It is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation prescribing, for the species of fish mentioned hereunder, the sizes or lengths set opposite the names thereof, less than which it shall be unlawful for any person to take, attempt to take, sell, or consign, or expose for sale, or have in his possession, house or shop, or under his control, fish of such species, in lieu of the weights set opposite the names of such species of fish in the Second Schedule to the *Fisheries Act 1890*, or of the weights substituted for any of such weights by any subsequent Proclamation:—

The size or length of all such fish (except Garfish and Crayfish) shall be ascertained by measuring them overall, that is, from the point of the snout to the end of the tail; in the case of Garfish the length shall be ascertained by measuring from the tip of the upper jaw to the end of the upper half of the tail; and in the case of Crayfish by measuring from the rostrum or small central horn between the eyes to the end of the telson or central flap of the tail.

WHEREAS by the 52nd Section of the *Explosives Act 1890* it is enacted that notwithstanding anything in the first Part of the said Act the Governor in Council may from time to time by order prohibit either absolutely or subject to conditions or restrictions the manufacture, keeping, importation from any place out of Victoria, conveyance and sale, or any of them, of any explosive when in the judgment of the Governor in Council it is expedient for the public safety to make such order: And whereas in the judgment of the Governor in Council it is expedient for the public safety to make this Order: Now therefore, in pursuance of the above-mentioned provisions of the said Act, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria doth, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, order as follows:—

The undermentioned explosives shall not be manufactured except upon the conditions or restrictions herein-after set forth—

RACKAROCK AND LITHYTE.

1. No person shall manufacture rackarock unless he shall previously have obtained a licence to do so under the provisions of the *Explosives Act 1890*.

2. The Minister may issue to such persons as he may think fit licences authorizing the manufacture by such persons of the explosive known as rackarock.

3. The names of the ingredients to be used in the manufacture of the said explosive shall be mentioned in each licence: Provided that the said ingredients shall not be used in the manufacture of the said explosive unless the case, barrel, canister or other receptacle containing each such ingredient is marked with the name, as specified in the licence, of the ingredient it contains, and also with the name and address of the manufacturer of the said ingredient.

4. The manufacture of the said explosive shall not be carried on underground in any mine.

5. No person shall carry on the manufacture of the said explosive other than the person to whom the licence is issued, or some person in his employ duly authorized in writing by him.

6. If in any matter which is not provided for by any express condition or proviso in any licence, a Government inspector find any store for the said explosive, or for the ingredients which, when combined, constitute the said explosive, or any part thereof, or any thing or practice therein or connected therewith, to be unnecessarily dangerous or defective, so as in his opinion to tend to endanger the public safety or bodily safety of any person, such inspector may require the person to whom the licence is issued to remedy the same at once and without delay; and, if such person neglect to do so, such neglect shall be deemed a breach of these Regulations.

7. The Minister may, either with or without notice, at any time stop the manufacture of the said explosive by any licensed person provided he deem such stoppage necessary in the interest of public safety, or may, in the said interest, direct the licensee or his agent to alter or amend the process of manufacture in such manner as he or any person duly authorized by him in that behalf may direct.

8. The Minister may, by notice in writing, declare any such licence void upon being satisfied that the manufacture of the said explosive is not being conducted in accordance with the conditions of the licence or in accordance with the directions given in pursuance of the last preceding clause, and that the further continuance of its manufacture will imperil the public safety.

9. The conveyance of rackarock in any vehicle or boat, in or upon any public thoroughfare, river, harbor, or public place within Victoria is hereby prohibited.

10. The licence shall be valid to the person only to whom it is issued.

11. The above Regulations relating to rackarock shall apply in like manner to the explosive known as lithyte.

Every licence granted under section 187 of the *Land Act 1901* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

Conditions.

1. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. 9. That where improvements are authorized under section 189 of the *Land Act 1901* the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.

13. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

15. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the *Thistle Act 1890* in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA.

REGULATION No. 21.

A Regulation of the Borough of Wangaratta, numbered 21, made under section 1 of Part IX. of the 13th Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1903* in force in the borough by virtue of a By-law of the above-named borough numbered 22, regulating bathing within the borough.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Wangaratta make the following Regulation which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Wangaratta.

