FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1915.

DETERMINATION OF THE CARDBOARD
BOX TRADE BOARD.

*Factories and Shops Act 1915.***DETERMINATION OF THE CARDBOARD BOX TRADE BOARD.**

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed either inside or outside a factory or work-room in the process, trade, or business of a maker of cardboard boxes has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That the previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 16th day of October, 1916.

2. That the lowest rates of wages to be paid to the following persons shall be:—

APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.**DEFINITION (ACT 2650, SECTION 3).**

"Apprentice" means any person under twenty-one years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over twenty-one years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship.

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over twenty-one years of age, or who, being over twenty-one years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver.

OVERTIME.

4. That any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of 48 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a third.

SUNDAY AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

5. That double time shall be the special rate for all work done on—

Sunday,
New Year's Day,
26th January (Foundation Day),
21st April (Eight Hours Day),
Good Friday,
Easter Monday,
Christmas Day,
Boxing Day,

but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

PIECE-WORK PRICES.

(6) That the lowest piece-work prices payable to any person engaged in the following kinds of work shall be:—

Where rates are fixed for making boxes in parts, if any part or parts enumerated are not done by the person making the box, the amount provided for making such part or parts may be deducted from the complete price.

The rates fixed in this Schedule are for boxes made with glue, except where "made with paste" is specially mentioned.

If boxes provided for as being made with glue are made with paste, 1s. per gross may be deducted from complete price for making.

Where paste and glue are mixed together in the manufacture of boxes, the rate fixed for making boxes with glue must be paid.

Piece-work rates fixed for making uncovered, machine-made boxes do not include lidding and nesting.

Any box of the kinds enumerated in this Schedule not provided for shall be paid for according to the nearest size box of the same description, taking length, width, and depth.

Lids over 1½ inches deep shall be paid for at Box Band rates.

Boxes fitted with calico, 6½d. per gross extra; cleaning glass for lids, 1s. 1½d. per gross extra.

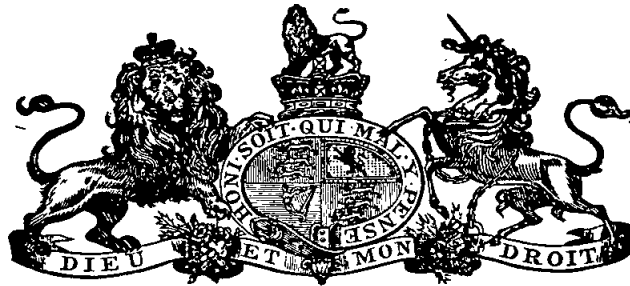
Labelling cartons, 1s. 2½d. per 1,000 cartons.

7. The Board determines, under the provisions of section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act* 1915, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which this Board has not fixed piece-work prices but has fixed a minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.

Factories and Shops Act 1915.

DETERMINATION OF THE UNDERTAKERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the business or occupation of an undertaker, has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That the previous Determination of this Board is hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 13th day of October, 1916.
The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

WAGES.

2. That the lowest rates of wages to be paid to the following persons shall be—

- (a) Workers engaged in making coffins of oak, kauri, cedar, white pine, or other wrought timber .. 64s. per week of 48 hours.
- (b) Workers engaged in making other coffins, trimming or polishing coffins, or conducting funerals .. 60s. " "
- (c) Workers engaged in driving or grooming horses, driving or cleaning motors, washing vehicles, cleaning harness, doing general stable work, or placing the remains of deceased persons in coffins .. 56s. " 52 hours.*

Provided that workers who live at branch establishments and work for more than two days per week at the employer's principal place of business shall receive 20s. per week extra, and that workers who live and work at either principal or branch establishments shall receive 10s. per week extra.

* The hours fixed above for the week's work are to be taken as including time occupied in attending to horses on Sundays (not exceeding two hours).

APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

3. The Undertakers Board has prescribed a form of apprenticeship agreement. Section 187 requires that the indentures must be in that form.

"Apprentice" means any person under 21 years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship or any person over 21 years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piecework price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over 21 years of age, or who, being over 21 years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

That—

- (a) the lowest rates which may be paid to apprentices or improvers; and
- (b) the proportionate number of apprentices and improvers who may be employed in any factory or place

shall be as shown in the following table:—

 7 a.m. 6.30 p.m. on six days in the week.

OVERTIME.

5. That the following rates shall be paid for overtime :—

- Outside the hours fixed in Clause 4 Time and a half.
 Within the hours fixed in Clause 4 in excess of the
 number of hours as fixed for a week's work Time and a quarter.

CASUAL LABOUR.

6. That casual employees, *i.e.*, persons who are employed during any week for not more than one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination as a week's work, shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter, with a minimum of 7s. 6d. per day.

SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

7. That double time shall be the special rate of payment payable to any person for work done on—

- Sundays ;
 New Year's Day ;
 Good Friday ;
 Christmas Day .

Provided that persons employed at cleaning out stables, feeding, grooming, and bedding-down horses shall be paid for the first two hours' work at the ordinary rate.

PIECE-WORK.

