NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PRESCRIBE MINIMUM LENGTHS IN LIEU OF MINIMUM WEIGHTS FOR CERTAIN SPECIES OF FISH.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation prescribing, for the species of fish mentioned hereunder, the sizes or lengths set opposite the names thereof; less than which it shall be unlawful for any person to take, attempt to take, sell or consign, or expose for sale, or have in his possession, house, or shop, or under his control fish of such species, in lieu of the weights set opposite the names of such species of fish in the Second Schedule to the *Fisheries Act* 1890, or of the weights substituted for any of such weights by any subsequent Proclamation:—

Blackfish—8½ inches.
Flounder—9 inches.
Luderick—8½ inches.
Mackerel—10½ inches.
Murray Cod—15 inches.
Rock Cod—8½ inches.
Salmon Trout—8 inches.
Trumpeter—9 inches.

The size or length of all such fish shall be ascertained by measuring them overall, that is, from the point of the snout to the end of the tail.

TOWN OF BRIGHTON.

BY-LAW NO. 69.—REMOVAL OF HOUSE REFUSE.

A By-law of the Town of Brighton, made under the provisions of the *Health Act* 1890, and numbered 69.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1890, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Brighton order as follows:—

1. Every occupier of premises, within the Town of Brighton shall provide or cause to be provided and kept therein a ratproof and flyproof receptacle made of some non-absorbent material, the contents of such receptacle shall not be less than one and a half cubic feet nor more than four and a half cubic feet.

2. Every such occupier shall—

- Cause all refuse or garbage receptacles in use on his premises, and the covers thereof, to be kept as clean as possible;
- Cause such receptacles to be sufficiently disinfected with some efficient disinfectant and deodorant when necessary;
- Cause such receptacles to be maintained in good order and condition;
- Cause all refuse and garbage arising from or upon such premises from time to time to be deposited in such receptacles;
- Cause such receptacles to be continuously covered save when refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom; and
- Cause such receptacles to be placed in the yard of such premises close to the entrance from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such premises abut once a week on such day in each week as may from time to time be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse or garbage.

3. No person shall place or cause to be placed any receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.

4. No person shall place or cause to be placed or deposited any refuse, garbage, or garden refuse, in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Town of Brighton.

6. This By-law shall come into force on the 1st day of April, 1915.

7. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, or if such breach be a continuing act or default to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds nor less than Five shillings for each and every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

