- (b) To the best of his power knowledge and ability teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the said apprentice in the process trade or business of _____ and all things incident or relating thereto
- (c) Pay to the said apprentice (during such time as he shall observe and perform the terms of this indenture) wages at the rate following (that is to say):—

- (d) Pay to the said apprentice such further rates for overtime worked as may be fixed by the Woodworkers Board.

Provided that this shall be conditional on the said apprentice serving the said term and observing and fulfilling the covenants herein.





HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1915.

THE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1915 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust; also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the Municipal rate of the Shire of Melvor; but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound five shillings.

2. A rate of Six shillings and threepence shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

3. Tenements not fronting a street within which a main pipe is laid, but are situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged half the amount of the assessed rate.

4. Tenements exceeding one-quarter, but not exceeding half-a-mile distant from a stand-pipe, shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of assessed rate.

5. For water supplied by measure a charge of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons shall be made,

and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and, shall be paid for in advance or as the Trust may deem necessary.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the first of January and first of July, 1915.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

OMEQ WATERWORKS TRUST.—BY-LAW FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make and levy the following rates and charges for the year 1915 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District, that is to say:—

No. 1. On every house or tenement on which a dwelling-house is erected of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

No. 2. On every unoccupied allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Five pounds or under, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence.

No. 3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds, a rate of Seven and one-half per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of £25, except where a meter is used.

No. 4. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound per annum shall be made.

No. 5. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per annum shall be made.

No. 6. For water supplied by measurement (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

No. 7. No service pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.

No. 8. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance on the 1st day of January, 1915.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

The Dentists' Acts.

THE DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

THE Dental Board of Victoria, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, doth, by virtue of the powers vested in it by the Dentists' Acts of Victoria, hereby repeal Regulation VIII., made by the Board on the 22nd day of July, 1904, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 16th day of August, 1904, and doth in lieu thereof make the following Regulation, viz.:—

C. AS REGARDS THE COURSE OF PROFESSIONAL STUDY.

VIII. Students shall pursue their studies for four years and pass four examinations before the Board. In addition to the places hereinafter specially mentioned, lectures, demonstrations, and practical work may be attended at any public educational institution as may from time to time be prescribed by Regulation for the purpose.

(a) First Year.

During the first year students shall attend the following courses of lectures:—

1. Chemistry, Theoretical and Practical.—The course at the University of Melbourne, Part I., or at the Melbourne College of Pharmacy, or at the School of Mines at Ballarat or Bendigo, or at The Australian College of Dentistry.
2. Junior Dental Anatomy, Human and Comparative.—The course of lectures at The Australian College of Dentistry.
3. Junior Anatomy.—The course of lectures on junior anatomy at the University of Melbourne.
4. Junior Dental Mechanics and Metallurgy.—The course of lectures at The Australian College of Dentistry.
5. Shall perform a course of dissections of the head and neck, the thorax, and the abdomen at the University of Melbourne.

The subjects of examination for the first year shall be—

- (a) Chemistry, theoretical and practical.
- (b) Junior dental anatomy, human and comparative.
- (c) Junior anatomy.
- (d) Junior dental mechanics and metallurgy.

(b) Second Year.

During the second year students shall attend the following courses of lectures and demonstrations:—

1. Senior Dental Anatomy, Human and Comparative.—The course of lectures at The Australian College of Dentistry.
2. Senior Anatomy.—The course of lectures on senior anatomy at the University of Melbourne.
3. Dissections.—Students shall perform a course of dissections, including demonstrations of the head, neck, thorax, and abdomen at the University of Melbourne.
4. Physiology, with special reference to Dentistry.—The course of lectures at the University of Melbourne or The Australian College of Dentistry.
5. Histology, with Laboratory Work therein, having special reference to Dentistry.—The course at the University of Melbourne.
6. Dental Mechanics (Vulcanite Work).—The course of demonstrations at The Australian College of Dentistry.
7. And shall attend a course of demonstrations in operative technique.

The subjects of examination for the second year shall be—

- (a) Senior dental anatomy, human and comparative.
- (b) Senior anatomy.
- (c) Dissections or demonstrations, with special examination of the head and neck.
- (d) Physiology, with special reference to dentistry.
- (e) Histology, with special reference to dentistry.
- (f) Dental mechanics (vulcanite work).

(c) Third Year.

