Public Service Act 1915 and Lunacy Act 1915. REGULATIONS.-LUNACY DEPARTMENT.

THE Inspector General of the Insane, pursuant to the provisions of the Public Service Act No. 2713, and the Lunacy Act No. 2687, hereby repeals the Regulations heretofore made under such Acts, and makes the following Regulations to take effect from the 1st July, 1916.—

In these Regulations "Inspector-General" means the Inspector-General of the Insane appointed under the Lunacy Act No. 2687.

The Regulations are divided into the following Chapters, viz.:—

Chapter II.—General Division, Appointment to the Chapter III.—General Division, Classification of.

CHAPTER II.—APPOINTMENT AND PROMOTION IN THE GENERAL DIVISION.

(Act No. 2713, Section 71 (v), (vi), and (vii), and Act No. 2687, Section 13.)

Registration and Examination of Applicants.

Registration and Examination of Applicants.

1. Every applicant (except for the position of Messenger) must at the date of his application be between the ages of twenty-one and forty-one years, and must forward to the office of the Inspector-General of the Insane an application in his own handwriting, stating his full name and address, the date and place of birth, and the particular appointment or class of appointment which he desires to obtain. He must also send in a certificate of good moral character and industry, as well as a certificate of suitability for employment from either the Inspector-General of the Insane or the Medical Superintendent of one of the Hospitals.

Nurses should be approximately 5 ft. 3 in. in height, and Attendants 5 ft. 8 in., with correspondingly good physical development, and in their form of application they should state what their previous occupation or work has been.

Applicants for the positions of Messenger must be between the ages of sixteen and twenty: Messengers will not be retained after they have reached the age of

between the ages of sixteen and twenty: Messengers will not be retained after they have reached the age of twenty-one years.

2. Every applicant to be recorded for appointment to any office requiring the exercise of skill usually acquired in some mechanical trade or other occupation must satisfy the Inspector-General, by the production of certificates or otherwise, that he possesses the handicraft and experience necessary for the work of the office.

3. On the production of these certificates applicants may have their names entered in the "Register of Applicants for Employment," and will be nominated as vacancies occur. Prior to nomination, however, it will be necessary for applicants to furnish a certificate of good physical health.

4. New appointments, all things being equal, will be made from among those persons whose names are entered in the "Register of Applicants for Employment" according to priority of registration for vacant offices, combined with fitness in each case for the particular office to be filled, and the Educational Test Examination having been passed; but the Inspector-General may nominate any applicant who has special qualifications without regard to his position on the Register.

5. If any person decline to accept an appointment which is offered to him, his name will thereupon be removed from the Register. The name of a candidate may also be removed from the Register if he fail to reply within seven days to any communication from the Lunacy Department addressed to him at his last place of residence known to the Inspector-General.

6. No name of any person shall remain on the Register as that of a person qualified for appointment after he shall have attained the age of forty-one years, or for a

longer period than two years from date of registration, except in the case of applicants who, subsequent to registration, joined the Australian Expeditionary

7. Any person appointed under these Regulations will be on probation for twelve months, and the Attendants will be required prior to their probationary appointment to pass an examination which will prove the sufficiency of their education.

The subjects of examination shall be those specified hereunder:—

(a) Handwriting: to be tested by copying out at least 200 words from a passage of simple English.

(b) Spelling: to be tested by writing from dicta-tion an extract from a newspaper—not less than 100 words.

(c) Arithmetic: first four rules, simple and money.

Applicants who have passed any examination for candidates for appointment in the Public Service of Victoria, or any like examination, will be exempted from this examination. Persons appointed to positions in the General Division other than those of Attendants will not be required to pass the Educational Examination, i.c., Hospital Trained Nurses, Nurses, Artisans, and Servants Servants.

First Departmental Examination.

8. Attendants and Nurses appointed under these Regu-

8. Attendants and Nurses appointed under these Regulations must qualify themselves for retention on the staff of the Lunacy Department and for subsequent increments to their salaries, by attending the necessary courses of lectures in Elementary Anatomy and Physiology, First Aid to the Injured, and General Duties.

Failure of an Attendant or Nurse to pass the Departmental Examinations within the times specified will be considered to be evidence of incapacity to discharge the duties of his or her office; and the retention of Attendants and Nurses on the staff will be conditional on their passing these examinations. No Attendant or Attendants and Nurses on the staff will be conditional on their passing these examinations. No Attendant or Nurse will be retained on the staff of the Lunacy Department unless he or she has passed the First Departmental Examination.

partmental Examination.

9. The First Departmental Examination cannot be undertaken before the Attendant or Nurse has been in the service of the Lunacy Department for a period of one year. In the event of a failure to pass at the first attempt, on the recommendation of the Medical Superintendent the Inspector-General may approve of a second opportunity to pass the examination being given.