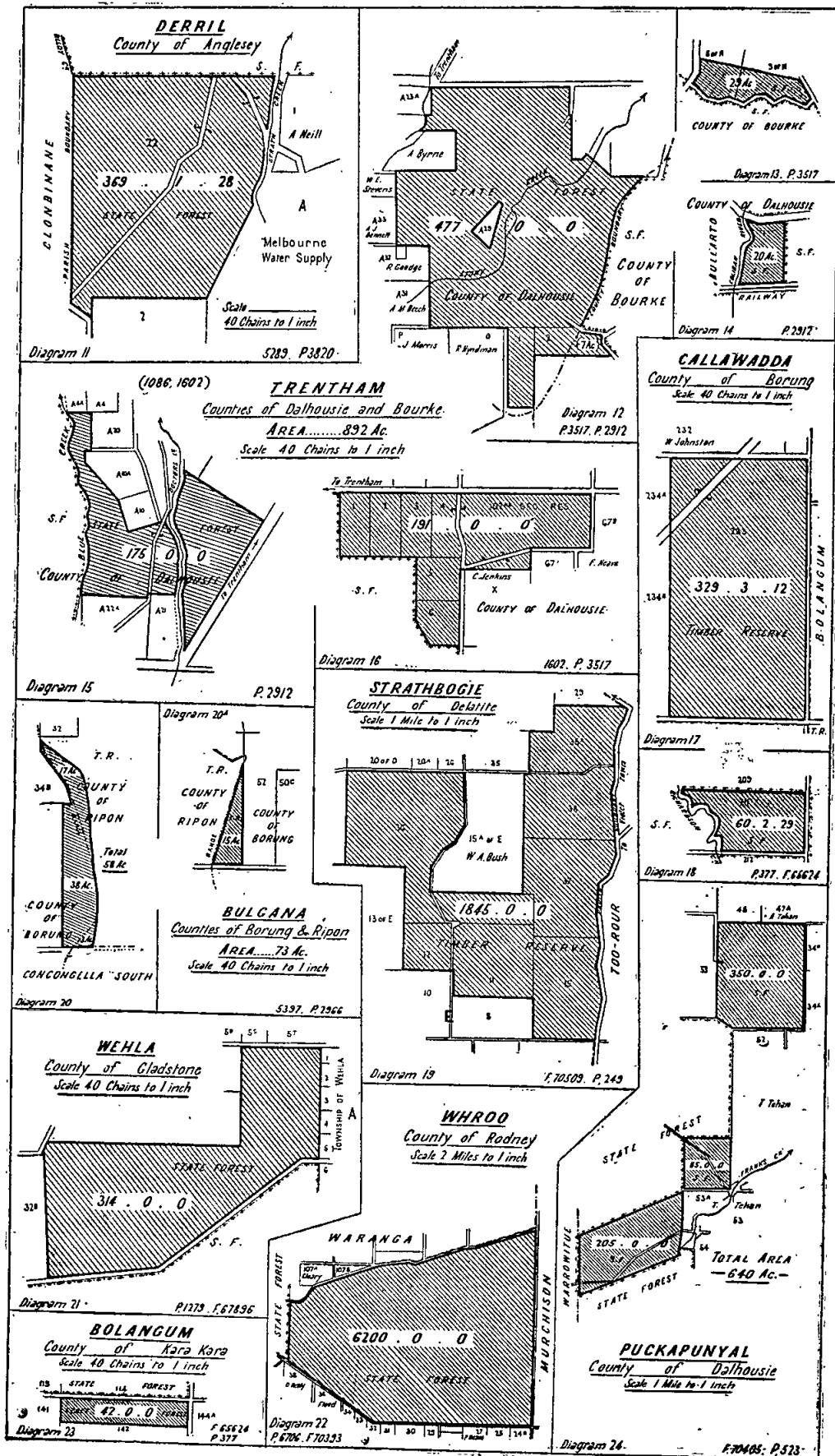

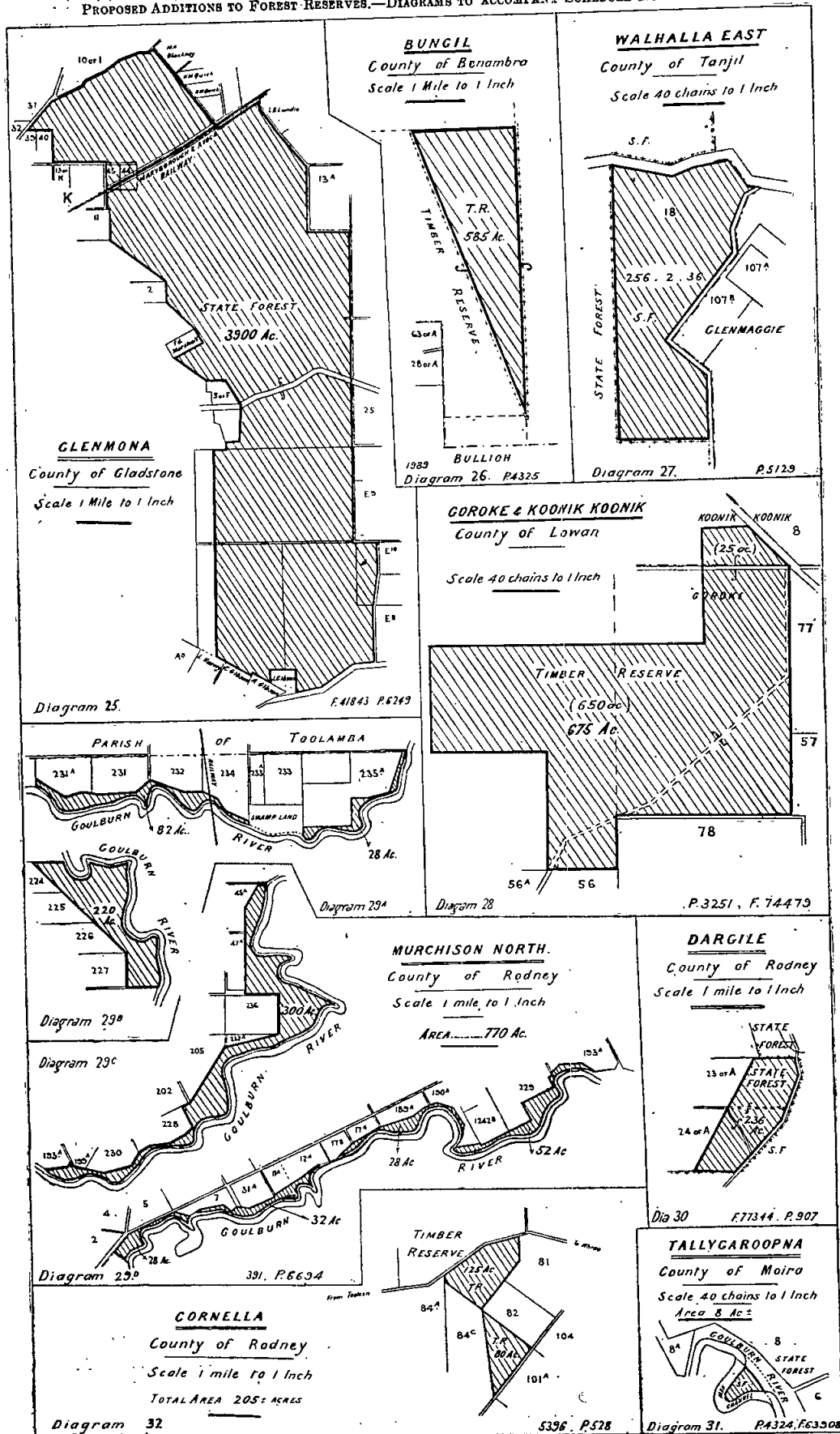

