BOROUGH OF QUEENSCLIFF.

A Ry-law of the Borough of Queenscliff, made under the provisions of the Health Act 1915, and num-bered 15.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Queenseliff order as follows:—

1. Every occupier of premises within the borough of Queenseliff shall provide or cause to be provided and kept therein a ratproof and flyproof receptacle (similar to specimen in Town Hall cellar), and made of 24-gauge galvanized iron; the contents of such receptacle shall not be less than two or more than four cubic feet capacity.

2. Every such occupier shall-

Every such occupier shall—

(a) Cause all refuse or garbage receptacles and covers thereof in use on the premises to be kept as clean as possible and maintained in good order and condition;

(b) Cause such receptacles to be sufficiently disinfected with some efficient disinfectant and deodorant when necessary;

(c) Cause all refuse and garbage arising from or upon such premises from time to time to be deposited in such receptacles;

(d) Cause such receptacles to be continuously covered save when refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom; and

(c) Cause such receptacles to be placed in the yard of such premises close to the entrance from the street, lane or right-of-way on which such premises abut, once a week on such day in each week as may from time to time be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse or garbage.

3. No person shall place or cause to be placed any receptacle in or upon any street, lane or right-of-way.

4. No person shall place or cause to be placed or deposited any refuse, garbage, or garden refuse, in or upon any street, lane, right-of-way or vacant land.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Queenscliff.

6. This By-law shall come into force on the first day of December, 1916.

7. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, or, if every such breach be a continuing act or default, to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds nor less than Five shillings for each and every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW, No. 17, UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1915. A By-law of the shire of Donald, made under the provisions of the *Health Act* 1915, and numbered 17, for regulating the removal of garbage and for the observance of general cleanliness.

In pursuance of the provisions conferred by the Health Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Donald do make the following By-law:—

No. 1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the township of Donald.
No. 2. That rubbish from houses and yards be placed without delay into covered, non-absorbent receptacles, into which a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be introduced when necessary.
No. 3. That at least once a week, or so much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct, the contents of these receptacles be removed and either rendered inoffensive or removed to a destructor.
No. 4. That in future the receptacles be not placed in streets or lanes by the householders, but be taken from the yards and replaced by the scavengers.
No. 5. That the householders be held responsible for the keeping of the receptacles in an inoffensive condition.

No. 6. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall for every breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) and to a penalty not less than One pound (£1) and not less than Five shillings (5s.) for each day during which such breach shall be continued

The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy which is not connected with the sewers of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used, for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy which is not connected with the sewers of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil and shall cause all night-soil, which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day time and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Hefore leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleaned by superheated steam and tar painted inside or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from which were interested.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding live pounds and not less than Five shillings, for each day during which breach shall be committed or continued. Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the twenty-sixth day of July, and confirmed the twenty-third day of August, Nineteen hundred and sixteen.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and efficiently deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar painted inside or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have power in lieu of making a rate to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) and not less than Five shillings (5s.), or to a ponalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) and not less than Five shillings (5s.) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BOROUGH OF INGLEWOOD.

BY-LAW NO. 35 UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1915.

A By-law of the horough of Inglewood, made under the provisions of section 38, Health Act 1915, for regulating the temporary deposit, removal, and disposal of house and yard rubbish.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health
Act 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses
of the Borough of Inglewood make the following By-

- 1. Sections 3 and 4 of By-law No. 28 are hereby-repealed.
- 2. This By-law shall come into force on its confirma-tion by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the municipal boundaries of the borough of Inglewood.
- 4. The Council may exempt any premises within the borough of Inglewood from the operation of this By-
- 5. The occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises within the said borough shall cause all rubbish from their houses or premises to be placed without delay in covered non-absorbent receptacles into which a sufficient quantity of some deodorant shall be introduced when necessary.
- 6. Every such occupier or person shall at least once a week or so much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct cause the contents of these receptacles to be removed to a destructor or depôt pro-vided by the Borough Council.
- 7. Every such occupier or person shall keep such receptacles in their yards, and shall not place them in any street or lane and shall cause them to be removed or replaced from time to time as often as occasion shall require, and shall be responsible for the emptying and the keeping of the receptacles in an inoffensive condition
- 8. If at any time the occupier or person of such premises shall neglect to have such rubbish removed as aforesaid the same may be removed by order of the Borough Council at the expense of such occupier or
- 9. Every such occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall on conviction forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued but the justices before whom such penalty is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid, and any person committing such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the Borough Council may be empowered by the By-law or otherwise to remedy such breach and whether the Borough Council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

Such minimum charge shall be computed at the charge of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of the properties so supplied, and for all water used in excess of such quantity the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than One pound two shillings and sixpence.

5. Such rates and charges other than charges for

the minimum charge shall not be less than One pound two shillings and sixpence.

5. Such rates and charges, other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess, are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, one moiety on the first day of January, 1917, and one moiety on the first day of July, 1917.

6. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Murchison Waterworks Trust this 18th day of September, 1916.

AVOCA TOWNSHIP, WATERWORKS TRUST. By-LAW No. 7

THE Avoca Township Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Act 1915 (and whose Waterworks District has been for the purposes of the said Act proclaimed an Urban District) make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1917 in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

1. On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal value thereof; but the minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound ten

not, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal value thereof: but the minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound ten shillings sterling.

2. Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. Private water troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be ten thousand callons (10,000).

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be Fiften pence per thousand gallons (1,000).

5. Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

6. For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

7. On buildings in course of erection where water is required for purposes the charge shall be Five shillings, per thousand gallons (1,000) and the contractor, owner, or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all neccessary fittings for same, otherwise the contractor, owner or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Two shillings and sixpence per cent. for wooden buildings, when a theter will not be required to be provided; or they may by special agreement with the Trust pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter and the hire of a meter, at the rate of One shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings per annum, and for water at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, payments

8. Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

9. In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to make a special charge.

10. For water supplied to public gardens, parks, and show-grounds, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons and the supply must be taken through a meter.

11. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the assessed rate payable for the premises on which such hose is used.

12. For all tenements in the said district situated otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes and being within a quarter of nile of any standpipe for the supply of water, the rate shall be one-half, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such standpipe and within half a mile thereof, shall be one quarter the amount which would be payable if such tenement were supplied with water from the service pipes.

13. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable in advance on the first day of January, 1917.

14. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that pur-pose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover such rates and charges.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be four feet eight and one-half inches (4 ft. 84 in.), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications, numbered from 1 to 14 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications, except in so far as the same may be varied by these presents, are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be electricity.

MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramways shall not exceed the following rise. lowing, viz.:-

Speed.

- On roads 66 feet wide—With hand-brake equipment, 15 miles per hour; with magnetic, air, or other approved brake, 20 miles per hour.
- roads 50 feet wide—With hand-brake equipment, 12 miles per hour; with magnetic, air, or other approved brake, 15 miles per hour.
- roads 40 feet wide—With hand-brake equipment, 10 miles per hour; with magnetic, air, or other approved brake, 12 miles per hour.

TIME OF, COMPLETION.

That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic within a period of two years from the date of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of the tramway.

TRAFFIC.

That the tramways shall be used for the carriage of passengers and such parcels or packages as they may nave in their possession.

NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramways and also to secure the satety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramways, shall be taken and ordered by the Fitzroy Northcote and Preston Tramways Trust.

STOPPAGES FOR TAKING UP AND SETTING DOWN PASSENGERS.

That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of such streets as are indicated by notice-boards or other sufficient devices erected at such intersections to be stopping points, and at such other points, upon the route of the tramways as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the charges to be made upon the said tramways shall be One penny for each passenger on each of the following sections:—

- (a) From Barkly-street, Fitzroy, to Kemp-street, Northcote, and vice versû.
- (b) From Kemp-street, Northcote, to Oakover-road, Preston, and vice versâ.
- (c) From Oakover-road, Preston, to Regent-street, Preston, and vice versû.
- (d) From Kemp-street, Northcote, to the intersection of Bell-street, Preston, and vice versâ.
- (e) From Bell-street, Preston, to Tyler-street, Preston, and vice versâ.

For each child under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), One penny for any one of the above sections, or for any two continuous sections, provided, however, that for any one or more sections the fare to be charged for two children traveling together under the age of twelve years shall not exceed the fare charged for one adult.

THROUGH FARES.

That the charge to be made for a through journey over the said tramway shall be Threepence (3d.), and for each child under twelve (12) years of age (other than children carried on the passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), a fare of Twopence (2d.) for any three continuous sections referred to.

COMBINED FARES OVER LINES OF TRUST AND TRAMWAY BOARD.

That power is hereby given to the Trust-

- (1) to enter into arrangements with any other tramway trust, board, council, or other authority or authorities conferring the right to issue transfer tickets for a through continuous trip over the tramways of the Trust and the tramways of such other tramway trust, board, council, or other authority or authorities, provided that the fare to be charged over such continuous trip shall not be less than the combined fares authorized on both tramways;
- (2) to run through cars over both the tramways of the Trust and of such other tramway trust, board, corporation, or authority upon such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon so long as the fares charged are in accord with the provisions of this Order.

SPECIAL TICKETS FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN.

That the charge to be made for tickets to school children under the age of eighteen years over any section shall be One halfpenny or One penny through fare, subject to such conditions as to the days on and hours between which such return tickets shall be available as the Trust may by regulations determine, also in such regulations to limit the right to travel in respect of such tickets to a portion only of the car.

MINIMUM OR THROUGH FARES FOR ANY SPECIAL DISTANCE.

