Income Tax Act 1915.

NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the State Income Tax Acts and the Regulations made thereunder, every person whose income for the twelve months—1st July, 1915, to the 30th June, 1916—consisted of salary, wages, allowance, pension, superannuation, or retiring allowance, stipend, rents, interest, or annuity, and whose income within the meaning of the Income Tax Acts earned in or derived from Victoria amounted to two hundred and one pounds or upwards, and every other person or company liable to make any return under the said Acts or Regulations, is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me in the prescribed form, such return, on or before the 25th day of August, 1916.

Every such return shall be addressed to the State Commissioner of Taxes, and be delivered at, or forwarded by post to, the State Income Tax Office, Railway Buildings, Flinders-street, Melbourne.

Any person or company failing or neglecting to furnish a return at the prescribed time, or making a false return, is, under the said Act, liable to be prosecuted, and to pay a penalty of not less than £2 nor more than £100, and will be assessed and charged a double amount of tax in addition to the tax for which he would have been otherwise liable; and under the said Act the Commissioner may assess any such defaulter for such sum as the Commissioner thinks ought to be charged.

Any person making a false return is liable to be prosecuted for perjury.

WHEREAS by section 108 of the *Water Act 1915*, No. 2747, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Waterworks Trust has been by Order in Council duly constituted, make additional Orders in Council not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act relating to such Waterworks Trust; and that the Governor in Council may in such Order, among other things—

- (a) Make any Order which might have been made in the Order in Council originally constituting such Waterworks Trust.
- (b) Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Waterworks Trust.

And whereas by a certain Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of June, 1913, a Waterworks Trust, known as the Maffra Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, to carry out certain waterworks for supplying a certain waterworks district, the extent and boundaries whereof were in and by the said Order in Council duly defined and limited: And whereas by clause 2 of the said Order in Council, bearing date as aforesaid, it was ordered that the councillors for the municipal district of the shire of Maffra for the time being, and one other person, shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust: And whereas it is deemed necessary to repeal the aforesaid clause: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the now in part recited Act, doth order—

That the said clause 2 of the said Order in Council, bearing date as aforesaid, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof it is hereby ordered and provided that the municipal councillors of the Central Riding of the shire of Maffra for the time being and three other persons shall, as from the 28th day of September, 1915, be the Commissioners of the said Maffra Waterworks Trust.

And the Honorable Hugh McKenzie, His Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Fruit Act 1915.

REGULATIONS IN REGARD TO FORMATION OF TRUSTS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the
eleventh day of July, 1916.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers under Part I. of the *Fruit Act 1915* (No. 2657), the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia is empowered to make Regulations and to rescind the same, and whereas in exercise of such powers certain Regulations were made on the 30th day of November, 1915, and the 17th day of February, 1916, and whereas it is desired to consolidate such Regulations: Now therefore I, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby rescind the aforesaid Regulations and order as follows, that is to say:—

INTERPRETATION.

1. In the construction of these Regulations the following terms, that is to say: "cool store," "cool stores area," "fruit," "machinery," "orchard," "owner," "prescribed," and "Trust" shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings assigned to them in the said Act.
"The secretary" shall mean the person for the time being acting as secretary to any Trust.
"The Act" shall mean the *Fruit Act 1915* (No. 2657) and any Act amending the same.
"Minister" shall mean the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Act, and shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be deemed to include any Minister for the time being acting for or on behalf of such Minister.
"Government Representative" shall mean any member of a Trust nominated by the Minister and appointed.
"Member" shall mean any member of a Trust elected by the owners of orchards. The singular shall include the plural, and the masculine shall include the feminine.

I.—FORMATION OF TRUSTS.

2. Every instrument signed in pursuance of section 5, sub-section 2 (a) of the Act shall be in the form set forth in Schedule A to the Regulations or to the like effect.
3. The scale of every map or plan prepared in pursuance of section 5, sub-section 2 (c) of the Act shall be any scale not less than two inches to the mile.

II.—THE NOMINATION AND APPOINTMENT, THE TERM OF OFFICE AND THE RESIGNATION OR REMOVAL OF MEMBERS OF, AND THE FILLING OF VACANCIES IN, TRUSTS.

4. The nomination of any person by the Minister to be a Government representative shall be in writing, and his appointment or removal shall be by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette*.
The term of office of every Government representative shall (subject to the Act) be that set forth in the Order in Council appointing him or in any subsequent order amending the same.
5. The term of office of members shall be as follows:—
As soon as may be after the Trust first meets the Trust shall divide the members into two classes as nearly equal in number as practicable. Such classes shall be formed from a list compiled in order of the lowest number of votes received at the election, and so upwards; and the half (or approximate half) of the candidates who shall stand lowest on such list shall form the first class and the remainder shall form the second class; and (subject as hereafter provided) the places of members of the first class shall become vacant at the expiration of the first year, and the places of those of the second class at the expiration of the second year, from the beginning of their term of service, and afterwards the places of members shall become vacant at the expiration of two years from the beginning of their term of service. If, within three calendar months after any such first election, any Trust shall not have made such division, the Minister may, by writing under his hand, and to be notified in the *Government Gazette*, make the same: Provided always that if the number of candidates nominated or remaining nominated at the first election of members shall not exceed the number of vacancies to be filled; then such division into classes shall be made by the Returning Officer by lot; and all members, whether elected or appointed by the Governor in Council, shall be included in the taking of such lot.
The election to fill vacant places shall be made in the year at the expiration of which the places are to become vacant.

For the purpose of these Regulations the term of service of a member shall be taken to begin on the 1st day of July following the day of his election, except in the case of the first election, when it shall be taken to begin on the day of his election, and notwithstanding anything in these Regulations contained, the terms of service of all members elected at such first election shall have added to them the period between the date of their election and the next ensuing 1st day of July.