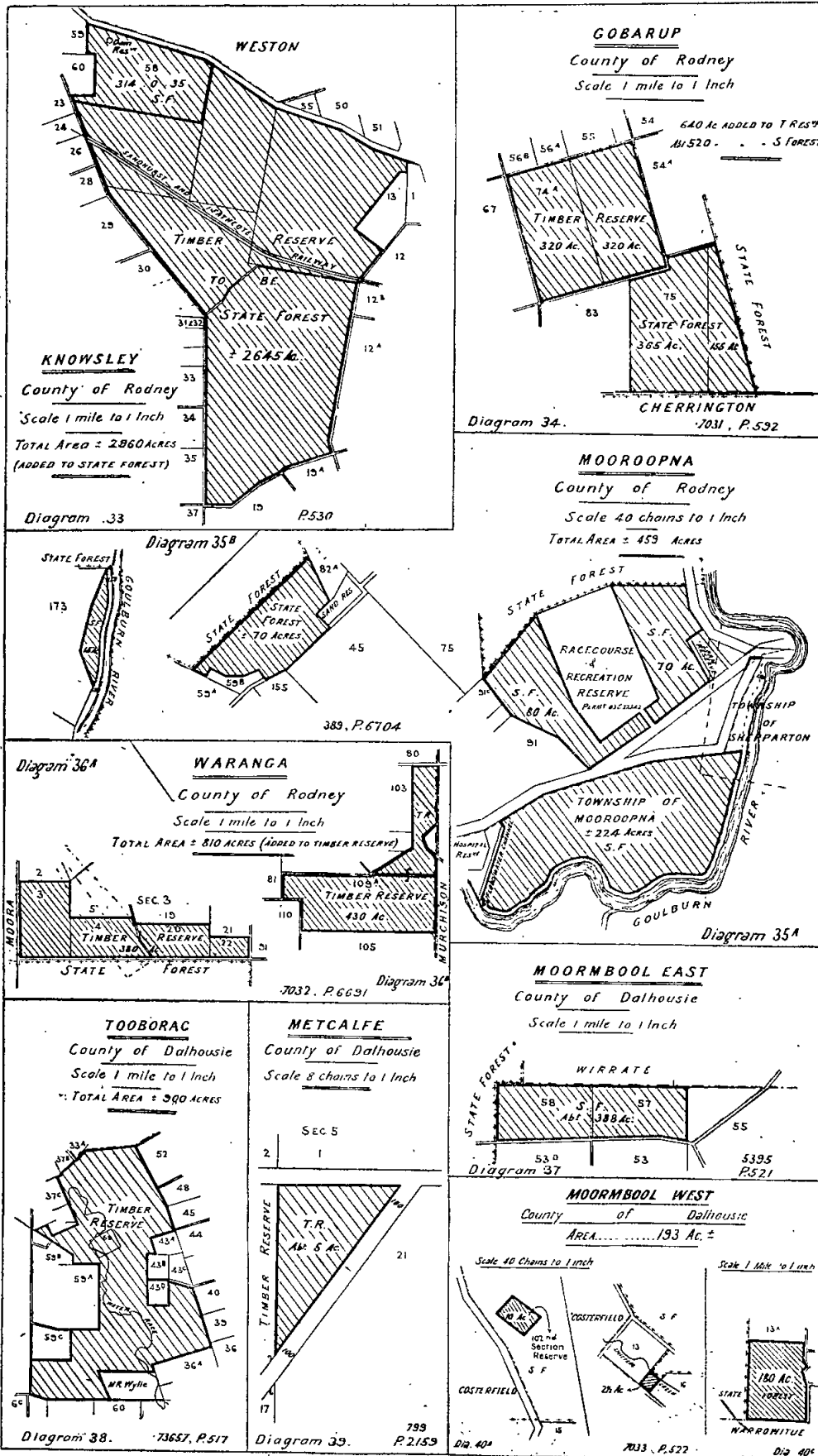
PROPOSED ADDITIONS TO FOREST RESERVES.—DIAGRAMS TO ACCOMPANY SCHEDULE No. 12.