8. That the lowest piece-work prices or rates to be paid to persons for doing work of the kinds specified in the following schedule shall be at the prices or rates fixed by such schedule in respect of such work :—

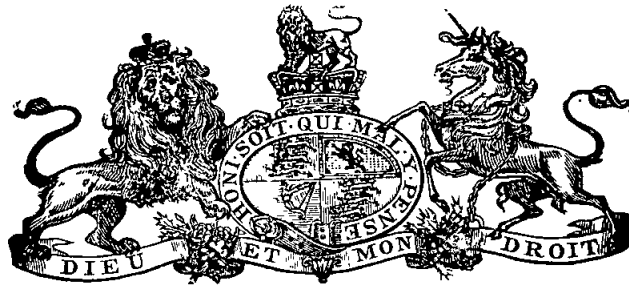

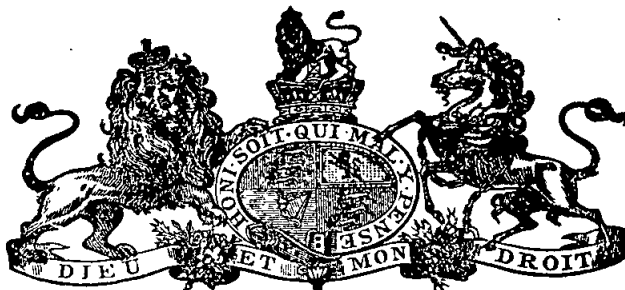

QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT

TO 30TH JUNE, 1916.

COMPILED FROM OFFICIAL RETURNS IN THE OFFICE OF THE
GOVERNMENT STATIST.

QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT, 30TH JUNE, 1916.

Population.—The estimated population on 31st December, 1915, was 1,417,801; on 31st March, 1916, it was 1,415,306—thus showing a decrease of 2,495 persons. This decrease in the population was due to the departure of members of the Australian Expeditionary Force for the front. The natural increase was 4,218, but there was an excess of emigration of 6,713. During the quarter Victoria gained from Tasmania 2,923, from Western Australia 429, from South Australia 152, and from the United Kingdom 20 persons, but lost 415 persons to New South Wales, and 244 to New Zealand.

Vital Statistics of the State.—For the June quarter of 1916 the marriages numbered 3,071, the births 8,384, and the deaths 4,140, as compared with 2,996, 9,168, and 3,788 respectively in the corresponding period of the previous year. Of the total number of deaths 264 were due to phthisis, 50 to other tubercular diseases, 300 to cancer, 20 to typhoid fever, and 93 to diphtheria and croup.

Vital Statistics of Melbourne, &c.—The births during the quarter numbered 4,249. This includes 44 cases of twins, and 292 illegitimate births. The deaths numbered 2,319, and the excess of births over deaths was 1,930. The deaths from diphtheria and croup numbered 59, from typhoid fever 7, and from tubercular diseases 191, as against 39, 6, and 145 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The deaths in Melbourne were 2,319, of which 367 were of infants under twelve months of age. In Ballarat, of 205 deaths, 12 were of infants; in Bendigo, of 176 deaths, 15 were of infants, and in Geelong, of 123 deaths, 13 were of infants. In the four towns mentioned there were 994 deaths of people aged 65 years and upwards—or 35 per cent. of the total.

State Revenue and Expenditure.—The total revenue for the quarter was £3,504,667, which represents an increase of £180,239 on that for the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The principal items of revenue were—Railways, £1,600,757; Income Tax, £343,276; Land Tax, £264,897; and Interest, £237,557. The total expenditure was £3,445,148, an increase of £332,668 on that for the June quarter of 1915.

Railways.—Particulars regarding Railway Revenue and Expenditure for the June quarter of 1916 are not yet available.

Victorian Banking Returns.—On the 30th June the liabilities to the public of the Associated and Commonwealth Banks amounted to £60,065,599, and the assets to £64,409,193, as against £55,010,756 and £53,978,244 respectively on the 30th June, 1915. The reserves of the associated banks amounted to £12,208,992, and the paid-up capital to £17,030,242. The ratio of coin, bullion, and notes to liabilities of all the banks was 26·46.

State Savings Banks.—On the 30th June the amount at credit of the 760,894 depositors in the State Savings Banks was £26,400,827. During the quarter 32,806 accounts were opened, and 23,530 were closed; the deposits made amounted to £5,077,635, and the withdrawals to £4,749,630.

Gold Yield.—The gold yield for the June quarter was 66,454 ounces.

Imports and Exports.—The total value of oversea imports into Victoria during the quarter under review was £6,668,407, and the total oversea exports during the same period were valued at £4,311,461, as compared with £4,905,551 and £2,920,083 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

Exports of Frozen, Preserved, and Perishable Products.—For the second quarter of 1916, the total value of these exports oversea through Cool stores was £186,634, of which £156,548 went to the United Kingdom, £382 to South Africa, and £29,704 to Eastern and other ports. The principal exports were—Fruit, valued at £102,329; Rabbits and Hares, at £58,727; and Butter, at £23,065.
