That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway, with hand-brake equipment on the cars, shall be at the rate of 15 miles per hour, and with magnetic, air, or other approved power-brakes and life guards, the maximum speed shall be at the rate of 20 miles per hour.

#### TIME OF COMPLETION.

That the tramway shall be completed and open for-traffic within a period of two (2) years from the date of the Order in Council authorizing the construction

#### TRAFFIG.

That the tramway shall be used for the carriage of passengers and such parcels or packages as they may have in their possession.

Necessary Precautions for Safety of Passengers and Public to be Observed.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the Council of the said municipality.

Stoppages for Taking up and Setting Down Passengers.

#### MINIMUM OR THROUGH FARES FOR ANY SPECIFIED DISTANCE

That power is hereby given to the Council to run cars at minimum or through fares upon the said trainway for any specified distance, provided that the amount of such minimum or through fare shall not exceed the total sum of the sectional fares upon such trainway or such parts of such trainway over which the cars shall be run. ELECTRIC WIRES CROSSING LINES OF RAILWAYS COM-MISSIONERS TO BE CONSTRUCTED SO AS NOT TO INTER-

Any electric line or lines in connexion with the said tramway which would cross under or over any wire of the Commissioners, or which would in the opinion of the Commissioners be in a position likely, if special precautions be not taken, to prejudicially affect the operation of the trains when electrified, or the maintenance of telegraphic or telephonic communication, or the transmission of signals on adjacent wires of the Commissioners, shall to the satisfaction of and without any expense to the Commissioners, be so placed, constructed, guarded and maintained as not to be capable, in the opinion of the Commissioners, of injuring or coming into contact with any wire of the Commissioners, or of prejudicially affecting or interfering, either mechanically or electrically, with the proper use of any such wire. wire.

Cost of Alteration to Postal Wires Incidental to Use of Electricity.

In the event of the Postal Department demanding any special alteration of its wires in consequence of the introduction of a high-tension or other electrical current in connexion with the tramway, the cost of any special arrangement of or provision for the wires because of such current shall be paid and borne by the Council.

FARES IN CASE OF COMBINED TRAMWAY AND RAILWAY PASSENGERS.

A Regulation of the City of Ballaarat, numbered 43. made with the approval of the Board of Public Health under the Meat Supervision Acts.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Meat Supervision Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citi-zens of the City of Ballaarat make the following Regula-

tion:—

1. This Regulation shall be read and construed as one with Regulation No. 42 of the said City, and any Regulation amending the same.

2. The owner of the carcase of an animal slaughtered in the Abattoirs of the said City shall remove or cause to be removed from the Abattoirs such carcase within eighteen hours from the time such animal shall have been slaughtered. Nothing in this section contained shall apply to the carcase of any animal affected or believed by the Meat Inspector to be affected with any disease mentioned in section 10 of the said Regulation No. 42, nor to any carcase condemned under the said Regulation.

No. 42, nor to any carcase condemned under the said Regulation.

3. No person affected with a dangerous communicable disease shall slaughter, dress, tend, or in any way handle or touch any animal, carcase, or meat in the Abattoirs.

4. If the Meat Inspector, having reasonable grounds for believing that any person handling carcases or meat at the Abattoirs, or that any person engaged, employed, or about to be employed in the handling of carcases or meat at the Abattoirs is affected with a dangerous communicable disease, requests such person to submit himself for medical examination at the expense of the Council of the said City by the Health Officer thereof, either alone, or, if such person so desires, with any other duly qualified medical practitioner at the time practising in the said City, and nominated by such person, and such person refuses to submit himself to such examination, he shall not handle or engage in handling any carcases or meat at the Abattoirs.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS The Parliament of Victoria stands prorogued until Tuesday, the thirteenth day of April, 1915: Now, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Tuesday, the twentieth day of April, 1915, and I do hereby fix Tuesday, the twentieth day of April, 1915, aforesaid, as the time for the commencement and holding the next Session of the said Parliament of Victoria, for the despatch of business, at the hour of Two o'clock in the afternoon, in the State Parliament Houses, situate in the Carlton Gardens, in the City of Melbourne: And the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and in the fifth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.
