NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PERMIT NETTING IN THE NORTHERN PORTION OF LAKE HINDMARSH.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation permitting, subject to the provisions of the Fisheries Act and Proclamations thereunder, the use of nets for the purpose of taking fish in the waters of Lake Hindmarsh north of an imaginary line drawn between two netting boundary posts situated one on each side of the said lake, approximately on the line of the 36th parallel of latitude; subject to the following conditions and restrictions:—

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BRIGHTON GENERAL CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the trustees of the Brighton General Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published previously in the *Government Gazette*, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

2. Any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purposes in the cemetery under the above Act, shall apply to the trustees thereof. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule A.

3. Any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply, in writing, to the trustees for permission to do so, and, at the same time, submit a plan, design, or drawing of such with full particulars for approval. Every permission will be subject to sections 21 and 26 of the *Cemeteries Act 1915*, and no label is to be removed from any grave without written permission from the surveyor or other officer, and must be again replaced under their direction.

4. For the information of the trustees, an English translation must accompany any inscription in a foreign language. No proposal to erect a tombstone or a monument in the portion of the cemetery, allotted to the Jews, will be entertained by the trustees, unless the design and the inscription (if any) accompanying such design has previously received the approval, expressed in writing, of a duly qualified minister of a Jewish congregation.

5. Any order for interment shall be given at the office of the trustees at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made.

6. The name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule B, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.

7. The trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under the direction of the surveyor or other officer, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, or iron securely cemented.

8. Every grave shall be at least 7 feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 4 feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.

In the portion of the cemetery allotted to the Jews one corpse only shall be interred in each grave of whatever character.

9. No interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence, that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.

10. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.

11. No burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a registrar of deaths, coroner, or justice of the peace. Such certificate shall be delivered to the gatekeeper before the funeral enters the cemetery.

12. Any public grave may, on approval of the trustees, be converted into a private grave on payment of the fees or balance of fees as per Scale of Charges.

13. In the case of it being desired to exhume any body, the same shall only be done on the production, at the office of the trustees, of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and at such hours and on the payment of such charges as the trustees may determine.

14. In case of re-interment or removal from another cemetery or burial ground a verified copy of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf must be produced at the office of the trustees, and the usual fees paid before such re-interment.

15. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from 10 a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4.30 o'clock p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will be from 2 to 5 o'clock p.m. throughout the year. No interment will be allowed on Sunday except in such cases as a medical practitioner or a magistrate certifies, in writing, that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day.

16. No burials shall be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m., except by special permission of the trustees.

17. The time fixed for any funeral shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

18. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance gates to the cemetery, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to pass the said entrance. Breaking out of the procession after passing the said gates is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.

19. Any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.

20. Any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the above Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.

21. Every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No bath, caen, oamaru, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stonework.

22. All materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrances. No person shall be allowed to bring work into the cemetery on a vehicle having wheels of less than 4 inches in width, unless by special permission.

- 23. No catacomb shall be allowed.
- 24. No wooden erection shall be allowed.
- 25. No dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery, and any found there are liable to be destroyed.
- 26. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or any trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or by-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.
- 27. No person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.
- 28. No person, other than the owner or his agent, duly authorized in writing, shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatever with a grave or enclosure, unless by special direction of the trustees.
- 29. The surveyor or other officer so directed shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.
- 30. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery or its approaches any trade, business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.
- 31. No person employed under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the trustees.
- 32. Any person employed under the trustees accepting any such gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.
- 33. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected there; and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.
- 34. The office of the trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- 35. In the event of a certificate of right of burial being lost or destroyed, or becoming so obliterated as to be useless, the person claiming to be entitled thereto shall supply a statutory declaration setting forth the facts upon which such claim is based, and the trustees, upon proof of their satisfaction of such claim, may issue a fresh certificate in the place of the one so lost, destroyed, or obliterated, subject, however, to the payment of the charge provided in the addition to the scale of fees and to such further conditions as the trustees in their discretion may deem necessary.
- 36. Every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate with name of deceased stamped thereon.
- 37. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these charges and regulations.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the locality to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- (1) All shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the township of Kaneira, within the municipal district of the shire of Wycheproof, shall be exempted from the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 98 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, so far as the closing hours on Saturday, Friday, and Wednesday are concerned.
- (2) All such shops shall be closed in each and every week during the whole of each year from the hour of—
 - (a) Ten o'clock on the evening of Saturday;
 - (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday;
 - (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

- (1) All shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*) within the township of Kaneira, within the municipal district of the shire of Wycheproof, shall be exempted from the provisions of section 77 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*.
- (2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—
 - (a) Ten o'clock on the evening of Saturday;
 - (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday;
 - (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

And the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Coal Mines Regulation Act 1915.
REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES
TO MINING MANAGERS AND UNDER MAN-
AGERS BY THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS FOR
MINING MANAGERS UNDER THE ACT CAN-
CELLLED, AND REGULATIONS SUBSTITUTED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the
twenty-fourth day of July, 1916.

