## DETERMINATION OF THE NAILMAKERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade. or business of-

(a) Making nails,(b) Weaving wire netting and barbed wire,

(c) Galvanizing,

has made the following Determination, namely :---

Note.—On the 19th August, 1913, the powers of the Nailmakers Board were extended to enable it to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed as storeman, packer.
or sorter in connexion with the trade or business of making nails.

1. That this Determination shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1917.

### APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

"Apprentice" means any person under twenty-one years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship or any person over twenty-one years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over twenty-one years of age, or who being over twenty-one years of age holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

5. That any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of 48 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

### SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

6. That time and a half shall be the rate payable to any person for all work done on-

New Year's Day,
Foundation Day (26th January),
Eight Hours Day (21st April),
Christmas Day,
Boxing Day,



# PIECE-WORK.

7. That the lowest piece-work prices to be paid to persons for doing work of the kinds specified in the following schedules shall be:—

# DETERMINATION OF THE PERAMBULATOR BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or lates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of perambulators has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That the previous Determination of this Board is hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 1st day of January, 1917.

### APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

"Apprentice" means any person under 21 years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over 21 years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2650, section 3.)

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over 21 years of age, or who, being over 21 years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2650, section 3.)

(3) That—

(a) the lowest rates which may be paid to apprentices or improvers; and

(b) the proportionate number of apprentices and improvers who may be employed n any factory or place

Provided that no apprentice or improver shall be employed working overtime at less than 6d. per hour.

# SPECIAL-RATES.

(6) That double time shall be the special rate for all work done on-

New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Christmas Day, Boxing Day,

but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