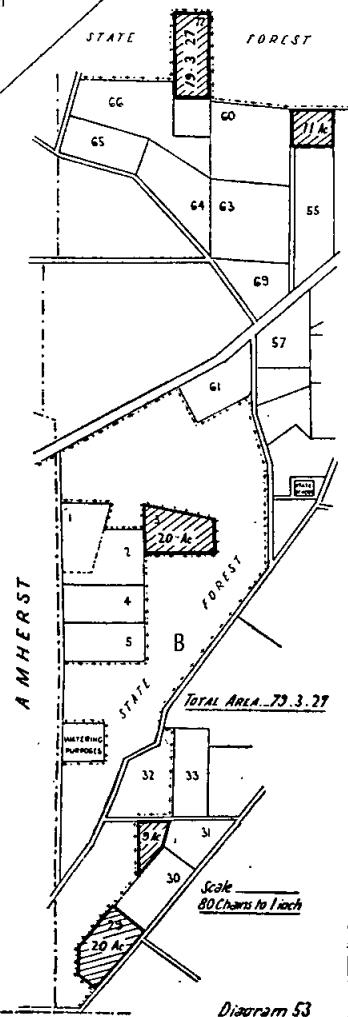

TONGALA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1915 WITHIN THE TONGALA URBAN DISTRICT.

THE Commissioners of the Tongala Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been duly proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1905*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1915, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rates and charges to be paid half-yearly, in advance, in equal moieties, on the first day of January and on the first day of July, 1915:—

(1) On every house or tenement vacant, or unoccupied land, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement or vacant or unoccupied land during the said year, the sum of Six shillings and threepence in the pound of such valuation, with a minimum of Thirty shillings.

(2) Water supplied to Government Departments, police stations, churches, court house, post office, State school, Shire hall, and similar properties, shall be charged by measurement or special arrangement.

(3) For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, the charge for every one thousand (1,000) gallons, or portion of same, to be at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand (1,000) gallons, with minimum of Sixpence for any one tank or load.

(4) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

BY-LAW No. 512.—RATE.—CARRUM WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, and in accordance with the provisions of an Order in Council bearing date the 31st March, 1915, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 9th April, 1915, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements within the respective divisions of the Waterworks District of the Carrum Waterworks Trust, as the same are respectively set out and described in the said Order in Council, bearing date the 31st March, 1915, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 9th April, 1915, that is to say:—

That the respective rates in the pound of the valuation of such lands and tenements in the said several divisions shall be—

- Division No. 1.—Forty-eight pence;
- Division No. 2.—Eighteen pence;
- Division No. 3.—Threepence;
- Division No. 4.—Fourpence;
- Division No. 5.—Twenty-four pence.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1915, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1915, and shall be payable on the 22nd day of April, 1915, at the office of the said Commission's collector at Dandenong.

3. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is, or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situated, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for the purposes of such rate be determined by a Police Magistrate.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE CLARKESDALE AND LYNCHFIELD COMMON.

IN pursuance of Regulations relating to common made by the Governor in Council on the 8th of January, 1902, the Managers of the Clarkesdale and Lynchfield Common, having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval of the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miner's rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or portion thereof, in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follows, and shall be payable quarterly, in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year:—For every horse, 6s. per annum, and for every head of other large cattle, 4s. per annum. For every head of small cattle, 3s. per annum. For every goat, 2s. per annum. Progeny under six months old of stock depasturing on the common, free.

