REGULATIONS—STORES AND TRANSPORT,
CHAPTER XV.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS.
MUNICIPAL SURVEYORS BOARD.
CERTIFICATES OF QUALIFICATION.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686), the Municipal Surveyors Board, appointed under the provisions of the said Act, makes the following Regulations with reference to the issue of Certificates of Qualification as Municipal Surveyors under the said Act:—

1. The Board will grant a certificate of qualification, without examination, as follows:—

- (a) To any holder of a certificate of qualification as municipal engineer granted after examination by the examining committee appointed under the *Local Government Act 1906* of New South Wales.
- (b) To any corporate member of the Institution of Civil Engineers, London, or of the Institution of Municipal and County Engineers, England, who can produce evidence that he has for a period of not less than three (3) years been engaged in carrying out works such as are usually supervised by a municipal surveyor or engineer.
- (c) To any graduate who holds the degree of M.C.E. or of B.C.E. of the University of Melbourne (or the corresponding degree of any University whose graduates in civil engineering are admitted by the University of Melbourne *ad eundem gradum*), who can produce evidence that he has for a period of not less than three (3) years been engaged in carrying out works such as are usually supervised by a municipal surveyor or engineer.

2. The Board will grant a certificate of qualification after partial examination as follows:—

- (a) To any applicant who has had one (1) year's practical experience in civil engineering work and holds the degree of M.C.E. or of B.C.E. of the University of Melbourne (or the corresponding degree of any University whose

graduates in civil engineering are admitted by the University of Melbourne *ad eundem gradum*) on passing the Board's examination in "Road and Street Engineering."

- (b) To any applicant who has had one (1) year's practical experience in civil engineering work and holds the Certificate of Engineer of Water Supply granted after examination by the Board of Examiners appointed under the provisions of the *Water Act 1905*, on passing the Board's examination in "Road and Street Engineering."
- (c) To any applicant who has had two (2) years' practical experience in civil engineering work and holds the Certificate of Land Surveyor, granted after examination by the Board of Examiners for land surveyors of any Australian State or of the Dominion of New Zealand, or of mining surveyor, granted after examination by the Mining Surveyors Board of Victoria, on passing the Board's examination in "Principles of Engineering Construction," and in "Drainage and Sanitary Engineering," and in "Road and Street Engineering."

3. On each certificate of qualification shall be stated—

- (a) the qualification in respect of which it is issued;
- (b) whether it is granted without examination; or, if after partial examination, the subjects in which the applicant was examined.

4. In all cases an applicant must submit satisfactory documentary evidence in detail as to his experience, and satisfy the Board that the rights conferred by the certificate, diploma, or membership in virtue of which he makes his application have not been cancelled or suspended.

5. A certificate will not issue to any applicant until he has satisfied the Board that he has attained the age of twenty-three (23) years, and satisfactory evidence must be produced, if required, as to respectability of character. No person will be eligible who has been convicted of a breach of trust.

6. Each application for a certificate must be accompanied by a fee of Three guineas (£3 3s.).

7. Every applicant for a certificate of qualification must legibly give his name in full, and postal address, in the margin of his letter of application, which should be addressed to—

OMEO WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1915*, make and levy the following rates and charges for the year 1916 upon all land and tenements within the Waterworks District, that is to say:—

No. 1. On every house or tenement on which a dwelling house is erected of the annual municipal value of £13 or under the sum of One pound sterling.

No. 2. On every unoccupied allotment of land of the annual municipal value of £5 or under, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence.

No. 3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of £13, a rate of seven and one-half per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of £25, except where a meter is used.

No. 4. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound per annum shall be made.

No. 5. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per annum shall be made.

No. 6. For water supplied by measurement (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

No. 7. No service pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.

No. 8. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance on the 1st day of January, 1916.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

WHEREAS by section 148 of the *Water Act 1915* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time fix a sum which shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by the occupier or owner of any land or tenement liable to be rated by any Waterworks Trust: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the now in part recited Act, doth order and direct that the sum of One pound sterling (£1) in respect of all lands and tenements supplied with water, and ten shillings (10s.) in respect of all vacant or unoccupied land, shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid for the year 1916, by every occupier or owner of any land or tenement liable to be rated by the Benalla Waterworks Trust.

And the Honorable Hugh McKenzie, His Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

*Coal Mines Regulation Act 1915.***REGULATIONS UNDER THE COAL MINES REGULATION ACT 1915
(No. 2630), DIVISION 14—MINERS' ACCIDENTS RELIEF.**

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of January, 1916.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1915*, doth hereby cancel the Regulations under the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1909*, Division 14—Miners' Accidents Relief, made by Orders in Council dated 1st March, 1910, 14th September, 1910, and 2nd September, 1912, and doth substitute therefor the following Regulations, that is to say :—

*Coal Mines Regulation Act 1915.***VICTORIA.****REGULATIONS UNDER THE COAL MINES REGULATION ACT 1915 (No. 2630),
DIVISION 14.—MINERS' ACCIDENT RELIEF.***Regulations for the Appointment of Members of Committee.*

1. (a) Any two or more persons employed in or about any mine may, by a written notice in the form of the Schedule I., convene a meeting of the persons employed in or about such mine for the purpose of appointing members of the Committee for such mine. Such notice shall be signed by the conveners of the meeting, and shall be exhibited in a conspicuous and frequented place in connexion with the mine for a period of not less than seven days prior to the date proposed for the meeting.

(b) The persons present at any meeting convened as aforesaid may appoint a Chairman and Secretary for such meeting, and shall then appoint three of the persons employed in or about such mine to be members of the Committee for such mine from the date of their appointment until the 31st day of December following: Provided, however, that until their successors have been duly appointed, in accordance with these Regulations, any such Committee shall remain in office and may exercise the powers conferred by the Act.