1. No person shall bathe in any portion of the borough unless properly clothed from the neck to the knee, so as to secure the observance of decency, in a Canadian bathing costume with kilt, such costume to be similar to the sample on view at the Town Hall and Police Station at Wangaratta, and any employé of the Council or any police constable, or any person authorized by the Council in writing, under the seal of the Council, may require any person contravening this provision to at once resume his or her ordinary clothes.

2. No person shall bathe in any portion of the King River within the borough except such portion as the Council may from time to time fix by resolution and indicate by notice exhibited on white posts erected on the banks of the said river.

3. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume in any place open to the public view.

4. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume in any place save the following, viz.—A dressing shed set apart by the Council, or any other dressing place duly authorized by the Council.

5. No male over the age of ten years shall trespass in or upon any dressing shed, bathing box, enclosure, bath, or latrine reserved for the use of females, and no female shall trespass in or upon any dressing shed, bathing box, enclosure, bath, or latrine reserved for males except for the purpose of rendering assistance in case of accident.

6. No person shall bring or deposit any empty or broken bottles, filth, rubbish, refuse, dead animals, or other offensive matter in or upon any enclosure or other place set apart or authorized by the Council, or used by the public for bathing purposes, or in the water adjacent thereto, or suffer or permit any filth, rubbish, refuse, or other offensive matter to run upon or into any such enclosure, place, or water.

7. In or upon any enclosure or other place set apart or authorized by the Council, or used by the public for bathing purposes—

(a) No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, riotous, or noisy manner to the annoyance of the public.

(b) No person shall blaspheme or use profane or obscene language or behave in an indecent manner.

8. A dressing enclosure or shed shall be used for dressing and undressing only. No person shall play games or loiter therein. No person shall damage, disfigure, or write in or upon any such enclosure or shed, or in or upon any other building or fence erected in or upon any place set apart for bathing purposes.

9. No persons clothed in bathing costume shall sit, lie, loiter on, or run along the banks of any river or stream within the borough.

10. The Council may, by resolution, fix, and from time to time alter, fees for the use of bathing and dressing accommodation and requisites, and for the safe custody of valuables.

11. No person, unless authorized by the Council, shall use, displace, play with, injure, or destroy any appliances or signal bells provided by the Council or by any volunteer life saving club, except such use or displacement be necessary for the purpose of saving life or such injury or destruction be caused while being used for such purpose and incidental to such use.

12. The Council may, at their discretion, authorize any volunteer life saving club—

(a) To provide and use life-saving appliances and boats.

(b) To use any such appliances provided by the Council, and

(c) To erect and remove from place to place danger notices.

13. Where any life-saving appliances are in use, either by members of the police or by any volunteer life-saving club for the saving of life, any employee of the Council or any police constable or any person authorized by the Council may—

(a) If he considers that the work is hampered by too many persons assisting, or for any reason, direct any person to cease assisting.

(b) Direct any person to stand back from the field of operations, and every person so directed shall obey.

14. No person shall bathe any dog or other animal, or cause or entice any dog or other animal to swim in or enter any water set apart or used by the public for bathing purposes, and no person in charge of any dog or other animal shall permit the same to enter or swim in such water.

15. The Council may from time to time, by resolution to be published once in a local newspaper, prohibit bathing in any enclosure or place set apart or used for bathing in the Ovens River or in the King River, or in any part of either of such rivers, or in any other open or exposed stream, river, or place within the borough, altogether or between such hours as the Council may deem proper.

16. The Council may, in writing under its seal, authorize any person to carry out the provisions of this Regulation, and to prosecute on behalf of the Council any person or persons offending under this Regulation.

2. For every such registration, and for every renewal thereof, there shall be paid to the Town Clerk of the Borough of Wonthaggi, in aid of the funds of the said borough, by persons for whom such registration shall be made, the sum of One pound.

3. Suitable appliances for the extinction of fire must be provided, and the attendance of two firemen must be engaged during entertainments for the proper using of such appliances.
