## Inter-State Destitute Persons Relief Act 1912. RECIPROCITY WITH QUEENSLAND.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Inter-State Destitute Persons Relief Act 1912*, it is provided that when in any State of the Commonwealth (other than Victoria) an Act is in force containing provisions substantially similar to those contained in and for carrying out objects substantially similar to the objects of section 6 of the said Act, the Governor may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that Part II. of the said Act shall be in force as regards such State; and by the said Act it is further provided that when in any State (other than Victoria) an Act is in force containing provisions substantially similar to those contained in or for carrying out objects substantially similar to the objects of Part III. and sections 21 to 23, both inclusive, of the said Act, the Governor may, by Proclamation published as aforesaid, declare that Part III. of the said Act shall be in force as regards such State; and that such Proclamations as aforesaid may be in the same or separate documents: And whereas in the State of Queensland an Act (to wit, an Act No. 9 of 1914, intitled "The Inter-State Destitute Persons Relief Act of 1914") is now in force containing provisions substantially similar to those contained in the said section 6 and provisions substantially similar to those contained in the said Part III. and the said sections 21 to 23, both inclusive: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State of Victoria, do hereby, by virtue of the power conferred by the said Act of Victoria, intitled the *Inter-State Destitute Persons Relief Act 1912*, declare that Part II. of the last-mentioned Act shall be in force as regards the said State of Queensland, and do also hereby, by virtue of the said power, declare that Part III. of the said last-mentioned Act shall be in force as regards the said State of Queensland.

#### DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.

##### RATING BY-LAW FOR 1915.

THE Dandenong Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

1st. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1915 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust District, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety, and become due on the 1st day of January, 1915.

2nd. On every house and tenement of an annual municipal value of under Eight pounds sterling (£8), the minimum sum of Ten shillings (10s.).

3rd. On every house and tenement of an annual municipal value of Eight pounds sterling (£8) or upwards, the sum of One shilling and threepence in the pound (£1) on the amount of the said valuation.

4th. On warehouses and wholesale stores, not being dwellings or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5th. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation shall be levied on all vacant land fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6th. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount which

the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8th. For water supplied to charitable institutions for gardens or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9th. For water supplied for cricket or bowling grounds, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10th. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12th. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13th. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brick work, or plastering.

#### STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 513.—AMENDING BY-LAW No. 1.—COLIBAN DISTRICT WATER SUPPLY.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission (hereinafter called "the Commission"), in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, doth hereby make the By-law following for the district supplied with water from the Coliban system of waterworks:—

That By-law No. 1, made by the Commission on the 16th day of July, 1906, be and is hereby amended by substituting for the thirtieth clause of the said By-law No. 1 the following:—

30. The charge to be paid for water supplied from the channels of the Commission, including that supplied for sluice mining, shall be One penny per 1,000 gallons, except in the cases hereinafter mentioned:—

- (1) For sluice mining by hand, without the aid of machinery or hose-jets and nozzles, one-third of a penny per 1,000 gallons.
- (2) For steam boilers, condensers, air compressors, and machinery for manufacturing purposes, Threepence per 1,000 gallons.

Pike	...	14 inches.
Red Mullet	...	8 inches.
Skipjack	...	9 inches.
Silver Bream	...	8½ inches.

The size or length of all such fish shall be ascertained by measuring them overall, that is, from the point of the snout to the end of the tail.

#### SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF FAWKNER PARK.

**WHEREAS** by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the city of Melbourne and their successors in respect of Fawkner Park, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used as and for a public park and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the colony (now State) of Victoria with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said city of Melbourne, and for no other purpose whatsoever. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the city of Melbourne do hereby make the following Supplementary Regulations in respect of the Tennis Courts in Fawkner Park:—