(c) When any member of a Committee dies, resigns, or becomes incapable of acting as such member his successor shall be appointed at a meeting convened and held as provided in Regulation No. 1 of these Regulations, and such successor shall, when appointed, hold office for the residue of the term for which his predecessor was appointed.

(d) The names of the members of any Committee appointed in accordance with these Regulations and of any persons appointed to fill any vacancy in such Committee shall be notified in writing to the Secretary to the Board, and such notification, duly signed by the Chairman and Secretary of the meeting at which such members were appointed, or by the Chairman and Secretary of the meeting making any appointment to fill a vacancy, shall be taken as conclusive evidence of the appointment of the members of such Committee.

When Payments to be made by Owners, &c.

2. The owner or manager of a mine shall, within three days after each pay-day, pay to the local Treasurer on behalf of the Committee for such mine the total sum then deducted by him from the wages of the persons employed in or about the mine; and the local Treasurer shall give to the owner or manager a receipt for the moneys so paid.

Returns by Owner or Manager.

3. The owner or manager of a mine shall, within three days after each pay-day, furnish to the local Secretary a return in duplicate in the form of Schedule II.

Where no Committee is appointed.

4. Where no Committee is appointed, the owner or manager of any mine, subject to the provisions of the Act, shall, within three days after each pay-day, remit to the Secretary to the Board the sums deducted in pursuance of section 76 of the Act, together with a return in form of Schedule II. Such Secretary shall deposit such sums to the credit of the fund in such bank as may be selected by the Board for that purpose.

Moneys paid to Committees—How dealt with.

5. The moneys received by the local Treasurer on behalf of the Committee for a mine shall only be disbursed by such Treasurer when so authorized by the said Committee in accordance with the provisions of the Act and of these Regulations.

Accounts of Committee—How kept.

6. The Committee for a mine shall cause the various items in relation to the moneys paid to and expended by it to be regularly entered in a cash-book in the form of Schedule III. supplied by the Board.

Such book shall, at all reasonable times, be open to inspection by the Secretary to the Board, or any person duly authorized in that behalf by the Minister; and every such person may take such extracts therefrom as he may require.

Payments by Committee to Fund.

7. Moneys payable by a Committee into a fund shall be remitted, in the most convenient way, not later than one week after the meeting of the Committee, to the Secretary to the Board, and shall immediately on receipt by the Secretary be deposited by him to the credit of the fund in such bank as may be selected by the Board for that purpose.

Such remittance shall be accompanied by—

- (a) A return in the form of Schedule IV.;
- (b) The owner's or manager's return of deductions; and
- (c) All application for allowances dealt with by the Committee and duly endorsed.

Non-payment by Committee to Fund.

8. Upon report being made to the Board of the failure of any Committee to pay within the period prescribed any money in its hands not required for payment of allowances, the Board shall report the fact to the Minister.

When Deductions from Wages insufficient, Payment from Fund.

9. In the event of the deductions made from wages and paid to the Committee for a mine being insufficient to meet the payment of allowances granted, such Committee shall direct its Chairman and Secretary to make application to the Board for the payment out of the fund of such sum as shall be necessary for the payment of such allowances. Such application shall be in the form of Schedule V.

Payment from Fund to Committees.

10. The Secretary to the Board, before paying to any Committee from the fund any money in compliance with the provisions of section 75 (a) of the Act, shall satisfy himself that such money is actually required for the payment of allowances granted by such Committee; and for this purpose may require the said Committee to furnish the Board with such information as he may deem necessary.

11. Moneys payable out of the funds shall be paid by the Secretary on the authority of the Board; and, where payable to a Committee, shall be paid to the local Treasurer on behalf of the Committee, and such payment shall be notified to the local Secretary.

Fund—How operated on.

12. The fund shall be operated on only by cheques signed by the Chairman or one other member of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary, and then only when duly authorized by the Board in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of these Regulations.

Joint Committees.

13. In section 77 and for the purposes of the Miners' Accidents Relief Fund "mine" shall include—

- (a) A mine that has at least twelve persons employed underground;
- (b) Several mines where two persons at least are employed in or about each mine and in the aggregate at least twelve persons are employed underground;
- (c) Two or more such mines in which at least twelve persons are employed underground, as set out in (a) or (b).

Constitution of Joint Committee.

14. Where the Minister is satisfied that a joint Committee of two or more mines in a district is desirable he shall so notify in the *Gazette*, and thereupon a joint Committee for such mines shall be constituted, consisting of—

- (a) an inspector of mines appointed by the Minister;
- (b) two persons in respect of each mine as in Regulation 13 from among those employed in or about such mine and appointed for the prescribed period by the persons so employed; and
- (c) one person in respect of each mine as in Regulation 13 appointed by the owner or owners of such mine or a representative thereof.

Such joint Committee shall, with respect to the said mines and the owners thereof, and the persons employed in or about the same, have the same powers and duties as a Committee has under the Act with respect to a single mine and the owner thereof and the persons employed in or about the same.

Joint Committees—Proposal to Appoint.

15. Any two or more persons employed in or about a mine may, by a written notice in the form of Schedule VI., convene a meeting of the persons employed in or about such mine to consider the advisableness of constituting a joint Committee for the said mine and such other mines as the notice may indicate.

Such notice shall be signed by the conveners of the meeting, and shall be exhibited in a conspicuous and frequented place in connexion with the mine for a period of not less than seven days prior to the date proposed for the meeting.

16. The decision of any meeting held in accordance with this Regulation shall be notified by document in the form of Schedule VII., forwarded to the Secretary to the Board for transmission to the Minister.

Dissolution of Joint Committees.

