#### REGULATIONS FOR PUPIL DRAUGHTSMAN. CONDITIONS.

A N applicant for appointment must not be more than eighteen years nor less then eighteen A eighteen years nor less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate that he is of sound constitution and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper discharge of his profession.

#### QUALIFICATIONS.

QUALIFICATIONS.

The candidate must have passed the Junior Public Examination in subjects including English, algebra, arithmetic, and geometry in the Melbourne or other recognised University; or Passed such other recognised examination, or produce such certificates from the Education Department or other authority as shall satisfy the Surveyor-General as to his competency in the subjects mentioned above, and as to his general educational proficiency.

He shall also, with such certificates, submit satisfactory proof of his aptitude for plan drawing.

A viva vace or a practical examination may be held before the final selection of candidates.

#### PROBATION.

Each candidate approved by the Minister shall enter the office as a probationer for a period of one month without pay; and, at the end of that time, if reported by the Surveyor-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, he shall be enrolled as a pupil, and shall be subject to the General Regulations for the Public Service, so far as they can reasonably apply.

#### TERM OF SERVICE.

The term of service shall be two years, and at the end of each year the pupil will be required to pass an examination on the subjects mentioned in the schedule

The Minister reserves the power to dispense at any time with the services of any pupil who may, in the opinion of the Surveyor-General, be wanting in application or in the careful performance of his work, or whose conduct may be considered by him to be unsatisfactory.

#### REMUNERATION.

The salary for the first year shall be £48, and, subject to the passing of the required examinations, the salary for the second year shall be £60. On successfully passing the prescribed departmental examinations, a pupil will, at the end of the term of two years, receive a certificate of competency as a draughtsman, and if otherwise satisfactory may be appointed on the permanent staff as Draughtsman, Class 1., salary £72 to £192, in accordance with the Regulations under the Public Service Acts.

BY-LAW NO. 135.

A By-law for Regulating the Keeping of Fowls within the City of Melbourne.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1915 (and of every other power enabling it on that behalf), the Council of the City of Melbourne hereinafter referred to as "the Council," doth hereby make the By-law following, that is to say:—

1. If in the opinion of the Council the removal of a fowl-yard, any part of which is within twenty-five feet of a dwelling-house, is necessary for the health of any of the residents in its vicinity, the Council may order the owner or occupier of the premises in which such fowl-yard is situate to remove or alter the same so that no part of it shall be within twenty-five feet of any dwelling-house. dwelling-house.

2. No person shall within twenty-five feet of a dwelling-house establish or construct a fowl-yard, or cause or permit one to be established or constructed, nor within such distance permit any land or place to be used afresh or for the first time as a fowl-yard.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the City of Melbourne.

4. Every person who shall disobey any order of the Council under this By-law, or who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

This By-law was made and passed by the Council of the City of Melbourne, at the meeting of the said Council held on the seventeenth day of July, 1916.

No subletting will be allowed; no delivery of Meat shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor. Every person engaged in the cutting up, preparation, or delivery of the Meat tendered for in this sub-schedule shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by any Wages Board under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts to which such persons are subject as employees; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory or shop (and in each of these conditions, or any breact of the said determination, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the-contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF YARRAGON.

therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Williams.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog nucless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained; and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosure and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fête, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by those Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
