PORT OF GEELONG.—HOPE TOWN CHANNEL.

No. 1 of 1916.

Referring to General Notice to Mariners, dated 1st August, 1907, page 78, mariners and others are hereby notified that in connexion with the widening of the Hopetoun Channel, and consequent removal of the beacons on the north side of the channel 100 feet in a N. 17° W. direction Mag. from their present position, that on or about the 13th instant the fixed white light exhibited from No. 2 (or the easternmost beacon on the north side of the channel) will be discontinued, and in lieu thereof, until further notice, a temporary white light 24 feet above sea level, visible all round for a distance of six miles in clear weather, will be exhibited from a punt moored 600 feet N. 73° E. of the beacon referred to (or in line with existing beacons).

Persons navigating this channel are requested not to pass too close to this punt, so as to avoid fouling its moorings.

Income Tax Act 1915.

NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the State Income Tax Acts and the Regulations made thereunder, every person whose income for the twelve months, 1st July, 1914, to the 30th June, 1915, consisted of salary, wages, allowance, pension, superannuation, or retiring allowance, stipend, rents, interest, or annuity, and whose income within the meaning of the Income Tax Acts earned in or derived from Victoria amounted to Two hundred and one pounds or upwards, and every other person or company liable to make any return under the said Acts or Regulations, is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me in the prescribed form such return on or before the 17th day of January, 1916.

Every such return shall be addressed to the State Commissioner of Taxes, and be delivered at, or forwarded by post to, the State Income Tax Office, Railway Buildings, Flinders-street, Melbourne.

Any person or company failing or neglecting to furnish a return at the prescribed time, or making a false return, is under the said Acts liable to be prosecuted and to pay a penalty of not less than £2 nor more than £100, and will be assessed and charged a double amount of tax in addition to the tax for which he would have been otherwise liable; and under the said Acts the Commissioner may assess any such defaulter for such sum as the Commissioner thinks ought to be charged.

Any person making a false return is liable to be prosecuted for perjury.

BOROUGH OF WONTHAGGI.

BY-LAW No. 11.

A By-law of the borough of Wonthaggi made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, with the approval of the Governor in Council, and numbered 11, for carrying out certain of the purposes provided for in the said sections, viz.:—

Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings and erections requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings and erections erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, authorizing the council to pull down and remove buildings and erections erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or remedied as required by or under this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings or erections, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof; appointing fees to be charged and received by the council of the borough of Wonthaggi for any acts done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the council, and for other purposes in connexion with the foregoing purposes.

IN pursuance with the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the borough of Wonthaggi order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on the thirtieth day after publication in the *Government Gazette*.
2. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.
3. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building, addition, or erection without first obtaining permission from the council so to do, and without submitting further particulars in writing regarding the same as shall be necessary to enable the council or its town clerk to determine if all the provisions of this By-law applicable thereto are complied with.
4. No building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling-house, and no addition to any such building, shall be built, constructed, or erected within a distance of ten feet measured horizontally from the building line of the street or road the building is intended to or shall front.
5. No building with an external wall of wood which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling-house, and no additions with an external wall of wood to any building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling-house shall be built, constructed, or erected—
 - (a) within a distance of four feet measured horizontally of any side street or road;
 - (b) within a distance of four feet measured horizontally of land not in the same possession or occupation;
 - (c) within a distance of eight feet measured horizontally of another building or erection with an external wall of wood in the same possession or occupation.

Provided always that any such building or addition may abut on the building line of any street or road at the side of such building, or be less than the prescribed distance therefrom or from land not in the same possession or occupation, or from a building or erection with an external wall of wood in the same possession or occupation used or intended to be used wholly or partially as a dwelling, provided that the wall or walls which abut on or face within the prescribed distance such street, road, or land not in the same possession or occupation, or building or erection, as the case may be, shall be of concrete or of brick or stone at least 8½ inches in thickness, projecting in all cases at least one inch beyond the woodwork front and back, and at least one foot through the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same.

6. The roof of every building or erection which is intended to be or shall be used as a dwelling-house shall be covered on the outside with incombustible covering, and approved sound boards shall be used for any external wall or walls thereof if of wood.

7. Stables, coach-houses, and outbuildings shall be subject to the like conditions as are hereinbefore imposed in regard to dwelling-houses by clauses 4, 5, and 6 hereof.

8. (1) The main rooms in every dwelling-house hereafter built or rebuilt shall be in every part not less than ten feet in height from floor to ceiling.

