BY-LAW 15.

After the words "City of Melbourne" add "or at the Institution, Cheltenham."

BY-LAW 16.

That the words "The Committee shall meet" to the words "transaction of business" at the commencement of this By-law, be deleted, and that the words "The Committee shall meet on the second and fourth Thursday in each month, at such time and place as the Committee may from time to time appoint. Four members shall constitute a quorum for transaction of business" be substituted.

BY-LAW 20.

That this By-law be cancelled, and that the following By-law be substituted as By-law 20:—

"There shall be two standing sub-committees, each consisting of not less than three members: First, the House Committee, whose duties shall be to inspect the several wards and other parts of the Institution, to inquire into the condition of the inmates, the character and quality of the provisions and other articles supplied to the Institution, and, in conjunction with the paid medical officer, ascertain if any of the inmates are in a fit state for employment or to leave the Asylum, and to report thereon to the General Committee; also, to offer suggestions from time to time as to necessary repairs, alterations, or improvements. Second, the Finance Committee, whose duties shall be to examine all books and recommend all accounts for payment after due examination, examine accounts when paid, and generally to investigate the books and accounts of the Institution."

BY-LAW 21.

At the end of this By-law add the words "Old Asylum Trust Account and also Kiosk Account or any other account a majority of the General Committee (not less than ten members being present) may think fit to make."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to further amend the *Supreme Court Act 1890*."

"An Act to provide for Special Loans by the Treasurer of Victoria to Municipalities."

"An Act to provide for the Construction and Management of certain Tramways in the Municipal Districts of Fitzroy Northcote and Preston and for other purposes."

"An Act relating to the Unauthorized Use of the Royal or other Arms and to the Issue of False or Misleading Process and other Documents."

"An Act to authorize the Geelong Harbor Trust Commissioners to convey certain Land and to Grant an Easement of Carriage-way appurtenant thereto over certain other Land as a Gift for Defence Purposes to the Commonwealth of Australia and for other purposes."

SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE.

BY-LAW NO. 36 (BUILDING REGULATIONS).—REGULATING AND RESTRAINING THE ERECTION AND CONSTRUCTION OF BUILDINGS, ERECTIONS OR HOARDINGS, AND OTHER PURPOSES.

Title.—A By-law of the Shire of Bairnsdale made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903* and numbered 36 and also regulations made under the provisions of Part 5 of the 13th Schedule to such Act for:

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings.
- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections, or hoardings.
- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to this By-law or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, or hoardings, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under such regulations and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.
- (e) And for repealing all by-laws and regulations if any inconsistent herewith.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903* the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bairnsdale do order as follows:—

1. *Commencement of Operation.*—That this By-law shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and the day after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

2. *Extent of Operation.*—This By-law shall apply only to that part of the municipality described in Schedule 1.

3. *Mandate.*—No person shall build or cause or permit to be built any building or any addition to any building contrary to the provisions of this By-law; but no part of this By-law shall be applicable to any Government buildings works or operations.

4. *Submission of Plans, &c., before building.*—No person shall build or cause or permit to be built any building or any addition to any building, without first submitting to and lodging with the Council through its Shire Secretary plans and specifications of the proposed building or addition including a block plan and without first obtaining a permit in writing from the Council or its Building Surveyor to build such building or addition, which permit the Council may revoke after three months from date thereof if such building or addition be not proceeded with to the satisfaction of the Council. Plans and specifications shall be returned to the person lodging same after due inspection by the Council or its Building Surveyor.

5. *Requirements for Plans, &c.*—All plans and specifications of any building or any addition to any building submitted must be legible and intelligible to scales in case of plans not less than one-eighth of an inch to the foot for constructive plans and not less than 40 feet to the inch for locality or block plans (except by permission in writing of the Building Surveyor) and such plans and specifications must show or state the purpose for which the building or addition is intended to be used as well as all details of construction including sizes and qualities and descriptions of all materials proposed to be used, the position of the proposed building or addition relative to nearest contiguous buildings, erections, fences or hoardings (if any such buildings, &c., exist within 80 feet of any part of the proposed building or addition) and to cross streets, lanes and rights-of-way, to street alignments and to the boundary lines of land not in the same occupation; and also shall show, state or describe the proposed drainage arrangement, and the name and address of the owner of the land on which it is proposed to build, and where necessary to comply with the provisions of this By-law and, if deemed necessary by the Building Surveyor, an estimate of the cost of the building or addition shall accompany the plans and specifications. Plans or specifications must be firmly written or drawn in ink or by some indelible process, and must not be in pencil or other alterable medium. The copy of the plans and specifications that has been marked as approved by the Council or its Building Surveyor with all requisitions by the Council or its officers thereon must be kept at the building referred to where

