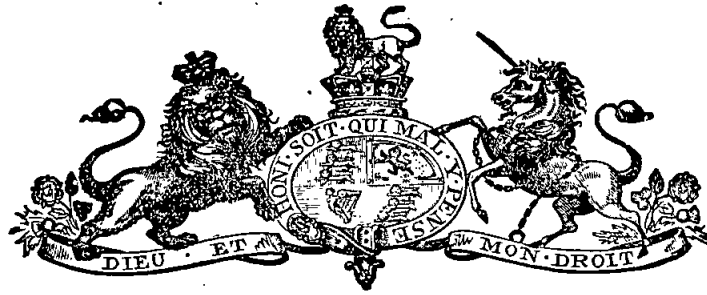

SUNBURY WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1916.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Sunbury Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1915*, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1916 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Sunbury Waterworks Trust, also dealing with sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets on which a main pipe has been laid according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Bulla, the minimum amount to be paid in respect of any tenement to be not less than Twenty shillings.

2. For all unoccupied allotments a minimum sum of Ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For all water supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes a charge of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons shall be paid and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which would be equal to the assessed rate payable for the premises so supplied and where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 30,000 gallons and shall be paid for in advance or as the Trust may deem necessary.

4. For any public water trough supplied by the Trust the sum of Thirty shillings per annum shall be charged unless supplied by meter.

5. For water supplied from the stand-pipe or hydrant for each load of 200 gallons or under the sum of One shilling and for each load in excess of 200 gallons *pro rata* on the above scale.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in advance on the 1st day of April, 1916, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

## TOWN OF BALLAARAT EAST.

## REGULATION NO. 21.

A REGULATION of the Town of Ballarat East, made under the 4th section of the *Meat Supervision Act 1915*, for prescribing the duties of the Meat Inspector, for fixing the fees for examining and branding carcasses of animals or meat slaughtered at any abattoir situated within the limits of the Meat Area as at present constituted and as may be constituted from time to time within the town of Ballarat East, and for the conduct of and for maintenance of cleanliness in abattoirs, and for imposing penalties.

By virtue of the powers conferred by section 44 of the *Meat Supervision Act 1915*, the Council of the Town of Ballarat East, being the Municipal Council of the Municipal District of the Town of Ballarat East, doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. Every Meat Inspector appointed for an abattoir "or appointed place" shall so far as regards such abattoir or appointed place:—

- (a) Have free access thereto at all times and at any hour by day or by night, and full power and authority to inspect the same and all appurtenances and appliances appertaining and to exercise all the powers of Health Officers under section 69 of the *Health Act 1915*.
- (b) Examine all animals intended to be slaughtered for human food before the same are slaughtered; condemn, destroy, or otherwise effectually dispose of all animals suspected of being affected with communicable disease, consistently with the provisions of the *Stock Diseases Act 1915*.
- (c) Examine the carcasses or meat of all animals after slaughter, cut into any part of such carcasses or meat, and give such directions to the slaughtermen as may be necessary to prevent the parts and offal of one carcass being removed or mixed with the parts and offal of any other carcass prior to examination, and after examination, for the removal of such parts and offal forthwith.
- (d) Brand or cause to be branded with the Council's brand in accordance with the branding regulations of the Board of Public Health the carcasses or meat of all animals found to be sound, wholesome, and fit for human food, and personally superintend the rendering unusable for human consumption such carcasses or meat as may be diseased, or for any sufficient reason condemned.
- (e) Give certificates of the examination of all animals, carcasses or meat condemned, if required by the owner thereof, or by the Council, or by an officer of the Board of Public Health, or by an order of any competent Court, or by any member of the police, so to do.
- (f) Have the custody of the Council's brands and appliances required in the performance of his duties; report once at least in each month to the Council the number of carcasses of each kind of animal examined and branded, the number of certificates issued and to whom, the number of animals, of carcasses and parts thereof condemned and how disposed of, and any other particulars about which the Council may give directions.
- (g) Provide, subject to the consent and approval of the Council, a qualified substitute as Acting Meat Inspector to carry out his duties in the event of his absence on leave, or of his absence from sickness, or of his absence for any other reason sanctioned by the Council, and such substitute or Acting Meat Inspector shall have and exercise all the powers and authorities vested in the Meat Inspector during the absence as aforesaid of such Meat Inspector.
- (h) Exercise generally all the powers and duties imposed on Meat Inspectors by the *Meat Supervision Act 1915*, or any amendment thereof, or any regulations thereunder, and in addition so far as may be prescribed the duties imposed on inspectors by section 28 of the *Butchers and Abattoirs Act 1915*.
- (i) Every Meat Inspector shall keep a register of, inspect and report on to the Council as frequently as directed, all butchers' shops, small goods factories, and such other places within the limits of the Meat Area within the Town, as the Council may direct, and shall examine all carcasses, meat, offal, small goods, fittings,

implements, and appliances at these places, and shall take such action in regard to these as may be authorized by the provisions of the Act.

