TRAINING OF TEACHERS FOR TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.

REGULATION XLII.

THE Minister may, on the recommendation of the Director, establish courses of training to be conducted in such Technical Schools and Junior Technical Schools as the Director may determine for persons desiring to qualify as teachers in Technical Schools.

- 2. These courses of training will be under the supervision of the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools, the Inspector of Technical Art, and such other officers as may be instructed by the Director to undertake such
- 3. Studentships will be awarded to qualified candidates from time to time by the Minister, who will determine the number of studentships to be granted in any school [in any year, and also the special branch of technical work to which the student shall devote himself.
- 4. The qualifications for candidates for studentships shall be-
 - (a) Candidates must not be less than sixteen (16) years of age.
 - (b) They must have passed successfully through the full course of study in a Junior Technical School or hold an approved equivalent qualification.
 - (c) They must produce a certificate from the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools, or from the head master or principal of a Technical School, that they exhibit aptitude and general suitability for the work of a teacher in a Technical School.

- (d) They must furnish satisfactory evidence of good moral character.
- (e) They must submit a certificate from a Schools Medical Officer, or a medical practitioner approved for this purpose by the Director that they are of sound constitution and free from any physical defect likely to impair their usefulness as teachers.
- 5. Where the number of qualified applicants is in excess of the number of studentships to be awarded, awards of studentships will be determined by a consideration of-
 - (a) The educational qualifications of the applicants as shown in their school records.
 - (b) The special qualifications of the applicants in respect of any special branch of technical work.
 - (c) The aptitude and general suitability of the applicants for the profession of teaching.
- 6. The awards of studentships will be made upon the recommendation of a committee, consisting of the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools, the Inspector of Technical Art, and a third person nominated by the Director.
- If it is deemed necessary, a competitive examination may be held in such subjects as the committee may determine.
- 7. The course of training for the Technical Schools Teachers Certificate shall extend over five (5) years, and shall include-
 - (a) Technical instruction in subjects connected with some trade.
 - (b) Workshop experience in an approved trade.
 - (c) The principles and practice of teaching.

During the currency of their studentships students will be required to attend such classes of instruction or per-form such duties as student teacher, or undergo such workshop or trade experiene as may be from time to time prescribed.

- 8. During their course of training students will receive an 8. During their course of training students will receive an annual allowance in the first year at the rate of £40 per annum, which will be subject to an annual increase at the rate of £10 per annum until a maximum of £80 is reached. The payment of each annual increment will be conditional upon a favorable report being received by the Director upon the progress of the student. A student will not receive an annual increment unless during the year he shall have passed the examination prescribed for that year of his trade course.
- Student teachers will be required each year to complete their corresponding technical examinations in the subjects prescribed for that year.
- 10. No student teacher may proceed to higher grades in any subject without having passed in the lower grades, except where special permission is given by the Director of Education.
- 11. Each student teacher will be required, as a condition of such studentship, to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety not to relinquish his course of training without the permission of the Minister, and for four (4) years after the termination of his studentship to teach in any school to which he may be appointed.
- 12. Student teachers who have completed their course of training and hold a Technical Teachers' Certificate will be eligible for appointment to positions on the staff of Junior Technical Schools and Technical Schools.
- 13. Students who pass in the complete trade course as prescribed, who are certified by the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools as having satisfactorily completed a sufficient amount of workshop practice under approved conditions, who have passed an examination approved by the Director in the theory and practice of teaching, and who have complied with the conditions in clause 10 above shall be granted the Technical School Teachers' Cartificate. Certificate.
