Factories and Shops Act 1915.

DETERMINATION OF THE BEDSTEAD MAKERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (including the moulders of bedsteads and excluding the moulders of fenders) employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of metal bedsteads or fenders, or parts thereof, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That the previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative, on and after the 17th day of December, 1915. The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

(2) That the lowest rates of wages to be paid to the following persons shall be:—

APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

"Apprentice" means any person under twenty-one years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over twenty-one years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over twenty-one years of age, or who, being over twenty-one years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. - (Act 2650, Section 3.)

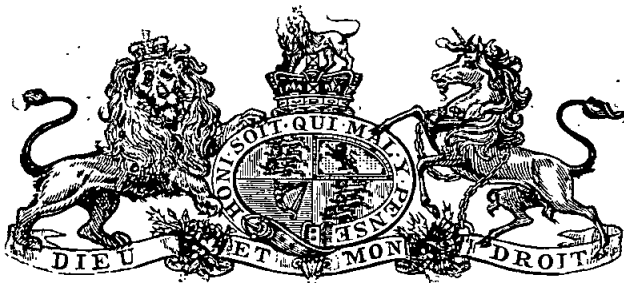
but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable on the day so substituted.

PIECE-WORK.

(7) The Board determines under the provisions of Section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which the Board has fixed a minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates fixed by the Board for such work.

Factories and Shops Act 1915.

DETERMINATION OF THE ELECTRO-PLATERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of—

- (a) Electro-plating ;
- (b) Metal polishing ;
- (c) Enamelling or japanning metals ;

other than persons subject to the Determination of any one of the following Boards :—

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over 21 years of age, or who, being over 21 years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2650, Section 3.)
