Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination—which must be that nearest their residence—and must forward, either with their application, or on or before Wednesday, the 26th May, 1915, a crossed postal note payable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for Ten shillings (10s.) in the case of candidates for the Clerical Examination, and Five shillings (5s.) in the case of candidates for the General Division Examinations, being the fees for such examinations.

At the Clerical Examination fifty (50) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerks. Candidates must at the date of examination be between the ages of sixteen and twenty-one years at last birthday; but no person twenty-two years of age or over can be appointed. The commencing salary is £60, rising to a maximum of £204 a year by increments, which may be granted at intervals of not less than one year if recommended by the Permanent Head of the Department and the Public Service Commissioner.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1915.

(3) For every house or tenement supplied by measure the charge for the water so supplied shall be One shilling per thousand gallons up to twenty-five thousand gallons, or up to an amount equal to the sum which would have been imposed and levied as aforesaid, whichever shall be greater, and for all water supplied over and above such maximum amount the rate per thousand gallons shall be increased by One shilling for the first thousand gallons, Two shillings for the second thousand gallons, and so on.

(4) Such rate and charges shall be due and payable in one sum, on the 1st day of January, 1915.

(5) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

WAHGUNYAH WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 3.

THE Commissioners of the Wahgunyah Waterworks Trust, constituted under the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates for 1915 which the occupiers or owners of land, tenements, or vacant allotments within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect to every such property.

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Thirteen pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of Two pounds sterling shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Thirteen pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Three shillings on municipal valuation shall be paid.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land shall be One pound.

4. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

5. Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and shall be paid for at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1915.

7. For any public water trough supplied by the Trust, the sum of Thirty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by meter.

8. For all water supplied from the stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of One shilling, and for each load in excess of 200 gallons *pro rata* on the above scale.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

10. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

RATE, AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.

BY-LAW No. 507.—WERRIBEE URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE WERRIBEE WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Werribee Urban District within the Werribee Waterworks District:—

(1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twelvepence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Ten shillings for the period hereinafter set out.

(2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twelvepence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.

(3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the period beginning with the first day of January, 1915, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1915, and shall be payable on the fourth day of March, 1915, at the office of the said Commission, at Werribee.

3. For making and levying such rates, the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a Police Magistrate.

4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

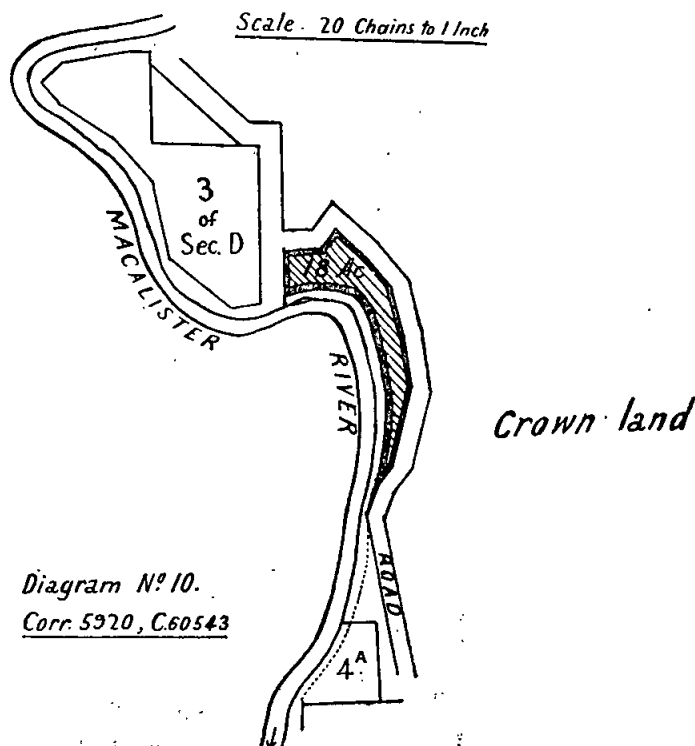

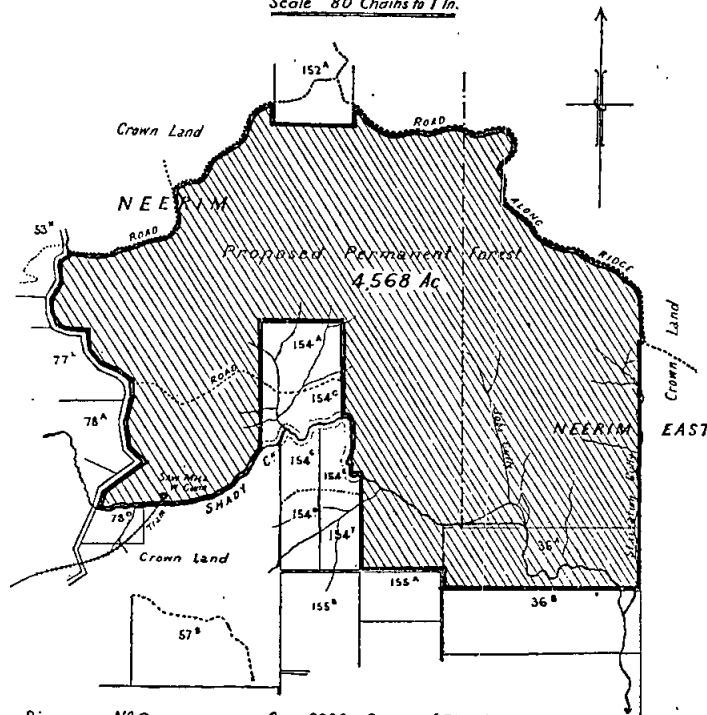
