*Meat Supervision Act 1915.*REGULATIONS FOR THE BRANDING OF
CARCASSES OR MEAT.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the *Meat Supervision Act 1915* that no person shall sell or attempt to sell or expose for sale any carcass or meat within any meat area unless the same is branded by or under the direction of a meat inspector as fit for human consumption and unless in the case of any carcass or meat imported into Victoria the carcass or meat is branded with the word "imported": And whereas it is further enacted by the said Act that the Board of Public Health may pursuant and subject to the provisions of sections thirty-one and forty-one of the *Health Act 1915* make regulations prescribing the modes in which carcasses or meat whether fresh frozen dried preserved or chilled shall be branded: Now therefore the said Board by virtue of the powers vested in it doth hereby make the Regulations hereunder set forth:—

SHORT TITLE.

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Meat Branding Regulations 1916."

REPEAL.

2. All Regulations heretofore made in respect of branding carcasses or meat are hereby repealed.

APPLICATION OF REGULATIONS.

3. These Regulations shall apply to the Metropolitan, Ballarat, Ballarat East, Bendigo, Dandenong, Dunmunkle, Geelong, Geelong Harbor Trust, Kilmore, Lillydale, Shepparton, and Warrnambool meat areas and to every other meat area that may hereafter be constituted.

INDICATING LETTERS.

4. Carcasses or meat, whether fresh, frozen, dried, preserved or chilled, when examined and passed as fit for human consumption, shall be branded by or under the direction of a meat inspector by means of a heated appliance with a legibly seared brand which shall include letters in the form of Roman capitals not less than one-quarter of an inch in height indicating the Board or the Municipal Council or other body under whose authority the said carcasses or meat are examined passed and branded. The letters indicating the several bodies under whose respective authorities the brands are applied shall be as set forth hereunder:—

Provided that in the case of meat intended for consumption by members of the Jewish faith the brand shall be the Hebrew equivalent of the word "Kosher" and may be applied by means other than that of a heated appliance.

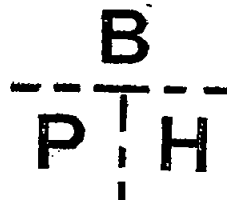
MODES OF BRANDING.

5. (a) Where the animal has been examined prior to slaughter and the carcass including the viscera has been examined after slaughter the outline of the brand shall be in the form of an interrupted circle not less than one inch and a quarter in diameter and within the circle

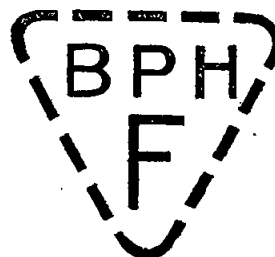
so formed the letters shall be so arranged that the first or first two shall occupy the upper half of the circle and the rest the lower half as shown hereunder:—



(b) Where a carcass, or part of a carcass of an animal without its viscera has been examined at an appointed place in accordance with the provisions of section twenty-seven of the *Meat Supervision Act 1915*, the brand shall be in the form of a T of which the horizontal line shall be not less than one and a quarter inches long and the vertical line not less than five-eighths of an inch long. The outline of the T shall be interrupted and the letters shall be so arranged that the first or first two shall be above and the rest below the horizontal line of the T as shown hereunder:—



(c) In the case of a carcass or meat being frozen the brand shall have the outline of an interrupted triangle having the sides not less than one inch and a quarter in length and the letters shall be arranged within the triangle along one base and the letter F shall occupy the opposite angle as shown hereunder:—



(d) In the case of a carcass or meat imported into Victoria the brand shall be the word "IMPORTED" arranged in the form of a circle not less than one inch and a quarter in diameter and in the centre of the brand there shall be the initial letter of the name of the body under whose authority the carcass or meat is examined and branded as shown hereunder:—



(e) In the case of "Kosher" meat the brand shall be the word "Kosher" in Hebrew characters as shown hereunder:—



APPLICATION OF BRAND.