During the third year students shall attend the following courses of lectures, demonstrations, &c.:—

1. General Surgery, Pathology, and Bacteriology.—The course of lectures, with specimens and exhibits, at the University of Melbourne or The Australian College of Dentistry.
2. Materia Medica and Therapeutics, with special application to Dentistry.—The course of lectures at the Melbourne College of Pharmacy, or at the School of Mines at Ballarat or Bendigo, or at The Australian College of Dentistry.
3. Senior Dental Mechanics.—The course of lectures at The Australian College of Dentistry.
4. Metallurgy, including Laboratory Work.—The course of lectures and demonstrations, with practical work, at The Australian College of Dentistry or at the Working Men's College, Melbourne.
5. Dental Surgery and Pathology.—The course of lectures at The Australian College of Dentistry, Melbourne.
6. Orthodontics.—The course of lectures and demonstrations at The Australian College of Dentistry, Melbourne.

Students shall further produce a certificate of having attended during nine months of the year the dental practice at The Australian College of Dentistry, such attendance to include clinical instruction and clinical lectures, and shall also produce a certificate of having attended during the year the demonstrations in crown and bridge work at The Australian College of Dentistry.

The subjects of examination for the third year shall be—

- (a) General surgery, pathology, and bacteriology.
- (b) Materia medica and therapeutics, with special reference to dentistry.
- (c) Senior dental mechanics.
- (d) Metallurgy.
- (e) Dental surgery and pathology.
- (f) Orthodontics.

(d) Fourth Year.

During the fourth year students shall attend the following courses of lectures and practical work:—

1. Medicine.—The course of lectures at The Australian College of Dentistry. They shall also produce a certificate of having attended during nine months of the year the medical practice of a recognised general hospital, such attendance to include clinical instruction.
2. Oral Surgery.—The course of lectures at The Australian College of Dentistry. They shall also produce a certificate of having attended during nine months of the year the surgical practice of a recognised general hospital, such attendance to include clinical instruction.

3. Dental Surgery and Pathology, with practical illustrations.—The course of lectures at The Australian College of Dentistry.
4. Bacteriology, with practical work therein having special reference to Dentistry.—The course at the University of Melbourne.
5. Dental Mechanics.—The course of practical laboratory work at The Australian College of Dentistry.
6. Demonstrations in oral surgery.

Students shall further produce a certificate of having attended during nine months of the year the dental practice of The Australian College of Dentistry, such attendance to include clinical instruction and clinical lectures; and shall also produce a certificate of having attended during the year the demonstrations in crown and bridge work at The Australian College of Dentistry.

The subjects of examination at the fourth year shall be—

- (a) Medicine.
- (b) Oral surgery.
- (c) Dental surgery and pathology.
- (d) Bacteriology.
- (e) Dental mechanics.

Candidates who have passed all the foregoing examinations, and fulfilled all the prescribed conditions shall be entitled to the Diploma of Licentiate of Dental Surgery of Victoria, and to registration as dentists.

CONSEQUENTIAL ALTERATIONS.

Students who have attended the course of lectures in metallurgy (including laboratory work), and passed the examination in that subject during their second year will not be required to attend the lectures and pass the examination in that subject during their third year; but students who during their second year have attended the course of lectures and passed the examinations in the subjects prescribed therein prior to the first day of March, 1915, shall be required during their third year to attend the lectures in histology with laboratory work therein, having special reference to dentistry, and to pass the examination in that subject.

This Regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of March, 1915.

This Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Dental Board of Victoria, held on the twentieth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

Land Surveyors Act 1895.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 8th November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

- (a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

- (b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

- (c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of spheroides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(e), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *pro-voc* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
(b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR BOTANIC GARDENS PURPOSES AT CASTLEMAINE.

WHEREAS by section 200 of the *Land Act 1901* it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved from sale, permanently, any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of such Act, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of the section specified. And whereas a Crown grant has issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Castlemaine in respect of the Reserve for Botanic Gardens Purposes at Castlemaine. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Castlemaine, do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the Reserve for Botanic Gardens as aforesaid:—

Regulations.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
4. No person shall in any way interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, statuary, fountains, or other property in the Reserve, or with the birds therein, or throw stones, or birdnest, or commit any nuisance in the Reserve or leave any bottle or any orange or banana peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter, or light fires therein, or smoke in the nursery or any other reserved place in the Reserve.
5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, or cut names on the fences, gates, trees, or seats, or stick bills thereon, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.
7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained, and all dogs otherwise found within the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.
8. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any nurseries or any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
10. No person shall remain within the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employé of the trustees, or any person duly authorized in that behalf, to leave the Reserve.
11. No person shall sell or offer for sale in the Reserve any article of food or drink or other commodity, or operate any money-making amusement without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant or constable, and taken before some justice, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
