ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to amend the Law relating to Default Summonses.”

“An Act to provide for Advances on certain Terms to Farmers to enable them to procure Dairy Cattle and for other purposes.”

“An Act to provide for the Registration and Better Training of Midwives and to regulate their Practice.”

“An Act to make provision in regard to the Custody of Property of Alien Enemies during the present War and for other purposes.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this thirtieth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and in the sixth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE ENEMY PROPERTY ACT 1915.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, this thirtieth day of November, 1915.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, pursuant to the provisions of Section 18 of the *Enemy Property Act 1915*, that is to say:—

1. Payments under the provisions of Section 4 (1) (c) shall be accompanied by the particulars in the form Schedule A hereto.
2. Payments under the provisions of Section 4 (2) (a) shall be accompanied by the particulars in the form Schedule B hereto.
3. Payments under the provisions of Section 4 (4) shall be accompanied by the particulars in the form Schedule C hereto.
4. Returns under the provisions of Section 6 (1) (a) shall be accompanied by the particulars in the forms of Schedule D 1 or 2 hereto.
5. Payments under the provisions of Section 6 (2) (a) shall be accompanied by the particulars in the form of Schedule E hereto.
6. Returns under the provisions of Sections 6 (1) and 7 (1) shall be accompanied by the particulars in the forms of Schedule F (1) or (2) hereto.

7. The Custodian may require such other or additional particulars in any case as he may think fit.
 8. There shall be charged in respect of the duties of the Custodian a percentage at the rate of Five pounds per centum upon all moneys paid to or collected by or coming under the control of the Custodian.
 In any case the fractional parts less than the moiety of the pound sterling shall be disregarded in the calculation of the amount payable for percentage.

And the Honorable Harry Sutherland Wightman Lawson, His Majesty's Attorney-General for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
