PART III. OF ADMINISTRATION AND PROBATE ACT TO APPLY TO THE PROVINCE OF THE CAPE OF GOOD HOPE IN THE UNION OF SOUTH AFRICA.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section two of an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria, passed in the second year of the reign of His present Majesty King George V., intituled "An Act to further amend the Administration and Probate Act 1890," and numbered 2342, it is provided that the Governor in Council, on being satisfied that the Legislature of any British Possession has made adequate provision for the recognition in that Possession of probates and letters of administration granted by the Supreme Court of Victoria, might, by Proclamation, declare that Part III. of the Administration and Probate Act 1890 of the State of Victoria, as amended by any Act, should, subject to any exceptions and modifications specified in the Proclamation, apply to that Possession, and that thereupon while such Proclamation was in force the said Part III. should apply accordingly: And whereas I, the Governor in Council of the said State of Victoria, being satisfied that the Legislature of the Province of the Cape of Good Hope (forming part of the Union of South Africa), a British Possession within the meaning of the said recited Act, has, by the Act No. 8 of 1888 of the said Province, made adequate provision for the recognition in that Possession of probates and letters of administration granted by the Supreme Court of Victoria, do now therefore, by and with the advice of the said Executive Council, hereby by this my Proclamation declare that Part III. of the said Administration and Probate Act 1890 of the State of Victoria, as amended by any Act, shall, without exception or modification, apply to the Province of the Cape of Good Hope in the Union of South Africa aforesaid, and that henceforth while this Proclamation is in force the said Part III. shall apply accordingly.

Applications, accompanied by evidence of good moral character and industrious habits, must be lodged at the office of the Public Service Commissioner, Geological Museum Building, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, on or before Friday, the 14th May, 1915.

Forms of application and copies of the Regulations may be obtained at the office of the Commissioner.

Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination—which must be that nearest their residence—and must forward, either with their application, or on or before Wednesday, the 26th May, 1915, a crossed postal note payable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for Ten shillings (10s.) in the case of candidates for the Clerical Examination, and Five shillings (5s.) in the case of candidates for the General Division Examinations, being the fees for such examinations.

At the Clerical Examination fifty (50) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerks. Candidates must at the date of examination be between the ages of sixteen and twenty-one years at last birthday; but no person twenty-two years of age or over can be appointed. The commencing salary is £60, rising to a maximum of £204 a year by increments, which may be granted at intervals of not less than one year if recommended by the Permanent Head of the Department and the Public Service Commissioner.

### REGULATIONS.

1. A candidate must give notice, in writing, not less than three weeks prior to the date of an examination, of his intention to present himself thereat; he must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that he has complied with Regulations 2 and 3 following, and on his application being approved by the Board, must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into a Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Office of Mines, Melbourne.

2. A candidate must produce a certificate of competency, issued by the Board of Examiners for the Survey Branch of the Department of Crown Lands and Survey of Victoria, or a certificate of competency or diploma issued by one of the Federated Surveyors Board of Australia and New Zealand.

3. He must also show to the satisfaction of the Board—

- (a) That he has served during not less than four months under some authorized mining surveyor, in obtaining practical experience in the conduct of underground surveys; or, that he has been engaged for not less than twelve months in the conduct of such surveys.
- (b) That he has acquired a knowledge of the methods and appliances used in mining operations.

4. A candidate whose application has been approved as having complied with the foregoing will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

- (a) *Mining Surveying.*—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.
- (b) *Practical Mining.*—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry; construction and management of pumping, winding, and other mining machinery.
- (c) *Hydraulic Engineering.*—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels; estimation of sources of water supply; dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels; construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.
- (d) *Geology.*—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

5. Candidates who have taken a degree in Mining Engineering in the University of Melbourne, or in some University whose degrees in Engineering are recognised by that University, and whose Engineering graduates are admitted by it *ad eundem gradum*, or who have taken a like degree in Civil Engineering and have passed the University examination in Mining Surveying and Practical Mining, will be exempt from the whole of the examinations prescribed by Regulation 4.

6. Candidates who have completed the course in Mining Engineering of any School of Mines or Technical School will be exempt from the examination required by sub-clauses (b) and (d) of Regulation 4.

7. Candidates who have obtained the certificate of the Board of Examiners for Engineers of Water Supply in Victoria will be exempt from the examination required by sub-clause (c) of Regulation 4.

8. Examinations are held half-yearly in April and October.

## Health Act 1890.

## CITY OF CAULFIELD.

## BY-LAW No. 33.

**I**N pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of all other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Caulfield, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said city in the interests of the public health, makes the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. That all fowl-yards, duck-yards, and geese-yards shall, if possible and where necessary for health, be at least twenty-five feet from any dwelling house.