1. Examinations for certificates of competency will be conducted by the Board at such time and place as may from time to time be notified by the secretary in the *Government Gazette* and in a newspaper published or circulated in the locality, and candidates will be examined according to priority of receipt of notice as required by clause 2. Each candidate will be duly notified of the time and place of the examination.

2. Any person desiring to present himself for examination shall notify the Secretary for Mines, Melbourne, on an application form, which may be obtained from the secretary to the Board, such notice to be given not less than twenty-one clear days prior to the date of the examination. The notice shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed in regulation 6a or 6b, as the case may be. This fee shall admit to one examination only.

3. Should the applicant pass the prescribed examination, the deposit shall in each instance go towards payment of the fee for certificate. In the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination, such amount shall be forfeited to the Consolidated Revenue.

4. No certificate shall be issued until full payment of the additional fee required by regulation 6c or 6d, as the case may be, shall have been made to the Secretary for Mines.

5. The Board will issue certificates of competency as mining manager (1st class) and as under manager (2nd class), and permits to managers of mines employing less than twelve persons underground. Such permit shall remain in force for twelve months, but may be renewed at the option of the Board.

8. If a candidate shall fail to pass the examination prescribed, he shall not again present himself until a period of not less than three months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

9. The examinations may be conducted wholly or in part, either by means of printed or written papers, or *vis a voce*.

10. Every candidate for a certificate shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has had practical experience in a mine or mines subject to the provisions of a Coal Mines Act, as follows:—

- (a) For a first class certificate of competency as mining manager: Five years' practical mining experience.
- (b) For a certificate of competency as under manager: Three years' practical mining experience.

(c) The Board will accept as evidence of satisfactory practical mining experience under (a) and (b):—

I. The Degree of Bachelor of Mining Engineering, University of Melbourne—2 years.

II. The Diploma of Mining Engineering of any School of Mines in Victoria approved by the Board under clause 13—1 year.

(d) For a permit as a mining manager in the case of a mine in which less than twelve persons are employed underground: Three years' practical mining experience.

11. Every candidate shall produce to the Board testimonials in proof of the nature and extent of his practical experience, sobriety, and general good character, and stating that he is not subject to any mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties; such testimonials to be signed by his previous employers, and in the case of a registered company by the legal manager or chairman of directors of the company.

12. No candidate for any certificate shall be entitled to be examined by the Board unless he produces evidence to comply with regulation 10.

13. The Board shall grant a certificate of competency to any person who has complied with regulations 6, 7, 10, and 11, and who shall produce to the Board a certificate of having passed the requisite examinations from and under the seal of any school of mines or educational institution whose curriculum, training, and subjects for and mode of examination are approved of by the said Board, and every such certificate shall state that it is issued on the certificate of a school of mines or educational institution approved by the Board, and also state the name of such school or institution and the class of mines to which the certificate relates.

14. Every candidate for a certificate shall, upon presenting himself before the Board for examination, make a statutory declaration that the testimonials he produces are genuine and true and correct in every particular; such declaration, together with copies of the testimonials produced, to be retained by the Board. The original testimonials must be produced as well as copies, but the originals will be returned after perusal.

15. If in any case the Board does not deem as satisfactory the evidence submitted by any candidate as required by regulations 10 and 11, it shall refuse to allow such candidate to present himself for examination, but this will not disqualify him from again making application to the Board in connexion with any subsequent examination.