- (2) Every main room and kitchen in a dwelling-house shall have one or more windows opening directly into the external air, with a total superficies of glass clear of sash frames free from obstruction to light equal to at least one-tenth of the floor area of the room, and so constructed that a substantial part of the windows equal in general to at least one-twentieth of the floor area can be opened for ventilation. The requirements of this sub-clause may under special circumstances be dispensed with or modified by the council or the town clerk subject to review by the council, but in such cases other approved provision for lighting or ventilation must be made.
- (3) For the purposes of this clause the expression "Main Rooms" shall be deemed to mean rooms used or intended to be used as bedrooms, dining-rooms, ordinary living rooms, but not kitchens.
- The decision of the council or of the town clerk, subject to review by the council, as to whether a particular room comes within the scope of this clause or not shall be final and conclusive.
- (4) The provisions of this clause in reference to the height, lighting, and ventilation of main rooms in dwellings shall, so far as applicable, be extended to all shops.
9. (1) All timbers used in any building shall be of good sound material, free from rot, large and loose knots, shakes, or any imperfections whereby the strength of the timber may be impaired.
- (2) The following conditions shall apply as to spacing and scantlings of timber:—
- Stumps to be not less than four inches x four inches redgum, jarrah, or other approved timber spaced to 4-foot centres and fixed on 6-inch x 6-inch x 1½-inch sole plates.
 - Studs and ceiling joists to be not less than 4 inches x 1½ inches, spaced not more than 18 inches apart centre to centre, and properly braced.
 - Rafters not less than 4 inches x 1½ inches, spaced 3 feet centre to centre. Floor joists to be not less than 4 inches x 2 inches, spaced 18 inches apart centre to centre on 4-inch x 3-inch bearers spaced 6 feet apart.
 - Vermiu plates to be provided to all walls.
10. No person shall erect, build, construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection to be used as a dwelling-house only, or as a combined shop or dwelling, unless the whole of the said building or erection, of whatever material constructed, shall cover an area of not less than 325 square feet, exclusive of the verandah or porch.
11. Every building, with the exception of buildings used for business purposes only, hereafter built or rebuilt must have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof an enclosed back yard or open space at the rear of the building of at least 1,000 square feet, exclusive of any buildings therein.
12. Every wall of brick or stone shall have two approved damp-proof courses of asphalt or other impervious material at approved levels, and in cases where it is not desirable to place the same throughout the building at one uniform level, then each damp-proof course must be laid in horizontal layers connected at the end by a vertical course of the same material.
13. The space under the ground floor of every building shall have a sufficiency of openings through all walls under the floor, and an air space of at least 4 inches, clear of all earth, to thoroughly ventilate the same.
14. No person shall erect, build, construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection to be used as a dwelling-house only unless the site or curtilage of such dwelling-house has a superficial area of at least 4,000 feet, and has a frontage of not less than 40 lineal feet to a street or road.
15. Two or more shops may be erected together in one block, provided that they shall be separated from each other by a wall of concrete, or of brick or stone, at least 8½ inches in thickness, projecting in the case of wooden houses at least one inch through the woodwork front and back, and in all cases projecting one foot at least through the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same, whether belonging to the same owner or not.
16. Whenever any existing external wall or external enclosure which may in any way contravene the provisions of the By-law is at any time hereafter taken down or otherwise demolished for the height of one story, or for a space equal to one-fourth of the whole surface of such external wall or enclosure, then every part thereof not built in the manner defined by this By-law shall be taken

down, and the same, if rebuilt, shall be rebuilt in all respects in accordance with the requirements of this By-law.

17. Clauses 4, 5, and 6 hereof shall apply to any building which is intended to be or shall be used as a shop or combined shop and dwelling, provided, nevertheless, that with the consent of the council or the town clerk, subject to review by the council, the said clauses or either of them may be modified in the case of any such building by permitting the same to abut wholly or partially on the building line of the street or road in front, or to be less than the prescribed distance therefrom.

18. No person shall erect, or cause or permit to be erected, any portico or verandah over the footway of any street in the municipality without first obtaining the consent of the council, or of the town clerk subject to review by the council, in writing, and such portico or verandah shall be of the shape, figure, dimensions, and materials as set forth on the plan and specifications adopted by the council, but the lowest part of such portico or verandah shall in no case be of less height than eight feet above the level of the outer edge of the footway.

19. No opening shall be made in the roof of any such verandah for the purpose of affording light unless such opening be properly framed and glazed with approved glass protected underneath with a fine-mesh wire netting or armoured glass to the satisfaction of the town clerk.

20. No fowl-houses shall be erected at a less distance than twenty-five feet from any building used as a dwelling on the same allotment or allotments adjoining. No building of the description referred to in this clause of this By-law shall be erected, except to the rear of any dwelling-house on the same allotment.

