“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Six hundred and thirty-nine thousand two hundred and thirteen pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and fifteen and One thousand nine hundred and sixteen.”

DISAPPEARANCE OF JESSIE STIRLING.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS Jessie Stirling, daughter of Mr. Walter George Stirling, of Footscray, who left Melbourne on the 12th day of August, 1915, in the company of a man, name unknown, who had engaged her, to proceed to a situation at Sale, has mysteriously disappeared, and hitherto the police have been unable to discover the whereabouts of either of the parties, a description of whom is hereunder supplied: Notice is hereby given that a reward of One hundred pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as may lead to the discovery of the whereabouts of the girl and the arrest and conviction of the man on a charge of abduction.

- (b) To the best of his power knowledge and ability teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the said apprentice in the process trade or business of* _____ and in all things incident or relating thereto.
- (c) Pay to the said apprentice (during such time as he shall observe and perform the terms of this indenture) wages at the rate following (that is to say) :—

- (d) Pay to the said apprentice such further rates for overtime worked as may be fixed by the Undertakers Board.
- (e) Provide all tools and materials necessary to enable the said apprentice during the term of this indenture to perform his work.
- (f) On completion of the term herein named hand over to the said apprentice this copy of agreement with a certificate thereon to the effect that the said term has been served. Provided that this shall be conditional on the said apprentice serving the said term and observing and fulfilling the covenants herein.
- (g) If at any time during the said term he shall die or cease to carry on the business aforesaid in all its branches as now carried on by him either altogether or within a radius of five miles from his present place of business he or his executors administrators or assigns or one of them will within one month thereafter find and provide some other employer or employers carrying on the business aforesaid in all its branches within such radius if any there be or if there be none such if the apprentice so require provide such employer carrying on business beyond that radius and will assign and transfer at his own expense and cost the said apprentice to such employer or employers upon and subject to the same or the like conditions and stipulations as are hereinbefore provided.
- (h) If from any cause whatever he is unable to find work for the said apprentice he will transfer such apprentice for a period not exceeding three months to some other employer or employers carrying on the same business within three miles of the original employer's place of business he being held responsible for the due performance of all obligations imposed by this indenture.

And that the said _____ apprentice and said employer that he the said apprentice during the said term (unless the employer shall remove his business to some place beyond the radius of five miles from his present place of business in which case the apprentice may if he so elect claim to have his indenture assigned to some other employer within the radius if any there be or if there be none such to be released from this agreement) will—

ORDER IN COUNCIL SEVERING THE CHILTERN AND INDIGO RIDINGS OF THE SHIRE OF CHILTERN FROM SUCH SHIRE AND ANNEXING SAME TO THE SHIRE OF RUTHERGLEN AND SEVERING THE BARNAWARtha RIDING OF THE FIRST-NAMED SHIRE THEREFROM AND ANNEXING IT TO THE SHIRE OF WODONGA.

WHEREAS by notices in writing dated the 22nd day of April, 1915, to and duly served upon the councils of the shire of Chiltern the shire of Rutherglen and the shire of Wodonga respectively, on or about the 23rd day of the same month the Honorable Frederick William Hagelthorn His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works in and for the State of Victoria and the Minister of the Crown of the said State for the time being administering the Local Government Acts of the same (hereinafter referred to as the "Minister") notified such councils that moved by reason (as the case in fact is) that the general and extra rates made and levied by the said shire of Chiltern during the twelve months ended the 30th day of September 1914 did not yield a sum of One thousand and five hundred pounds sterling, he intended to proceed to obtain an Order severing those portions of the shire of Chiltern constituted by the Chiltern and Indigo ridings of the said shire and annexing such ridings to the shire of Rutherglen the municipal district of which together with that of the two said ridings forms one continuous area and severing that portion of the said shire of Chiltern constituted by the Barnawartha riding of the same and annexing such riding to the shire of Wodonga the municipal district of which together with that of the said last-named riding also forms one continuous area which notices were published in the *Government Gazette* of the 28th day of April aforesaid and respectively in three consecutive issues of the *Age* a newspaper generally circulating in Melbourne and the *Federal Standard* a newspaper generally circulating in the several municipalities of Chiltern, Rutherglen, and Wodonga (that is to say in the *Age* on the 28th, 29th, and 30th of April 1915 and in the *Federal Standard* on the 30th April 1915 and the 7th and 14th May 1915) And whereas the said Minister has given to the councils of the municipalities of Chiltern, Rutherglen and Wodonga (no creditor of any of them within the period of three months from the 14th day of May now last past or at all having notified the Minister of his or its desire so to do) full opportunity of showing cause why an Order in Council severing the three ridings aforesaid of the shire of Chiltern from the said shire and annexing two of such ridings namely the Chiltern riding and the Indigo riding to the shire of Rutherglen and the third of such ridings namely the Barnawartha riding to the shire of Wodonga should not be made and passed And whereas the Minister having entertained, inquired into and decided upon all the representations made by or on behalf of such councils respectively has recommended that the Chiltern, the Indigo and the Barnawartha ridings should as on and from the thirty-first day of May 1916 be severed from the shire of Chiltern and that as on and from the said date that the said Chiltern and Indigo ridings should be annexed to and become part and form portion of the shire of Rutherglen as a separate riding under the name of the "Chiltern Riding" and the said Barnawartha riding be annexed to and become part and form portion of the shire of Wodonga as a separate riding thereof under the name of the "Barnawartha Riding" And whereas such recommendations have been duly considered and approved Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State being satisfied that all conditions precedent to the making hereof have been fulfilled and observed and acting under the authority conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and under all other powers enabling him in that behalf doth hereby order and direct as follows (that is to say):—