Second Departmental Examination.

10. The Second Departmental Examination-in gene-10. The Second Departmental Examination—in general nursing and duties—cannot be undertaken until after the end of the second year of service in the Lunacy Department, but the Attendants and Nurses must present themselves for this Examination before the end of the fourth year of service, dating from the time of appointment on probation. In the event of a failure to pass this second examination at the first attempt, on the recommendation of the Medical Superintendent the Inspector-General may approve of other conportunities. spector-General may approve of other opportunities to pass the examination being given. In the event of a second failure to pass, however, the services of the unsuccessful candidate may be dispensed with.

11. The first increment will only be recommended to

the Attendant or Nurse conditional on the First Dethe Attendant or Nurse conditional on the First Departmental Examination having been passed, and if he or she is approved of by the Medical Superintendent and the Inspector-General, and on the production of a certificate of good conduct and diligence from the Medical Superintendent of the Hospital for the Insane where he or she is employed. The second increment will not be recommended until the Second Departmental Examination has been passed. ination has been passed.

Third Departmental Examination,

12. The Third Departmental Examination in mental disorders, nursing and duties, together with elementary anatomy and physiology of brain and nervous system, can only be undertaken after the third, year of service and one year after the passing of the Second Examination. On the passing of this examination a certificate will be given to the successful examine setting forth that he or she is a Trained Mental Attendant or Nurse. In the event of failure other opportunities will be given to pass on the recommendation of the Medical Superintendent. This Examination will qualify Attendants and Nurses for promotion to the Second Grade. Attendants and Nurses who passed the Second Nursing Examination provided by the previous Regulations will be eligible for promotion to the Second Grade without passing the Third Nursing Examination provided by these Regulations. Before being eligible for promotion to the position of Head Attendant or Hospital Attendant and Chief Nurse or Hospital Nurse they must pass the Third Examination 12. The Third Departmental Examination in mental Examination

- 13. In determining the claims of officers to promotion, consideration will be given in respect of merit to the following qualifications:—
 - (a) Possession of the Departmental Nursing Certi-
 - ficate.

 (b) Ability and knowledge required to fulfil the duties of the superior office, and the possession of the necessary tact and judgment.

 (c) Industrious habits and careful performance of

 - (d) Good conduct, regular attendance, and prompt and cheerful service on urgent occasions.

 (e) Mental vigour and sound bodily health.

 (f) Performance of valuable services of a special nature.
- 14. For promotion to the First Grade selection will be made from among those Attendants and Nurses who have passed into the Second Grade, and who have, by reason of their special fitness for the work, as well as by their good conduct and industry, proved themselves capable of taking charge of a large and important ward.
- 15. Except in a case in which the Inspector-General shall certify that some particular office in the Lunacy Department should be filled by a Hospital Trained Nurse, the person to fill the position of Hospital Attendant or Hospital Nurse may be selected from among the Attendants and Nurses who have demonstrated their capacity for the special work required of them.
- 16. Officers appointed to any position in the Lunacy Department shall not, until they shall have served for a period of 5 years on the staff of the Department, be transferred to any other Department or Branch unless such transfer is determined to be in the interests of the Public Service.

Board of Examiners.

- 17. All Departmental Examinations will be conducted y a Board of Examiners, which will consist of the 17. All Departmental Examinations will be conducted by a Board of Examiners, which will consist of the Inspector-General, and one or two Medical Superintendents or Deputy Superintendents as may be considered necessary appointed by the Inspector-General.
- 18. The subjects for the Departmental Examinations shall be those set forth in the syllabus of lectures adopted from time to time and issued to each Hospital for the Insane, the text-book being as prescribed from time to time.
- 19. The employees at the Idiot Asylum and the Recaption House so far as is practicable will be subject to the same rules as the employees in the Hospitals for the
- 20. In accordance with the exigencies of the Department, and in order to facilitate the better training of Attendants and Nurses, the Inspector-General may transfer an Attendant or Nurse from one Hospital to another, or from the female side to the male side of the same Hospital where the nursing of male patients is undertaken by formels Nurses. taken by female Nurses.
- 21. All probationers and persons appointed on the staff of the Lunacy Department will be required to sign the agreement hereunder at the time of entry on duty.

LUNACY DEPARTMENT.

I hereby acknowledge to have received and read a copy of rules and instructions appended hereto and behaviour and suitability (and, for the Attendants and Nurses, that the possession of the Departmental Nursing certificates), are the only means by which I may expect promotion, and that any attempt to gain promotion by other influences than these will be taken as an acknowledgment on my part of my unfitness for such promotion; further that one month's notice at least is required before an application to be allowed to leave the service of the Lunacy Department will be considered.

CHAPTER III.—CLASSIFICATION OF THE GENERAL DIVISION.

(Act No. 2713, Section 71 (viii), and Act No. 2687, Section 13.)

