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being for all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rate be determined by a police magistrate.

1. When any person charged with an offence punishable by death, or any aboriginal accused of an indictable offence, requires assistance from the Crown for his defence, he shall, seven days before the first day of the good delivery, Circuit Court, or Court of General Sessions at which he is to take his trial, or so soon as he shall know that he is to be tried for such offence, apply to the Sheriff for such assistance, and shall show to the satisfaction of such Sheriff that he is without sufficient means wherewith to employ legal assistance.

2. Upon the Sheriff being convinced of the truth of the allegations contained in such application, and having ascertained from the Crown Solicitor or the Clerk of the Peace, as the case may be, that the applicant is to be tried on a capital charge, or in the case of an aboriginal, that he is to be brought to trial, he shall—if the applicant nominate one legal practitioner to conduct his whole defence—communicate to such legal practitioner with the amount of fees to be allowed, and forward notice of the same to the Attorney-General. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF LONG-FORD

W E, William Harvey Newnham, John Charles Brennan, Herbert Samuel Boston, James Earls, and Andrew Sutherland, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for. Public Recreation in the town of Longford, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may

be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements. On any of such occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, brubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or other property, or any trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or other rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- 6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect in the Reserve any dwelling, nor any booth or other struc-ture for the purpose of offering for sale any article with-out the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Com-mittee of Management first obtained.
- 9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- 10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Re-
- 11. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
- game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

 12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure; and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management. Management.
- 13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 181 of the Land Act 1915, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.



PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.; Vice-Admiral of the State of Victoria.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the Prize Courts Act 1894 and of certain Commissions and Warrants issued thereunder, I did, on the nineteenth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, for further assurance, proclaim that war had broken out between His Majesty the King and the German Emperor and also between His Majesty the King and the Emperor of Austria, King of Hungary:

AND WHEREAS I did, on the seventh day of November, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, further proclaim that war had broken out between His Majesty the King and the Sultan of Turkey:

AND WHEREAS a state of war now exists between His Majesty the King and the King of Bulgaria:

Now THEREFORE I, SIR ARTHUR LYULPH STANLEY, the Vice-Admiral aforesaid, being satisfied thereof by information received by me, do hereby proclaim that war has broken out between His Majesty the King and the King of Bulgaria.

Given under my Hand and Scal, at Government House, Melbourne, this twenty-seventh day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign.