16. Every person who—

- (a) forges or counterfeits or knowingly makes any false statement in any certificate of competency under this Act or in any certificate of service granted under the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1909* or any official copy of any such certificate; or
- (b) knowingly utters or uses any such certificate or copy which has been forged or counterfeited or contains any false statement or knowingly makes use of or attempts to make use of any certificate of competency or service granted to some other person; or
- (c) for the purpose of obtaining for himself or any other person employment as a certificated manager or under manager or the grant renewal or restoration of any certificate under this Act or a copy thereof, either
 - (a) makes or gives any declaration representation statement or evidence which is false in any particular, or
 - (b) knowingly utters produces or makes use of any such declaration representation statement or evidence or any document containing the same—

shall be guilty of a misdemeanour and be liable on conviction to imprisonment for any term not exceeding two years.

17. Every holder of a second class certificate as under manager under these regulations must produce such to the Board previous to his being examined for a first class certificate as mining manager, and in the event of the latter being granted, the certificate he holds shall be surrendered and delivered up to the Board.

18. Every holder of a permit under these regulations must produce such to the Board previous to his being examined for a certificate, and in the event of the latter being granted, the permit he holds shall be surrendered and delivered up to the Board.

19. Whenever any person proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he has, without fault on his part, lost any certificate granted to him under these regulations, such Board may, upon payment of the fee specified in regulation 6e, cause a copy of the certificate

to which the applicant appears to be entitled to be made out and certified to by the Secretary to the Board, and delivered to the applicant, and any copy so made and certified to, as aforesaid, shall have the effect of the original certificate. The fee herein referred to shall be paid to the Secretary for Mines in cash or post-office order, and shall by him be paid into the Consolidated Revenue.

20. Any person holding a certificate under these regulations, and who is charged with any offence or misconduct likely to be detrimental to the efficient discharge of his duties, may render himself liable to have his certificate altered suspended or cancelled by the Board.

21. Candidates for examination for first-class certificates of competency as mining managers must pass in all the following subjects. The details specified are intended to serve merely as a guide to candidates:—

Mining.—The laying out and construction of shafts, chambers, and other underground workings. The winning and working of coal, shale, iron stone, or fire clay. The tapping of water under pressure, the drainage of mines, and construction of underground dams. Blasting, and the nature, properties, and uses of explosives.

Ventilation.—Theory and practice of methods of ventilation; construction of airways, division of currents, and the effects of friction, testing and measurement of mine air; fans and other ventilators. The nature and properties of explosives and dangerous gases; sources and effects of heat in mines; construction, use, and examination of safety lamps.

Explosives in Mines.—Underground fires and inundations, their causes and prevention; coal dust; spontaneous heating; rescue operations, apparatus, and organization. Recovery of mines after explosions, fires, and inundations.

Machinery and Surface Work.—The principles of action, methods of inspection and testing, and the care of winding, pumping, and haulage machinery, and of boilers; transmission of power; practical elementary electricity; coal cutting machines; screening, conveying, and weighing of coal. Erection of mining plant; the laying out and construction of tramways, water races, and flumes. The construction and use of safety cages, detaching hooks, apparatus for preventing overwinding, and other safety appliances. The strength of materials used in mining, such as ropes, chains, timber, iron, and steel. Simple structures.

Surveying.—Principles and practice of surface and underground surveying; adjustment and use of clinometer, level, miners' compass, and theodolite; making of mine plans and connexion with surface surveying; measurements of bedded deposits, and calculating quantities thereof. Each candidate must produce a mine plan with field notes of an actual survey carried out by himself, and these must be certified by the mining manager of the mine to have been the work of the candidate.

Mining Geology.—General and fundamental principles of geology. The composition and character of different classes of coal; bedded deposits and the more common rocks associated with deposits of coal, shale, iron stone, and fire clay; geological sections; effects of faults; location of shafts.

Mine Organization and Accounts.—Books and records to be kept; stores; cost sheets; conditions of employment; contracts, specifications.

Mines Act.—The provisions of the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1915*.

"*First Aid.*"—Each candidate must be the holder of a "First Aid" certificate granted by the St. John Ambulance Society or other approved institution.

22. Candidates for examination for second-class certificates of competency as under-managers must pass in all the following subjects:—

Arithmetic.—Elementary rules applied to mining problems. Vulgar and decimal fractions. Simple mensuration, use of elementary formulæ.

Mining.—(For details of subject, see clause 21.)

Ventilation.—(For details of subject, see clause 21.)

Explosions in Mines.—(For details of subject, see clause 21.)

Surveying (Excluding Production of Mine Plant).—(For details of subject, see clause 21.)

Mines Act.—(For details of subjects, see clause 21.)

"*First Aid.*"—(For details of subject, see clause 21.)