- 1. In the case of appointments, promotions or transfers to any office in the General Division in the Lunacy Department, the scale or amount of salary assigned to the several offices mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be that respectively entered opposite the name of the office in such Schedule in the column headed "Yearly Rate of Pay."
- 2. In cases where no minimum salary is entered opposite the name of his office in the said Schedule every officer shall be entitled to receive pay at the maximum rate without addition thereto.
- 3. In cases where there is a minimum rate and a maximum rate, every officer shall be entitled to receive salary at a rate within the minimum and maximum limits to be approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Inspector-General of the Insane, provided that an officer on his first appointment to the Department shall be paid at not more than the minimum rate of his effice.
- 4. Any officer transferred or promoted to any class or grade shall thereupon be deemed to be junior to any officer already in such class or grade, but notwithstanding anything in the Schedule hereto he shall be paid an amount not less than that which he was receiving

immediately before such transfer or promotion. Officers who are transferred to the Attendants' or Nurses' staff from the Artisans' and Servants' staff, and who are in receipt of salaries at or above the maximum of the Third Grade, may be transferred to the Second Grade on the recommendation of the Inspector-General without regard to their seniority. They will, however, be required to pass the Educational and Departmental Examinations prior to being so transferred.

- 5. In the case of Attendants and Nurses, promotion from Grade to Grade may be approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Inspector-General, and shall be regulated in accordance with the special regulations for Attendants and Nurses.
- 6. Increments may be granted to officers appointed to the offices mentioned in the following Schedule, and at the rates set forth in the Schedule.
- 7. Where an officer previously to his transfer from one office to another has been paid the same salary as in his new office, time served in such former office may be counted in reckoning the interval for the first increment.
- 8. Every increment shall be discretionary, and no increment shall be payable except on the certificate of the Permanent Head of the Department and of the Inspector-General that such increment has been earned by good conduct and efficient service.
- 9. If any officer is in receipt of pay greater than the maximum rate, he shall continue to receive such pay until he can be employed upon work equivalent to his salary.
- 10. Failure on the part of Attendants and Nurses to pass the Nursing Examinations will be taken as inefficient service, and, should the examinations not be passed, increments will not be granted.
- 11. If any officer be absent from duty on account of illness, and such illness shall have extended beyond seven days, no deduction shall be made from the salary of such officer on account of allowances after the expiration of such period of seven days if the officer is under medical treatment at his own home or at a general hospital. In the case of the single men and the members of the female staff, it shall be at the discretion of the Medical Superintendent as to whether the officers shall remain at the Hospital for the Insane for treatment or be allowed to leave the institution. When an officer on sick leave on full pay is drawing his allowances the full charge for these allowances as provided by these Regulations will be made. When the officer is on half pay only, half the charge will be made. No charge is to be made should an officer be allowed leave without pay.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 8th November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

- 1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed
- 2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board-
- (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the Government Gazette.
- (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

- 3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.
- 4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to
- 5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

- (b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the loard, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.
- (c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.
- (d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.
- 6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

Examiners.

I. A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously amployed with me as in the practice of land surveying, for viz., from or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of years (of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

(Signed) (Date.)

Note.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

- 8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.
- 9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plandrawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tacheometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

· Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compila-tion of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Oandidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

· · CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or

authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealaud, either without examination or on such viva voce examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent theoreto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination un'ess he shall have passed the University or other examination as setforth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913;
- (b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service. LICENCES TO SURVEY.

LICKNOES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to lat January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, and who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 ls.), the declaration as prescribed by the Land Surveyors Act 1895, and satisfactory evidence as to character. character.

Stock Foods Act 1915. REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council is empowered by the Stock Foods Act 1915 to make Regulations as to any matters whatsoever not being contrary to the provisions of this Act necessary to give effect to this Act: Now therefore the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the following Regulations:—

1. The substance mentioned and set forth in the second column of the Schedule hereunder is hereby prescribed to be a "foreign ingredient" relative to "stock food." The proportion or amount of such "foreign ingredient" which may be contained in any kind of "stock food" shall not exceed the proportion or amount placed in the third column of the said Schedule opposite the name or description of such kind of "stock food" in the first column of such Schedule.

2. That all bags containing straw chaff shall be distinctly stencilled (in letters not less than 2½ inches in length) the words "straw chaff."

3. That where possible straw chaff shall be stored on a separate floor from that on which the chaffcutter is located, but where this cannot be done the straw chaff shall be stacked at a distance from the chaffcutter satisfactory to the Inspector.

4. That every firm dealing in straw chaff or oat hulls keep a register open to the Inspector during business hours in which shall be distinctly shown the quantities brought into store, that cut or produced on the premises, and how disposed of.

5. The penalty for any contravention of these Regulations shall be a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.