That power is herby given to the Trust to run cars at a minimum or through fares upon the said trainway for any specified distance provided that the amount of such minimum or through fare shall not exceed the total sum of the sectional fares upon such tramway or such parts of such tramway over which the cars shall be run. Every such car shall have a notice or notices plainly exhibited on the outside of such car indicating its destination and the minimum fare chargeable thereon.

SPECIAL CARS.

That the charges to be made-

- (1) for the hire of a special car, with a seating capacity not exceeding thirty-six persons, 1s. 6d. per mile between the hours of 6 a.m. and midnight, and 2s. 6d. per car mile after midnight;
- (2) for the hire of a special car, with a seating capacity exceeding thirty-six persons, 2s. 6d. per car mile between 6 a.m. and midnight, and 3s. 6d. per car mile after midnight. The car mileage shall be the mileage run by the car from the time of its leaving the depot until its return thereto. Provided always, however, that a minimum charge of £1 1s. may be made for the hiring of any special car between 6.30 a.m. and midnight, and £2 2s. between midnight and 1 a.m., and the sum of 5s. per hour per car for detention during the journey for which such special car is hired.

FARES IN CASE OF COMBINED TRAM AND RAILWAY PASSENGERS.

Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Trust from entering into any arrangement with the Railways Commissioners to sell through tickets to travel over both tramway and railway and in that case charging or providing for the payment of fares at a lower rate than those specified in this Order in respect of passengers travelling over both tramway and railway.

BRIDGE TO CARRY TRAMWAY OVER THE RAILWAY AT DUNDAS-STREET.

The bridge to carry the tramway line over the railway at Dundas-street shall be of a permanent character, and be constructed by the Railways Commissioners, and be

built so as to provide the necessary headway that will be required in connexion with the electrification of the railway line passing under the bridge, and all expense involved in the construction of the bridge and in any alteration of the lay-out or levels of the railway tracks necessitated by the construction of the bridge shall be borne by the Trust. The Trust shall also construct at its own expense the approaches to the bridge, and shall be responsible for and bear the cost of the maintenance of the approaches and of the whole of the road surface on the bridge.

ELECTRIC WIRES CROSSING LINES OF RAILWAYS COM-MISSIONERS TO BE CONSTRUCTED SO AS NOT TO INTERFERE.

Any electric line or lines in connexion with the said tramway which would cross auder or over any wire of the Commissioners, or which would, in the opinion of the Commissioners, be in a position likely, if special precautions be not taken, to prejudicially affect the operation of the trains when electrified, or the maintenance of telegraphic or telephonic communication, or the transmission of signals on adjacent wires of the Commissioners, shall, to the satisfaction of and without any expense to the Commissioners, be so placed, constructed, guarded, and maintained as not to be capable, in the opinion of the Commissioners, of injuring or coming into contact with any wire of the Commissioners, or of prejudicially affecting or interfering, either mechanically or electrically, with the proper use of any such wire.

COST OF ALTERATION TO POSTAL WIRES INCIDENTAL TO USE OF ELECTRICITY.

In the event of the Postal Department demanding any special alteration of its wires in consequence of the introduction of a high-tension or other electrical current in connexion with the tramway, the cost of any special arrangement of or provision for the wires because of such current shall be paid and borne by the Trust.

GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with, or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order, and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the Tranways Act 1915, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If upon report to the Governor in Council by the referee, made under the said clause 25 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudiction the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Fitzroy Northcote and Preston Tramways Trust shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramways, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the Fitzroy Northcote and Preston Tramways Trust finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than that provided for in this Order, the said Trust shall take upon itself all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government, or upon the Board of Land and Works, for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure, or to provide funds therefor.

And the Honorable William Addison Adamson, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas an engineer of the Public Works Department under instructions from the Minister of Public Works made an inspection of the track and reported that the company appears to have entirely abandoned all pretence of maintaining the track in running order or of making any provision for the safety of vehicular traffic using the road and that the state of the track is such that it would be impossible to resume running unless the track was entirely reconstructed for the full distance between Sandringham and Beaumaris. That in his opinion the condition of the track is a menace to public safety, as many lengths of rails have entirely left the sleepers and stand up above the level of the roadway, that joints of rails have become uncoupled and rails pushed out of line and in places the filling between the rails has been washed out to the level of the sleepers and for considerable lengths in flat ground the rails are completely covered with silted sand and that the whole track is so bad that it is difficult to particularize:

WHEREAS by Division 2 of Part III. of the Water Act 1915 the Governor in Council is empowered to make regulations for the election of Commissioners of Waterworks Trusts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid make the following regulations for the election of Commissioners of the Lancelleld Waterworks Trust.

1. Interpretation of terms—In these regulations with the control of the

1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the Lancefield Waterworks Trust. "Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply.

2. Period for which Commissioners shall hold office.— The period for which the Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years, and shall date on and from the date of election.

3. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.—Should any vacancy in the office of Commissioner be occasioned by death, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, the same shall be filled up by election under these regulasame shain to fined up by election under these regula-tions, within one month after the vacancy has occurred, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of Commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the Commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

4. Date of first and subsequent Election of Commis-4. Date of first and subsequent Election of Commissioners.—The first election of Commissioners under these regulations shall be held on the 11th day of January, 1917, and the ordinary election of Commissioners shaut be held on the 11th day of January in each succeeding trieunial year. Provided that whenever such date shall fall upon a Sunday or any day set apart as a public holiday such election shall be neld upon the day next tellowing. tollowing.

5. Voters' List to be prepared.—For the purposes of the first election of Commissioners a voters' list shall be prepared in like manner to that provided by section 117 of the Water Act 1915 in so far as eircumstances will admit, on or before the 30th day of November, 1916, by the Secretary to the Trust, certified by him as correct, and such list shall be the list of voters for the same election of Commissioners, and shall remain in force, and shall be used at any subsequent election of Commissioners that may be held prior to a, fresh voters' list being made out as heremafter provided.

6. Voters' List to be prepared annually.—Before the

6. Voters' List to be prepared annually.—Before the last day of February in each year a votors' list shall be made out in the manner prescribed by section 117 of the Water Act 1915, which shall, upon approval of the Commissioners under the common seal of the Trust, be the list of voters for the election of Commissioners for the twelve months next ensuing the twelve months next ensuing.

7. Form of Voters' List.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form in the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of every ratepayer within that portion cothe municipal district of the Shire of Romsey included within the district of the Waterworks Trust.

In making out such list of voters, if the property in respect of which any ratepayer is entitled to vote is only in part within the Waterworks district, then the number of votes of such ratepayer in respect of such property shall be reduced in the proportion which such part bears to the whole property of such ratepayer rated in the nunicipal district.

8. Minister to appoint returning officer for first election.—Chairman of Trust to be returning officer at sub-sequent elections.—For the purpose of the first election herein mentioned the Minister shall appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extra ordinary) the Chairman of the Trust holding office as such on the day immediately preceding the date of election shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of Chairman of the Trust should become vacant the Commissioners of the Trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

Notice of Election.—Nomination of Candidates.—Second Schedule.—Fourteen clear days before any election of Commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of sure election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the Lancefield township, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said township to be named in such notice in manner herein after mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein, and any person desirous of becoming a candidate shall, before Pour o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination paper in the form of the Second Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein both his christian and surname, together with the other particulars required in and by the said Schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than three persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, as well as by the candidate. And no person who shall not have been so nominated shall, within the provisions of these regulations, be deemed to be a randidate at any election of Commissioners.

10. Qualifications of Commissioners.—No person shall be eligible for election as a Commissioner unless he is liable to be rated under the Water Act 1915 in respect of property within the district of the Trust.

And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate; and after such name or names have been so struck out, the ballot-paper or ballot-papers (as the case may be) shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; and no person having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.
- 19. Ballot-papers to be numbered.—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, eheck off such voter's name as paving voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter. to such voter.
- 20. Informal Ballot-papers.-If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of Commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.
- 21. What Question may be asked.—At any election of Commissioners the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following. lowing :-
 - "Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B. in the roll now in force for this Trust, being enrolled therein in respect of property described to be situated in (here specify the street or other place described in the roll)?"
- And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.
- 22. False Answer, Polling Twice, and Personation.—
 Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer
 to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than
 once, or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any
 polling booth after having received a ballot-paper, without having deposited the same in the ballot-box, as
 hereinhefore provided, or who shall personate any other
 person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall
 be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing
 contained in this clause shall apply to any person only
 by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often
 as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

 23. Result of Polling, how ascertained.—Immediately

Result of Polling, how ascertained.—Immediately on the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll, publicly declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected Commissioners of the Trust, and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer sl determine by lot the candidate to hold office.

- 24. Ballot-papers, how disposed of.—The returning officer shall forthwith after the declaration of the poll indorse with a description of the contents thereof, and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Secretary of the Trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and the bed with the presence of then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three Commissioners of the Trust,
- 25. Minister to determine question arising upon first election.—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question, in a writing, to the Minister, who shall decide the same; and such decision shall be final and binding and binding
- 26. Questions arising upon subsequent election to be determined by the Trust.—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at any subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such question shall be determined by the Commissioners of the Trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no Commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a Commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a Commissioner until such question shall have been so determined; and the majority of the Commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum. shall form a quorum.
- 27. Appeal to Minister from Determination of Trust.—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the Commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just; and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.
- 28. Failure to Elect deemed to create Extraordinary Vacancies.—If at any election of Commissioners any vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are not filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the Commissioners eventually elected or appointed to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election. at such election.
- 29. Expenses of Election to be paid by Trust.—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connexion with any election shall be defrayed by the Trust.
- 30. Penalty for Breach of Regulations.—Any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.
- 31. Interpretation.—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpreta-

ALTERATION IN THE CONSTITUTION OF THE TRUST.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Mclbourne, the twenty-third day of October, 1916.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria. Sir A. J. Peacock Mr. McLeod Mr. Hagelthorn Mr. Livingston.