NOTE.—The questions set in these subjects shall be of a nature suitable for practical working miners.

23. For examination purposes the following are the relative values of the subjects in the syllabus:—

24. For a mining manager's certificate a candidate must obtain at least 40 per cent. of the possible marks in each subject, and 60 per cent. on the whole examination.

25. For an under manager's certificate a candidate must obtain at least 40 per cent. of the possible marks in each subject, and 50 per cent. on the whole examination.

WHEREAS by section 24 of the Education Act
1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2644), it is enacted that
the Governor in Council may from time to time make
and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes
therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said
Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the
Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the
advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby
rescind Regulation XXI.—Scholarships—of the Regu-
lations under the Education Act 1915, and make the
following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION XXI—SCHOLARSHIPS.

The Minister of Public Instruction may annually
award scholarships in the manner and on the con-
ditions hereinafter mentioned.

A.—Junior Scholarships.

1. There shall be awarded annually, on competitive
examination, one hundred junior scholarships, or any
less number, in two divisions, namely:—

- (a) Eighty shall be open to pupils in attendance
at State elementary schools, higher ele-
mentary classes, higher elementary
schools, or district high schools in such
proportion as the Director may from time
to time determine.
(b) Twenty shall be open to pupils in attendance
at registered schools.

2. The eighty junior scholarships under clause 1
(a) above shall be divided proportionately between
pupils of State schools grouped for the purpose of the
competitive examination as may be determined from
time to time by the Director and approved by the
Minister.

3. No junior scholarship under clause 1 above shall
be awarded to any candidate whose age, as attested by
a certificate of birth, will exceed fourteen years and
six months on the first day of January immediately
succeeding the examination.

4. The subjects of the competitive examination shall
be:—

(a) For candidates from State elementary schools
under clause 1 (a) above—

English,
Elementary mathe-
matics (including
arithmetic, al-
gebra, and geo-
metry),
Geography,
History and civics,
Drawing.
As prescribed
for Grade
VIII in State
elementary
schools;

(b) For candidates from State higher elementary
classes and higher elementary schools
and district high schools under clause 1
(a) above—

English,
French or Latin or
German,
Elementary mathe-
matics,
History and civics,
Geography,
Elementary science,
Drawing.
As prescribed for
the second
year of the
course in dis-
trict high
schools;

- (c) The twenty junior scholarships, under clause
1 (b) above will be awarded on the com-
petitive examination mentioned in sub-
clauses (a) and (b) of this clause in such
proportions as the Director may, from
time to time, determine. Candidates must
state on their application forms in which
course of study they wish to be examined;
(d) Each candidate must forward with his
application a certificate from his head
teacher showing that he has, during the
year of the competitive examination, fol-
lowed the full course of study prescribed
for Grade VIII. or for the second year of
the course in district high schools.

5. Junior scholarships under clause 1 above shall be
tenable for four years under the following conditions,
namely:—

- (a) That the scholar shall become, at the com-
mencement of the term immediately fol-
lowing the award of the scholarship, and
thereafter during the tenure of his schol-
arship shall remain, a student at an ap-
proved district high school or approved
registered secondary school, or alter-
natively at an approved higher elementary
school for two years, and thereafter during
the currency of his junior scholarship at an
approved district high school or approved
registered secondary school;
(b) That the scholar shall obtain satisfactory re-
ports as to his attendance, conduct, and
progress from the head teacher of the
school which he is attending;
(c) That the scholar shall be recommended an-
nually by an inspector of schools for a
continuance of his scholarship.

6. Registered secondary schools at which holders of
scholarships may attend will, after inspection, be ap-
proved by the Director, provided that they satisfy the
following conditions, namely:—

- (a) They shall provide a complete progressive
course of instruction suitable for pupils
between fourteen and nineteen years of
age at least up to the standard of the
Senior Public examination or the School
Leaving Certificate examination;
(b) The curriculum shall provide a reasonable
range of optional subjects throughout the
course;
(c) The staff normally employed shall be suffi-
cient in number and qualifications for
providing adequate instruction in each
subject of the curriculum, and changes
in the staff must be notified to the Direc-
tor within one month of their occurrence;
(d) There must be at least twenty-five scholars
in attendance taking the full course re-
ferred to in sub-clause (a) above, and
the work of the classes in each year must
be clearly differentiated;
(e) The general equipment shall be satisfactory,
and provision shall be made for the teach-
ing of at least one branch of science with
adequate laboratory accommodation,
equipment, and appliances for practical
work;
(f) The organization, buildings, and grounds
shall be satisfactory, and generally the
school shall rank as a good secondary
school;
(g) They shall be open at any reasonable time
for inspection by any inspector of schools,
authorized by the Minister, and they
must furnish to the Director such reports,
returns, and information as may be re-
quired from time to time;

- (h) After the 1st January, 1918, they shall provide three courses of equivalent standard to those approved by the University of Melbourne for the purpose of the School Intermediate Certificate and the School Leaving Certificate.