17. Any two or more persons employed in or about any mine represented upon a joint Committee may, by a notice in writing duly signed by them, convene a meeting of such persons to consider the advisableness of the dissolution of such joint Committee. Such notice shall state the place and the day and hour of the meeting, and shall be exhibited in a conspicuous and frequented place in connexion with the mine for a period of not less than seven days prior to the date proposed for the meeting. The decision of the majority present at such meeting shall be sent to the Secretary to the Board, signed by the Chairman and Secretary of the meeting, for transmission to the Minister.

Should it be decided that such joint Committee shall be dissolved, the Minister may so notify in the *Gazette*, and such Committee shall thereupon be dissolved.

Other joint or separate Committees may at any time thereafter be constituted in the prescribed manner.

Notice of Accident to Committee.

18. Where in or about any mine, whether above or below ground, loss of life or any personal injury to any person employed in or about such mine occurs, by reason of any accident whatever, the person meeting with such accident, or some person acting in his behalf, shall notify the manager, under-manager, or other person in charge at such mine of the occurrence of such accident within 24 hours next after the accident takes place; and shall also notify the Secretary or other officer of the Committee for the said mine within 48 hours next after the accident takes place.

The notice shall be in the form of Schedule VIII., and shall be in duplicate.

Form of Applications for Allowances.

19. (1) Every application for an allowance under the Act shall be made to the Committee for the mine at which the accident happened, under the hand of the person claiming the allowance, as soon as possible after the date of the accident, and shall state—

- (a) Name in full of the deceased or person disabled.
- (b) Age of such person.
- (c) Name and description of mine at which accident happened.
- (d) Date of accident.
- (e) How the person was employed when the accident happened.
- (f) Nature of accident.
- (g) Result of accident.
- (h) Whether married or single.

And in the case of a fatal accident shall further state—

- (i) Age of wife.
- (j) Name and age of each child under fourteen.
- (k) Date and time of death.
- (l) When such person was unmarried or a widower—names, relationship, and ages of those dependent on him.

(2) Every such application shall be accompanied by—

- (a) A certificate, signed by the manager or some other responsible official of the mine, that the deceased or the person disabled was at the time of the accident employed in or about such mine, and that the accident occurred in or about the working of such mine; and
- (b) A certificate, signed by a legally qualified medical practitioner or the local coroner, that the disablement or death was caused primarily by the accident referred to. In the case of disablement the nature and effects thereof shall be stated in such certificate.

Provided that, where the circumstances appear to warrant such a course, the Minister may dispense with a medical certificate in cases of disablement.

(3) Every application shall contain full and accurate particulars, and shall, in the case of death, be in the form of Schedule IX., and in the case of disablement be in the form of Schedule VIII.

Proof Required before Payment of Allowance.

20. Before any allowance is granted, or any payment is made by any Committee, where death has resulted from the accident, such Committee shall satisfy itself that the application for such allowance was made in the form and contains the particulars prescribed by these Regulations, and shall require satisfactory proof to be given—

(a) Where the deceased was married—

- (1) If the deceased left a widow, of the marriage, and of the identity of such widow.
- (2) If the deceased left a child or children, of their identity, and of the age of each child.
- (3) If the deceased left a child or children, and a widow, but the widow subsequently died; or if the deceased left a child or children, but no widow: of the death of the widow, or that the deceased did not leave a widow, as the case may be, and the person claiming is the guardian, or has the care of the child or children.

(b) Where the deceased was unmarried—

- (1) If the deceased left a father, that he was at the time of his son's death dependent upon the deceased for support, and of his identity.
- (2) If the deceased left a mother, that she is a widow, and that she was at the time of his death dependent on deceased for support, and of her identity; that such widow had at the time of his death children, and of their ages, and of their identity.
- (3) If the father and mother of deceased be dead, or be not entitled to an allowance; that the deceased left a sister or sisters, that she or they are unmarried, and was or were at the time of his death dependent on deceased for support, and of their identity; that the sister or sisters had a child or children, and of their ages and identity.

Allowance granted to be indorsed upon Application.

21. As soon as an application for allowance has been dealt with by a Committee for the mine, there shall be indorsed upon such application, in the place provided for the purpose, full and accurate particulars of the—

- (a) Amount of allowance or allowances granted.
- (b) Name of person to whom granted, and in what capacity.
- (c) Date from which payment is to commence.

And such indorsement shall be signed and dated by the Chairman of the Committee.

Continuation of Relief.

22. Before making a second or succeeding payment of an allowance to any person claiming to be entitled to the same, the Committee may, if considered necessary, demand satisfactory evidence that the applicant is entitled to a continuance of the relief prescribed by the Act.

The Committee may discontinue or reduce any allowance where the Board and the Committee are satisfied that the person to whom relief has been granted so misconducts himself that in their judgment he should be deprived of the allowance in whole or in part.

Any person being in receipt of, or claiming to be entitled to, an allowance for permanent disablement shall, if directed by the Board, subject himself to examination by the Government Medical Officer, who shall determine finally and conclusively the condition of the grantee or applicant.

Beneficiaries resuming Work.

23. When a person who has been in receipt of an allowance, by reason of disablement, is able to resume work, he shall, in writing, notify the Secretary of the Committee of the fact. Such notice may be given to the Secretary direct, or left at the office of the mine, addressed to him. Any person who resumes work without furnishing the notice herein prescribed shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Board—Period of Appointment; Powers and Duties; Fees and Expenses.

24. The period of appointment of the Board shall be during the pleasure of the Governor in Council. The Board shall have the powers and duties set out in section 73 of the Act, and prescribed by the Regulations. The fees to be paid to members shall be—Chairman Three pounds and other members Two pounds each for each day of meeting respectively, and necessary travelling expenses. The Chairman shall for such attendances at the Department as may be required for administrative purposes (being not less than one in each week) be paid in addition a sum of Three pounds per week.