21. No privy, closet, urinal, or stable which is not connected with the septic tank system or with the underground sewerage system, and approved by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, shall be erected at a less distance than fifteen feet from the door or window of any dwelling-house on the same allotment or allotments adjoining, or a less distance than nine feet from any street, and each privy, closet, or urinal shall be properly screened from public view. Provided that in case where there is a right-of-way abutting on such allotment the privy, closet, urinal, or stable may be erected to the boundary between such allotment and the right-of-way.

22. No person shall build, construct, or put in, or cause to be built, constructed, or put in, any septic tank or septic tank installation without the consent of the council, in writing, or the town clerk subject to review by the council, and such consent shall be given only upon application in writing by the person desiring such consent, and such application shall be supported by plan, drawings, and specifications of such septic tank or septic tank installation, such plan, drawings, and specifications to be in duplicate, provided that duplicates of plans and drawings may be on tracing paper.

23. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any tent except in conformity with the specification following, that is to say:—The framework of such tent shall be of timber, and no tent having external walls sheeted either as a whole or in part with canvas, calico, or other light inflammable material shall be built or erected nearer to the boundary of the allotment upon which the same is built or erected than six feet, nor nearer to any other tent on the same allotment than ten feet, the number of tents to be erected on one allotment in the same ownership shall be not more than four, with a kitchen in addition.

At least two closets or privies must be provided on each allotment on which more than one tent stands (one for each sex, and such closet or privy shall be erected at each corner of the allotment at the rear of tents, and at a distance of not less than nine feet from any street, and such closet or privies shall, to the satisfaction of the town clerk in each case, be effectively screened from public view.

Provided that in case there is a right-of-way abutting on such allotment, such closets or privies may be erected to the boundary between such allotment and the right-of-way.

24. The distances mentioned in clauses 4, 5, 19, and 20 of this By-law shall be respectively measured from the verandah or any other projection nearest to the point at which such building may be from such other building, street, land, right-of-way, or boundary line.

25. The town clerk, at all reasonable times during the progress and during 14 days next after the completion of any building or addition to any building affected by any of the provisions of this By-law, may, and he is hereby authorized to enter and inspect such building or addition.

26. If any building shall be partly or wholly built contrary to the provisions of this By-law, the council, by its town clerk or other authorized agent, may give to the owner or builder, or leave upon the site of such building, fourteen days' notice, in writing, to bring such

building into conformity with the said provisions, or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building, and in default shall be made, in complying with such notice, and notwithstanding the impositions or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said council, by its town clerk or other authorized agent, to enter upon such building and on the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen, and for that purpose to break down any fence surrounding the land on which such building is situate, and to demolish and pull down the said building, or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place, and if the council in its discretion thinks fit, to sell the same in such manner as it thinks fit, and all expenses incurred by the council, its town clerk, or other authorized agent in demolishing and pulling down the said building or any part thereof, or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing other acts as aforesaid, and all fees and penalties due by the owner or builder thereof, may be deducted and retained by the council out of the proceeds of such sale, and the council shall restore any surplus (if any) arising from such sale to such owner or builder, or other person legally entitled thereto on demand.

27. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, greenhouse, fernery, aviary, or to temporary offices and sheds used by builders during the construction of any building at or about the site of such building for a period not exceeding six months.

28. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in and throughout the whole of the borough of Wonthaggi.

29. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided to the contrary, the council may, under special circumstances and for special causes, and at a meeting of which notice of the business has been given as for extraordinary business to each councillor, declare that the provisions of this By-law, either in the whole or in part, shall not apply to any particular building.

30. Penalties.—Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than Ten shillings and not exceeding Twenty pounds. And if such offence is a continuing one, to a further penalty not exceeding Ten shillings per day for each day such offence is continued.

31. In this By-law, save where the context is inconsistent therewith—

“Council” means the council of the borough of Wonthaggi.

“Square,” applied to the measurement of any area, means the space of 100 square feet.

“Town Clerk” means the town clerk or acting town clerk for the time being of the said borough.

“Approve” means approved by the town clerk subject to review by the council.

“Dwelling-house” means a building used or constructed, or adapted to be used, wholly or principally for human habitation.

“Shop” means a building in which goods are regularly offered or exposed for sale, or in which meals or refreshments are regularly offered or provided for payment, and also includes the saloons of shops of barbers and hairdressers, and offices of agents and auctioneers. A *bona fide* private boarding-house shall not be included in this definition by reason only of the fact that meals or refreshments are occasionally supplied to persons other than boarders.

“Street” or “Road” means and includes “Street” and “Road” and “Private street” and “Private road” as respectively defined in the *Local Government Act 1915*, section 3.

“Lane” or “Right-of-way” means a street or road less than 33 feet wide.

32. The provisions of this By-law shall not apply to Government buildings.