practicable and shall be available for inspection by the Council's officers concerned at all reasonable times on demand during the construction of the building or addition and must be kept available until final inspection by the Building Surveyor.

6. *Fees Payable before building.*—No person shall commence any building or any addition to any building without having first paid to the Council such fees as are provided therefor in and by this By-law.

7. *Fire-proofing dwelling houses—Fire-proofing roofs inside a certain area.*—The interiors of all walls and ceilings of every building and of every addition to any building which is intended to be used or shall or may be used as a dwelling wholly or in part shall be built in brick, stone, or concrete, or finished with lath and plaster, wood, iron, or other approved fire-resisting material, and the roof of every building, or addition, or outhouse within the area described in Schedule 2 shall be composed of slates, tiles, iron, or other non-inflammable material, and no building or addition to any building whose outer walls or roof consists of canvas, calico, hessian, or similar inflammable material shall be erected. Provided that for temporary or for health purposes the Shire Secretary or Building Surveyor may permit in writing the erection of tents, marquees, and the like upon payment of the prescribed fees and upon satisfaction that all reasonable requirements for the safety of the public and neighbours have been attended to.

8. *Removal and re-erection of houses.*—No person shall remove or transport or cause or permit to be removed or transported any building whether in whole or in part either into the part of the municipality described in Schedule 1 hereof or from one place to another within that part, without first obtaining the consent of the Council or its Building Surveyor in writing; and every building so removed or transported shall be so erected as to comply with all the provisions of this By-law and in good repair.

9. *Quality, &c., of materials.*—All materials used for any building or any addition must be of quality sufficiently good of their kind as to satisfy a reasonable architect, and if second-hand must be of such an origin and in such a condition as not to be reasonably suspected by the Building Surveyor of being dangerous to health or safety whether of life or limb or to the stability of the building, and all workmanship and design shall be of such quality as to reasonably insure the stability of the building and the safety of life, limb and adjoining property.

10. *Wooden Buildings, distances from neighbours and alignments.*—Within the area described in Schedule 1 hereto no wooden building or wooden addition to any building shall be constructed, erected or placed at a less distance than 20 feet from any street frontage, nor at a less distance than 10 feet from the boundary of the land, save and except as hereinafter provided. Nothing herein shall prevent the erection of a building partly of stone, &c., and partly of timber and in that case the timber part shall be governed by the provisions of this section.

11. *Iron Buildings, distances from neighbours and alignments.*—Within the area described in Schedule 1 hereto no iron building or addition shall be constructed, erected, or placed at a less distance than 20 feet from any street frontage nor at a less distance than 10 feet from the boundary of the land.

12. *Additions to wooden or iron buildings.*—Notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary hereto—

Additions may be made to any wooden or iron buildings existing prior to the commencement of this By-law provided that, and only if, after the completion of such additions, the whole building, inclusive of such additions, is at least 20 feet from any street frontage and if the whole structure be wooden at not less distance than 20 feet from any other wooden building and if the whole structure be iron at not less distance than 10 feet from any other building.

13. *Hoardings.*—No person shall, within the area described in Schedule 1, construct, erect, or place, or cause to be constructed, erected, or placed, any hoarding for any purpose within a distance from a public highway equal to its own height from the ground without first obtaining the consent in writing of the Council or its officer duly authorized in that behalf.

14. *Minimum area of buildings.*—No person shall build, or cause, or permit to be built any building or any addition to any building in the area described in Schedule 3 hereto unless such building or such addition, including the original building, if otherwise in compliance with this By-law, covers an area of at least 1,000 superficial feet in the case of residences, and 300 superficial feet in the case of buildings used as offices and shops, solely, exclusive of all detached buildings, outhouses, &c., or where two or more buildings are built attached

unless each component and separate part covers an area of at least 800 superficial feet in the case of dwellings and 200 superficial feet in the case of buildings used solely as offices or shops, exclusive of all detached out-buildings.