Committee's Expenses.

25. For the purpose of remunerating its officers and of paying local expenses under the Act and the Regulations not otherwise provided for, each Committee or joint Committee shall be paid from the fund an amount equal to seven and a half per centum on the moneys received by it in pursuance of section 76 of the Act, but not being greater than £37 10s. nor less than £2 10s. per annum.

The first payment after the commencement of this Act shall be made on the moneys so received by the Committee from the date of its appointment, subsequent payments shall be made on the moneys so received after the date of the last receipts on which payment was made.

The payments to Committees for such expenses shall be made quarterly, and shall be paid direct to the Committees by the Board.

Payments—How ascertained, &c.

26. As soon as practicable after the termination of each quarter the Secretary of the Board shall, from the returns furnished from time to time by the several Committees, make a return showing the amounts of money received since the preceding return by the several Committees, in pursuance of section 76 of the Act, and showing the sums to which the several Committees are entitled for expenses. The Secretary to the Board shall forward to the Treasurer of such Committees cheques for the amounts payable to such Committee under these Regulations, and shall advise the Secretary of each Committee of such payment: Provided that where the returns furnished by any Committee are incomplete, the amount payable under the Regulations may be withheld pending the completion of such returns.

Owner's Payments under Section 74 and Returns to be made.

27. The owner of a mine shall make the payments prescribed by section 74 of the Act not later than thirty days after the termination of each quarter, by bank draft, or post office order made payable to the Secretary to the Board; and shall at the same time furnish the said Secretary with a return in the form of Schedule X., showing the sums deducted from the wages for each period of the quarter.

The fine imposed by section 82 of the Act shall also be paid by bank draft or post office order to such Secretary.

The said Secretary shall give to the owner a receipt for any moneys so paid.

Non-payment of Moneys under Sections 74 and 82.

28. Upon report being made to the Board of the failure of any owner to pay within the period prescribed any moneys which he is liable to pay, under sections 74 or 82 of the Act to the fund, the Board shall cause proceedings to be instituted for the recovery of the same.

Accounts to be kept by Board.

29. The Board shall cause the various items of receipt and expenditure in connexion with the fund to be duly entered in a book or books in the form of Schedule XI.

The Board shall keep in a ledger—

(a) A separate account of all moneys received from and paid to each Committee; such account shall be in the form of Schedule XII.

(b) An "Investment Account," showing the investment of moneys of the fund.

(c) Any other accounts that the Board may deem it necessary to keep.

The Board shall also keep an Entry Register in the form of Schedule XIII.

Proclamations to be observed.

30. A copy of any Regulation made under the Act shall be supplied to each Committee and to the Board by the Minister, and such Regulations shall be observed by such Committees and Board.

State Contribution.

31. Within thirty days after the termination of each quarter the Secretary to the Board shall notify to the Minister of the amount of the total payments then made by owners under section 74 of the Act, and shall apply for the payment to the funds out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund in terms of section 74 (b) of the Act.

Should any payment by an owner be made after the time prescribed the said Secretary shall forthwith notify the Minister of the amount, and apply for the payment to the fund of an equal amount out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

Proceedings of Board.

32. Proceedings at Board meetings shall be regulated as follows :—

1. The Board shall meet at the Department of Mines at such times as the Minister may require.
2. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum.
3. The Board shall keep minutes of its proceedings.
4. The order of business at a Board meeting, after the confirmation of minutes, shall be as follows :—

The reading and consideration of the correspondence.

The consideration of any question of which notice shall have been given.

The consideration of any statements of accounts or report prepared by the Secretary.

Such other business as may be brought forward.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to act temporarily as Chairman of the Board.

Proceedings of Committee.

33. The following directions and provisions shall have effect with respect to every Committee :—

1. The Committee shall meet as soon as convenient, but not later than one week after each pay-day, and at such other times as may be deemed necessary.
2. Any three members of the Committee shall form a quorum.
3. The Committee shall keep minutes of its proceedings, and such minutes shall show in detail all allowances granted at any meeting.
4. The Committee shall, from time to time, appoint some one of their number to be Chairman.
5. The Committee may appoint a Secretary and a Treasurer from their own number. The person so appointed to act as Secretary or Treasurer, as the case may be, shall hold office until his successor is appointed.
6. The order of business at a meeting of the Committee after the confirmation of the minutes shall be as follows :—

The reading and consideration of the correspondence ; and the reports and statements of the Secretary and Treasurer.

The consideration of applications for allowances.

The consideration of all questions of which notice has been given.

Such other business as may be brought forward.

Procedure at Board and Committee Meetings.

34. The following additional directions and provisions shall have effect with respect to the Board and every Committee :—

1. Whenever at any appointed time of meeting, or at any time during a meeting, there is not a quorum present, the names of those members then present shall be recorded in the minute-book.
2. The reading of the minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall form the first business at each meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings ; and upon their being confirmed, or amended and confirmed, as the case may be, they shall be signed by the Chairman of the meeting.
3. When a motion has been proposed and the debate thereon (if any) concluded, a question shall be proposed by the Chairman, and it shall be resolved in the affirmative or negative by the majority of voices "Aye" or "No."
4. In the case of an equality of votes at any meeting, the Chairman for the time being of such meeting shall have a second or casting vote.
5. When any amendment has been made, the main question, as amended, shall be put, but when any amendments proposed have not been carried, the question shall be put as originally proposed.
6. The Chairman having put a question to the vote, shall state whether in his opinion the "Ayes" or "Noes" have it ; and unless his opinion be acquiesced in by the minority the question shall be resolved by show of hands. Every member present when the question is so put shall vote, and the vote so given by each member shall be recorded in the minutes.
7. No member shall be entitled to vote on any question in which he has any direct pecuniary interest ; and no member shall be entitled to vote in any show of hands unless he was present when the question was put.
8. If the number of votes has been inaccurately reported, the Chairman shall inform the meeting of the same, and shall cause the records to be corrected.
9. Any member rising to a point of order shall be allowed simply to direct attention to the point complained of, and submit it to the decision of the Chairman.
10. Every member desiring to speak shall rise in his place and address the Chairman, and if two or more members rise to speak the Chairman shall call upon the member who, in his opinion, rose first. If the Chairman's opinion be not concurred in by the meeting a notice may be made that a certain member (naming him) be now heard.

