By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

In pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the Banks and Currency Act 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2618), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as a Bank Holiday or Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

THURSDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1916, at Camperdown.

Bank Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon :==

WEDNESDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF MARCH, 1916, at Rochester;

THURSDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF MARCH, 1916, at Seymour; WEDNESDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF MARCH, 1916, at Kerang; THURSDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF MARCH, 1916, at Charlton.

ROYAL COMMISSION TO INQUIRE INTO GENERALLY AND REPORT AS TO THE WORKING OF THE PUBLIC DEPARTMENTS OF THE STATE OF VICTORIA, EXCEPTING THE RAILWAY DEPARTMENT.

H IS Excellency the Governor in Council has, by an Order made on the 17th day of February, 1916, appointed

ALEXANDER COOCH, Esquire; JOSEPH THORNTON TWEDDLE, Esquire; and WILLIAM ROSS ANDERSON, Esquire, P.M.,

to be a Royal Commission to inquire into generally and report as to the working of Public Departments of the State of Victoria, excepting the Railway Department, and more particularly into the system of Public Service Administration; the relation between the number of employees and the work to be performed; the effectiveness and modernity of the methods in use; the suitability of office and other accommodation; the observance of Regulations; the collection of Taxation; the desirability of transferring any branch of the Public Service to the Commonwealth or other authority; the respective merits in relation to economy, effectiveness of methods, &c, of Government administration as compared with the conduct of business under private enterprise; reduction in number and volume of Government publications; and the amendment of the Public Service Act to secure efficiency combined with economy.

And His Excellency has, by the same Order, further directed that Alexander Cooch, Esquire, shall be the Chairman, and Thomas Rae Gilchrist, Esquire, Secretary, and that the maximum expenditure be fixed at £25, of the said Commission.

Conditions of Lease.

The general conditions of the lease under the Agricultural Colleges Act 1915, as approved by the Governor in Council, shall apply.

1. The term of lease is thirty years.

2. The rental at which the lease is granted will apply for the first ten years of the lease, when a reappraisement of the rent shall be made, and further reappraisement shall be made at the end of every successive five years after the first ten years.

3. At any reappraisement should the rent be increased and the lessee desire to surrender his lease, the Trustees of Agricultural College Reserves may accept such surrender, and all improvements (excepting buildings crecked by lessee with consent of Trustees, and which lessee may sell or remove within one month from date of surrender) become the property of the Trustees, as at expiry of the lease.

The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
- 2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of and fithe particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. For every basket or barrow, 6d. per day.
For every cart or waggon, 1s. per day.
Provided that bonā fide local residents only shall have the option of paying for each hawker's cart or waggon either 1s. per day or £1, in advance, for the year or portion of the year ending on the 31st day of Decem'er next following upon the date of payment; but a person to whom a receipt is issued at the latter rate shall be entitled to hawk in respect of such payment of £1 only so long as he or she remains a bonā fide local resident.

The times and hours during or at which respectively any such registered hall or other building used for public meetings or any registered building or any registered ground in which public amusements are conducted shall be closed shall be as follows, viz.:—From Twelve o'clock midnight on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday in each week until the hour of Eight o'clock in the morning of the next succeeding day and from half-past Eleven o'clock on Saturday night until Eight o'clock in the morning of Monday in the following week.

Provided that nothing in this Regulation shall apply to the use of any such registered hall or other building for any ball private party or social on any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday during the times and hours set forth in clause two (2) of this Regulation for such registered hall or other building to be closed nor to the use of any such registered hall or other building for any religious service on any Sunday.