WHEREAS by section 116 of the Water Act 1915' it is enacted that where in any Order in Council, whether made before or after the passing of the said Act, it has not been provided that the Commissioners of any Waterworks Trust are to be elected by the ratepayers, the Governor in Council upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers may, if he thinks fit, declare that the Commissioners shall, from a date to be named in such Order, cease to be such Commissioners, and shall, from such day, be succeeded by Commissioners elected by the ratepayers.

And whereas it is further provided by the aforesaid section 116 that the Governor in Council may, by the same or any subsequent Order, direct that any number of Commissioners stated in such Order shall, within a time specified in such Order, and thereafter from time to time, be elected in such manner as may be prescribed by regulations made by the Governor in Council.

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the Ist April, 1890, a certain Waterworks Trust, known as the Lancefield Waterworks Trust, was duly re-constituted, and it was ordered and provided that the Municipal Councillors for the Shire of Lancefield and one other person should be the Commissioners of the said

And whereas a petition has been signed by a majority of the ratepayers within the Waterworks District of the said Trust praying that the Municipal Councillors for the Shire of Lancefield and the one other person appointed Commissioners of the said Trust shall cease to hold office as such Commissioners, and that they be succeeded by Commissioners to be elected by the ratepayers within the Waterworks District of the said Trust.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the provisions of the said Water Act 1915, doth hereby declare that the persons holding office as Commissioners of the said Lancefield Waterworks Trust, by virtue of their office as Municipal Councillors for the Shire of Lancefield and the one other person appointed Commissioners of such Trust, shall, after the tenth day of January, 1917, case to hold office as such Commissioners accordingly, and shall, after such day, be succeeded by six Commissioners to be elected for such Trust on the eleventh day of January, 1917, in the manner prescribed by regulations made for that purpose, and also for the purpose of conducting subsequent elections.

Aborigines Act 1915. REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of September, 1916.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Sir A. J. Peacock Mr. Lawson Mr. McLeod Mr. Hutchinson Mr. Livingston Mr. Membrey.

WHEREAS by the 6th section of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria numbered 2610, intituled An Act to Consolidate the Laws relating to the Aboriginal Natives of Victoria, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make Regulations and orders for any of the purposes therein specified and at any time to rescind or alter such Regulations—

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the following Regulations and orders, in which the word "Board" has the meaning attached to it by the Act, and the words "Prescribed Station" in such Regulations mean "any place now or hereafter to be prescribed by the Governor in Council as the place where any aboriginal or tribe of aboriginals shall reside."

Places of Residence.

1. Provision is made by the Board for the residence of aboriginals at the following places:—

Coranderrk, Lake Tyers, Lake Condah.

Contracts and Certificates.

- 2. No contract with any aboriginal for any service or employment for a longer period than three months shall be of any validity as against such aboriginal, or as an exemption from the penalty imposed by section 12 of the Act, unless such contract is approved by the Board, or the aboriginal at the making and during the continuance thereof holds a subsisting certificate, issued as hereinafter provided; but this Regulation shall in no way affect the validity of any such contract as against the person entering into it with the aboriginal.
- 3. Any person desiring the approval of the Board to any such contract shall apply therefor by transmitting to the local guardian or other authorized agent of the Board in or nearest to the district in which the applicant resides, an application signed by him in the subjoined form (hereinafter referred to as the contract):—

Contract submitted for the approval of the Board for the Protection of the Aborigines.

Particulars of Contract.

Name, residence, and occupation of employer.

Name of aboriginal.

Nature of work or service to be performed.

Date from which service under the contract is to commence or has commenced.

Money payment as wages or otherwise, and the time or times when payable under the contract.

Rations (if any) to be given in addition to money payment (if any), and quantity and quality of rations agreed to be supplied.

Name and address to which the applicant desires communications in reference to this application to be posted.

Date of application.

Signature of Applicant.

4. The local guardian or other authorized agent of the Board, after making such inquiries as the Board may think necessary, shall forward the contract, with his opinion thereon, to the Board.

5. The Board, if satisfied of the propriety of approval, will cause their approval signed by the Secretary, to be indorsed on the contract, and will return the same to the local guardian or committee, and post a copy thereof with such approval indorsed to the address mentioned in the contract.

6. The Board may modify any such contract at the time of approving the same by directing all or any part of the money payment payable to the aboriginal to be made to some local guardian or other person specified in that behalf instead of to the aboriginal himself, and shall in such case indorse such direction in manner hereinbefore provided with respect to their approval; and after the time at which the approved contract so modified would in course of post have reached the address given in the contract, the contractor shall not be entitled to credit under the contract for any payment so directed, to be made unless made as directed.