Officers of Board.—Appointment; Salaries, Expenses.

35. The officers of the Board shall be appointed by the Governor in Council; and the salaries of such officers and, except where otherwise provided, the expense of carrying out the provisions of the Act shall be paid out of moneys appropriated by Parliament for that purpose.

Duties of Officers.—Secretary to Board.

36. The Secretary to the Board shall—

1. Conduct the correspondence of the Board under the direction of the Chairman.
2. Summon the meetings of the Board in accordance with these Regulations.
3. Keep the minutes of the proceedings of the Board.
4. Prepare and submit to the Board for adoption and transmission to the Minister in January of each year a report of the business transacted during the last preceding year; and such report shall contain such statistical tables, observations, explanations, and suggestions as to the Board may appear desirable.
5. Keep the accounts of the Board in accordance with the requirements of these Regulations, and submit a statement of accounts and produce the books at each meeting of the Board.
6. Report to the Board all payments made from the fund to the Committee.
7. Make up the accounts for submission to and adoption by the Board.
8. Be responsible for all moneys paid into his hands on account of the fund, and duly account for the same from time to time.
9. Make such investments as the Board may authorize, and in such manner as it may direct.
10. See that proper receipts are given and taken for all moneys received or paid by him.
11. Be responsible for the safe custody of the account and other books of the Board, and any documents and papers affecting its interests; and of any minute and cash books received from Committees.
12. Give security in the sum of £500.
13. Make requisition (on the forms provided) to the Secretary for Mines for any furniture, books, stationery, and printing required by the Board.
14. Forward each year to each Committee twelve copies of the Board's accounts after the same have been laid before Parliament.
15. Forward a copy of every Proclamation published under the Act to each Committee.
16. Report to the Board the non-payment of moneys by owners or Committees.

Local Secretary.

37. The Secretary to a Committee (termed in these Regulations the "Local Secretary") shall—

1. Conduct the correspondence of the Committee under the direction of the Chairman.
2. Summon the meetings of the Committee in accordance with these Regulations.
3. Keep the minutes of the proceedings of the Committee in accordance with these Regulations.
4. Be responsible for the safe custody of the minute-book, and any documents and papers affecting the interests of the Committee, and forward to the Secretary to the Board the minute and cash books within six months after the same have ceased to be used for entries therein.
5. Make requisition (on the forms provided) to the Secretary to the Board for any books and stationery required by the Committee.
6. Act under the control and superintendence of the Committee.
7. Report all appointments to and all vacancies on the Committee to the Secretary of the Board.

Local Treasurer.

38. The Treasurer to a Committee (herein termed the "Local Treasurer") shall—

1. Keep the accounts of the Committee in accordance with the requirements of these Regulations.
2. Be responsible for all moneys paid into his hands on behalf of his Committee, and duly account for the same from time to time.
3. Produce the account books at each meeting, and at any other time when required by a member of the Committee, or for the purposes of audit, or when necessary under these Regulations.
4. Prepare the copy of the cash-book required by these Regulations to be furnished to the Board, for submission to and certification by the Chairman.
5. Pay all allowances granted by the Committee, and obtain proper acquittances for such payments in the form prescribed by the Regulations.
6. Be responsible for the safe custody of the cash book of the Committee until it is no longer required for making entries therein, when he shall hand it to the Secretary.
7. Report the non-payment of moneys by any owner or manager.
8. The Board may direct that the accounts of any Committee shall be conducted by means of an account current with any conveniently situated bank. Where such direction is given all moneys paid to a Committee by the owner or manager of a mine, or by the Board, shall be deposited to the credit of such Committee with such bank, and all amounts payable by such Committee shall be paid by cheques drawn upon such bank, and signed by two officers of such Committee.

Returns, for Employees' Information.

39. The Committee of a mine shall, after every ordinary meeting of such Committee, cause a return to be prepared in the form of Schedule XIV., showing—

1. The aggregate amount deducted from wages and paid to the Committee, under Section 76 of the Act, for the pay period immediately preceding the meeting of the Committee;
2. The amounts voted by such Committee in payment of allowances, as prescribed;
3. The names of the persons to whom such allowances were voted; and
4. The amount unexpended and forwarded to the Board.

The correctness of such return shall be certified to by the officers of the Committee.

The Committee shall, within three days after the meeting, cause such return to be posted in a conspicuous place at or near the entrance to the mine, for the information of the employees of the mine.

Breach—Penalty.

40. If any person contravenes or fails to comply with any of the foregoing Regulations, or makes any return, statement, or certificate, which is to his knowledge false in any particular, he shall be guilty of a breach of such Regulations, and shall be liable for each such breach to a penalty not exceeding £5.

SCALE AND CONDITIONS OF ALLOWANCES.

The allowances under the Act shall be as follows:—

1. Where death results from the accident—

(a) if the deceased was married—

- (i) a weekly sum of Eight shillings, payable to the widow, if any, while unmarried;
- (ii) a weekly sum of Two shillings and sixpence in respect of each child; if any, of the deceased until such child attains the age of fourteen years, or dies, payable to the widow, if any, during her life; or, if there is no widow, or the widow dies while any such sum is payable, to the guardian or person having the care of such child;
- (iii) a weekly sum of Eight shillings per week, payable to the guardian of the motherless children of the deceased until no child is below the age of fourteen years;
- (iv) a sum of Twelve pounds in respect of the expenses of the funeral of the deceased, payable to any person approved by the Committee.