1. That on and from the thirty-first day of May 1916 the date upon which this Order shall come into operation the Chiltern, the Indigo and the Barnawartha ridings respectively of the shire of Chiltern incorporated as the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the shire of Chiltern shall be severed therefrom and annexed as hereinafter provided.

2. That with regard to the ridings of Chiltern and Indigo aforesaid as on and from the date last aforesaid the said ridings and the territories therein comprised shall be annexed to and form part of the shire of Rutherglen incorporated under the name of "The President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Rutherglen" as a separate riding to be called the "Chiltern Riding" with the boundaries as set out and defined in the First Schedule hereto and that the boundaries of the said shire of Rutherglen shall be as set out and defined in the Second Schedule hereto.

3. The existing subdivision of the said shire of Rutherglen being hereby retained such shire after the annexation thereto of the territory in the First Schedule referred to as aforesaid as a new riding under the name of the "Chiltern Riding" shall be taken as subdivided into five divisions namely the existing ridings of Browns Plains, Lilliput, Norong and Wahgunyah and the said new riding of Chiltern, which several ridings shall have the boundaries set forth and described in the Third Schedule hereto under the respective names.

4. At the next annual election following the annexation to the shire of Rutherglen of the territory constituting the new Chiltern riding and thereafter the ratepayers of such new ridings shall return three councillors and the number of the councillors of the council of the shire of Rutherglen shall be increased from twelve to fifteen accordingly.

5. That with regard to the said Barnawartha riding aforesaid as on and from the thirty-first day of May 1916 the said riding of the shire of Chiltern and the territories therein comprised shall be annexed to and form part of the shire of Wodonga, incorporated under the name of the "President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the shire of Wodonga" as a separate riding to be called the "Barnawartha Riding" with the boundaries set out and defined in the Fourth Schedule hereto and that the boundaries of the said shire of Wodonga shall be as set out and defined in the Fifth Schedule hereto.

6. The existing subdivision of the said shire of Wodonga being hereby retained in such shire after the annexation thereto of the territory in the Fourth Schedule referred to and constituted as aforesaid a new riding under the name of the "Barnawartha Riding" shall be taken as subdivided into four ridings namely the existing ridings of Wodonga, Bonegilla and Green Hill and the said new riding of Barnawartha which several ridings shall have the boundaries set forth and described in the Sixth Schedule hereto under the respective names.

7. That at the next annual election following the annexation to the shire of Wodonga of the territory constituting the new Barnawartha riding thereof and thereafter the ratepayers of such new riding shall return three councillors and the number of councillors of the council of the shire of Wodonga shall be increased from nine to twelve accordingly.

8. That all councillors of the present shire of Chiltern shall go out of office at midnight on the thirtieth day of May 1916 and that thereafter the corporation of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the shire of Chiltern shall be dissolved and cease to exist.

9. That failing an amicable settlement of any differences and the apportionment settlement adjustment or determination of any property income assets rights liabilities expenses or matters requiring to be apportioned settled adjusted or determined between the municipalities hereinbefore referred to in this Order, the Governor in Council shall, under the powers conferred by the said *Local Government Act 1915* by Order apportion, settle, adjust or determine such matters.

Factories and Shops Act 1915.

DETERMINATION OF THE AGRICULTURAL IMPLEMENTS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of—

- (a) agricultural machinery or implements ;
- (b) parts of agricultural machinery or implements ;
- (c) bag-filling machinery, bone-crushers, butter-making machinery, chaff-cutters, corn-crushing machinery, cream separators, hay presses, horse works, iron feeding troughs, lawn mowers, machinery for treating flax or hemp, maize shellers, windmills ; or
- (d) in assembling or putting together any parts of machinery or implements of classes or kinds (whether the same have been made inside or outside the State) same or similar to those specified above,

has made the following Determination, namely :—

1. That the previous Determination of this Board is hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 13th day of December, 1915. The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

"Apprentice" means any person under 21 years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over 21 years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over 21 years of age, or who being over 21 years of age holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

 (b) The proportionate number of apprentices and improvers who may be employed in any factory or place

OVERTIME.

6. That any employee who works for any time in excess of 48 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

7. That time and three-quarters shall be the special rate for all work done on—
Sundays,
Christmas Day,
New Year's Day,
21st April (Eight Hours Day),
Good Friday,

but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named public holidays, the special rates shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

PIECE-WORK.

8. The Board determines under the provisions of Section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act* 1915 that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which the Board has fixed a minimum wage, provided that any such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions; and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates that are fixed by the Board for such work.