3. All stock upon which the prescribed fees shall remain unpaid for a period of seven days shall be liable to be impounded.

4. No bull or entire horse shall be depastured on the common without the permission, in writing, of the managers.

5. The managers of the common shall appoint certain times and places for registering and branding stock, and shall give due notice thereof, and the managers or the herdsman shall attend at such times and places for the purpose aforesaid, and all persons desirous of depasturing stock upon the common shall be in attendance therewith, at the times and places appointed, for the purpose of giving a full and correct description of such stock and assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such stock before the same shall be registered or branded with the common brand.

6. All stock, except travelling sheep or cattle, found upon the common without the common brand thereon, shall be deemed to be trespassing thereon, and shall be liable to be impounded forthwith by the herdsman.

7. No person shall remove any stock from the common without having first given notice to, and obtained permission in writing to do so, from the managers or herdsman of the common.

8. The managers shall not be responsible for loss or injury to any stock depasturing on the common, but shall, by their herdsman, take every possible care of such stock, and in the event of loss thereof, or injury thereto, shall give to the owners of such stock every information and assistance.

9. The managers shall cause to be removed from the common all diseased stock, or stock which by a competent person shall be deemed to be diseased and dangerous to the health of other stock on the common, and the owner of such diseased stock shall be required to keep same off the common, and should the owner thereof refuse or neglect to do so, the managers may cause such diseased stock to be forthwith destroyed, and the owner thereof shall not be entitled to compensation.

10. The managers of the common shall be responsible for any damage done to property thereon, and shall obtain the permission of the Board of Lands and Works before proceeding with any works on the common.

11. No person shall wilfully injure, or destroy, or unnecessarily disturb or drive away from the common any stock legally depasturing thereon. Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

In certain schedules where doubt exists as to whether the articles enumerated may or may not be manufactured within the Commonwealth, double columns are inserted for the rates, "A" for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, and "B" for articles manufactured elsewhere.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is satisfactory and equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule and the rates charged are considered reasonable. Preference will also be given to articles of British manufacture as against those of foreign manufacture. In all cases (except where it is expressly provided in the schedule that goods of British or Commonwealth manufacture as the case may be are required) the country of origin of the article offered must be inserted in the schedule, otherwise the tender will be considered informal.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government Debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited, and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for—" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, which office they must reach by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. Substantial and effective preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is satisfactory and is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule. Preference will also be given to articles of British manufacture as against those of foreign manufacture.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office, and Williamstown district will include the Town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra. Supplies for s.s. *John Murray* must be delivered at the Railway Pier, Port Melbourne.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Clause 6, or the head of the Department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased. On no account must payments in cash be proffered by officers on the premises of the contractor.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned, on a legibly written business label.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any Department except the Commonwealth Departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department or such other department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with Clause 12. (In the case of the Commonwealth Departments, however, the Commonwealth consignment note only

which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under Clause 16 of these conditions.

12. Immediately after the consignment of the goods the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay, to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted, as in Clause 7.

13. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

14. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Clause 7.

15. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Clause 7.

16. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of Clauses 11 and 12 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Clause 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

17. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

18. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or violated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissioner or Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works, or State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, or on account of the Federal Government, or for the Railway Department, or for supplies for Technical High or Higher Elementary Schools, or for the Metropolitan Parks and Gardens, or for supplies to the Aborigines, or for connexions and fittings for Diamond Drills and Batteries; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

19. For the purpose of the contracts entered into under these conditions, it is hereby expressly provided that in the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter at his last-known place of business or abode.

20. As regards Contracts for Supplies used expressly for the Defence Department, however, it will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, to terminate the whole or any item of the contract by giving three full calendar months' notice, in writing, to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given as in Clause 19.

21. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in Clauses 19 and 20 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

22. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.

23. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor: the terms of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for, and the wages paid to any such person shall be in accordance with and subject to the terms and conditions specified in the schedules concerned; and a copy of the labour clauses thus indorsed on the schedules affected shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

24. Where expressly provided in the schedule, the contractor shall, before any account is passed for payment for services rendered, furnish a statutory declaration that all the workmen under the contract have been employed in accordance with Clause 23 of these conditions, and have been paid not less than the minimum rate of wages for such workmen as is provided for in the particular schedule.

A By-law of the City of St. Kilda made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 88, for preserving public decency and maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of St. Kilda.
