DETERMINATION OF THE ASPHALTERS BOARD.

APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

- "Apprentice" means any person under 21 years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over 21 years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2650, section 3.)
- "Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piecework price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over 21 years of age, or who being over 21 years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2650, section 3.)



Factories and Shops Act 1915.

DETERMINATION OF THE FUEL AND FODDER BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons-

(a) employed in the business of a hay, corn, or chaff dealer;

(b) employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving in connexion with the business of a hay, corn, or chaff dealer;

(c) employed in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of wood, coal, or coke,