7. Any money received in pursuance of any such direction shall be applied at the discretion of the receiver for the benefit of the aboriginal or of any member of his family, subject to any express direction given by the Board, and shall in every case be accounted for to the Board as hereinafter directed, or upon application by the

Secretary at any time.

8. The Board may, at their discretion, grant to any aboriginal able and willing to earn a living by his own exertions a certificate in the subjoined form, signed by the Secretary, which certificate shall not remain in force for more than six months from its date or the date of its last renewal; and any such unexpired certificate may be renewed for six months by the indorsement of the date of renewal and signature of any member of the Board, local guardian, or member of a local committee, who, in the exercise of his discretion, shall think fit to renew the same.

Certificate under the Aborigines Act 1915.

This certificate was issued on the , 19 , to an day of , aged about aboriginal named , height about , and known or distinguishable by the following peculiarities [state if any], he having represented himself as able and willing to earn a living by his own exertions.

The effect of this certificate, while in force, is as follows:—

It authorizes him to enter into a binding contract of service for any time during which this certificate remains in force.

It permits a European to harbor him without incurring any penalty.

It does not authorize any person to sell or give him any intoxicating drink or affect the penalty for so doing, or confer any other exemption from penalties under the said Act.

From the wages earned the sum of pence per week shall be remitted to

shillings and for the maintenance

of his wife and children.

This certificate will not remain in force after the day of , unless renewed in the meantime by the date of renewal, and signature of some member of the Board for the Protection of Aborigines, local guardian, or member of local committee being written thereon; and it will not remain in force after six months from the date of the last renewal.

Earnings and Moneys Received.

9. When a number of aboriginals are located on a reserve, and cultivate fields and gardens, or raise and keep live stock, or otherwise by their labours produce marketable goods, the Board may from time to time order the sale of any produce or live stock or goods, and out of the net proceeds of sale pay to the aboriginals who have laboured on the reserve such sums as the Board may deem right, having regard to the kind and amount of labour performed by each.

10. Every able-bodied aboriginal, half-caste, and other person resident on one of the Board's stations shall do a reasonable amount of work, as directed by the Manager; and whilst so engaged shall be remunerated at a rate to be arranged by the Manager and approved by the Board. Anyone persistently refusing to work when required to do so by the Manager shall be reported to the Board and may have all supplies for himself and his family withdrawn until he resumes work, and be liable to be removed from the station.

11. Every local committee, local guardian, or other person intrusted by the Board with the distribution of any stores or materials, or the application of any moneys received from the Board, or from the employer of any aboriginal, shall furnish the Board with a monthly statement in detail of all stores and materials received and distributed, and of all moneys received and disbursed, and showing the balances on hand of stores or materials, and of moneys unexpended up to and inclusive of the last day of each calendar month.

Custody of Children.

- 12. The Governor in Council may for the better care, custody, and education of any aboriginal or half-caste child order that such child be transferred to the care of the Department for Neglected Children or the Department for Reformatory Schools.
- 13. Every aboriginal under the age of fourteen years resident anywhere in Victoria shall, when so required by the Board or the person in charge of the nearest station, attend any school at or near such station at such times as is directed.
- 14. Every aboriginal male under fourteen years of age, and all unmarried aboriginal females under the age of eighteen years, shall, when so required by the person fn charge of any station, reside, and take their meals, and sleep, in any building set apart for such purposes.

Conduct of Business.

- 15. The Board shall meet for the despatch of business at such times and places as they appoint, and shall deal with all matters brought before them relating to aboriginals. Three members of the Board shall form a quorum.
- 16. Every question shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members voting on that question. In the event of an equality of votes, the Chairman for the time being shall have a second or casting vote.
- 17. A Vice-Chairman shall be elected by the Board as early as practicable after the first day of July in each year. Due notice of the meeting for such election shall be given to each member of the Board.
- 18. The Vice-Chairman, or any three members, may, in writing, direct the Secretary to convene a special meeting of the Board on any day and hour to deal with special business. Notice of such business shall be given to each member of the Board.
- 19. Any member of the Board may resign his office, by letter addressed to the Chief Secretary.
- 20. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to prepare the business paper for each meeting of the Board; to take and record the minutes of proceedings of same; to conduct all correspondence, and to keep all such books of account, vouchers, reports, documents, plans, and charts as the Board shall direct or require; to give such instructions to officers and persons appointed under the Aborigines Act as the Board directs, or as the Regulations prescribe; and, generally, to fulfil zealously, and to the best of his ability, all duties, and obey all directions imposed on or given to him by the Board.

Duties of Board.