Members appointed under section 11 (1) of the Act shall, for the purposes of these Regulations, be deemed to be elected.

The provisions of the second paragraph of sub-section (2) of said section 11 shall apply to all members appointed under said sub-section (1) or elected to fill a vacancy.

Any Government representative or member may resign his office by notice under his hand delivered to the Chairman or Secretary of the Trust, who shall forthwith note thereon the day and hour of its receipt by him and transmit every such notice to the Minister.

The secretary shall also forthwith send notice, in writing, to the Minister of the vacation of any seat under section 15 of the Act, which notice shall contain full particulars of the name of the person vacating such seat and the day (and if possible the hour) of such vacation and the ground thereof.

III.—FOR THE ENROLMENT OF PERSONS ENTITLED TO VOTE IN THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF TRUSTS, AND FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE ELECTION OF SUCH MEMBERS.

6. The Minister shall cause to be prepared a roll of the names of all persons entitled under the Act to vote as owners of orchards. This roll shall be certified by the Minister as being a correct compilation of the names of owners of orchards entitled to vote as by the Act provided. Such roll shall be available for inspection by any person at the most centrally-situated post-office in the Trust area to which it relates continuously for fourteen days at least prior to the holding of the first election of members of such Trust.

Notification of the intention to so make the said roll so available shall be given by advertisement in the *Government Gazette*, and in at least one daily newspaper generally circulating in the Trust area, not more than fourteen, nor less than seven, days prior to its being made so available.

The Minister may at any time, not less than 48 hours prior to the holding of any such first election, amend any such roll by adding thereto or removing therefrom the names of any persons as owners of orchards so entitled to vote.

All such amendments shall be dated and initialed by the Minister.

The Minister may, by writing under his hand, delegate any of his duties or powers under this Regulation to any other person.

Such roll shall be used at the election of members, and shall remain in force until a new roll has been prepared and revised as hereafter provided.

The secretary shall, between the 1st and 6th days of June in each year, make out, according to the form in Schedule B hereto, or to the like effect, a roll of the names of owners of orchards entitled to vote in the election of members of the Trust, and shall arrange such roll according to the alphabetical order of surnames contained therein, and shall state in such roll against the name of each person the several particulars indicated in the several columns of the said schedule.

In compiling any such roll all detached orchards of any owner shall be considered as one orchard only.

The secretary shall forthwith, after making out the said roll, notify by advertisement in the *Government Gazette*, and at least one daily newspaper generally circulating in the Trust area, that such roll is in his custody and available for inspection at the Trust office, and shall keep such roll to be inspected by any person at all reasonable hours between the 6th and 10th days of June in each year.

Any person whose name has not been included on any such roll, and who claims to have his name inserted therein; and any such person or any person whose name has been inserted in such roll, and who claims that the name of any other person ought or ought not to be included therein, may, on or before the said 10th day of June, give or send by post to the secretary, and also give or send by post to the last known address in Victoria of any person affected by such claim notice, in writing, of such claim, stating the particulars of the grounds of such claim, and shall sign the same with his name; and the secretary shall cause a list to be prepared of all such claims.

The said roll, together with the said list of claims, shall be submitted for revision by the secretary to a police magistrate sitting in a court of petty sessions in the Trust area (or if there be no such court within such area, then at the court of petty sessions nearest to the

Trust office) at such time as the police magistrate shall appoint between the 10th and 20th days of June in every year; and the police magistrate shall, at the expense of the Trust, give three days' notice at least of the holding of a court for such revision and of the time and place thereof, by advertisement in the *Government Gazette* and in some daily newspaper generally circulating in the Trust area.

The police magistrate shall, after proof of due giving of the requisite notice of claim as aforesaid, insert or retain in the said roll under revision, or remove therefrom, the name of every person named in any such claim who is proved to his satisfaction to be entitled or liable or disentitled or not liable, as the case may be, to be inserted in the said roll.

The police magistrate shall initial all alterations so made by him in the said roll, and sign and certify the same, and forthwith deliver the same to the secretary, who shall keep the same at the Trust office, where it shall be available for inspection by any person at all reasonable times.

Every election of a member or members of a Trust shall be held before some person, hereinafter called the Returning Officer, who shall be some person appointed by the Minister by notice in the *Government Gazette*.

The Returning Officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any such election; and such deputy may do all or any of the acts or things which the Returning Officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

No person who acts as Returning Officer or as his deputy at any such election shall be, or become, a candidate at such election.

Until the establishment of a Trust office every election of members shall be held at such place within the Trust area as the Returning Officer shall appoint (and the expense of providing which shall be borne by the Trust); thereafter every such election shall be held at the Trust office.

Fourteen days at least before any such election the Returning Officer shall give public notice thereof by advertisement in the *Government Gazette* and in some daily newspaper generally circulating in the Trust area, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the Trust area (and which place, after the establishment of a Trust office, shall be such office), and between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on some day, before or on the day of nomination, which day of nomination shall be not less than three nor more than six days after the time of giving such notice and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before 4 p.m. of the day of nomination, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the Returning Officer or his deputy, a nomination-paper in the form in Schedule C hereto or to the like effect; and such nomination-paper shall be signed by not less than five persons eligible to vote at such election, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent of his being so named.

If, at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nomination of candidates, the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of members then to be elected, the Returning Officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected.

If, at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates, the number of candidates exceeds the number of members to be elected, the Returning Officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed or typewritten with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full in the form in Schedule D hereto, or to the like effect, and shall forthwith give public notice, by advertisement in the *Government Gazette* and in some daily newspaper generally circulating in the Trust area, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken (at the place to be named therein) for the election of such members on the day appointed for holding the election and named in such notice, and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at 1 p.m. and close at 8 p.m.