B.—Senior Scholarships.

7. There shall be awarded annually, on competitive examination, forty senior scholarships, or any less number, of which—

- (a) Twenty shall be open to holders of junior scholarships under clause 1 above; and
 (b) Twenty shall be open either to holders of junior scholarships under clause 1 above, or to pupils of district high schools or registered schools who satisfy the conditions specified in clause 8 (a) and 8 (c) below.

Holders of junior scholarships must compete for senior scholarships under sub-clause (a); but any holder of a junior scholarship who fails to gain a senior scholarship under sub-clause (a) may have his marks considered for a senior scholarship under sub-clause (b):

8. (a) No senior scholarship under clause 7 above shall be awarded to any candidate whose age, as attested by a certificate of birth, will exceed eighteen years and six months on the first day of January immediately succeeding the examination;
 (b) Candidates for senior scholarships under clause 7 (a) above must have been holders of junior scholarships under clause 1 above for at least three years, and must, previous to the competitive examination, have passed the School Intermediate Certificate examination of the University of Melbourne, or an approved equivalent examination;
 (c) Candidates for senior scholarships under clause 7 (b) above must, previous to the competitive examination, have passed the School Intermediate Certificate examination of the University of Melbourne, or an approved equivalent examination, and, for the two years immediately preceding the competitive examination, must have been in regular attendance at day classes at a district high school or a registered secondary school;
 (d) A candidate who was adjudged "meritorious" at an examination held prior to 1st January, 1914, for scholarships under clause 1 of Regulation XXI, then in force shall be entitled to compete, under the same conditions as holders of junior scholarships, for senior scholarships under clause 7 (a) above.

9. The subjects of the competitive examination for senior scholarships under clause 7 above shall be three of the major subjects (honors standard) prescribed for the School Leaving Certificate examination, provided that a certificate signed by the head master and the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools shows that the candidate has followed an approved course of study for at least two years prior to the examination for senior scholarships and has made satisfactory progress in each of the subjects of such course. The Schools Board shall have power to standardize the marks obtained in each of the subjects presented for the competitive examination.

10. Senior scholarships under clause 7 above shall be of the value of £40 per annum, and will be tenable for four or five years at the University of Melbourne under the following conditions, namely:—

- (a) That the scholar shall, at the commencement of the term immediately following the

award of the senior scholarship, enter as a student at the University of Melbourne, and that he shall, during the whole term of tenure, be enrolled as attending lectures in as many subjects as he must pass in to complete the year of the course he is pursuing;

- (b) That the continuance of the scholarship shall be recommended annually by the Professorial Board of the University of Melbourne.

11. (a) On the recommendation of the Professorial Board, the Director may grant permission to the holder of a senior scholarship under clause 7 above to change the course on which he has entered at the University of Melbourne, but the period for which the scholarship is tenable under the course originally selected shall not be thereby extended;

- (b) In special cases, senior scholarships under clause 7 above may be extended by the Minister for a sixth year.

C.—Scholarships for Candidate Teachers.

12. Sixty teaching scholarships, or any less number, shall be awarded annually for the preliminary training of candidate teachers intending to enter the service of the Department.

13. No teaching scholarship under clause 12 above shall be awarded to any candidate whose age, as attested by a certificate of birth, will be less than fourteen years or more than seventeen years on the first day of January immediately succeeding the competitive examination.

14. (a) The subjects of the competitive examination for the teaching scholarships under clause 12 above shall be those prescribed in clause 4 above for junior scholarships.

- (b) The Director shall determine the number of teaching scholarships under clause 12 above to be awarded, in the subjects specified in sub-clauses (a) and (b) respectively of clause 4 above; and he shall fix, from time to time, the number of teaching scholarships under clause 12 above to be awarded to boys and girls respectively.