- 21. It shall be the duty of the Board-
 - (a) with the consent of the Minister, to apportion, distribute, and apply as may seem most fitting, any moneys voted by Parliament, and any other funds in its possession or control, for the relief of aboriginals;
 - (b) to distribute blankets, clothing, and relief to aboriginals at the discretion of the Board;
 - (c) to provide for the custody, maintenance, and education of the children of aboriginals;
 - (d) to manage and regulate the use of reserves;
 - (e) to exercise a general supervision and care over all matters affecting the interests and welfare of aboriginals, and to protect them against injustice, imposition, and fraud.

- 22. (1) It shall not be lawful for any person other than an aboriginal, or an officer under the Board, or a person acting under the Board's direction, or under the authority of the Regulations, to enter or remain upon or be within the limits of a reserve upon which aboriginals are residing, for any purpose whatsoever.
- (2) The Board may remove from a reserve any aboriginal who is guilty of any misconduct, or who, in the opinion of the Board, should be earning a living away from such reserve.
- (3) Any building erected on a reserve shall be vested in and become the property of the Board, also all cattle, horses, pigs, sheep, machinery, and property thereon purchased or acquired for the benefit of aboriginals. No stock shall be permitted to remain on a reserve without the sanction of the Board.

Local Guardians.

23. The duties of guardians shall be to issue to aboriginals orders on the storekeeper for the supply of rations, to visit the settlement at least once in two weeks, to exercise general supervision over and to attend to the welfare of the aboriginals, and to institute proceedings for offences under the Act or Regulations as may be directed by the Board.

Management of Stations.

- 24. All stations shall be under the control of Managers appointed by the Board.25. The duties of Managers shall be—
 - (a) To have the general management and control of all persons on the stations under their charge, buildings, stock, and other property; to supervise the good order and conduct of the stations; and to devote all their energies to the moral and social welfare of the aboriginals resident on such stations.
 - (b) To report in a prescribed form, at the end of each month, for the information of the Board, as to the general condition of the stations—i.e., the number of aboriginals located thereon, and the daily average for the month, distinguishing in all cases the sexes and the full-bloods from the half-castes; the number of children attending the school; the nature and extent of the work done during the month, and what work is in contemplation; the number of births and deaths during the month; information as to the general health of the aboriginals; and any other matters of interest.

(c) To discourage any further introduction of half-castes, which shall be allowed only on the conditions set out in the Act and these-Regulations.

- (d) To keep a diary of all occurrences at the stations under their charge, together with the usual statistics, and submit the same when required for inspection by members of the Board or officer authorized by them.
- (e) To exercise supervision of the aboriginals at the stations; to restrain them from leaving the stations and visiting public houses; and to endeavour to see that they do not squander their earnings.

(f) To be accountable for all rations, clothing, medical comforts, &c., and their distribution as authorized by the Board.

(g) To keep accounts of all money and supplies received and disposed of, and to furnish to the Board monthly abstracts of the same.

(h) To forward all moneys received from the sale of wool or produce, &c., to the Board immediately after the end of each month, accompanied by a statement showing the various items.
(i) To submit requisitions for supplies of rations, clothing, and stores.

(i) To submit to the Board applications by aboriginals at the stations who desire to occupy blocks of land to be cultivated by them to earn a livelihood thereon for themselves and their families, and to report fully as to the locality and suitability of the land applied for, and the character of the applicant.

(k) To assist in and supervise the erection of and repairs to buildings, fencing, &c., and the cultivation of the land, and do their best to make the aboriginals as comfortable and contented as practicable; also to take an interest in their work and recreations.

26. (a) Managers shall be personally liable for any expenditure incurred without authority from the Board. They shall take stock of all Government property on the station on the 30th June of each year, and furnish a return thereof for the Board's information. They shall also take stock, monthly, of rations and other stores on hand, and furnish a return showing clearly the quantities received and used during the month, and the quantities on hand.

(b) Application for leave by Managers or other officers must be submitted to the

Board.

(c) All correspondence must be promptly attended to, and recorded for inspection.

27. The matron shall have an oversight of all the women, with special charge of girls and young children; shall daily visit the dwellings of married and unmarried women, and give instructions in cooking, washing, sewing, and other domestic duties, and shall be responsible to the Manager for the cleanliness of the women and children, together with the buildings they occupy.

Rations and Clothing.

28. Rations according to the undermentioned scale will be issued to Managers and other officers on the Board's stations, viz.:-

Where butter can be made or potatoes grown on the stations, they must be taken from the station supply.

29. (a) Rations consisting of 8 lb. of flour, 2 lb. sugar, and \(\frac{1}{4}\) lb. tea per week will be allowed to all aboriginals. Children under ten years of age shall be allowed half these quantities. On the Board's stations, and at reserves where specially authorized, meat up to 7 lb. per week, ½ lb. tobacco, rice, oatmeal, salt, and soap are to be issued as required.

b) In cases of special urgency, rations not exceeding a week's supply may be

issued, but the particulars must be at once reported to the Board.

(c) A quarterly return of all rations issued shall be furnished to the Board, giving particulars of the names, ages, sex, and caste of the recipients, and the reason for the issue.