(b) if the deceased was unmarried—

- (i) a weekly sum of Eight shillings, payable to the mother of the deceased during her life and while she is unmarried, if, in the opinion of the Committee, she was at the time of his death dependent on the deceased for support;

A weekly sum of Eight shillings, payable to the father of the deceased during his life if, in the opinion of the Committee, the father was at the time of his son's death dependent on the deceased for support;

- (ii) if the father and mother of the deceased are dead, or are not entitled to an allowance, a weekly sum of Eight shillings, payable to the sister or sisters of the deceased (sharing equally) while such sister or any of such sisters is or are alive and unmarried, if, in the opinion of the Committee, she or they were at the time of his death dependent on the deceased for support;
- (iii) a weekly sum of Two shillings and sixpence for each child of the mother of the deceased, or of the sister or sisters of the deceased, payable to the mother or to the sister or sisters, as the case may be, until such child attains the age of fourteen years, if, in the opinion of the Committee, such mother or such sister or sisters was or were at the time of his death dependent on the deceased for support;
- (iv) a sum of Twelve pounds in respect of the expenses of the funeral of the deceased, payable to any person approved by the Committee.

2. Where disablement results from the accident—A weekly sum of Twelve shillings, payable to the person disabled. A person shall be deemed to be disabled when he is wholly incapacitated from attending to his ordinary occupation.

3. Where permanent disablement results from the accident—

- (a) a weekly sum of Twelve shillings, payable to the person disabled;
- (b) a weekly sum of Two shillings and sixpence in respect of each child, if any, of the person disabled until such child attains the age of fourteen years, or dies, payable to the person disabled.

- (1) All shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*) within the township of Waubra, within the municipal district of the shire of Lexton, shall be exempted from the provisions of section 77 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*.
- (2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—
 - (a) Ten o'clock on the evening of Saturday;
 - (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday;
 - (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Thursday.

