A By-law of the Municipality of the Shire of Numurkah under the provisions of and the powers conferred by the Health Act 1915.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1915 and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Numurkah, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Numurkah, hereby make the following By-law being By-law No. 27.

1. That this-By-law shall come into force after it shall have been confirmed by the Board of Public Health and immediately after it is published in the Government Gazette.

2. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the township of Numurkah, being part of the shire

3. Interpretation of terms.—In the construction and for the purposes of this By-law the following terms shall if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter have their respective meanings hereby assigned to them, viz.:

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed victualler's premises, factories, workrooms, common or other lodging houses, or other buildings or premises. "Street" shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

"Occupier" means the person for the time being entitled to receive the rent of the house or premises in connexion with which the word is used whether on his own account or as the agent of or as the trustee of such person or who would be entitled to receive the same if the house or premises were let at a rent. the house or premises were let at a rent.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed to include the feminine and the singular to include the plural and the plural the

singular. "Council" shall mean the council of the shire of Numurkah.

WITH RESPECT TO THE DISPOSAL DEODORIZING AND REMOVAL OF RUBBISH.

REMOVAL OF RUBBISH.

4. Occupier to provide Receptacle for Refuse and Rubbish.—The occupier of any house or premises shall provide a covered non-absorbent receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse and of rubbish from his house and yard.

5. To place Refuse and Rubbish in Receptacle.—He shall without delay place or cause to be placed in such receptacle all such refuse and rubbish.

6. To Deodorize same.—He shall when necessary introduce into such receptacle a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant.

7. Occupier to keep Receptacle on Premises for

some efficient deodorant.
7. Occupier to keep Receptacle on Premises for Removal of Contents.—For discharge and removal of the contents thereof by the person thereto appointed or employed by the council he shall place such receptacle in some convenient part of his own premises at such times and at or between such hours as may be specified from time to time by the council. He shall not place such receptacle in any street or lane.
8. Householder to keep Receptacle Inoffensive.—Every householder shall be responsible for keeping such receptacle in an inoffensive condition.
9. Every such receptacle shall be of such dimensions

9. Every such receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same and the contents thereof when full shall not exceed 56 lbs. in weight and so constructed that the same can be readily and conveniently emptied by one man.

10. Penalties.—Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds (£10) for every such breach or of Five pounds (£5) for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued unless the inciting before much or the property is consistent before the continued to be which such breach shall be committed or continued unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings (5s.) to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the council may be em-powered by this By-law or otherwise to remedy such breach and whether such council has or has not taken

advantage of such powers.

6. For water supplied to troughs in streets of the borough, Eighteen shillings per annum, in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

7. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or the Commissioners may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

Provided the occupier or owner provides a suitable wrought-iron trough, with strong cover for locking down, and fixes a suitable ball-cock, the following shall be the scale of charges per annum for supplying stock with water, unless the Commissioners decide that the water must be taken by measure, and at such rate per 1,000 gallons as fixed by them:—

9. On land not exceeding 20 acres, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum.

10. On land above 20 acres, but not exceeding 50 acres, the sum of Thirty-one shillings per annum.

11. On land above 55 acres, but not exceeding 75 acres, the sum of Twenty-five shillings per annum.

12. On land above 75 acres, but not exceeding 100 acres, the sum of Thirty-one shillings per annum.

13. On land above 100 acres, the sum of Thirty-seven shillings and sixpence per annum.

14. In addition to the foregoing s

lands and tenement. All payments to be made in advance.

15. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where it is supplied by measure for domestic use, the watering of stock, or irrigation of private or other gardens, or for any other purpose whatsoever, shall be the quantity for which the return would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable upon the premises supplied, if supplied under the rating or otherwise than by measure.

16. The rates and charges shall be payable by equal instalments on the 1st day of December, 1916, and the 1st day of April, 1917, at the Town Hall, Clunes.

 (d) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping and other purposes, a minimum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof, and a minimum charge of Three shillings for any fractional part thereof exceeding 500 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under terms of sub-section (y) of section 1 of this By-law, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

 (f) Water supplied to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach-horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other than domestic purposes may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.

 (g) Water supplied to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, cricket clubs, and bowling greens, shall be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum, where the valuation of the property on which such troughs are situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of 20s. will mean to include the rate at valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20 the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.

(2) For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each each.

(1) Each house or tenement must be provided with a separate service from the main.

(m) Water supplied to market gardens, nurseries, or for any irrigation purposes shall be charged for by meter at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallous in addition to the usual rate for a domestic supply on the basis of valuation. A separate service from the main for a domestic supply may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust.

(2) The rates and charges for water and all sums due to the Trust under this By-law shall be paid by and recoverable from the occupier of the premises, or owner, or the person requiring, receiving, or using the supply

(3) The said rates and all charges for water supplied.