2. (a) Abattoirs may be open and slaughtering shall be permitted therein on every day (Sunday excepted) from 7.30 a.m. to 5.30 o'clock p.m., and the Council shall from time to time fix hours for killing at each abattoir within the hours aforesaid.
- (b) At every abattoir during the absence of the owner, lessee, or manager, there shall be at all times some one person who shall be nominated as responsible for the conduct of the abattoir, and such nomination shall be notified to the Inspector.
- (c) The owner, lessee, or person in charge of every abattoir shall keep or cause the same, with its appurtenances and all appliances used thereat, to be kept in a strictly sanitary state; shall see that the clothing of all persons engaged in slaughtering or dressing carcasses therein is cleanly and inoffensive; shall prevent persons suffering from dangerous or communicable disease being employed in the handling of carcasses or meat; shall remove all accumulations of blood, offal, garbage, and refuse daily; shall maintain in a clean and wholesome state all carts and vehicles used for the transport of carcasses or meat; and shall cleanse, purify, and wash all walls, doors, floors, pits, bins, and receptacles on the conclusion of each day's operations.
3. (a) No person employed at any abattoir shall ill-treat, over-drive, over-crowd, or otherwise cause needless suffering to any animals taken there to be slaughtered.
- (b) No slaughterman or other person engaged at any abattoir shall resort to any unnecessary cruelty in driving any animals into the killing pens or in slaughtering them there.
- (c) All animals brought to any abattoir to be slaughtered and kept there for twenty-four hours shall be provided by the abattoir owner with sufficient food and water.
4. The fees payable for examining and branding carcasses, parts of carcasses, or meat by or under the direction of the Meat Inspector shall be as follows:—  
Swine ... .. 1s. 6d.  
And such fees shall be paid to the Town Treasurer at the Town Hall once at least in each month, and the amount of such payment shall correspond with and be accompanied by a voucher from the Meat Inspector.
5. For every offence against any of the provisions hereof, the offender shall, upon conviction thereof, before any one or more Justices of the Peace of the Court of Petty Sessions, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds for each offence, and for each continuing offence, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2) per day for each day during which the offence continues.
6. The above regulations shall apply to all abattoirs or appointed places, and to all owners or lessees thereof, and all persons using the same, and shall have full force and effect within all the Meat Area of the Town of Ballarat East.

Resolution for passing this Regulation was agreed to by the Council on the eighteenth day of October, 1915, and confirmed on the fifteenth day of November, 1915.

SHIRE OF DONCASTER.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE WARRANTYDE COMMON.

ALL persons entitled to depasture stock on the above-named Common will be allowed to do so subject to the following Regulations:—

- 2nd. The fees payable for depasturing stock shall be for cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, mules, and swine 5s. per head per annum and for sheep and goats. 3s. per head.
- 3rd. The fees shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, the half-years commencing respectively on the first day of March and the first day of September in each year.
- 4th. Special licences may be granted to butchers or to slaughtermen to depasture for such periods of time as may be agreed upon, cattle intended for slaughter; but the fees charged shall be at a proportionately less rate than 5s. per head per annum for large and 3s. per head per annum for small cattle.

5th. The progeny of stock for whose dams commouage fees have been paid shall be allowed to run free until they are six months old.

6th. No entire horses, rigs, or animals affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the Common.

7th. Bulls may be allowed to run on the Common on payment of the usual fees, but if they are objected to by the managers of the Common the owners shall be allowed three (3) days to remove the same and if the owners shall fail to do so such bulls shall be liable to be impounded.

8th. All goats depasturing on the Common must have a triangle on their necks at least 1 ft. 6 in. on the side or they will be liable to be impounded whether the fees have been paid or not.

9th. All stock for which fees shall have been paid shall be branded with the Common brand and the owners shall, when required by the Herdsman, muster the same and render every assistance to the Herdsman in carrying out this Regulation.

10th. All stock, other than travelling cattle, found depasturing on the Common, and for which no commouage fees shall have been paid, shall be liable to be impounded.

11th. No person or persons shall knowingly and wilfully depasture, without the authority in writing of the manager in that behalf, any cattle or sheep on any of the said Common, or interfere with or disturb any cattle or sheep legally depasturing thereon.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.