Such notice shall be published not more than fourteen days, nor less than seven days, prior to such election.

Not later than 4 p.m. four days before the day so appointed for such election any candidate may, by notice in the form or to the effect set forth in Schedule E hereto, signed by him and by at least two of his nominators, and delivered to the Returning Officer or his deputy, withdraw his nomination, and the election shall then proceed as if he had not been nominated; and the Returning Officer shall, if necessary, erase his name from all ballot-papers already prepared.

Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present at the polling place, and such scrutineers and the Returning Officer and his deputy, and any voters not exceeding six in number actually engaged in voting, and to be named if necessary by the

Returning Officer or his deputy, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling place.

The Returning Officer or his deputy shall provide in every polling place sufficient pencils for the voters; and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers, and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the poll clerks and scrutineers before the polling begins, and then locked and kept locked until the poll is concluded, and shall stand on a table opposite the Returning Officer or deputy, who shall keep the key of such box.

The Returning Officer or his deputy shall deliver to every voter who shall require the same a ballot-paper in the form aforesaid and initialed by the Returning Officer or his deputy, and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from such paper the name of every candidate for whom he shall not desire to vote, but so as to leave uncanceled a number of names of candidates neither more nor less than the number of vacancies to be filled; and in case any voter shall be unable to read or write, the Returning Officer or his deputy, if required, shall, in view of such one, if any, of the scrutineers as such voter may desire, strike out the names as such candidate may designate; and after such names shall be so struck out the ballot-paper shall be forthwith deposited in the said box.

Before delivering any ballot-paper to a voter the Returning Officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number corresponding to the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll of voters, and shall thereupon upon such roll, or a copy thereof, check off such voter's name as having voted.

If any voter shall cause or suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater or lesser number of names than the number of members to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

At each election the Returning Officer or his deputy may, if he see fit, or if required so to do by any candidate or scrutineer, shall put to any person tendering his vote either or both of the following questions:—

(I) Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) on the voter's roll of owners of orchards for this Trust [naming it]?

(II) Have you already voted at the present election? and no person who shall refuse to answer either of such questions, or who shall not answer the former of such questions absolutely in the affirmative, and the second of such questions absolutely in the negative, shall be permitted to vote.

The vote of any incorporated company which appears on the roll of owners of orchards may be recorded by the chairman or principal director of such company or by any director or member of the board of management thereof who may be thereunto authorized, in writing, under the hand of such chairman or principal director, and under the seal of such company; and the vote of any persons being joint owners not incorporated of any orchard may be recorded by either of such persons.

Immediately upon the close of the poll the Returning Officer or his deputy shall proceed, in the presence and subject to the inspection of any poll clerks and of any scrutineers of the candidates as shall please to be present, to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate, and such Returning Officer or deputy shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the Returning Officer or his deputy shall immediately make up under the inspection of the said scrutineers a list of the total number of votes for each candidate.

The Returning Officer or his deputy shall immediately seal up the ballot-papers in a parcel, and shall, as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll, give public notice (at the expense of the Trust), by advertisement in the *Government Gazette*, of the number of votes given to each candidate, and shall declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to be duly elected as members; and if two or more candidates shall have received an equal number of votes, the Returning Officer or his deputy shall in each case have a casting vote.

The Returning Officer shall forthwith, after the declaration of the poll, cause the sealed parcel of ballot-papers to be indorsed with a description of the contents thereof signed by him, and forward it to the Trust, which shall cause them to be safely and secretly kept for six months and then to be destroyed.

If at any election no members, or a less number of members than is necessary to fill the vacancies, to fill which such election was held, shall be elected, the Returning Officer shall notify the same forthwith to the Trust and also to the Minister.

When an extraordinary vacancy occurs in the office held by any member, the same course of procedure shall be adopted in and about the election of a person to fill such vacancy as in hereinbefore prescribed for an election to fill an ordinary vacancy.

All the expenses of and incident to the holding of any election shall be borne and paid by the Trust, and shall be recoverable in a court of petty sessions.

No moneys shall be paid by the Trust for refreshments in connexion with the conduct of any election.

IV.—THE APPOINTMENT, TERM OF OFFICE, RESIGNATION OR REMOVAL OF THE CHAIRMAN OF ANY TRUST.

7. The appointment of a chairman shall be by open voting.

The term of office of a chairman shall be twelve calendar months, from the 1st day of July in the year of his appointment, provided always that, as to the chairman first elected, he shall have added to his term of office the period between his appointment and the 1st day of July then next ensuing.

A chairman may resign his office as chairman at any time by writing under his hand and handed to the secretary.

Every chairman shall vacate his office as such upon ceasing to be a member.

Any chairman may be removed from office by a unanimous vote at a full meeting of members. The absence of such chairman from such meeting shall not preclude the same from being considered as a full meeting.

Any vacancy in the office of chairman may be filled in the same manner as that prescribed for the original appointment of a chairman.

Any person appointed to fill such vacancy shall hold office as long as the person in whose place he was appointed would have held office if he had continued in office, and no longer.

V.—THE REGULATION OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MEETINGS OF TRUSTS AND THE KEEPING OF MINUTES OF SUCH PROCEEDINGS AND THE GIVING OF AND FORMS OF NOTICES.

8. The Trust shall cause entries of all its proceedings, with the names of the Government representatives and members who attend at each meeting, and the names of all persons voting upon any question for the decision of which a division is called, to be duly made from time to time in books to be provided for the purpose, which shall be kept by the secretary under the superintendence of the Trust; and every such entry shall be signed at the meeting next succeeding the meeting at which such proceeding or attendance has taken place, by the chairman of such meeting; and every such book shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection of any Government representative or member and by any creditor of the Trust or his agent at the Trust office.