2. No person shall within twenty-five feet of a dwelling house establish or construct a fowl-yard or duck-yard, or geese-yard, or cause one to be constructed or established, or within such distance permit any land or place to be used as a fowl-yard, duck-yard, or geese-yard.

3. Every person who shall be guilty of any breach of or offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Twenty shillings for each day during which such breach or offence is continued by such person.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield.





## BY-LAW No. 33.

## Prevention of Fire.

A By-law of the Shire of Dandenong, numbered 33, and made under sub-section (8) of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and of any and every power thereunto them enabling, for the prevention of fires within that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Dandenong hereinafter set out and hereinafter referred to as the Area.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903* and of any and every other power thereunto them enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong order as follows:—

This By-law shall have operation and be in force throughout the whole of all that piece of land commencing at the north-west corner or angle of Crown allotment 12a, parish of Lyndhurst; thence along the Mordialloc Creek to the intersection of the drain running along the eastern boundaries of Crown allotments 135 to 101 in the said parish; thence to the south-east corner of the Crown allotment 91; thence westerly to the Eel Race-road to the Frankston-road; thence to the south-east corner of Crown allotment 1A; thence south-westerly by the southern boundary of the said Crown allotment 1A, in a straight line to Port Phillip Bay; thence along Port Phillip Bay to the commencing point.

1. No person being the owner or occupier of any land within the area shall allow any fallen or severed tree or rubbish of any description to lie or remain upon any land so owned or occupied by him.

2. No person shall ignite or cause to be ignited, or in any way use any fire within the area unless same shall be (a) in a properly constructed fireplace of brick or other approved material, built into a dwelling-house, or (b) (if such fire be in an open space) within a properly constructed fireplace of brick or other approved material, and all the living and dead tree undergrowth and vegetable matter of every description within a radius of 10 feet from the centre of the chimney shall be completely removed from the circle of which the said 10 feet is the radius.

Every person offending against any part of this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty of not less than Five pounds nor more than Twenty pounds for each offence.

## SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

## BY-LAW 34.

A By-law of the Shire of Dandenong, numbered 34, and made under sub-section (20) of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for regulating the keeping or storage of volatile fluids in or upon any premises within that part of the municipal district of the Shire of Dandenong hereinafter set out, and in this By-law referred to as the Area.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903* and of any and every power thereunto them authorizing, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong order as follows:—

1. That this By-law shall have operation and be in force throughout all that piece of land commencing at the north-west corner or angle of Crown allotment 12a, parish of Lyndhurst; thence along the Mordialloc Creek to the intersection of the drain running along the eastern boundaries of Crown allotments 135 to 101 in the said parish; thence to the south-east corner of the Crown allotment 91; thence westerly by the Eel Race-road to the Frankston-road; thence to the south-east corner of Crown allotment 1A south-westerly by the southern boundary of the said Crown allotment 1A and a straight line to Port Phillip Bay; thence along Port Phillip Bay to the commencing point.

2. That in the construction of this By-law the words "volatile fluids" shall be construed to mean and include all or any of the following substances or fluids, namely:—Petroleum, kerosene, paraffine (solid or liquid), benzine, naphtha (mineral or vegetable), gas oil (produced from gas tar), turpentine, or any other similar volatile fluid, the flash point of which, according to the "Abel-Pensky" test, is not less than 73 degrees Fahrenheit.

3. That from and after the coming into force of this By-law no person being the occupier or having the use or control of any premises or building whatsoever within the area shall place, or cause or permit to be placed, or allow to remain upon such premises or within such buildings at any one time, one or more of the volatile fluids specified in this By-law greater in aggregate measure than 50 gallons unless with the consent in writing of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong, and then only if such volatile fluid be stored in a receptacle of the description and in the situation hereinafter specified, and unless the following conditions are complied with.

4. That no such receptacle in the area shall be used as aforesaid unless it be situated and constructed in the manner following, that is to say:—

The receptacle shall be of one story only, with walls not more than 9 feet in height from the floor level, and having a floor area of not more than 100 square feet. All walls to be of brick or concrete not less than 9 inches thick. The walls to have vents cut through them, each vent to be covered on the inside with fine copper wire gauze of a mesh of 800 to the square inch, or 28 to the lineal inch. The whole of the roof to be of concrete, and doors to be of iron. No artificial light to be used in the building. The floor to be of cemented concrete or of bricks on edge, laid and jointed in loose sand, and to be sunk at least 18 inches below the ground level. The receptacle to stand not less than 30 feet from any adjoining building, and all ground within a radius of 20 feet from the centre of the receptacle to be completely cleared of all living and dead tree undergrowth or other vegetable matter.