##### FAWKNER PARK TENNIS COURTS.

##### Regulations for the Management of the Courts.

1. The tennis courts in the park shall be open from Six a.m. to sunset from the 1st October to 31st March, and from sunrise to sunset from 1st April to 30th September. The courts will not be open on Sundays.
2. The charges for playing on the courts are as follow:—  
Monthly tickets for males, 2s. 6d.; for females, 2s.  
For casual players—Per set: Singles, 3d.; Doubles, 6d.
3. The caretaker at the lodge, Fawkner Park, is authorized to issue tickets and collect payment from all persons using the courts.
4. Players using the courts must exhibit their tickets at any time when requested to do so by the caretaker or by any officer or employee of the trustees.
5. All players using the courts shall have equal rights in regard to playing thereon.
6. Players upon arrival must register their names on the notice boards at the courts.
7. The right to play shall be in the order of registration on the board.
8. Should other players be waiting to play on the courts in their turn, the players then using the courts must make way for them at the conclusion of the set then being played.
9. Tennis shoes must be worn by all persons using the courts.
10. Dressing rooms are provided for males and females, and these must be used only by players of the sex for which they are set apart.
11. Onlookers must not trespass on the courts, or dressing rooms, nor interfere with persons playing on the courts.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PARK, WHICH, TOGETHER WITH PORTION OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE TOWN OF EUROA, ARE KNOWN AS "THE SEVEN CREEKS RESERVE."

**THE** Council of the Shire of Euroa, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the lands temporarily reserved for a Public Park, in the Town of Euroa, and portion of the lands adjacent thereto permanently reserved for Public purposes, and placed under the control of the said Council as a Committee of Management thereof, and which are together known as "The Seven Creeks Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901.

##### REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, improvements, trees, or other vegetation in the reserve, or light any fire therein.
3. No person shall climb over the fences or gates in or around the reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
4. No person shall bring into or put in the reserve any dogs, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, providing always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve and an account thereof rendered annually to the Board of Land and Works.
5. No person shall camp in the reserve or erect therein any dwelling or any booth or other structure, or offer for sale any article in the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
6. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees, shrubs, or grass.
7. No person shall bathe in any portion of the reserve except at that part of the strand or banks of the Seven Creeks extending from the Shire Bridge No. 1 to the small footbridge at the foot of Bury-street, in the township of Euroa, or such other portion as may hereafter be appointed by the Committee of Management.
8. Such portions of the Seven Creeks as aforesaid shall be open to the public for bathing purposes from 4 o'clock a.m. to 10 o'clock p.m. on week days, and from 4 o'clock a.m. to 10 o'clock a.m. on Sundays, and no person shall bathe therein at any other time.
9. No person shall bathe in such portion of the reserve unless attired from the neck to the knees in a proper Canadian two-piece bathing costume.
10. No person shall in bathing costume sit, lie, loiter, or run in such portion of the reserve outside a distance of twenty feet from the water's edge.

11. No person shall play any game in the reserve with a hard or solid ball, or contest any race or train therein, on Sundays.

12. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to such portion of the reserve as is set apart for a bathing place shall be as follows:—

For the admission of every person not under the age of sixteen years such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence; for the admission of every child over the age of six years and under the age of sixteen years, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF NAYOOK.

WE, John Young Woolstencroft, Andrew Wilson, Claude Neerim English, John Hopkins, and Francis William Blencowe, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the parish of Nayook, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901:—

##### REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the reserve, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and reserve.

11. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RACING, RECREATION, AND PUBLIC PARK PURPOSES, KNOWN AS THE CAULFIELD RACE-COURSE.

- (a) behaves in a riotous, indecent, offensive, threatening, or insulting manner, or
- (b) uses any threatening, abusive, or insulting words, or any person who has been convicted in a Court of competent jurisdiction of any of the offences set out in (a) and (b) of this Regulation on the said land, may be refused entrance to the said land, and may be expelled therefrom after being warned off by or on behalf of the Committee of the said Club, notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission to the said land, and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the said land or any part thereof.

No person who after having been informed of the decision of the said Committee to refuse the said person admission to the said land under the power given by this Regulation shall enter the said land or remain on the said land or any part thereof.

XXI. (B). On any day on which a race meeting is held any person who, in the opinion of the Committee of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club, is not a desirable person to be admitted, shall not be admitted to any of the divisions of the said land as set out in Regulation 2 of these Regulations, and may be expelled therefrom after having been warned off by or on behalf of the said Committee, notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission, and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the said land or any part thereof.

Regulation XXII. is hereby repealed, and the following Regulation substituted therefor:—

XXII. Any person who has been proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club to be a defaulter in payment of any bets, or to have been guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connexion with racing, or who has been disqualified by virtue of any Rules of Racing under which the said Club races, may be warned off the said land, or any part or division thereof, by the said Committee or by any person duly authorized by the said Committee in that behalf, notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission, or is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the said land or any part thereof.

#### PENALTIES.

Every person offending against any of the above Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the Trustees or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such officer or servant or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