6. The brand shall be applied to not less than the following parts, viz. :—

- (1) In the case of beef and veal, on the upper surface of the tongue, and on each side of the carcass—
 - (a) On the buttock;
 - (b) On the flank;
 - (c) On the outside of the ribs; and
 - (d) On the shoulder.
- (2) In the case of an unflayed carcass of veal, on each side of the carcass—
 - (a) On the brisket; and
 - (b) On the inner surface of the flank.
- (3) In the case of mutton and lamb, on each side of the carcass—
 - (a) On the shoulder; and
 - (b) On the leg.
- (4) In the case of pork, on each side of the carcass—
 - (a) On the cheek;
 - (b) On the hand;
 - (c) On the loin; and
 - (d) On the leg.
- (5) In the case of parts of a carcass the brand shall be applied to such places as the meat inspector considers advisable.
- (6) In the case of "Kosher" meat the brand shall be applied to such parts as the Shouchet desires.

Health Act 1915.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREVENTION OF OVER-CROWDING AND OBSTRUCTION IN GANGWAYS, PASSAGES, AND AISLES IN ANY PUBLIC BUILDING.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria by virtue of the powers conferred by section 244 of the *Health Act 1915* and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth make the following Regulations with a view to the prevention of overcrowding and obstruction in gangways, passages, and aisles and generally to secure public safety in public buildings, that is to say :—

1. *Overcrowding*.—The seating space assigned for each person throughout the auditorium of every public building gallery &c. shall be not less than 17 inches by 30 inches. Where continuous seating is provided each seat shall be clearly defined.

No standing space shall be permitted except in those parts of the auditorium specially set apart and approved by the Board of Public Health, and not more than one person to every 2 feet superficial of floor area shall be allowed in any such space.

Unless otherwise exempted by the Board of Public Health all seats in the auditorium of every public building shall be firmly secured to the floor, and where it is found impracticable to fix the seating as aforesaid, all movable seats shall be secured together in rows from gangway to gangway, and no single loose seat or seats shall be placed in any part of the auditorium except in positions specially allowed by the Board.

2. *Gangways*.—Gangways shall be formed near, or at, each side of the auditorium, and between the doors at the side or the rear of the seating in every part of the auditorium, gallery, &c., so that no seat shall have more than seven seats intervening between it and an aisle or gangway.

3. *Gangways, &c., to be kept clear*.—All aisles and gangways throughout the auditorium of every public building, and all exit doorways, passages and vestibules leading therefrom, shall be kept clear and free from obstruction of any kind, and no person shall be allowed to occupy, stand in or place any obstruction in any aisle, gangway or passageway of any public building during any performance, lecture, concert, or any public assemblage.

The person or persons in charge of any public entertainment or assemblage or the owner or lessee or manager under whom or by whose authority such person or persons occupy the said building, shall be responsible for keeping the said aisles, passages, and gangways clear and free from obstruction.

4. Regulation 1 shall not apply to any public building, the floor area of the auditorium of which, including gangways, contains less than 1,000 superficial feet.

Regulation No. 2 of Part II. of the Regulations made on 24th September, 1886, under section one hundred and ten of the *Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and the Regulations made on 18th September, 1912, under section 233 of the *Health Act 1890*, are hereby repealed.

5. *Penalties*.—Any person who fails to comply with any of the foregoing Regulations, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is, by section three hundred and eighty-eight of the *Health Act 1915*, thereby guilty of an offence against that Act, and is liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Twenty shillings for each day during which such offence is continued, besides any expenses which may be incurred in remedying his default.

Land Surveyors Act 1895.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 8th November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

(Signed) A.B.

(Date.)