15. *Semi-detached houses, &c.—Party Walls, &c.*—Two or more dwellings or buildings may be erected in one block on land belonging to the same owner provided that they may be built in accordance with sections 10, 11, 12, or that the walls or party walls between each shall be carried up at least 1 foot above the main or verandah roof covering or gutter adjoining and shall project in the case of wooden fronts at least 1 inch beyond the face of any woodwork or spouting and the party walls must be at least 9 inches thick of brick, stone, or concrete.

16. *Minimum back yard area.*—Every building hereafter built or added to must have an enclosed back yard or open space of at least 450 square feet exclusive of any buildings thereon unless all the rooms of such building can be lighted and ventilated from a street or right-of-way. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any building as to which the Council is satisfied that it can and will only be used for commercial or business purposes.

17. *Existing Structures altered or added to.*—If any structure existing at the time of commencement of this By-law be afterwards taken down or demolished by the height of one story or, if a wall, for a space equal to one-quarter its area then every part of such building or wall must, if not in compliance with this By-law, be taken down and if rebuilt be built to comply with this By-law, and no structure existing at the time of commencement of this By-law shall be added to unless the structure as a whole including the addition will comply with this By-law.

18. *Alignment.*—Within the whole area to which this By-law refers all buildings shall be built with their fronts not nearer the street alignment than the general line of other buildings in the same street as, and if, established by the Council, by resolution and on corner allotments the owner may elect on which street he shall front and then shall build the side of his building facing the side street not nearer the street alignment than the general line so established of the side street.

19. *Heights of habitable Rooms.*—Every habitable room hereafter built or re-built in every house used in whole or part as dwelling, except rooms wholly or partly in the roof, shall be in every part at the least 10 feet high from the floor to the ceiling but in habitable rooms under a skillion roof the least height from floor to ceiling shall be 8 ft. 6 in., and every habitable room wholly or partly in the roof shall be at least 8 feet in height from the floor to the ceiling over half the area of the room at least.

20. *Seclusion of Privies.*—No privy, closet, or urinal shall be erected at a less distance than 6 feet from the door or window of any dwelling-house whatever or at a less distance than 2 feet from any street, road, or fence, provided however that this shall not apply, if such privy, closet, or urinal is cut off for its full height from the door, window, street, road, or fence by a 9-in. brick, stone, or concrete wall, or approved equivalent.

21. *Fowl-houses, Stables, &c.*—No fowl-house, stable, nor cow-shed, or other animal stalls, or the like, shall be erected at a less distance than 25 feet from any building whatever used as a dwelling, nor shall any fowl-house, stable, or cow-shed be erected except to the rear of any dwelling-house on the allotment in a position approved by the Council or its Building Surveyor.

22. *Exemption of certain minor Structures.*—The provisions of the By-law shall not apply to any fence, green-house, detached conservatory, aviary, nor to temporary offices and sheds used by builders at the site of a building in course of erection and demolished within one month of completion of the said building.

23. *Entry and Inspection.*—The Building Surveyor or his deputy may at all reasonable times during the progress and for fourteen days next after notification in writing by the person concerned of completion of any building or addition to any building may and he or they is or are hereby authorized to enter and inspect such building or addition and shall be afforded by all persons concerned all reasonable facilities for such entry and inspection, and the owner, builder, or architect, as the case may be, shall produce to the officer described both the original plans and specifications as approved and also the contract documents (if any) when demanded, and notice in writing of the completion of any building or any addition to any building must be lodged forthwith with the Shire Secretary by the owner, builder, or person responsible under this By-law.

24. *Distances, how measured.*—All distances shall be measured from the verandah or other projection of a building nearest to the point or line or building measured to.