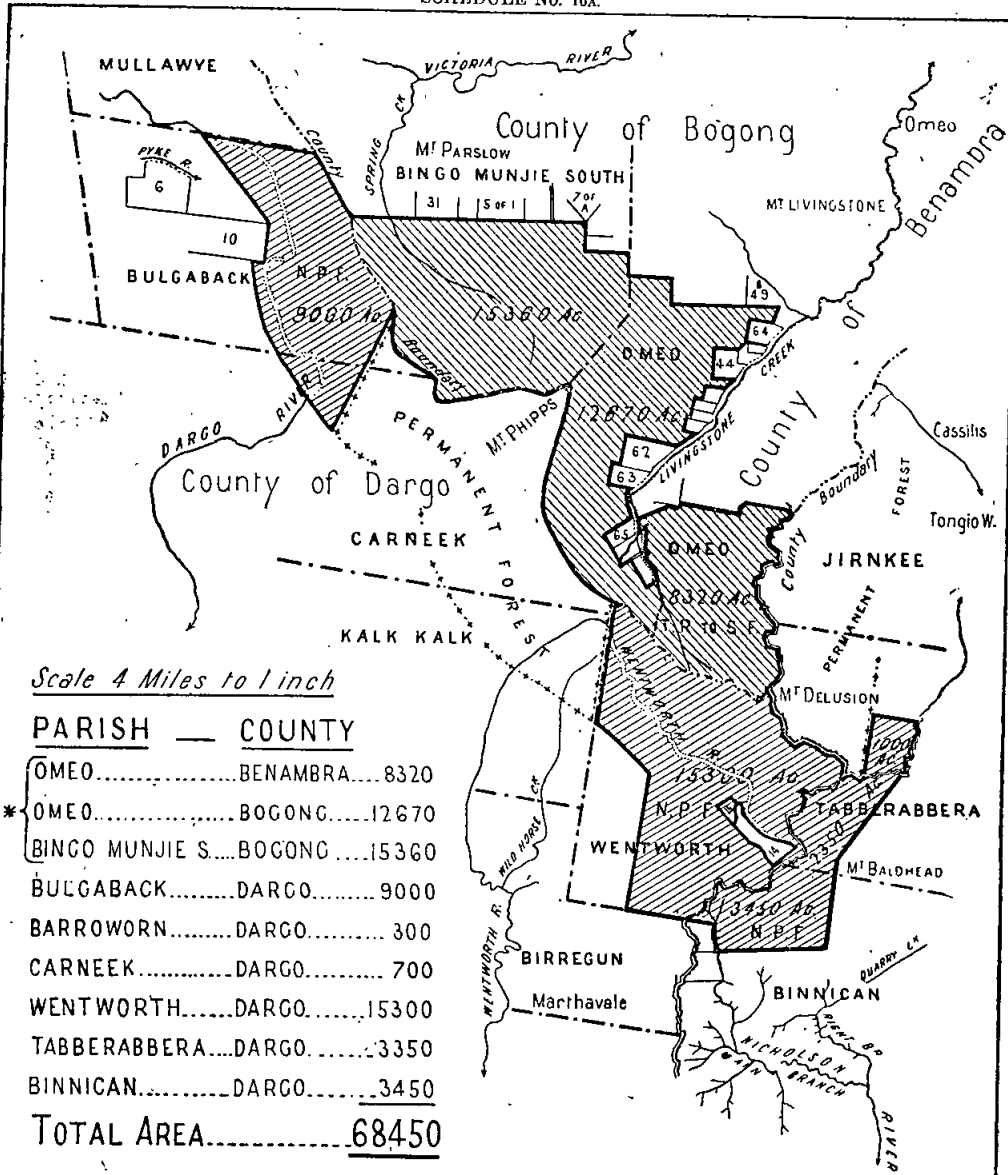

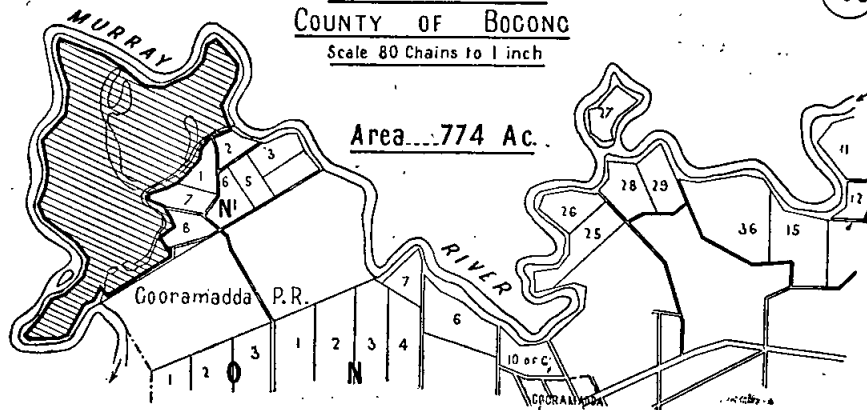

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES
TO MINING ENGINE-DRIVERS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the
twenty-sixth day of January, 1916.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Sir A. J. Peacock | Mr. McLeod.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Mines Act, doth hereby cancel the Regulations for granting certificates to mining managers and others, made by Orders in Council dated 5th June, 1906; 31st July, 1906; and 11th April, 1910, and doth substitute therefor the following Regulations, that is to say:—

Victoria.

Mines Act 1915.

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES TO MINING
ENGINE-DRIVERS.

Preliminary Requirements.

1. Each applicant for a certificate of competency must forward to the Secretary for Mines, Mining Department, Melbourne, notice in writing of his intention to present himself for examination, such notice to be given not less than fourteen (14) clear days prior to the date of examination.

The notice must be accompanied by cash, post-office order, or postal notes to the amount or value of 10s.

Should the applicant pass the prescribed examination the deposit shall, in each instance, go towards payment of the fee for certificate. In the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination, such amount shall be forfeited to the consolidated revenue.

No certificate shall be issued until full payment of the fee required shall have been made to the Secretary for Mines.

Certificates of Competency.

2. The certificates of competency to be issued by the Board of Examiners shall be of three classes, namely:—first, second, and third.

A first class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes, unless the certificate be qualified as provided for in clause 5 (b).

A second class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes, except a winding engine, unless the certificate be qualified as provided for in clause 4 (b).

A third class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes not being a winding engine, and the cylinder of which does not exceed 12 inches in diameter, or a double-cylinder engine, the cylinders of which have a combined area not exceeding that of a single cylinder of not more than 12 inches in diameter, unless the certificate be qualified as provided for in clause 3 (b).

3. An applicant for a third class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

- (a) of his respectability of character;
- (b) that within a period of three (3) years prior to the date of examination he has, during not less than twelve months, been assisting to drive engines used for mining purposes for not less than twelve (12) hours per week.

Where the applicant has had experience only on one engine or class of engine, the Board may grant a conditional certificate for that engine or class of engine only—

- (c) that he is at the date of examination not under the age of eighteen (18) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years. This latter age not to apply to persons who had experience in driving engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty years;
- (d) that neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any mental or other bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties. A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company or mine-owner, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence of his having had the necessary experience at a mine; provided the document signed by the engine-driver be declared by such engine-driver before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits to be true and correct in every particular.

4. An applicant for a second class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

- (a) of his respectability of character;
- (b) that he has been the holder of a third class certificate under these Regulations, or a second class certificate under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* for a period of not less than twelve (12) months, and that he has had at least six (6) months' experience during that period in driving a third class mining engine or engines, such driving experience to have been for not less than twelve (12) hours per week; or that he has within a period of three (3) years prior to the date of examination assisted to drive a steam-engine the cylinder of which is more than twelve (12) inches in diameter, or a double-cylinder steam-engine the cylinders of which have a combined area equal to that of a single cylinder of more than twelve (12) inches in diameter for a period of twelve (12) months, and for at least twelve hours per week: The examination to be equivalent to that undergone by a candidate for a first class factory certificate.

Where the applicant has had experience only on one engine or class of engine, the Board may grant a conditional certificate for that engine or class of engine only—

- (c) that he is at the date of examination not under the age of nineteen (19) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years. This latter age not to apply to persons who had experience in driving engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty years;
- (d) that neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any mental or other bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties. A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company or mine-owner, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence of his having had the necessary experience at a mine; provided the document signed by the engine-driver be declared by such engine-driver before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits to be true and correct in every particular.

5. An applicant for a first class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

- (a) of his respectability of character;
- (b) that he has been the holder of a second class certificate under these Regulations, a first class certificate of competency or service issued under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, an ordinary mining engine-driver's certificate issued in New South Wales, or a second class mining engine-driver's certificate issued in any other State of the Commonwealth, for a period of not less than twelve months, and that he has had at least six months' experience during that period in assisting to drive both loose eccentric and link-motion winding engines, such experience to be for not less than twelve (12) hours per week.

Where only one class of the above engines or any other class of winding gear has been driven, the Board may grant a conditional certificate for that class of engine only—

- (c) that he is at the date of examination not under the age of twenty-one (21) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years. This latter age does not apply to persons who had experience in driving winding engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty years;
- (d) that neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any mental or other bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties. A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company or mine-owner, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence of his having had the necessary experience at a mine; provided the document signed by the engine-driver be declared by such engine-driver before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits to be true and correct in every particular.