(3) The said rates and all charges for water supplied otherwise than by meter or by special agreement, shall be payable in advance, by equal instalments, on the 1st day of January, 1917, and on the 1st day of July, 1917. REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE PREPARATION OF ROLLS OF ELECTORS QUALIFIED TO VOTE AT ELECTIONS OF MEMBERS OF THE MARINE BOARD, AND THE CONDUCT OF ELECTIONS

HEREAS by section 35 of the Marine Act 1915 it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for providing for the mode in which the various rolls are to be prepared under the said Act of persons qualified to vote at the election of a member or members of the Marine Board by that Act constituted and incorporated and for regulating generally the mode manner and time of election of members of the said Board.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say :-

- 1. Short Title.—These Regulations may be cited as "The Marine Board Rolls and Elections Regulations 1916."
- 2. Commencement.—These Regulations shall take effect 2. Commencement.—These Regulations shall take effect on and from the date of publication hereof in the Government Gazette from which date the Regulations relating to the preparation of Marine Board Rolls and conduct of Elections made by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council on the 9th day of September 1901 and published in the Government Gazette on the 13th day of September, 1901, shall be and stand repealed.
- 3. Interpretation.—In these Regulations the following shall, unless there be something in the context repugnant thereto, have the meanings hereinafter respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—
 - "Minister" shall mean the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Marine Act 1915.
 "Secretary" shall mean the Secretary to the Marine Board of Victoria.

PART I.—FOR THE COMPILATION AND REVISION OF THE ROLLS OF PERSONS ENTITLED TO VOTE IN THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS.

4. Preparation of Rolls.—The Secretary shall, in the manuer prescribed by the Marine Act 1915, between the 16th and 31st days of January in each year, make out according to the form in Schedule I. hereto rolls of the following persons:—

Licensed Pilots, Certificated Engineers, Masters, Seamen.

and shall arrange such rolls respectively according to the alphabetical order of surnames contained therein, and shall state in such rolls against the name of each person the several particulars indicated in the several columns of the said Schedule respectively.

- 5. The Secretary shall, upon completion of the said rolls, forward the same to the Minister for publication in the Government Gazette, and the Minister shall, on receipt thereof, immediately cause them to be published accordingly.
- 6. Inspection of Rolls.—The Secretary shall, immediately after the publication of the said rolls, notify by public advertisement in the Melbourne daily papers that copies of such rolls are ready for inspection at his office, and shall permit such inspection at all reasonable hours for two weeks after the date of such advertisement.
- ment.

 7. Claims and Objections may be Lodged.—Any person whose name has been omitted from any such rolls, and whose laims to have his name inserted therein, shall, during the time such rolls are open for inspection, give or send by post to the Secretary notice thereof in the form appropriate thereto as prescribed in Schedules II., III., and IV. to these Regulations, as the case may be; and every person whose name has been inserted in any of such rolls may object to any other person as not being entitled to have his name retained in such rolls; and every person so objecting shall, on or before the last day upon which rolls are open for inspection, give or send by post to the Secretary notice thereof in the form pend by post to the last-known address within the State of Victoria of the person objected to notice in

writing of such objection, stating the particulars of the grounds of such objection, and shall sign the same with his name; and the Secretary shall cause lists to be prepared of all such claims and objections respectively.

- 8. Revision of Rolls.—The said rolls, together with the lists of claims and objections (if any) shall be forwarded by the Secretary to the Minister for submission to the Governor in Council, who may thereupon make such order as he may deem fit.
- 9. Printed copies of any of the rolls so gazetted shall be supplied to any person upon payment of One shilling for each copy.

PART II .- THE MANAGEMENT AND CONDUCT OF ALL ELECTIONS OF MEMBERS.

- 10. Time of Elections.—In all cases of ordinary vacancy in the office held by any elected member, the Minister shall fix the time for the election of a member to supply such vacancy, in the event of there being a greater number of persons nominated, as hereinatter provided, than the number of vacancies to be filled up.

28. Fees.—The Minister may pay to each deputy returning officer or poll clerk such fee as may to him seem fit.

REGULATION.

5. All stock legally depasturing on the Common shall (as far as possible) be branded by their respective owners with some distinctive brand or mark, for the purpose of identification, which shall at all times be kept legible and distinct by the owners, and shall be supplied to the Managers at the time of registration. In all cases where such stock shall be impounded from the Common in consequence of non-observance or non-compliance with this Regulation, the Managers shall not be responsible in any respect.

All stock depasturing on the Common shall wear a chain and badge, and the Managers shall be at liberty to appoint certain times and places for registration, or renewing of registration, of stock, on at least three days' notice of the intention to do so, being given by the herdsman, either by advertisement in the local newspaper, or by hand-bills posted about the Common, and the herdsman shall attend at such times and places for the purpose aforesaid. Every person entitled to commonage shall, after paying the herein-prescribed fees. obtain from the herdsman the necessary number of chains and badges which shall at all times he the absolute property of the Managers. Every such person shall then he responsible and liable to be charged for stock equivalent to the number of badges and chains until they are returned to the herdsman. No person shall use other than the authorized or registered chain and badges in connexion with stock legally depasturing on the Common. In addition to the fee for deoasturing stock the sum of Ninepence shall be paid to the herdsman at the time of registration for the hire of each badge and chain in the case of large and small cattle, but should any person cease at any time to depasture stock on the Common the amount paid for each badge and chain shall be returned to the herdsman in good order and condition. 