25. *Council may require demolition, &c.*—If any building shall be partly or wholly built contrary to the provisions of this By-law, the Council, by its Shire Secretary, Building Surveyor, or other authorized agent, may give to the owner or builder or leave upon the site of such building, fourteen days' notice in writing to bring such building into conformity with the said provisions, or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building, and if default shall be made in complying with such notice, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said Council, by its Building Surveyor or other authorized agent, to enter upon such building and on the site thereof, with a sufficient number of workmen, and for that purpose to break down any fences surrounding the land on which such building is situate, and to demolish and pull down the said building, or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place, and, if the Council in its discretion thinks fit, to sell the same in such a manner as it thinks fit, and all expenses incurred by the Council, its Shire Secretary, Building Surveyor, or other authorized agent in demolishing and pulling down the said building, or any part thereof, or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing such other acts as aforesaid, and all fees and penalties due by the owner or builder thereof, may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale, and the Council shall restore any surplus (if any) arising from such sale to such owner or builder, or other person legally entitled thereto, on demand.

26. *Fees.*—Fees payable under this By-law shall be as under:—

(a) For all new buildings or additions thereto, or old buildings re-erected or removed, four rooms and less, 10s.

For all new buildings or additions thereto, or old buildings re-erected or moved, over four rooms and not exceeding seven, 15s.

For all new buildings or additions thereto, or old buildings re-erected or moved, over seven rooms, £1.

Each stable, shed, or outhouse, not erected at the time of above, 5s.

(b) For every permit to build, erect, or construct any verandah or hoarding, the sum of 5s.

(c) But in no case shall the fees payable in respect of any one building exceed in all the sum of £2.

27. *Interpretative Clause.*—The following words or expressions whenever used in this By-law shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively so far as such meanings are not excluded by context, that is to say:—

"Council" shall mean the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale.

"Shire Secretary" shall mean the Shire Secretary or Acting Shire Secretary for the time being of the Shire of Bairnsdale.

"Building Surveyor" shall mean Building Surveyor for the time being of the Shire of Bairnsdale.

"Dwelling-house" shall mean a building used or constructed or adapted to be used for human habitation, whether the building or a portion thereof may be or is used for some other purpose.

"Street or road" shall mean and include "street" and "road" and "private street" and "private road" as respectively defined in the *Local Government Act 1903*.

"Hoarding" shall mean and include any erection or structure used, or that may be used for the purpose of writing, printing, pasting or posting notices, advertisements, placards, or other printed or written matter thereon, provided that the height measured from the ground level is not less than 6 feet, but shall not apply to "To Let" or "For Sale" boards not exceeding 30 square feet in area.

"Wooden building" shall mean and include a building of any kind (except a hoarding) of which all or any of the outer walls thereof are constructed of wood in whole or part save and except such interpretation shall not mean or include any building the outer walls of which are covered with iron, fibro-cement, or fire-resisting material other than wood.

"Iron building" shall mean and include any building (except a hoarding) of which all outer walls are covered with iron, fibro-cement, or other fire-resisting material other than wood.

"Stone" shall mean and include brick, stone, and concrete.

- "Area" applied to a building shall mean the superficial area of a horizontal section thereof made at the point of its greatest surface, exclusive of the external walls.
 - "Square" applied to the measurement of the area of any building shall mean the space of 100 superficial feet.
 - "Build" shall mean and include erect, build, or construct.
 - "Built" shall mean and include erected, built, or constructed.
 - "Building" shall mean and include erection, structure, hoarding, and every structure of whatever kind, and every part of such structure.
 - "Addition" shall mean and include any increase in the habitable enclosed or covered area, height, or cubic contents of any building.
- All words importing the singular shall include the plural and the plural the singular.

28. *Penalties for Breaches.*—Any person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each such offence, and in the case of a continuance of such offence to a penalty not exceeding £2 per day for each and every day such offence is continued after written notice of the offence from the Council by its Shire Secretary.

29. *Special circumstances.*—Council may exempt.—Provided always that notwithstanding anything herein-after provided to the contrary, the Council may, under special circumstances and for special causes, and at a meeting of which due notice of the business has been given to each Councillor, declare that the provisions of this By-law, either in the whole or in part, shall not apply to any particular building.