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or

authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *nisi voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1916.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1915*, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) and upwards situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1916.
2. The minimum rate for such properties valued at less than Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings (20s.)
3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds (£5) sterling per cent. on the amount

of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use or for the watering of private gardens or distribution otherwise on or about such premises shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.
5. For every steam boiler or engine using water the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.
6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge will be Ninepence (9d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the municipal charge shall not be less than equal to One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation of the shire of Shepparton for the year 1916 of the property so supplied.
7. Water supplied to Government Departments, public gardens, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show yards, cattle yards, sheep dips, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.
8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of Two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.
9. For a temporary supply during the laying down of any new works or the erection of new buildings, or repairs, or additions, the charge shall be by meter measurement at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000), which shall include supply of meter. The meter, with box enclosed, shall be supplied by the Trust, and shall be fixed by the Trust officer or officers, and the applicant for the temporary supply shall have all pipes and connexions to the main ready before the meter is so fixed. All persons requiring a supply of water under this clause shall first notify the Trust and shall not use any water for such purposes until authorized in writing so to do. The Trust officer or officers shall be entitled at any time to go upon the premises to inspect and supervise the meter and the supply and use of the water.
10. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the said year 1916. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.
11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act 1915*, on the evening of Tuesday, fourteenth day of December, 1915.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW RELATING TO WATER SUPPLY.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1915 and all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

1. Any person affixing any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust shall connect such by a lead pipe three (3) feet in length, with proper brass connexions, and before any person in any manner interferes with any service-pipe, cock, or fitting up to the building line connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall give a clear twenty-four (24) hours' written notice of his intention to do so to the secretary of the Trust, and shall before doing such work obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any person offending against this By-law in any way shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

2. Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent, or by himself or his employees committing any breach of the *Water Act* 1915, or any other Act or Acts relating to water supply or of this By-law or any By-law of the Trust.

3. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and shall pay in advance a licence fee of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; but the Trust may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.

4. No person shall lay down a pipe at a less depth than two (2) feet from the surface of the earth.

5. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

6. The bore of any service-pipe for the supply of water from the pipes of the Trust shall not exceed—

- (a) One-half of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued at the municipal valuation for rating purposes of Twenty pounds (£20) or under; and
- (b) Three-quarters of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued as aforesaid at a sum exceeding Twenty pounds (£20); and this By-law shall be taken as a consent of the Trust to any such service. Before any service-pipe with a bore, the dimensions of which are contrary to this clause, is laid down to any premises, the consent of the Trust must first be obtained.

7. No person shall use, or permit to be used, or allow to run on any premises, any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire-extinguishing purposes before the hour of Seven o'clock a.m. or after the hour of Nine o'clock p.m. during the months of November, December, January, and February, or before the hour of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. or after the hour of Eight (8) o'clock p.m. during the other months of the year. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

8. Any person who shall allow water to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

9. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement, use, take, or carry away, or wilfully permit to be used, taken, or carried away, water from any drinking tap, water-trough, or private or public water service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

10. Every person upon whose premises a water-trough stands shall keep such trough provided with a ball tap, and shall keep such water-trough and ball tap at all times in a state of thorough repair. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

11. No person shall use any water on, or allow any water to run on any land, garden, plantation, or vegetation, wherever growing, otherwise than by means of a garden hose, or at any time other than between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. and Nine (9) o'clock p.m. during the months of November, December, January, and February, or between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. and Eight (8) o'clock p.m. during the other months of the year. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

12. Every person supplied with water shall keep the pipe or pipes on the premises occupied by him disconnected and free from any hose pipe or other conduit during the times the use of water is forbidden under clause seven (7) hereof. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

13. No person shall use water, or permit water to be used, or allow water to run in any manner whatsoever upon any land upon which is growing lucerne, maize, millet, amber cane, sorghum, or other fodder crop, or other crop of any nature whatsoever, without a permit from the secretary of the Trust, who shall, subject to the approval of the Trust, issue the same. The fee for such permit and conditions thereof shall be as may be fixed by the Trust. No person shall so use water, or permit its use, or allow water to so run upon more than one-eighth (1/8) of an acre of any land occupied by such person without a permit as aforesaid and unless a meter be attached by such person to the service-pipe supplying such land, and kept and maintained in good working condition by such person to the satisfaction of such officer as the Trust may appoint. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

