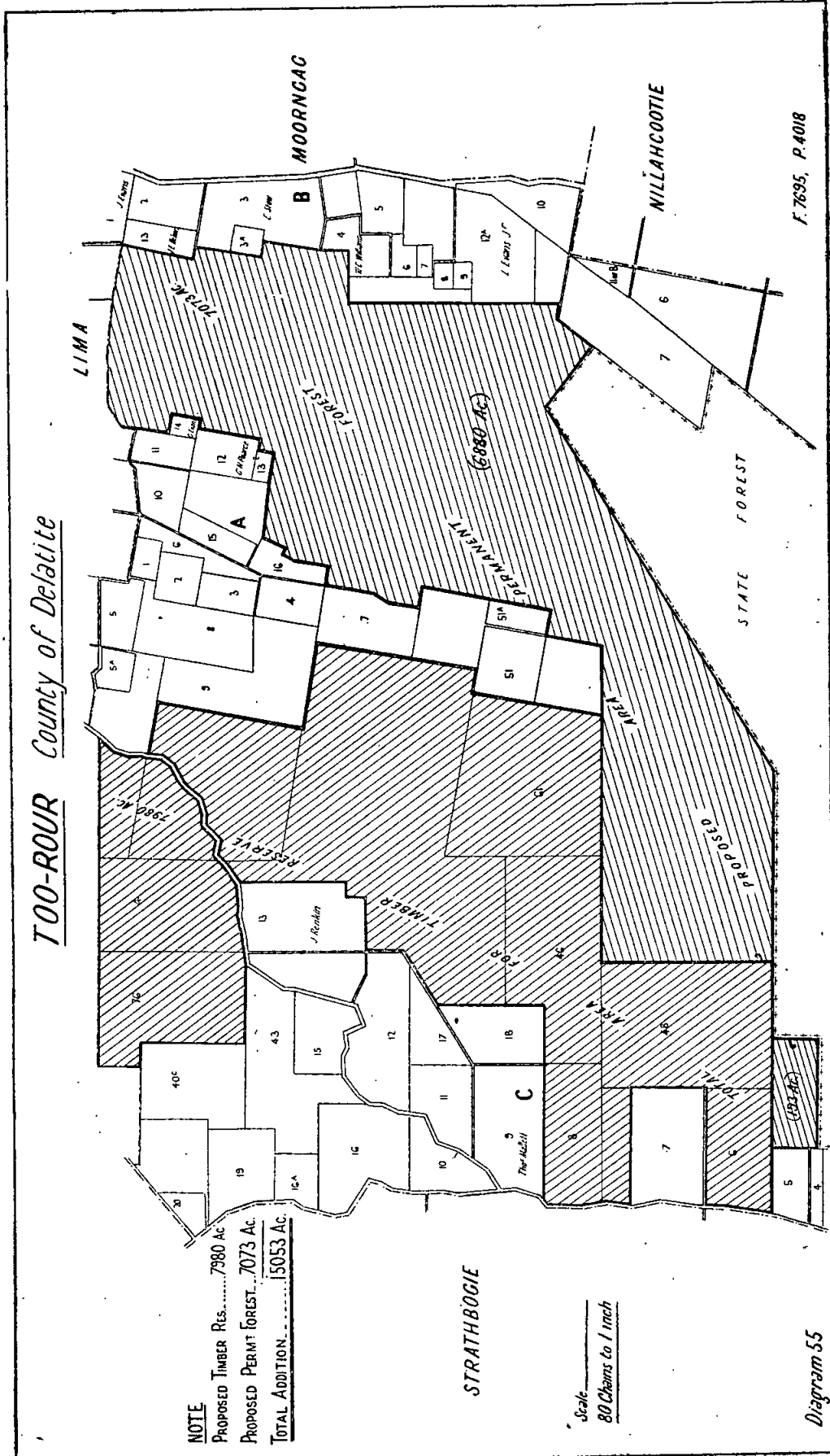

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, under the powers in that behalf contained in the *Upper Yarra Traffic Act 1909*, hereby repeal clauses 7 and 11 of the Regulations for the Control of Traffic, made by Proclamation dated the twelfth day of October, 1909, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 13th October, 1909, page 4555, and amended by Proclamations dated the thirtieth day of November, 1910, and the twelfth day of March, 1912, respectively, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 7th December, 1910, p. 5396, and 20th March, 1912, p. 1261, respectively, and do substitute the following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

PASSENGER BOATS PLYING OR LET FOR HIRE.