The Trust shall meet when and as often as it may appoint; provided that it shall hold one meeting at least in each calendar month.

All meetings of the Trust shall be held at the Trust office when established, and meanwhile at any place within the Trust area appointed by the chairman, subject to the approval of the Minister.

Any person on the voters' roll shall be entitled to be present in the room where any such meeting may be held, but shall not take part in, interfere with, or interrupt such meeting.

All powers vested in the Trust under the Act may be exercised at any meeting holden in pursuance of the Act by any four members present thereat (and for the purposes of this Regulation the word "members" is to be deemed to include a Government representative) or by any smaller number forming the major part of the number of members for the time being assigned to the Trust; and no business shall be transacted at any meeting of the Trust unless the said number of members be respectively present.

Where there is an equality of votes upon any question it shall, unless otherwise provided by the Act or by these Regulations, be decided by lot.

At all meetings of the Trust, save where it is otherwise herein provided, all members (including Government representatives) shall vote, and the questions there considered shall be decided by open voting and by the majority present, subject to the casting vote of the chairman, as provided by the Act. Every person declining to indicate his vote shall be deemed to vote in the negative.

No Government representative or member shall vote upon or take part in the discussion of any matter in or before the Trust in which he has, directly or indirectly by himself or his partner, any pecuniary interest.

The Trust may from time to time adjourn any meeting; and if at any meeting there be not a quorum present within half-an-hour of the time appointed for holding the same, the secretary may adjourn such meeting to any time not further distant than seven days from the date of such adjournment.

No resolution of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless written notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given to each member of the Trust (including Government representatives) seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the members (including Government representative) present at such subsequent meeting, if the number present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority if the number present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

Notice of all meetings shall be given by the secretary at the times and in manner directed by the Trust.

The provisions of Part XI. of the 13th Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1915* shall be and are hereby adopted at regulations applying to Trusts; provided that the words "council" and "municipality" wherever therein occurring shall respectively mean "Trust," the word "Act" wherever therein occurring shall mean the *Fruit Act 1915* and any Act amending the same, the word "councillor" wherever therein occurring shall mean "member" (including Government representative), the words "municipal clerk" wherever therein occurring shall mean "secretary," the word "ratepayer" wherever therein occurring shall mean "owner of an orchard."

VI.—THE ACCOUNTS OF TRUSTS AND THE AUDIT THEREOF.

9. Every Trust shall keep such accounts as shall be prescribed or approved of by the Minister.

Such accounts shall be audited once at least every year.

Every auditor shall be appointed annually by the Trust subject to approval by the Minister. Vacancies for any unexpired period of an auditor's term may be filled in the same manner. If any vacancy shall occur and remain unfilled for one calendar month, it may be filled by the Minister.

VII.—SECRETARY'S DUTIES.

10. The secretary shall be in attendance at the Trust office at such hours as from time to time may be appointed by the Trust for that purpose, and be present at all meetings of the Trust. It shall be his duty to superintend the affairs of the Trust under the directions of the Trust. The secretary shall keep the books and accounts of the Trust in a neat and orderly manner; he shall conduct the correspondence and issue all summonses, take the minutes of all meetings for business, and read them, and make a report of all matters that come under his cognisance for the information of the Trust. He shall consult the chairman in any business requiring attention between the various meetings, and be responsible for the safe custody of all books, documents and property belonging to the Trust which shall be under his control; and he shall find security in such sum as the Trust shall require in some fidelity or guarantee company, the premium upon which shall be paid by the Trust.

The secretary shall present to the Trust a monthly statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the past month, and shall also, in the month of June in each year, prepare and present to the Trust an annual balance-sheet showing the exact financial position of the affairs of the Trust.

All moneys of the Trust amounting to £10 and upwards shall, within 72 hours, or such shorter period as the Trust may direct, after they have come to the hands of the secretary or other proper officer of the Trust, be paid into such bank and in such manner as the Trust shall from time to time appoint and direct for that purpose; and no such money shall be drawn out of such bank save by cheque signed by any two members (or Government representative) and countersigned by the secretary.

VIII.—THE REMUNERATION OF MEMBERS OF THE TRUST.

11. Each of the members (including Government representatives) shall be entitled to be paid out of the Trust funds an attendance fee of Ten shillings for each meeting of the Trust attended by him at which a quorum is present. Not more than one fee shall be paid to any such member (or representative) in respect of any one day. No such member (or representative) shall be entitled to receive or be paid in any one year more than Twenty-six pounds.

We the undersigned, being a majority in number of the owners of orchards not less than one acre in extent, within the area as follows, i.e., commencing [Here describe boundaries of proposed area.] and representing in area a majority of the total acreage of such orchards, do hereby, in consideration of the said area being created a "Cool Store Area" under the said Act, undertake and agree with the Minister for Agriculture and his successors in office to bear and pay any contribution payable under the Fruit Act 1915 within the meaning of section 5, sub-section 2 (a) of that Act or any amendment thereof with respect to such area.

And whereas the circumstances which led to the application of the provisions of the said Acts to the said part of the shire have ceased to exist, and the Council of the Shire of Lillydale has requested that the said application of such provisions be cancelled;

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby cancel the application of the provisions of the Meat Supervision Act 1915 to the said part of the shire described aforesaid, which shall accordingly cease to be a Meat Area subject to and within the meaning of the provisions of the said Act.