5. No person shall carry any matches into such receptacle, or shall smoke or ignite any material, or do anything whatsoever within such receptacle or within the circle of which the 20 feet from the centre of the floor is the radius or elsewhere which would endanger such receptacle or the volatile fluids stored therein. And no person who occupies or has the use or control or management of such receptacle shall permit any person to carry any matches or smoke or ignite any material, or do anything as aforesaid within such circle.

6. That such receptacle shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection and view of the Council of the said Shire, or the duly authorized officer of such Council.

7. Any person offending against this By-law shall for each offence, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty or sum of not more than £20 nor less than £5.

## SHIRE OF SOUTH GIPPSLAND.

A By-law of the Shire of South Gippsland, numbered 5, and made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting and regulating the depasturing of stock within certain boundaries of the Shire of South Gippsland, for the suppression of nuisances, and for maintaining the good order and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of South Gippsland order as follows:—

1. That the provisions regarding the impounding of stock contained in section 498 of the *Local Government Act 1903* be enforced, and that all stock found depasturing or wandering at large upon any road in the Shire of South Gippsland be impounded.

2. That the above order be carried out under the following rules and regulations, that is to say:—That all resident ratepayers of the said Shire and occupiers of land fronting the said roads, shall be exempt from such impounding of ten head of cattle or ten head of horses, and that in the case of public carriers the number so exempted be the team of horses or bullocks in actual use; and that the holder of any grazing licence under section 187 of the *Land Act 1901*, or any amendment or extension thereof, shall be exempt as to all stock wandering or at large, and of which he is the owner, on any roads bounding or intersecting any lands comprised in any such grazing licences.

3. That a condition precedent to such exemption be a payment to the Council of the Shire of South Gippsland, half-yearly in advance, at the rates following:—

(a) For every horse, Fifteen shillings per annum.

(b) For every head of cattle eighteen months old and over, Ten shillings per annum.

(c) For every head of cattle under eighteen months, Five shillings per annum.

And such payment to be a remuneration for the officers appointed by the Council as persons in charge of such horses and cattle, and hereinafter called the Herdsman.

4. When the above fee is paid to the Herdsman, he shall register such head of horses or cattle in a book to be kept for that purpose, as exempt from the operation of this By-law, and, in the case of such cattle, shall fasten a chain and tag on the neck of each beast, in token of such exemption, and shall give to the person so registering a receipt for the money paid, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose, and for the information and use of the said Council.

5. Any exemption for impounding granted in accordance with the provisions of this By-law shall not

extend to any stock found wandering within the boundaries of the townships of Foster and Toora, in the said Shire. Any stock found within such boundaries, even though registered, will be impounded by the Herdsman.

6. The Council will not be responsible or liable for loss by theft or death, or for any injury or damage to, or straying of any cattle or horses grazing under the aforesaid permit, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass or water, and the permit or licence to graze will be applied for and obtained under these conditions.

7. Each animal for which application is made to register shall be the *bona fide* property of the applicant, and the applicant shall make a declaration to that effect in the form of the schedule attached hereto.

8. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of the registered cows or mares, may run with their mothers free of charge up to that limit of age.

9. No entire horse or bull shall be exempted without the special consent of the Council.

10. A muster of all stock so registered shall take place on a day, of which due notice shall be given by an advertisement, at the close of every half-yearly period, and owners requiring exemption for the ensuing half-year are required to present their stock for registration at such musters, and after three months shall have run of any half-yearly period, the exemption fee shall be Two shillings and sixpence in the case of cows, and Three shillings and ninepence (3s. 9d.) in the case of horses.

11. The Herdsman shall keep an entry of all cattle impounded by him, and present a return of the same to the Council every six months, on a day preceding the half-yearly muster and registration, together with the books in which such entries are made.

12. The Council, or the Herdsman, will not be responsible for any damage arising from the impounding of such exempted stock by any person owning lands adjoining or abutting on such roads, or owning land, or any situation whatever.

13. No pigs, goats, or sheep are to be allowed to wander or to depasture on such roads, and all travelling stock must move thereover at the rate of 2 miles an hour, and, in the case of sheep, at the rate of not less than 6 miles in each day between sunrise and sunset.

14. No person shall be allowed to remove from the Herdsman's charge any stock registered as above without giving due notice of the same beforehand, upon receipt of which the owner so removing same will be entitled, without further charge, to substitute for each head so removed one other head of stock for the unexpired portion of the registered period.

15. The Council shall have exclusive right to cause all stock suspected of contagious diseases to be removed from such streets or roads, and in the event of any registered cattle or horses dying, the owner thereof shall cause same to be destroyed on receiving notice, failing which the Herdsman or Inspector of Nuisances shall cause the same to be destroyed at the owner's risk and expense.

Violations of the provisions of this By-law shall render the person so offending liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