- (7) No person shall let any boat for hire unless he has taken all reasonable precaution to ascertain that a person competent to manage such boat is to be in charge thereof, nor shall any person let any boat for hire without first instructing the person taking charge of such boat as to the Rule of the River as set out in Regulations (10) and (11), nor shall he let any boat to a party any member of which is under the influence of liquor.

RULE OF THE RIVER.

- (11) Boats turning round or crossing from one side of the River towards the other shall be kept out of the way of boats proceeding up or down the River, and shall not be turned round or crossed from one side of the River to the other immediately in front of any approaching boat.

Any boat proceeding down the River to the boat-houses on the South bank near Prince's-bridge shall pass through the centre arch of Prince's-bridge before crossing the stream, and then return to the staging at such boat-houses through the South arch of such Bridge.

- (11a) Coaches of racing crews desirous of stopping a crew for the purpose of giving instruction shall bring the boat as close to the bank as possible before stopping it, and shall not cause any interference to any boat or boats following.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne and their successors in respect of Fawkner Park, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a public park and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Melbourne, and for no other purpose whatsoever. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Melbourne

do hereby make the following Supplementary Regulations in respect of the Tennis Courts in Fawkner Park:—

FAWKNER PARK TENNIS COURTS.

Regulations for the Management of the Courts.

1. The Tennis Courts in the Park shall be open from Six a.m. to sunset from the 1st October to 31st March, and from sunrise to sunset from 1st April to 30th September. The courts will not be open on Sundays.

2. The charges for playing on the courts are as follows:—

Monthly tickets for males, 2s. 6d.; for females, 2s.

For casual players—

Per Set—Single, 3d.

Do. Doubles, 6d.

3. The caretaker at the Lodge, Fawkner Park, is authorized to issue tickets and collect payment from all persons using the courts.

4. Players using the courts must exhibit their tickets at any time when requested to do so by the caretaker or by any officer or employé of the Trustees.

5. All players using the courts shall have equal rights in regard to playing thereon.

6. Players upon arrival must register their names on the notice boards at the courts.

7. The right to play shall be in the order of registration on the board.

8. Should other players be waiting to play on the courts in their turn, the players then using the courts must make way for them at the conclusion of the set then being played.

9. Tennis shoes must be worn by all persons using the courts.

10. Dressing rooms are provided for males and females, and these must be used only by players of the sex for which they are set apart.

11. Onlookers must not trespass on the courts, or dressing rooms, nor interfere with persons playing on the courts.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF CAMPERDOWN, KNOWN AS "LEURA RECREATION RESERVE."

WE, Frederick Wright, John Miller, Peter Alexander Nicol, and Thomas Harrison, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserves for Public Recreation in the township of Camperdown, known as the "Leura Recreation Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901:—

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence, may be charged for and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones or other missiles in the Reserve, or break or deposit glass bottles therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first being obtained.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first being obtained.

8. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. Any society or person renting or hiring any building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, fêtes, or other amusements may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding £10 (Ten pounds), which the Committee of Management may determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such building, erection, or enclosure, and the gates, fences, walks, trees, shrubs, plants, or other property in the Reserve during such renting or hiring, and the Committee of Management may make good any damage or loss sustained by such building, erection, enclosure, gates, fences, walks, trees, shrubs, plants, or other property during the period covered by the renting or hiring, and may deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited as aforesaid, and any society or person so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the Reserve, or the buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.

10. Children under ten (10) years of age shall not be admitted to the Reserve unless accompanied by and in charge of a competent person.

11. No person shall play, practise, train, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