REGULATIONS.—CONSOLIDATION.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act* 1915, among other things, the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make orders and regulations for the purpose therein mentioned and to rescind the same: And whereas from time to time the Governor in Council has made divers regulations under the powers conferred by the said Act, all of which, except certain Orders and Regulations bearing date the 11th November, 1890, or such portion thereof as have not been repealed by other amendments, or become obsolete through the operations of Statutory Rules under the Commonwealth Quarantine Acts 1908-15; the 21st December, 1897; the 15th August, 1898; the 20th September, 1898; the 6th February, 1899; the 30th October, 1899; the 16th July, 1900; the 17th December, 1901; the 16th September, 1902; the 11th June, 1903; the 10th March, 1904; the 27th September, 1904; the 1st August, 1905; the 5th February, 1906; the 4th December, 1906; the 10th June, 1908; the 27th February, 1909; the 15th June, 1909; the 29th April, 1914, have since been rescinded: And whereas it is desirable to rescind such last-mentioned Regulations and make other Regulations in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above fresh recited Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. *Rescission of previous Regulations.*—The Regulations of the Governor in Council expressed to be made under the powers conferred by the *Stock Diseases Act* 1915 and of other powers enabling him in that behalf of the date mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby rescinded except as to acts, matters, and things made, done, or commenced thereunder.

2. *What to be deemed Infectious or Contagious Disease and Diseased Stock.*—The diseases mentioned in the Second Schedule are hereby declared to be contagious or infectious diseases, and all stock affected with any such disease, or stock in direct or indirect contact with any such stock, or which shall graze or travel over lands where disease is known to exist are hereby proclaimed to be diseased stock.

3. *Interpretation of Terms.*—In construing these Regulations the following words, if not inconsistent with the context, shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them (that is to say):—

"Australasian States" shall mean all States of the Commonwealth of Australia and all Dependencies of the said States.

"Cattle" shall include any bull, cow, ox, or calf.

"Horse" shall include any stallion, mare, gelding, or foal.

"Swine" shall include any boar, sow, barrow, or sucker.

"Sheep" shall include any ram, ewe, wether, or lamb.

"Poultry" shall include any kind of living land and water bird bred or reared in a domestic state.

"Chief Inspector of Stock" shall include officer acting for the Chief Inspector of Stock in his absence.

4. *Stock to which Part I. of the Stock Diseases Act 1915 is extended.*—All the sections of Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act* 1915 shall extend to all stock of the kinds mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto.

5. *Prohibition of the Introduction of Stock found to be Diseased.*—The introduction of any stock mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto into the State, either by land or sea found to be diseased stock within the meaning of the *Stock Diseases Act* and these Regulations is prohibited.

6. *These Regulations not to authorize the Introduction of certain Stock except from Australasian States.*—Nothing in these Regulations shall be taken to authorize the introduction into Victoria of stock save and except from the Australasian States and the Dependencies thereof or any part of the Commonwealth of Australia, and the introduction of stock from the Australasian States or any part of the Commonwealth will only be permitted when all the provisions of every law and these Regulations and every Regulation or Order of the Governor in Council has been complied with.

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7. *Transgression of the Regulations Forbidden.*—No person shall do or attempt to do, cause or permit to be done or to be attempted to be done, or assist in doing or attempting to do any act forbidden by these Regulations, or obtain or endeavour to obtain, or assist any one in obtaining or endeavouring to obtain by fraud any certificate or authority under these Regulations, or forge any such certificate or authority, or make use of any such forged or fraudulently-obtained certificate or authority, or fraudulently grant or issue any such certificate or authority, or obstruct or refuse to carry out the directions of any inspector or other person acting under the authority of these Regulations.

PART I.—INTRODUCTION OF STOCK INTO VICTORIA.

8. *Inspector's Authority required for the Introduction of Stock.*—No one shall introduce into Victoria, either by land or sea, any stock mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto coming from any of the Australasian States or any part of the Commonwealth of Australia, or any hides, skins, hair, horns, bones, blood, or animal products without the authority in writing of an Inspector of Stock, and except in accordance with the conditions of such authority and these Regulations; and no inspector shall grant any such authority until he is satisfied that all the provisions of every law and of every regulation or order of the Governor in Council for the time being in force with respect to the introduction of such stock have been complied with. Any Inspector of Stock, Officer of Customs, or member of the Police Force may detain and prevent the travelling of stock newly introduced into Victoria, by land or sea, until these Regulations have been complied with. Provided always that any inspector may, on the authority of the Chief Inspector of Stock, refuse to issue such authority for any specified time.

9. Any Inspector of Stock may order that any stock or fittings shall be disinfected, smeared, or treated in a suitable manner prior to their introduction into Victoria, and may order such crush or other examination as he may deem fit; and the owner shall carry out such instructions and pay all expenses incidental thereto.

10. *Places at which Stock may be Introduced.*—No one, except under special circumstances, of which the Chief Inspector of Stock shall be the judge, shall introduce any stock at any place not being one of the places mentioned in the Fourth Schedule hereto, and any person so desiring to introduce such stock shall give not less than twenty-four hours or more than ninety-six hours' notice, in writing, to the inspector in charge of any such place of his intention to introduce any such stock thereat on a given date. When, under special circumstances, the Chief Inspector of Stock has authorized the introduction of stock at other than a place mentioned in the Fourth Schedule, the owner shall pay such fee and expenses as are determined by the Chief Inspector of Stock.

11. *Duties of Inspectors before Authorizing the Introduction of Stock.*—No inspector shall authorize any stock to be introduced or travel until he has inspected such stock, and is satisfied that the same are free from any of the diseases mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, and has counted the same, or been otherwise satisfied as to the number of stock to be introduced, and has received a statutory declaration made by the owner or person in charge as hereinafter provided.

12. *Introduction of Saddle, Draught, or Pack Horses, Mules or Asses, or Working Bullocks.*—In the case of the introduction of saddle, draught, or pack horses, mules or asses, and working bullocks used *bona fide* for the purpose of riding, draught, or carrying burdens having been once inspected, special authority may be granted by an Inspector of Stock, and continue in force until revoked by a notice from such inspector to enable such horses, mules, asses, or working bullocks to pass and repass without further inspection between any portions of either of the adjoining States of Victoria.