Such portions of the municipal district as are included in the areas described, namely:—

Commencing at a point on the Mitchell River being the north-eastern angle of the parish of Moormurug; thence down stream northerly and easterly by that river to a point on its bank opposite the eastern end and south side of McLeod-street in the subdivision of Bairnsdale Pre-emptive Right, parish of Bairnsdale; thence south-westerly and westerly by the railway connecting Bairnsdale Railway Station and the wharf to a point on that railway due north of the N.E. corner of Crown allotment 1A, parish of Bairnsdale; thence due south to the N.E. corner of the said Crown allotment 1A; thence westerly and south-westerly by the boundary between Bairnsdale Pre-emptive Right, parish of Bairnsdale, and McLeod's Morass to the south-western corner of Crown allotment 18A of section B, parish of Bairnsdale; thence westerly by a Government road to its intersection with the Melbourne to Bairnsdale railway; thence south-westerly by that railway to the point where it crosses the eastern boundary of the parish of Moormurug; thence northerly by that boundary to the point of commencement.

And also in the parish of Wy Yung: Commencing at the S.W. angle of Lucknow Pre-emptive Right; thence northerly along the east bank of the River Mitchell to its intersection with the Backwater; thence generally northerly and westerly by the east bank of the Backwater to its intersection with the extreme western boundary of the aforesaid Pre-emptive Right; thence northerly and westerly by the boundary of that Pre-emptive Right to its intersection with the western boundary of Crown allotment 28B; thence northerly and easterly by the western and northern boundaries of Crown allotment 28B and furtherly westerly by the northern boundaries of Crown allotments 41, 44A, 44B, and 49 to the N.E. corner of Crown allotment 49, then southerly by the whole of the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 49 and further southerly by a line parallel to and 20 chains west of the eastern boundary of the Lucknow Pre-emptive Right to the southern boundary of the said Pre-emptive Right; thence westerly by the southern boundary of the said Pre-emptive Right to the point of commencement.

SCHEDULE 2.

Commencing at the intersection of Main-street and the east side of Dawson-street, in the township of Bairnsdale; thence north-easterly by Main-street to the intersection of Main-street and Grant-street; thence south-easterly by Grant-street produced to the south side of McLeod-street in the subdivision of Bairnsdale Pre-emptive Right; thence north-easterly by the south side of McLeod-street to its intersection with the west side of Buchanan-street in the same subdivision; thence southerly by the west side of Buchanan-street to its intersection with the south side of Rupert-street in the same subdivision; thence north-easterly by the south side of Rupert-street to its intersection with the railway from Bairnsdale Railway Station to the wharf; thence easterly and north-easterly by that railway to the Mitchell River at the foot of the aforesaid McLeod-street; thence

up stream by the course of the Mitchell River to a point on the bank of that river opposite the N.E. angle of Crown allotment 67, township of Bairnsdale; thence south-westerly by a street unnamed and the north side of Warde-street in the said township to its intersection with the S.W. side of Bent-street; thence by the S.W. side of Bent-street north-westerly to its intersection with the east side of Goold-street in the same township; thence southerly by the east side of Goold-street to its intersection with the eastern side of Dawson-street; thence south-easterly by the eastern side of Dawson-street to the point of commencement.

SCHEDULE 3.

In the township of Bairnsdale: Commencing at intersection of Main-street and McCulloch-street; thence north-westerly by McCulloch-street to Francis-street, north-easterly by Francis-street to Riverine-street; thence south-easterly by Riverine-street to Bailey-street; thence south-easterly by Bailey-street to Nicholson-street; thence north-easterly by Nicholson-street and the river bank to Wood-street; thence south-easterly by Wood-street to Main-street; thence north-easterly by Main-street to Park-street in the subdivision of Bairnsdale Pre-emptive Right; thence south by Park-street to McLeod-street in the same subdivision; thence westerly and south-westerly by McLeod-street to McArthur-street in the same subdivision; thence north-westerly by McArthur-street to the point of commencement.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation prescribe, for the species of fish mentioned hereunder, the size or length set opposite the name thereof, less than which it shall be unlawful for any person to take, attempt to take, sell, or consign, or expose for sale, or have in his possession, house or shop, or under his control, fish of such species, in lieu of the length set opposite the name of such species of fish in the Proclamation dated the fourth day of May, 1915, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the twelfth day of May, 1915:—

Blackfish (except those in streams flowing north from the Great Dividing Range), 9½ inches.

The size and length of such fish shall be ascertained by measuring overall; that is, from the point of the snout to the end of the tail.
