FEES PAYABLE ON SUCCESSFUL VACCINATION, ON REGISTRATION OF THAT FACT AND FOR CERTIFICATE OF INSUSCEPTIBILITY.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred upon the Governor in Council by section 192 of the *Health Act 1890*, to make, among other purposes, Regulations directing what fees shall be paid to an officer appointed under Part IX. of the same, or to any Registrar for the registration of cases of successful vaccination, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth make the Regulation following (that is to say):—

1. The Regulations made by the Governor in Council on or about the 13th day of July, 1875, and gazetted in the *Government Gazette* of the 23rd of the same month, page 1395, relating to the fees the subject of this present Regulation are hereby revoked.

2. Every public vaccinator appointed under the provisions of Part IX. of the *Health Act 1890* or any other Act thereby repealed, shall be paid the sum of Two shillings and sixpence for each person who shall be successfully vaccinated by him such person not having been previously successfully vaccinated.

3. In the case of any child who not having been previously successfully vaccinated is treated with the result that such child is after three attempts found to be insusceptible to successful vaccination the public vaccinator aforesaid giving the certificate required by the *Health Act* as to such child's non-susceptibility shall be paid the sum of Two shillings and sixpence with respect to his service in connexion with such attempts.

4. Each Registrar of Births, Deaths, and Marriages shall be paid the sum of One shilling for the registration of each case of successful primary vaccination duly registered by him in accordance with the provisions of Part IX. of the *Health Act 1890*.

And the Honorable James Drysdale Brown, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SCHEDULE.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the Education Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1086), and section 29 of Act No. 2301, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind clauses 5 and 6 of Regulation II.—The Standard of Education and the Certificate of Merit—and make the following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION 11B.

Qualifying Examination and the Merit Certificate.

The Qualifying Examination shall be held and the Merit Certificate awarded to candidates from State Schools under the conditions set out hereunder:—

A.

1. *Qualifying Examination*.—The examination shall be held upon the course of study prescribed for Grade VI. Provided that any candidate who has failed to pass the examination on the work of Grade VI. may be examined in the whole or any portion of the work of Grade VII. in a subsequent year in order to complete the examination.

2. Every pupil in Grade VI. who has been not less than nine months in that Grade, shall be presented as a candidate for the Qualifying Examination. In exceptional cases, the Inspector may, at his discretion, allow candidates who have been less than nine months in Grade VI. to sit for the Qualifying Examination.

3. *Merit Certificate*.—A pupil shall be entitled to the Merit Certificate who—

- (a) has passed the Qualifying Examination, and
- (b) subsequently to completion of the course of study for Grade VI. has completed satisfactorily an approved course of study extending over not less than two years prescribed for Grades VII. and VIII. in Elementary Schools or equivalent. Any year of the course of study prescribed for High Schools, Higher Elementary Schools, Junior Technical Schools, or Domestic Arts Schools shall be deemed to be equivalent for one year's work in the Elementary Schools, and
- (c) are recommended by the Head Teacher of the school in which they are enrolled, and such recommendation is confirmed by the Inspector of Schools.

4. In exceptional cases, a Merit Certificate may be awarded to candidates who have completed satisfactorily approved courses of less than two years, or to candidates who produce evidence of having satisfactorily passed through an approved course of study equivalent to that set out in 3 (b) above.

B.

1. A Merit Certificate shall be granted to candidates from Registered Primary Schools who pass a satisfactory examination in the following subjects:—English, including Reading, Poetry, Spelling, Writing, Composition, Grammar, Elementary Mathematics or Arithmetic, Mental Arithmetic, History, Geography, Elementary Science, Drawing, and Occupations as prescribed for Grade VIII.

2. With the approval of the Director candidates from State Schools may be allowed to present themselves for the examination indicated in B, clause 1, and upon passing satisfactorily, they shall be granted a Merit Certificate.

And the Honorable T. Livingston, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