15. Teaching scholarships under clause 12 above shall be tenable for three years under the conditions specified in clause 5 above for junior scholarships, provided also that the course of study undertaken by each scholar is approved by the Director.

16. The holder of a teaching scholarship under clause 12 above shall be required to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety not to relinquish his scholarship without the permission of the Minister, and for three years after the termination of his scholarship to teach in any school to which he may be appointed.

D.—Junior Technical Scholarships.

17. There shall be awarded annually, on competitive examination, fifty junior technical scholarships, or any less number, in two divisions, namely:—

- (a) Forty shall be open to pupils in attendance at State elementary schools, higher elementary classes, higher elementary schools, and district high schools;

- (b) Ten shall be open to pupils in attendance at registered schools.

18. No junior technical scholarship under clause 17 above shall be awarded to any candidate whose age, as attested by a certificate of birth, will exceed fourteen years on the first day of January immediately succeeding the examination.

19. (a) Candidates from State elementary schools for junior technical scholarships under clause 17 (a) above will be examined in the following subjects as prescribed for Grade VII. in State elementary schools, namely:—

English;
Elementary mathematics (including arithmetic, algebra, and geometry),
Nature knowledge (including geography, elementary science, and hygiene),
History and civics,
Drawing,

or such other subjects in lieu of these as may be prescribed by the Director and announced from time to time in the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid*;

- (b) Candidates from State higher elementary classes, higher elementary schools and district high schools, for junior technical scholarships under clause 17 (a) above will be examined in the following subjects as prescribed for the first year of the Industrial Course in district high schools, namely:—

English,
History and civics,
Geography,
Arithmetic,
Mathematics,
Elementary science,
Drawing,

or such other subjects in lieu of these as may be prescribed by the Director and announced from time to time in the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid*;

- (c) The ten junior technical scholarships under clause 17 (b) above will be awarded on the competitive examination mentioned in sub-clauses (a) and (b) of this clause. Candidates must state on their application forms in which course of study they wish to be examined;
- (d) The proportionate number of scholarships to be awarded in each of the courses specified in sub-clauses (a) and (b) of this clause shall be determined from time to time by the Director;
- (e) Each candidate for a junior technical scholarship must forward with his application form a certificate from his head teacher showing that he has, during the year of the competitive examination, followed the full course of study prescribed for Grade VII. or for the first year of the Industrial Course in district high schools.

20. Junior technical scholarships under clause 17 above shall be tenable for two years under the following conditions, namely:—

- (a) That the scholar shall become, at the commencement of the term immediately following the award of the scholarship, and thereafter during the tenure of his scholarship shall remain, a student in a junior technical school or in the industrial course at an approved higher elementary school or district high school;
- (b) That the scholar shall obtain at the end of each year a satisfactory report as to his attendance, conduct, and progress from the head teacher of the school which he is attending;
- (c) That the scholar shall be recommended annually by an inspector of schools for the continuance of his scholarship; and
- (d) That the course of study followed by the scholar shall be approved by the Director on the report of an inspector of schools.

21. The holder of a junior technical scholarship under clause 17 above shall receive free tuition at a junior technical school, or in the industrial course at an approved higher elementary school or district high school; and, in addition, there shall be granted to his head teacher an allowance of £4 per annum towards expenses of school requisites of such scholar.

E.—Senior Technical Scholarships.

22. Fifty-five senior technical scholarships, or any less number, shall be awarded annually to candidates who have been in regular attendance, for at least two years, at junior technical schools, technical schools, evening continuation classes, higher elementary classes, higher elementary schools, district high schools, or registered secondary schools, of which—

- (a) Twenty shall be open to boys, and shall be tenable for the full length of approved day courses in technical schools, and shall entitle the holders to free tuition and to an allowance of £30 per annum;
- (b) Ten shall be open to girls, and shall be tenable for the full length of approved day courses, and shall entitle the holders to free tuition and to an allowance of £30 per annum;
- (c) Twenty shall be open to boys in employment, and shall be tenable for the full length of approved evening courses, and shall entitle the holders to free tuition and to an allowance of £10 per annum;
- (d) Five shall be open to girls in employment, and shall be tenable for the full length of approved evening courses, and shall entitle the holders to free tuition and to an allowance of £10 per annum.