14. If any person does, or causes, or permits, allows, or suffers to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, he shall be liable (where no penalty is otherwise herein provided for such offence) to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every day such misfeasance or nonfeasance shall continue after notice of the offence from the Waterworks Trust; and the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipe by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust. Provided that neither this By-law or anything done hereunder shall in any way lessen or extinguish the rights of the Trust under the *Water Act* 1915, or any other Act or Acts relating to water supply.

15. The officer or officers of the Trust, or other person appointed for that purpose, may at all lawful times enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water, or breach of this By-law; and if any person hinders or prevents such entry or examination he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5). The Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from any house, tenement, or land to which such entry is refused, or on which such examination is hindered, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

16. The word "person" in this By-law shall include corporation.

17. The By-law made by the Trust on the twentieth day of April, 1915, relating to water supply is hereby repealed.

LONGWOOD WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW FOR 1916.

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1915*, make the following By-law:—

The rates and charges herein specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1916 in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1916.

I. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the rate shall be of such percentage on the valuation in each case as shall produce the sum of Twenty-seven shillings and sixpence.

II. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the time being, the sum of Two shillings and ninepence in the pound of such valuation.

III. For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated separately from any building, Two shillings and ninepence in the pound of the municipal valuation thereof.

IV. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile from a stand-pipe and not supplied with a service pipe from the main, shall be charged one-half the assessed rate.

V. Tenements situated more than a quarter of a mile, but within half a mile of a stand-pipe, shall be charged one quarter of the assessed rate.

VI. All accounts for water supplied by special agreement shall be paid as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates.

7. *Jaeralang West-road*.—NOTE.—The route of the portion of this road between the shires of Alberton and Morwell is already set out in the description of road routes in the shire of Morwell.

Shire of Benalla.

3. *Goorambat-road*.—(A) Commencing at its junction with the Sydney-road at the eastern angle of allotment 9, section 11, township of Benalla; thence north-westerly crossing the Wodonga railway line to the southern angle of allotment 1, section 16, of the said township; thence north-easterly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 6, section 1, parish of Benalla.

Shire of Donald.

2. *Donald-Charlton Road*.—(A) Commencing at its junction with the St. Arnaud-Birchip road at the intersection of Woods and Hammill streets in the township of Donald; thence north-easterly to the Donald-Birchip railway line.

Shire of Flinders.

Regulations in connexion with the Vote of Five thousand five hundred pounds (£5,500) for fencing and improving public parks, gardens, and other reserves under the control of borough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c.

A SUM of Four thousand pounds (£4,000) shall be distributed in such manner and on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Lands shall approve, and the remainder (£1,500) shall be dealt with as follows:—

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve, having a claim on the vote for every One pound (£1) expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land, and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister of Lands may approve, in such park, garden, or other reserve, between 1st January, 1915, and 31st December, 1915, out of the funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st day of May, 1916. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made on Form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form B.
2. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1915 (vide Form A), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) they shall be reduced *pro rata*.
4. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.
5. The foregoing shall not apply to parks, gardens, and other reserves within the limits of the city of Melbourne (except the Royal Park), or to the Edinburgh Gardens, Fitzroy, or to the Darling Gardens, Collingwood, or to Albert Park, South Melbourne, and St. Kilda, or to the Richmond Park and Barkly Gardens, Richmond, or to the Botanical Gardens, Geelong.

Conditions of Lease.

The general conditions of the lease under the *Agricultural Colleges Act 1915*, as approved by the Governor in Council, shall apply.

1. The term of lease is thirty years.
2. The rental at which the lease is granted will apply for the first ten years of the lease, when a reappraisal of the rent shall be made, and further reappraisements shall be made at the end of every successive five years after the first ten years.
3.