13. No Inspector of Stock shall authorize the introduction of any stock by sea unless such stock are carried on a vessel known as a "clean vessel" as hereinafter provided.

The Chief Inspector of Stock may from time to time declare any vessel to be a clean vessel under these Regulations, or may revoke such declaration; but no such declaration shall be made unless the master or the owners furnish satisfactory evidence to the Chief Inspector of Stock that such vessel has not during the preceding three months been in any port outside the Australasian States or the Dominion of New Zealand, or received on board stock from any place outside such States or Dominion, or from any vessel which during the preceding three months has been outside such States or Dominion, and every vessel not proclaimed a clean vessel shall be deemed to be an unclean vessel.

14. *Destruction of Stock found to be Diseased.*—If any stock of any of the kinds mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto, whether on board any vessel on which they may be introduced, or after they may be landed, or have travelled, or been conveyed by rail, be found to be diseased stock, they may be forthwith seized and

destroyed by an Inspector of Stock in compliance with section 10 of the *Stock Diseases Act 1915*, or such inspector may, in lieu of seizing and destroying such stock, by writing under his hand, order that such stock may be inoculated, dressed, or vaccinated to his satisfaction in or with such medicaments or vaccines as he may prescribe on board such vessel, or at a specified place, within a defined time to be stated in such order; or he within a further time also specified in such order removed from Victoria or Victorian waters unless the conditions of such order relative to treatment are complied with within the time named in that behalf, or such further time as an Inspector of Stock may from time to time by writing under his hand allow, any Inspector of Stock may seize and destroy all such stock in contravention of this Regulation arriving in Victoria in such manner as he may think fit.

15. *Expenses to be Borne by Owners.*—All expenses connected with the detention, treatment, or slaughter of such stock from time of the arrival of such stock until the same may be destroyed or released, including the expenses of the destruction of any such stock as may be destroyed, and of the removal and disposition of the carcasses of any such stock as may be destroyed or die, shall be borne and paid by the owners thereof; and no Inspector of Stock shall authorize the introduction of any such stock until every claim for expenses incurred have been satisfied by the owners of such stock. The proceeds of the sale of anything seized under these Regulations and sold shall be paid into the Consolidated Revenue.

16. *Fodder or Fittings.*—No fodder or fittings shall be removed from any ship or vessel without the written authority of an Inspector of Stock, and any such fodder or fittings shall be subjected to such treatment as the inspector may direct.

17. *Animals for Circus or Menagerie Purposes.*—The introduction into Victoria of animals forming part of or used for circus or menageries shall be permitted after inspection from any State provided they conform with all Regulations to which each of such animals are subject for the time being.

18. *Stock, exclusive of Pigs and Poultry from New South Wales, South Australia, and Tasmania.*—The introduction of stock (exclusive of pigs and poultry) from New South Wales, South Australia, and Tasmania will be permitted provided all the requirements of these Regulations have been complied with, and they are accompanied by a declaration duly completed in the form of Schedule A.S. hereunder:—

PART II.

THE PREVENTION OF THE SPREAD OF DISEASE IN VICTORIA.

28. *An Inspector may declare Premises on which he has discovered Disease a Quarantine District.*—When an inspector finds any of the diseases mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, except the diseases known as Scab and Influenza or Catarrh in sheep, to exist in stock, he shall forthwith deliver a notice under his hand of the existence of such disease to the occupier of the premises where the diseased stock is found, and thereupon such premises and all lands and buildings contiguous thereto in the same or other occupation, and all other lands and buildings the inspector may from time to time think fit to include, and on the occupiers of which, if any, he shall serve notice shall become a quarantine district.

29. *Steps to be taken by an Inspector after discovery of Disease.*—When an inspector delivers a notice of the existence of disease he shall forthwith forward a copy thereof to the Chief Inspector of Stock, and such district, or part thereof, as is therein described shall remain a quarantine district for such time as may be determined by the Chief Inspector of Stock.

30. *Owners of Diseased Stock may be required to keep Notices Affixed.*—The inspector may from time to time direct persons in the occupation of any premises included in a quarantine district to affix and keep affixed notices to such effect, on such portion of such premises and in such manner as the inspector may order, and such persons shall affix and keep affixed the same accordingly.

31. *Inspector may Slaughter or Seize Diseased Stock.*—When an inspector finds diseased stock he may either slaughter or seize the same, and take such other steps to eradicate disease as he may deem expedient, as also to insure the isolation and safe custody of any such stock, and he shall at once report the circumstances to the Chief Inspector of Stock.

32. *Stock not to be Introduced into or Removed from Quarantine without Authority.*—No stock shall be introduced into or removed out of any quarantine district without the written authority of an inspector, and then only in accordance with the conditions contained in such authority; and any inspector or any constable may require that any animal mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto, or thing moved out of a quarantine district in contravention of these Regulations, or of the said part of the said Act, be forthwith taken back at the cost of the owner within the limits of such district, and may enforce and execute such requisition.

33. *Inspector may order Premises, Fittings, Carcasses, &c., to be Treated or Disinfected.*—The inspector may direct any quarantine, or any portion thereof, or carcass, fodder, litter, or anything thereon with which diseased stock has been in contact, or any clothes of any one who has been in contact with diseased stock to be dealt with, treated, or disinfected in such manner as he may think fit; and all persons shall permit the same to be carried out and in such manner as directed by the inspector.

34. *Owners to Treat or Disinfect Stock for Diseases.*—The Chief Inspector may direct the owners of any stock of the kinds mentioned in the Third Schedule to submit them to inoculation, vaccination, or any other treatment to prevent the spread, or for the cure of any of the diseases mentioned in the Second Schedule, or for the purpose of disinfecting them, and the owner of such stock shall with all diligence carry out such directions.