23. Senior technical scholarships under clause 22 above shall be tenable under the following conditions, namely:—

- (a) That the scholar shall become, at the commencement, or as soon as possible after the commencement, of the first term, and thereafter during the currency of his scholarship shall remain, a student in an approved course of study at an approved technical school;
- (b) That the scholar shall obtain satisfactory reports as to his attendance, conduct and progress from the principal or director of the school he is attending;
- (c) That the scholar shall be recommended annually by the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools for a continuance of his scholarship;
- (d) That holders of scholarships in evening courses shall be in employment in the same kind of work as that in which the scholarship is granted.

24. Senior technical scholarships under clause 22 above will be awarded on application to the Director, which must be made on a prescribed form before the first day of November in each year. Applications for senior technical scholarships will be dealt with by a Board consisting of the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools, the Inspector of Art, and a third person nominated by the Minister. In all cases the decision of this Board shall be final. Where, in the opinion of the Board, such a course is considered necessary, a competitive examination may be held. The details of this competitive examination will be determined by the Board.

F.—Travelling Scholarships.

25. On the recommendation of a Board consisting of the Director, the Public Service Commissioner, and a member of the teaching staff of the University of Melbourne, nominated by the Minister, one travelling scholarship, tenable for one year, for the purpose of

enabling the holder to pursue such studies and investigations outside Victoria as may be approved by the Minister, shall be awarded annually in rotation to the following classes of officers:—

- (a) An inspector of schools.
- (b) A lecturer in the Teachers' College or a teacher in a technical school.
- (c) A teacher in a higher elementary school or in a district high school.
- (d) A teacher in an elementary school.

The value of a scholarship under this clause shall be full pay during the absence of the holder from Victoria, and, where the salary of the holder does not exceed £250 per annum, an additional allowance up to £50.

26. On the recommendation of the Board mentioned in clause 25 above, a travelling scholarship shall be awarded annually to an officer of the Education Department for the purpose of allowing him to undertake such studies as may be approved by the Minister. This scholarship shall be of the value of £150 per annum, together with such allowance (if any) as may be approved by the Minister, and shall be tenable for a period of one or two years as the Minister may determine.

27. On the recommendation of the Board mentioned in clause 25 above, one travelling scholarship shall be awarded biennially to teachers of modern languages in the service of the Education Department who are also graduates in arts and in education, and who have obtained final honors in the School of Modern Languages at the University of Melbourne. This scholarship shall be of the value of £150, and shall be tenable in courses of study in countries outside Australia approved by the Minister.

28. On the recommendation of the Board mentioned in clause 25 above, a travelling scholarship shall be awarded annually to exit-students or to teachers in technical schools to enable the holders to undertake such studies as may be approved by the Minister. This scholarship shall be tenable for one year, and shall entitle the holder to an allowance of £150, together with such allowance (if any) for travelling as may be approved by the Minister.

29. The holder of a travelling scholarship under clauses 25, 26, and 27 above shall be required to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety not to relinquish his scholarship, and for three years after the termination of his scholarship to remain in the service of the Department.

30. The special conditions under which the travelling scholarships under clauses 25, 26, 27, and 28 above are tenable shall be determined annually by the Minister.

G.—Nominated Courses in Agriculture, Mining, and Veterinary Science.

31. In accordance with the provisions of section 4 (d) of the University Act, No. 1926, twenty nominations, or any less number, shall be made annually for the purpose of enabling students to proceed to a degree or a diploma in agriculture or in mining or in veterinary science at the University of Melbourne.

32. (a) Students nominated under clause 31 above shall receive free tuition at the University of Melbourne in the subjects of degrees or diplomas in agriculture, mining, or veterinary science for the full period of the course taken, subject to the conditions set forth in sub-clauses (a) and (b) of clause 10 above;

(b) Every student nominated under clause 31 above will be required to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety not to transfer to any other course at the University of Melbourne without the approval of the Minister, and also in

the event of such approval being granted, to repay to the Minister all fees and allowances the benefits of which he has received as a result of the said nomination.

33. (a) Application for nominated courses under clause 31 above must be made on a prescribed form before the first day of November in each year. When applications are being dealt with, preference will be given to the holders of scholarships under clause 1 (b) of Regulation XXI. made on 28th October, 1913, and to applicants qualified for matriculation at the University of Melbourne who have undergone a course in agriculture at an agricultural high school or in science at an approved school;

(b) No nomination under clause 31 above shall be made to any student whose age, as attested by a certificate of birth, will exceed eighteen years and six months on the first day of January in the year immediately succeeding the year in which the application is made.