(d) A supply of medicines and such medical comforts as rice, sago, arrowroot, oatmeal, and maizena shall be kept in stock at the Board's stations, and issued to any aboriginals who may be sick or otherwise in need of the same, but the circumstances of such issue must appear on the quarterly returns of rations issued.

30. Clothing will be supplied to aboriginals throughout the State as may be

considered necessary.

31. All supplies must be obtained upon requisition under contracts taken by the Tender Board. The Regulations under the Public Service Act 1915, relating to the "Mode of Obtaining Supplies," "Receipt, Custody, and Issue of Stores," &c., shall be observed as far as possible.

In all cases where articles are not obtainable under contract, local offers, in writing, should accompany requisitions.

Half-castes.

32. On the recommendation of the Manager of a prescribed station, the Board may in cases of illness, infirmity, or other necessitous circumstances, issue a licence, signed by the Secretary of the Board, to any half-caste or child of half-caste to reside for a period of three months upon any prescribed station; and the Board may renew such licence for a like period as often as it thinks fit, and may at any time cancel such licence

3. Any half-caste or child of half-castes who may be permitted under a licence to reside at a prescribed station shall be under the control of the Manager of such station, and shall strictly adhere to the Regulations of the Board for the management of such

stations.

34. Any half-caste or child of half-castes may, with the approval of the Board, be dismissed and removed from any prescribed station for misconduct on the advice of the Manager of such station.

35. Any half-caste who may be permitted to reside on any prescribed station shall receive the following supply of rations weekly:—7 lbs. of bread or 8 lbs. of flour, 2 lbs. of sugar, ½ lb. of tea, 7 lbs. of meat when obtainable, and rice, oatmeal, salt, and soap in such quantities as the Manager of the station may think necessary.

Children under ten years of age shall receive half of the above supply of rations.

- 36. Any half-caste or child of half-castes who may be permitted to reside on any prescribed station shall be supplied with such clothing, blankets, medical attendance, and comforts as may be granted by special permission of the Board.
- 37. Every able-bodied half-caste and aboriginal residing on a prescribed station shall do a reasonable amount of work, and any one persistently refusing to do so when required shall have his supplies stopped until he resumes work.
- 38. If any aboriginal or half-caste having his supplies so stopped use the supplies of any aboriginal or half-caste child, or in any way deprive any aboriginal or half-caste child thereof, he shall be reported to the Board.
- 39. The granting of railway passes to aboriginals and half-castes shall be limited to urgent and needful cases only, and travelling discouraged and prevented as much as possible.
- 40. Before any half-caste can receive any assistance from the Board to select or acquire Crown lands or private property, or to improve the same, the Board must be satisfied that he is sober, honest, and industrious; and if living on a prescribed station, he must produce a certificate to that effect from the Manager of such station, or from a respectable house-holder if not living on a prescribed station.
- 41. The Board may license or apprentice, in a lawful manner, to any trade or occupation any male or female half-caste child over fourteen years of age to any person or persons of approved respectability.
- 42. Girls shall not be apprenticed or sent to service to single gentlemen, or hotel or boardinghouse-keepers.
- 43. Half-castes licensed to service and apprentices shall be provided with female protection and sleeping accommodation to be approved of by officers authorized by the Board to inspect them.
- 44. All persons to whom boys or girls are licensed or apprenticed shall properly feed and lodge them, and also provide them with medicines and medical attendance when necessary, and also see that their persons, clothing, &c., are kept clean and healthy.
- 45. One-half of the wages of every half-caste child licensed to service and of every apprentice shall be paid quarterly, viz.:—On the 1st January, April, July, and October—and sent by the employer to the Secretary of the Board, who shall have such money placed to such child's credit in a savings bank, and paid to such child at the end of his or her service or apprenticeship, and the other half shall be paid to the child at the end of each quarter's service or apprenticeship.
- 46. Apprentices and half-castes licensed to service shall be allowed, when practicable, to attend divine service and Sunday school, and their moral training shall be duly cared for by their employer.
- 47. If within three months after the execution of any indenture the employer shall not be satisfied with the apprentice, the child may be returned to the Board, and the indenture shall be cancelled.
- 48. In the event of any change of residence by any employer, written intimation thereof shall be given by him at once to the Secretary of the Board.
- 49. Every employer shall forward to the Secretary as often as the Board requires written reports on the conduct of any child in his service or apprenticed to him, and shall allow such child to write to the Board at such times as he deems necessary.
- 50. In the event of any child becoming seriously ill, dying, absconding, leaving, or meeting with an accident, information shall at once be given by the employer to the Secretary of the Board, and in the event of a child absconding, information shall also at once be given by the employer to the local police, who shall take immediate steps to recover and return the child.

51. The Board shall provide a printed form of application for the use of those who desire to obtain children as apprentices or servants, and such form shall be filled up with the following particulars:-