35. *Diseased Stock not to be exposed for Sale at Market or Travelled, &c.*—If any person exposes in a market or other public place where stock are exposed for sale, or exposes in any sale-yard, whether public or private, or places in any fair or place adjacent to or connected with any market or where stock are commonly placed before exposure for sale, or sends or causes to be carried on a railway or on a canal or river, or by any other inland navigation, or on a coasting vessel, or carries, leads or drives or causes to be carried, led, or driven on a highway or thoroughfare, or keeps on any common or on the side of a highway, or unless such stock be constantly followed and kept in sight on any unenclosed land, or in any field or other place insufficiently fenced, any stock of any of the said kinds infected with any of the diseases mentioned in the Second Schedule, shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these Regulations.

36. *Owners of Diseased Stock to give Notice forthwith.*—The owner or person having the charge of any stock affected with any of the diseases mentioned in the Second Schedule shall forthwith upon discovering that such stock is affected, give notice to the Chief Inspector or to the inspector of the district, and for the purposes of this section every such owner or person shall be deemed to have discovered that such stock was so affected as soon as the same was in fact so affected.

37. *Owners of Stock neglecting notice till Discovery of Disease.*—If any inspector shall find any stock to be diseased before notice thereof has been given by the owners or persons having the charge or custody thereof, every such owner and person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

Provided that no notice is given to any inspector after he has entered upon any premises for the purpose of inspecting the stock thereon shall be deemed a notice for the purpose of this section.

38. *Anthrax—Steps to be taken on Outbreak of Anthrax.*—Upon any stock of any kind in Victoria dying of Anthrax or under circumstances that might reasonably suggest that such stock was so affected, the owner of such stock, or the occupier of the land upon which the same then is, in addition to complying with every provision contained in the preceding Regulation, shall—

- (a) forthwith isolate any stock which has been in direct or indirect contact with such diseased stock;
- (b) forthwith plug, so as to prevent the oozing of blood therefrom, the nostrils and other natural openings of the carcasses of any animals diseased or suspected so to have died, with tow, wool, hay, or other suitable material, such plug in each case to be saturated with a solution of carbolic acid or other effective disinfectant;
- (c) prevent any person not being an Inspector of Stock from cutting, removing, or otherwise interfering with the skin of any animal which has died, or is suspected to have died from Anthrax, except for the purpose of microscopical examination or other test, and shall report the circumstances to the Chief Inspector of Stock.

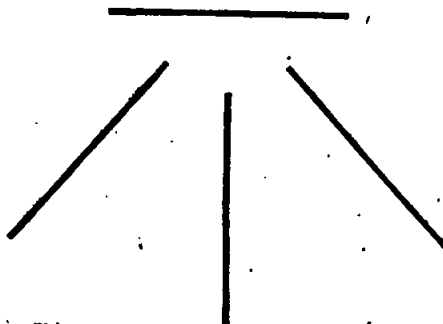

(4) Provision for the branding of any cow the use of which for the production of milk for sale is prohibited, shall be as follows:—

- (a) Temporary brand or brand which is not of a permanent character:—A mark or figure in the form of a broad arrow, with dimensions not greater than four inches in any direction, made by clipping the hair with scissors, one such mark to be made at the upper extremity of each quarter on each side of the escutcheon, or tail, and immediately below the tuberosity of the ischium bone (point of the rump or rump bone).
- (b) Permanent brand:—A fire brand in the form of a broad arrow, with dimensions as set out below, made with a heated cautery, one such brand to be impressed in such manner as to leave a distinctive and permanent scar on the skin at the upper extremity of each quarter on each side of the escutcheon, or tail, and immediately below the tuberosity of the ischium bone (point of the rump or rump bone).

Dimensions of brand:—The brand to measure two inches in length vertical and two and three-quarters inches in breadth over all; and to be composed of four lines or bars each one and a half inches long, one placed horizontally, one vertically below and at right angles to the horizontal line, one anglewise to the left of the vertical line, and one anglewise to the right of the vertical line, the two latter converging towards the vertical line at its upper extremity; the four lines having the following position and relationship to each other:—

The upper extremity of the vertical line to be one-half inch distant from the centre of the horizontal line, the upper extremities of the anglewise lines to be one-half inch distant from the centre and from the left and right extremities respectively of the horizontal line, and the lower extremities of the anglewise lines to be one and a half inches distant respectively from the lower extremity of the vertical line; the whole as approximately indicated in the attached diagram.



(5) The standards size and measurements of all apparatus used for measuring and testing any specified dairy produce and the chemicals which may be used for testing shall be:—

