VIOLET TOWN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1916.

THE Commissioners of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1915*, hereby make the following Rating By-law:—

(1) A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust, supplied otherwise than by meter, according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal district in which such rateable property is situated, for one year, commencing the first day of January, 1916, and ending the thirty-first day of December, 1916.

(2) The sum of Twenty-five shillings (25s.) shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid for the year 1916 by every occupier or owner of any land or tenement liable to be rated by the Violet Town Waterworks Trust.

(3) For every house or tenement supplied by measure the charge for the water so supplied shall be One shilling per thousand gallons up to twenty-five thousand gallons, or up to an amount equal to the sum which would have been imposed and levied as aforesaid, whichever shall be greater, and for all water supplied over and above such maximum amount the rate per thousand gallons shall be increased by One shilling for the first thousand gallons, Two shillings for the second thousand gallons, and so on.

(4) Such rate and charges shall be due and payable in one sum, on the 1st day of January, 1916.

(5) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

SHIRE OF SWAN HILL.

BY-LAW No. 31.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1915*, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers (hereinafter called the council) for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction do hereby make the By-law following, that is to say:—

1. That section 4 of By-law No. 24 of the shire of Swan Hill is, so far as it relates to the matters and the things provided for in this By-law, hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into operation and full force immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the shire of Swan Hill.
4. A suitable privy shall be attached to every house, shop or building erected or hereinafter to be erected within the boundaries of the shire of Swan Hill as hereinafter mentioned or set forth.
5. Every such privy shall have—
 - (a) An entrance door.
 - (b) A trap door for removing the pan.
 - (c) A wooden covering for the seat.
 - (d) A sufficient ventilator pipe rising up to and through the roof.
 - (e) A fly-proof middenstead.
 - (f) A proper and effectual screen from public view.
6. Every such privy shall be kept in good repair and condition.
7. The owner or occupier of such house, shop or building shall be liable for any breach of this By-law.
8. The penalty for a breach of this By-law shall not exceed Five pounds, and shall not exceed One pound for each day during which such breach shall be continued.

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

BY-LAW No. 24.

A By-law to amend By-law No. 21 intituled "A By-law to Prevent Pollution of certain Rivers or Streams within the Shire."

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1915* and of every other power enabling it in that behalf the council of the shire of Winchelsea in the names and on behalf of the President Councillors and Ratepayers thereof doth hereby order and enact as follows:—

After the word "Whosoever" appearing in the first line of clause 1 of By-law No. 21 of the shire there shall be inserted and read the words following namely "without having first obtained a special permit in writing of the council of the said shire and under the corporate seal thereof."

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the council the third day of December, One thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and confirmed the seventh day of January, One thousand nine hundred and sixteen.

Factories and Shops Act 1915.

EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN THE SHIRE OF MILDURA.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of March, 1916.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Act 1915, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the locality to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- (1) All shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the municipal district of the shire of Mildura shall be exempted from the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 98 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, so far as the closing hours on Saturday, Friday, and Wednesday are concerned.
- (2) All such shops shall be closed in each and every week during the whole of each year from the hour of—
 - (a) Ten o'clock on the evening of Saturday;
 - (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday;
 - (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF DOLLAR.

WE, Robert Alexander Wallace, George Harrison, Hugh Gaw, William Lamb, and Peter Cowan, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the township of Dollar having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :—

REGULATIONS:

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regard dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the gates, buildings, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; or roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
11. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building,

erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

BOROUGH OF STAWELL.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE STAWELL COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the 19th day of October 1915 the Council of the Borough of Stawell as managers of the Stawell and Pleasant Creek Goldfield Common having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approved by the Governor in Council in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common:—

REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction and for the purpose of these Regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses and mules, and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of 5 miles from the Common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on the Common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall be as follows, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of October and the first day of April in each year:—

For every cow, heifer, ox or steer, Five shillings per annum, for every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly or mule, Six shillings per annum, for every goat Two shillings per annum, for every sheep Four shillings per annum.

Progeny of stock legally depasturing on the Common under the age of 3 months, free; 3 months old and over full fees.

4. No person shall depasture on the Common, stock of which he is not the *bonâ fide* owner.

5. During the months of October and April in each year, or as soon thereafter as possible all owners of stock on the Common shall when required, by the managers, muster such stock in their own yards, or in some other convenient place, to be determined by the managers within forty-eight (48) hours after receiving notice in writing to do so and assist in branding them with the Common brand, horses and sheep only being exempt from branding.

6. Previous to the depasturing of stock, the owners thereof shall register the same, with brands and description, in a book to be kept for the purpose, and such registration shall be renewed half-yearly, and shall be made previous to the branding of such stock.

7. Holders of licences shall be at liberty to substitute stock for others removed from the Common during the currency of their licences by giving notice, in writing to the herdsman, showing the brands and number of stock so substituted, and a record of such notice shall be kept by the herdsman.

8. All stock depastured on the Common if not registered, branded and duly paid for, shall be liable to be impounded by the herdsman.

9. No person shall depasture any bull or entire horse on the Common without the written permission of the managers.

10. No licence shall be transferred without the written permission of the managers.

11. When any animal is affected with any contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall remove same from the Common within twelve hours after receiving notice to do so from the managers or herdsman, and such animal shall not again be put on the Common without the special permission, in writing of the managers.

12. After due notice has been given, the managers shall, at the owner's expense, be at liberty to remove all diseased animals from the Common; and also, at the owner's expense, to remove, bury, or destroy all dead carcasses found on the Common.

13. No person shall cart away water from any dam on the Common without the permission, in writing, of the managers.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed by special order on the 19th December, 1915.

Conditions of Lease.

The general conditions of the lease under the Agricultural Colleges Act 1915, as approved by the Governor in Council, shall apply.

1. The term of lease is thirty years.
2. The rental at which the lease is granted will apply for the first ten years of the lease, when a reappraisal of the rent shall be made, and further reappraisals shall be made at the end of every successive five years after the first ten years.
3. At any reappraisal should the rent be increased and the lessee desire to surrender his lease, the Trustees of Agricultural College Reserves may accept such surrender, and all improvements (excepting buildings erected by lessee with consent of Trustees, and which lessee may sell or remove within one month from date of surrender) become the property of the Trustees, as at expiry of the lease.

In the event of the tender being accepted for goods of Commonwealth or British manufacture, as the case may be, all such goods supplied shall bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the Contractor may at any time during the currency of the Contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, what ever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.