Examinations.

6. Examinations will be conducted by the Board at such time and place as may from time to time be notified by the Secretary in the *Government Gazette*, and in a newspaper published or circulated in the locality, and candidates will be examined according to priority of receipt of notice required by clause 1. Each candidate will be duly notified of the time and place of examination.

7. Candidates for certificates of competency will be examined as to their practical knowledge and working of machinery, including steam and other engines, boilers, furnaces, winding and pumping gear, or any other machinery used for mining purposes.

8. If a candidate shall fail to pass the examination prescribed he shall not again present himself until a period of not less than three months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

9. The holder of a first class certificate of competency or of service under the *Mines Act 1915* shall be entitled to drive any engine at a mine or any engine under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*.

10. The holder of a first class certificate of competency or of service under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* shall be entitled to drive any engine at a mine except a winding engine.

11. The holder of a second class certificate of competency or of service under the *Mines Act 1915* shall be entitled to drive any engine under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*.

12. The holder of a second class certificate of competency or of service under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* shall be entitled to drive any engine used for mining purposes not being a winding engine, and the cylinder of which does not exceed 12 inches in diameter, or a double-cylinder engine the cylinders of which have a combined area not exceeding that of a single cylinder of not more than 12 inches in diameter.

13. The holder of a third class certificate under the *Mines Act 1915* shall be entitled to drive any second class engine under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*.

Copies of Certificates.

14. Whenever any person proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he has, without fault on his part, lost or been deprived of any certificate previously granted to him under the provisions of the *Mines Act 1915*, such Board shall, upon payment of such fee, if any, as they may direct, but not exceeding the fee specified in the Schedule hereto, cause a copy of the certificate to which the applicant appears to be entitled to be made out and certified by the Secretary to the Board, and delivered to the applicant, and any copy so made and certified as aforesaid shall have the effect of the original certificate. The fee, if any, herein referred to shall be paid to the Secretary for Mines in cash or post-office order, and shall by him be paid into the consolidated revenue.

15. If a candidate attempt to obtain a certificate by means of false testimonials, he shall not be allowed to again present himself to the Board of Examiners for examination until a period of not less than twelve months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

16. Every holder of a second or third class certificate under these Regulations must produce such certificate to the Board previous to his being examined for a higher class, and, in the event of the latter certificate being granted, the former shall be surrendered and delivered up to the Board.

17. Any person holding a mining engine-driver's certificate issued in any other State of the Commonwealth, or in New Zealand, and who takes up his residence in Victoria, may be granted a registration slip of equal grade to his certificate, upon payment of the fee prescribed by the following Schedule, and without undergoing any examination. This registration slip shall entitle the holder to drive the same class or classes of engine that he had been qualified to take charge of under his certificate in the issuing State, or in New Zealand, and these particulars will be shown on the face of the registration slip. He will also be subject to the provisions of section 434 of the *Mines Act 1915*, and section 35 of the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1915*.

18. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF ELPHINSTONE.

WE, Arthur William Hornville, Robert Oliver, jun., Patrick Joseph Doran, John Christopher Owens, Philip Henry Neville, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 8th September, 1908, as a site for Public Recreation in the town of Elphinstone, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915.

REGULATIONS.

(1) The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

(2) No persons shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

(3) No person shall damage in any way the trees or shrubs in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

(4) No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

(5) No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first being obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for admittance shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

(6) No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(7) No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(8) No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(9) No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

(10) No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

(11) Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, or enclosure on the occasions of fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any injury or damage sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from

so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

By-law No. 3.—A By-law of the shire of Mirboo made under section 4 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, and numbered 3 for the purpose of extending to the said shire of Mirboo certain parts of the provisions of Part I. of the said Act, namely, sections 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, and 14 of the said Act.

By-law No. 4.—A By-law of the shire of Mirboo made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 4, for prohibiting spitting or expectorating on footpaths and for prohibiting the throwing, placing, or leaving upon any public highway of orange-peel, banana-peel, or other vegetable matter.

By-law No. 5.—A By-law of the shire of Mirboo made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 5 for regulating the locking of the wheel of any vehicle when descending a hill whereby the locking of any wheel of any vehicle while descending any hill on any road is prohibited unless a skid-pan or slipper of a prescribed kind is placed at the bottom of such wheel while so locked.

By-law No. 6.—A By-law of the shire of Mirboo numbered 6, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915* for prohibiting or regulating the use on any road of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway whereby the use on any public highway of any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any projections is prohibited except under certain specified conditions and whereby it is provided that there shall be painted on every traction engine proceeding on any street or road the weight thereof and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for the propulsion thereof and whereby it is provided that no traction engine so long as the fire thereof is alight or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient power to move it shall be left on any public highway unless

attended by some male person over the age of 21 years and whereby it is provided that no person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment if by so doing he will meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or vehicle drawn by a horse and whereby the halting of a traction engine (except under certain specified conditions) on any narrow part of a road is prohibited and whereby the stopping of any traction engine on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water or for any other purpose is prohibited and whereby it is provided that no person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise except under certain specified conditions and whereby it is provided that no person shall use on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried thereon at least 4 wood planks of a specified size to be used in a specified manner when such engine is crossing a bridge or culvert and whereby it is provided that the driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of such engine commence to skid and shall before starting again take all necessary steps to prevent damage to the highway by the skidding of the wheels and whereby the penalties for breach of the said By-law are fixed.

By-law No. 7.—A By-law of the shire of Mirboo made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and numbered 7 for the purpose of compelling residents or occupiers of premises to keep them free from offensive or unwholesome matters and for preventing any place house or premises from being kept in a state offensive injurious to health or dangerous.