- (a) The measure used for the purpose of taking samples of milk for testing by the "Babcock" method for butter-fat contents shall be the pipette measure, graduated to hold 17.6 cubic centimetres of milk.
- (b) The weights used for weighing samples of cream for testing by the "Babcock" method for butter-fat contents shall be nine (9) grammes.
- (c) The "Babcock" test bottles used for milk testing shall be graduated so as to contain two (2) cubic centimetres or 1.8 grammes between zero (0) and ten (10) per cent., and each percentage and decimal part thereof shall be accurately marked according to its holding capacity.
- (d) The "Babcock" test bottles used for cream testing shall be graduated so as to contain six (6) cubic centimetres or 5.4 grammes between zero (0) and thirty (30) per cent., and each percentage and decimal part thereof which is marked shall be accurate according to its holding capacity.
- (e) The specific gravity of the sulphuric acid for use with the "Babcock" test shall be 1.827, at a temperature of 60 degrees Fahrenheit.
- (f) The pipette used for the purpose of taking samples of milk for testing by the "Gerber" method for butter-fat contents shall be graduated to hold 11 cubic centimetres of milk.
- (g) The weights used for weighing samples of cream for testing by the "Gerber" method for butter-fat contents shall be five (5) grammes.
- (h) The "Gerber" test bottles used for milk testing shall be graduated so as to contain 1.125 cubic centimetres or 1.0125 grammes between zero mark (0) and nine (9) per cent., and each percentage and decimal part thereof shall be accurately marked according to its holding capacity.
- (i) The "Gerber" test bottles used for cream testing shall be graduated so as to contain 5.55 cubic centimetres, or five (5) grammes between the zero mark (0) and one hundred (100) per cent., and each percentage or decimal part thereof which is marked shall be accurate according to its holding capacity.
- (j) The specific gravity of the sulphuric acid for use with the "Gerber" test shall not be less than 1.820, nor greater than 1.825, at a temperature of 60 degrees Fahrenheit.
- (k) The amyl alcohol for use with the "Gerber" test shall be fat free, and have a specific gravity of .815, at 60 degrees Fahrenheit.
- (l) All milk or cream purchased for the purpose of manufacture into butter, cheese, condensed milk, concentrated milk, or dried milk shall be weighed and not measured by the gallon or part thereof.
- (m) The sample of milk or cream secured for testing by the "Babcock" or "Gerber" methods for its butter-fat contents shall be taken in such a way as to represent the average conditions and specific gravity of the whole; and in the case of cream shall be weighed by the weights, and in the case of milk shall be measured by the measures hereinbefore specified.
- (n) The reading of the fat shall be made at a temperature between 120 and 140 degrees Fahrenheit.

WHEREAS by the *Artificial Manures Act 1904*, *Artificial Manures Act 1910*, and the *Fertilizers Act 1915*, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, is empowered to make Regulations and to rescind the same. And whereas in exercise of such powers certain Regulations were made on the 7th day of March, 1911, and whereas it is desired to consolidate such Regulations. Now therefore I, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby rescind the aforesaid Regulations and order as follows, that is to say:—

1. The register-book, to be compiled and kept in compliance with section 18 (1) of the *Fertilizers Act 1915*, shall be in the form or to the effect of that contained in the First Schedule hereto.

2. Every application to the Director of Agriculture for the registration of a brand of manure under the *Fertilizers Act* shall be in the form or to the effect of that contained in the Second Schedule hereto, and the statutory declaration which is to accompany such application shall be in the form or to the effect of that contained in the Third Schedule.

3. The registered brand to be set forth on every parcel, invoice, certificate, or label used in connexion with the sale of any manure shall be plainly printed in black ink or other indelible substance.

4. Every label required to be affixed to a parcel of manure shall be of linen and otherwise of good quality, and shall in size be 4 inches in length by 2 inches in breadth.

5. Where any manure is sold which is being prepared upon an order in writing of a purchaser and according to a *bond fide* special prescription in writing supplied by the purchaser, the person who prepares the same, whether a manufacturer, importer, vendor, or dealer in manures, shall, if required by the Minister, furnish to the Chemist of the Department of Agriculture the date of the sale of such manure, the price charged or paid therefore, the quantity thereof sold, the name and address of the purchaser, and to also furnish a copy of or produce for inspection the special prescription use.

6. The scale of fees set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto shall be payable in respect of the several kinds of manure therein named forwarded to the Chemist of the Department of Agriculture for analysis, in accordance with sub-section 3 of section 29 of the *Fertilizers Act 1915*.

7. The scale set out in the Fifth Schedule hereto shall be the fees payable in respect of the several matters therein mentioned.

WHEREAS by the *Education Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2644) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind Regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind 11b.—Qualifying Examination and the Merit Certificate Regulation—of the Regulations under the *Education Act 1915*, and make the following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION 11b.

Qualifying Examination and the Merit Certificate.

A.

The Qualifying Examination shall be held and the Merit Certificate awarded to candidates from State schools under the conditions set out hereunder:—

1. The Qualifying Examination.

- (a) The examination shall be held upon the Course of Study prescribed for Grade VI., and under such conditions as the Director may prescribe.

- (b) Every pupil of Grade VI. who has been not less than nine months in that Grade shall be presented as a candidate for the Qualifying Examination. In exceptional cases, the District Inspector may allow candidates who have been less than nine months in Grade VI. to sit for the Qualifying Examination.

2. The Merit Certificate.

Merit Certificates shall be awarded in any one of the following ways, as shall be determined by the Director:—

- (a) The Merit Certificate shall be awarded to a candidate who has passed the Qualifying Examination and has subsequently completed satisfactorily a course of study extending over not less than two years prescribed for Grades VII. and VIII. in elementary schools or equivalent, and who is recommended by the head teacher of the school in which he is enrolled, provided that such recommendation is confirmed by an Inspector of Schools. Any year of the course of study prescribed for High Schools, Higher Elementary Schools, Junior Technical Schools, or Domestic Arts Schools, shall be deemed to be equivalent to one year's work in the elementary schools.
- (b) Candidates who have not passed the Qualifying Examination, but who have completed satisfactorily two years of the course of study prescribed for Grades VII. and VIII. in elementary schools, for High Schools, Higher Elementary Schools, Junior Technical Schools, or Domestic Arts Schools, shall be awarded a Merit Certificate upon passing a satisfactory examination in the elementary mathematics and English of the second year of their course.
- (c) The Merit Certificate shall be awarded to a candidate who passes, under such conditions as may be prescribed by the Director, a satisfactory examination in the course of study for Grade VIII. or its equivalent.

B.

The Merit Certificate shall be awarded to candidates from registered schools who pass a satisfactory examination in the following subjects:—English (including reading, poetry, spelling, writing, composition, grammar), elementary mathematics or arithmetic, mental arithmetic, history, geography, elementary science, drawing, and occupations, as prescribed for Grade VIII.

And the Honorable Harry Sutherland Wightman Lawson, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1915 (6 Geo. V.