34. The Minister may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it in any special case, grant to a student nominated under clause 31 above a subsistence allowance of £26 per annum; but in every case the special circumstances must be specifically set forth.

General Conditions.

35. Where schools are classified in divisions or in subdivisions, the Director shall determine the division or the subdivision in which a school shall be placed, and the number of scholarships to be awarded to each division or subdivision; and, in the case of candidates who, during the twelve months preceding the examination at which they present themselves, have attended more schools than one, he shall determine the division or the subdivision in which such candidates may be permitted to compete.

36. No scholarship under clause 1, 12, or 17 above shall be awarded, and no nomination under clause 31 above shall be made, to any candidate who, during the two years immediately preceding the first day of January succeeding the examination, has not been continuously on the rolls of and in regular attendance at a school in Victoria; but candidates who have not resided in Victoria for a period of two years may be granted permission to compete in the division or subdivision in which the school they have attended is placed.

37. No scholarship shall be awarded to any candidate who, at the competitive examination, does not obtain a satisfactory percentage of the possible marks. If, however, the number of candidates in any division or subdivision of scholarships under clauses 1, 12, and 17 above, who obtain a satisfactory percentage of the possible marks, be less than the number of scholarships allotted to such division or subdivision, the scholarships unallotted may be awarded to candidates in any other division or subdivision.

38. (a) Where a scholar under clause 1 or clause 12 above is allowed by the Minister to attend a higher elementary school or a district high school, he shall receive free tuition thereat; and, in addition, there shall be granted to his head teacher an allowance of £4 per annum towards expenses of school requisites of such scholar;

(b) Where a scholar under clause 1 or clause 12 above is allowed by the Minister to attend an approved registered secondary school, he shall be granted an allowance of £12 towards expenses of tuition and of school requisites.

39. (a) Where a scholar under clause 1, 12, or 17 above does not reside within five miles of a school at which his scholarship is tenable, the Minister may allow him such sum (not exceeding £5 per annum) as will cover the cost of transit to and from school;
- (b) Where it is necessary that any scholar under clause 1, 12, or 17 above shall reside apart from his parents or guardians, the Minister may grant, in lieu of the cost of transit of such scholar, an allowance for board at the rate of £26 per annum. Provided, however, if the circumstances warrant it, the Minister may, in special cases, grant this allowance to scholars not residing apart from their parents or guardians;
- (c) The allowances mentioned in sub-clauses (a) and (b) of this clause shall not be paid to any scholar if the total amount of net profits, emoluments, and income received by his parents or guardians during the preceding year exceeded a quota of £50 for each member of the family, including such parents or guardians and excluding children earning a wage of Ten shillings or more weekly. Provided that the above restriction shall not affect any scholar whose parents' net profits, emoluments, and income were less than £250. The Minister shall decide whether any scholar is eligible to receive such allowance, and the decision of the Minister shall be final.

40. Payments of allowances will be made quarterly, with the exception of those mentioned in clauses 21 and 38 (a) above, which will be made to the head teacher at the beginning of the school year. All payments and all awards of scholarships by the Minister will be conditional on moneys being placed at his disposal by the Legislature. The approval of the Minister must first be obtained to a letter of application (on a prescribed form) by the scholar's parent or guardian before a claim for payment of the allowance under clause 34, 39 (a), or 39 (b) above will be entertained.

41. The Minister may at any time cancel any scholarship if—

- (a) the prescribed conditions of tenure are not complied with; or if
- (b) he is satisfied that the conduct of any scholar has been idle, unbecoming, disorderly, or immoral; or if
- (c) it is shown, on the report of an inspector of schools, that any scholar has failed to make satisfactory progress;

and, thereupon, all advantages and allowances connected with such scholarship shall cease and determine.

42. On the production of satisfactory evidence, any scholar may, on the certificate of the Director, have his scholarship suspended by the Minister for one year, and, if necessary, for a further period.

43. No scholar shall at the same time hold and enjoy more than one scholarship granted under this regulation.

44. The provisions of this regulation shall come into force on 1st January, 1917.

The portion described in the foregoing schedule is shown on a plan approved by the Governor in Council, and deposited in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne.

And the Honorable Hugh McKenzie, His Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

A By-law of the City of Richmond, made under sections 197 and 228 of the *Local Government Act* 1915, for altering By-law No. 75 of the Council of the City of Richmond.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915, the Council of the City of Richmond hereby order as follows:—
