KERANG WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1915.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act* 1905, doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 16, Making a Rate for 1915.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements within the district of the Kerang Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house or tenement of the annual value of over Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of One shilling per 1,000 gallons will be charged, except in cases of special agreement.

For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, or the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement. Minimum charge, One pound.

The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the first day of January and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1915, and shall be due and payable on the first day of July, 1915.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the rates and charges hereby made.

PROVISIONS OF PART IV. OF THE ELECTORAL ACT 1910 APPLIED TO MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS—SHIRE OF VIOLET TOWN.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twentieth day of July, 1915.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Violet Town, has, by Order made on the twentieth day of July, 1915, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), directed that the provisions of Part IV. of the *Electoral Act 1910*, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedule, shall apply to the election of Councillors for the said Municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said Schedule, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

SCHEDULE.

PROVISIONS OF PART IV. OF THE ELECTORAL ACT 1910 APPLICABLE TO MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS, AND ALTERATIONS TO BE READ AS MADE THEREIN FOR THE PURPOSES OF SUCH APPLICATION.

Section 88 shall apply, omitting the word "elector" in the first line, and substituting therefor the word "ratepayer"; omitting the words "province or district" in the first line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality" after the word "held" in the second line, inserting the words "whose name appears on the Voters' Roll for such Municipality"; omitting all the words after the word "miles" where it appears in the third line down to the word "miles" where it appears in the fifth line; omitting the words "province or district" in the sixteenth and seventeenth lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "elector" in the twenty-fifth line, and substituting therefor the word "ratepayer"; omitting the whole of sub-section four.

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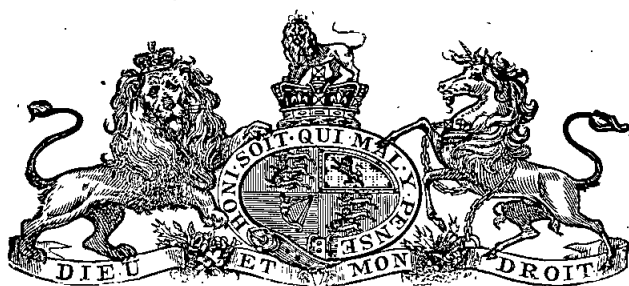

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE ENGINEERING BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than persons subject to the Determination of any Special Board heretofore constituted) wheresoever employed in the process trade or business of a mechanical engineer, including—

- (1) a patternmaker,
- (2) an iron and brass turner,
- (3) a fitter,
- (4) a blacksmith,
- (5) a coppersmith,
- (6) a planer,
- (7) a slotter,
- (8) a borer,
- (9) a milling machiner,

has made the following Determination :—

NOTE.—The Resolution for the appointment of the Engineering Board was passed by the Legislative Assembly on the 1st, and by the Legislative Council on the 7th, December, 1910. On the 4th January, 1911, Act No. 2305 came into force, and the effect of the provisions of section 14 is that any of the persons enumerated below, wheresoever employed, in the process or business of a mechanical engineer, shall be paid the rates determined by this Board, notwithstanding that any other Special Board has fixed prices or rates for such persons.

1. That the previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 24th August, 1915. The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder :—

APPRENTICES.

"Apprentice" means any person under twenty-one years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship or any person over twenty-one years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2386, Section 5.)

NOTE.—The Engineering Board has prescribed a form of apprenticeship agreement. Section 187 requires that the indentures must be in that form.

IMPROVERS.

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over twenty-one years of age, or who being over twenty-one years of age holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2386, Section 5.)

- (b) The higher rate to be paid for each hour or fraction of an hour worked by any employee before or after his shift shall be time and a half calculated on the rates fixed for the Day Shift.

ALLOWANCES.

6. Persons employed outside employer's works on old work shall be paid 1½d. per hour extra.

SPECIAL RATES.

7. That double time shall be the special rate for all work done on—

Sunday ;
 Good Friday ;
 Easter Monday ;
 Foundation Day (26th January) ;
 Eight Hours Day (21st April) ;
 Christmas Day ;
 Boxing Day ;
 New Year's Day ;

but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable on the day so substituted.

PIECE-WORK.

8. The Board determines under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1912*, No. 2386, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the bolt and nut making and the spring making departments, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions ; and that such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the minimum wage fixed for the department in which such worker is employed.
