The commencing salary is £80, rising to a maximum of £204 a year by increments, which may be granted at intervals of not less than one year if recommended by the Permanent Head of the Department and the Public Service Commissioner.

For the position of Penal Warder applicants must be between the ages of 25 and 35 years, and must furnish a certificate of fitness from the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments, Melbourne, not later than Friday, the 6th October, 1916. No applicant shall be registered as a candidate for such position if he shall be less than 5 ft. 8 in. in height, or measure round his chest less than 38 inches, or weigh less than 11 stone.

REGULATIONS FOR PUPIL DRAUGHTSMAN.

CONDITIONS.

AN applicant for appointment must not be more than eighteen years nor less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate that he is of sound constitution and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper discharge of his profession.

QUALIFICATIONS.

The candidate must have passed the Junior Public Examination in subjects including English, algebra, arithmetic, and geometry in the Melbourne or other recognised University; or

Passed such other recognised examination, or produce such certificates from the Education Department or other authority as shall satisfy the Surveyor-General as to his competency in the subjects mentioned above, and as to his general educational proficiency.

He shall also, with such certificates, submit satisfactory proof of his aptitude for plan drawing.

A *viva voce* or a practical examination may be held before the final selection of candidates.

PROBATION.

Each candidate approved by the Minister shall enter the office as a probationer for a period of one month without pay; and, at the end of that time, if reported by the Surveyor-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, he shall be enrolled as a pupil, and shall be subject to the General Regulations for the Public Service, so far as they can reasonably apply.

TERM OF SERVICE.

The term of service shall be two years, and at the end of each year the pupil will be required to pass an examination on the subjects mentioned in the schedule hereunder.

The Minister reserves the power to dispense at any time with the services of any pupil who may, in the opinion of the Surveyor-General, be wanting in application or in the careful performance of his work, or whose conduct may be considered by him to be unsatisfactory.

REMUNERATION.

The salary for the first year shall be £48, and, subject to the passing of the required examinations, the salary for the second year shall be £60. On successfully passing the prescribed departmental examinations, a pupil will, at the end of the term of two years, receive a certificate of competency as a draughtsman, and if otherwise satisfactory may be appointed on the permanent staff as Draughtsman, Class I, salary £72 to £192, in accordance with the Regulations under the Public Service Acts.

BY-LAW No. 135.

A By-law for Regulating the Keeping of Fowls within the City of Melbourne.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1915* (and of every other power enabling it on that behalf), the Council of the City of Melbourne hereinafter referred to as "the Council," doth hereby make the By-law following, that is to say:—

1. If in the opinion of the Council the removal of a fowl-yard, any part of which is within twenty-five feet of a dwelling-house, is necessary for the health of any of the residents in its vicinity, the Council may order the owner or occupier of the premises in which such fowl-yard is situate to remove or alter the same so that no part of it shall be within twenty-five feet of any dwelling-house.

2. No person shall within twenty-five feet of a dwelling-house establish or construct a fowl-yard, or cause or permit one to be established or constructed, nor within such distance permit any land or place to be used afresh or for the first time as a fowl-yard.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the City of Melbourne.

4. Every person who shall disobey any order of the Council under this By-law, or who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

This By-law was made and passed by the Council of the City of Melbourne, at the meeting of the said Council held on the seventeenth day of July, 1916.

MEAT (FRESHLY KILLED).

No subletting will be allowed; no delivery of Meat shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor. Every person engaged in the cutting up, preparation, or delivery of the Meat tendered for in this sub-schedule shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by any Wages Board under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts to which such persons are subject as employees; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory or shop (and in each part of the factory or shop where several rooms are in use) in which Meat is prepared under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, or any breach of the said determination, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

The Meat must be supplied as ordered. Where hindquarters or buttocks are ordered, 9 inches must be cut off from the end of the leg from the hock upwards, i.e., the end of the leg from which the shank has been removed at the abattoirs; and joint, must be removed. No. 2686) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Caulfield has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Council for the purpose of making streets within the said city, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby declare the lands reserved, used, or acquired for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate within the City of Caulfield aforesaid, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF YARRAGON.

WE, Christopher Johnstone, Charles Thomson, James Brown, Albert Harris, George Samuel Brown, Andrew Wall, and Oliver Francis Lintoll Anderson, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 15th September, 1890, as a site for Public Recreation in the parish of Yarragon, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained; and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosure and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fête, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by those Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

CONDITIONS OF SUPPLY UNDER MONTHLY QUOTATIONS.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the person or firm quoting for goods all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order during the month for which quotations are made.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule. In the case of different makers' goods, the person or firm quoting will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. Substantial and effective preference will be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is satisfactory and the rate reasonable. Preference will also be given to articles of British manufacture as against those of foreign manufacture.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices quoted; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever, or packages, cases, casks, &c., beyond the price quoted and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the person or firm quoting. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the person or firm quoting shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the person or firm.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office, and Williamstown district will include the Town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra. Such officers shall have full power to reject supplies not considered suitable or which are not in the terms of the schedule.
