UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Marine Act 1915 the Marine Board of Victoria (hereinafter referred to as the "Board") with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth make the Regulations following (that is

These Regulations may be cited as the "Second Mate Temporary Certificate Regulations 1916" and shall be read and construed as one with the Regulations made and passed by the Board on the 28th day of August 1903 and called "The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates" (hereinafter called the "Principal Regulations") and shall come into operation on and from the date of their publication in the Government Gazette.

 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Principal Regulations the Board may until the issue by the proper authority of a Proclaimation that the war now subsisting between His Majesty the King and the German Emperor and the Emperor of Austria King of Hungary respectively has ceased issue a Temporary Certificate of Competency as Second Mate to any candidate who shall pass the examination prescribed by the Principal Regulations for a Second Mate's Certificate who has either served three years at sea or two years on a training ship followed by two years' service at sea.

3. Any certificate issued under these Regulations shall be marked "Temporary" and (unless sooner revoked or cancelled) shall be valid from the date of its issue until three months after the termination of hostilities and no longer.

4. All the provisions of the Principal Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates (including fees) which apply to the examination for a Second Mate's Certificate other than the requirements as to four years' service at sea shall apply to the case of an applicant for a Temporary Second Mate's Certificate issued hereunder shall on the completion by him of the service at sea required by the Principal Regulations for a Second Mate's Certificate he entitled on proof of such-service to have issued to him a full Second Mate's Certificate without further examination or payment of any further fees.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREVENTION OR MITIGATION OF ACUTE ANTERIOR POLIOMYELITIS.

POLIONYELITIS.

THE Governor in Council of the State of Victoria having, by an Order, dated the 29th day of February, 1916, directed that the provisions contained in section 173 of the Health Act 1915, as amended by the Health Act 1915 (No. 2), No. 2810, be put into force in Victoria, the Board of Public Health doth hereby make the following Regulations for the prevention or mitigation of the dangerous infectious disease known as Polionyelitis (Infantile Paralysis, Epidemic Paralysis, Spinal Palsy), that is to say:— Palsy), that is to say:-

Short Title.—These Regulations may be cited as a "Poliomvelitis Regulations 1916."
 Interpretation.—"Board" means the Board of

(2) Interpretation.—Board means the Board of Public Health.

"Council" means the council of any municipality, including the cities of Melbourne and Geelong.

(3) On receipt of notification of a case of poliomyelitis the council shall immediately take steps to have the infected person removed to a hospital or isolated at his own residence to the satisfaction of the Officer of Health

and shall cause inquiries to be made into the whole circumstances of the case including sickness amongst animals and into the general sanitary environment of the premises wherein the patient resides.

(4) The council shall take such action as is necessary to secure the destruction of the nose and mouth discharges of infected persons and such persons shall be kent in isolation until released on the authority of the Officer of Health.

(5) The council shall take such action as is necessary to secure that contacts residing in the same premises as the patient shall have their throats and noses disinfected and such contacts shall submit to such treatment as the Officer of Health specifies and for such period as as he directs.

as ne directs.

(6) The council shall cause the premises wherein the infected person resides to be disinfected to the satisfaction of the Officer of Health and all insanitary conditions to be remedical forthwith including the removal of accumulation of many the conditions.

tion of the Officer of Health and all insanitary conditions to be remedical forthwith including the removal of accumulations of manure.

(7) The council shall in every case of poliomyclitis furnish a report to the Board as soon as possible after the notification of the case is received and such report shall include particulars as to source of infection, contact with other cases, sickness amongst animals, measures taken to prevent the spread of the disease and all other matters that will aid the Board in taking action to safeguard the public welfare.

(8) Every council and its officers are hereby authorized, required and directed to superintend and see to the execution of these Regulations and to provide for the supply of medicines and other substances for the prevention or cure and for affording persons afflicted by or threatened with poliomyclitis, such medical or other aid as may be required.

(9) Any person who fails to comply with any of the foregoing Regulations, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is, by section 388 of the Health Act 1915, thereby guilty of an offence against that Act, and is liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a benalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Eve pounds nor less than Twenty shillings for each day during which such offence is continued, besides any cost or expenses which may be incurred in remedying his default.

BROADFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.
RATING BY-LAW FOR 1916 WITHIN THE BROADFORD URBAN DISTRICT.

THE Commissioners of the Broadford Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been duly proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Act 1915, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements situated within the aforesaid Urban District and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1916 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure, for domestic purposes, such rates to be paid half-yearly in advance in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1916.

1. On every house and tenement of the annual value of Fifteen spounds or under, according to the municipal

1. On every house and tenement of the annual value of Fifteen spounds or under, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Thirty-seven shillings and sixpence.

2. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Fifteen pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound of such substitution.

sum or two sninings and sixpence in the point of such valuation.

3. On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land, the sum of Ten shillings.

4. The following shall be the charge payable in respect of water supplied by measure—

(1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling for every one thousand gallons or at such price as may be specially agreed upon. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case so supplied shall be twenty thousand gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at One shilling per thousand gallons would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) For stand-pipe or hydrant water for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under, One shilling.

shilling.

(3) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Five shilling per cent, on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or in the event of there not being any contract, Five shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

(4) All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid as agreed upon.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

No. 2644) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby add Regulation XLIV—Art Teacher's Certificate, Art Teacher's Diploma—to the Regulations under the Education Act 1915, that is to say:—

REGULATION XLIV.

Art Teacher's Certificate.

- 1. A candidate for this certificate must possess the School Intermediate Certificate of the University of Melbourne, or the Primary Teacher's Certificate—Second Class—or have qualified for Matriculation at the Melbourne University, or give other satisfactory evidence of the completion of a preliminary general education of this standard.
- 2. He must furnish a satisfactory medical certificate, indicating his fitness for the work of a teacher.
- 3. He must have completed to the satisfaction of the Department an approved course in the principles and practice of teaching and school management, at an approved Art School affording practice under expert supervision in the teaching of artistic subjects both to children and adults, collectively and individually.

This special pedagogical training must extend through at least one year of the candidate's time in the Art School. On the completion of this course a special examination in school management and methods of instruction, as applied to Art, must be passed.

- 4. He must possess the Drawing Teacher's Primary and Secondary Certificates issued by the Department, or produce satisfactory evidence of having done the work entailed by the possession of these certificates.
- 5. Satisfactory specimens of the following works must be submitted:—
 - (a) An architectural drawing from measurements taken by the candidate from an actual piece of architecture, which may be a porch to an ecclesiastical or other building, or a public monument, or some important piece of interior decoration in relief, or object of that kind. The work is to be executed in plan and elevation, in ink, but not shaded, on an imperial sheet. Accompanying the drawing must be a small portfolio containing the measurements and sketches from which the drawing was made.
 - (b) A study in colour of a flowering plant from nature (such as that submitted for the Drawing Teacher's Secondary Certificate) with three designs based on the plant, each design being intended for one of three distinct industrial processes. Such, for instance, as repoussé metal, decorative needlework, inlay, carving, painting, &c. The process and material for which it is intended must be named on each design.

The four studies are to be on one imperial sheet.

(c) A modelled study of a flowering plant (such as that required for the Drawing Teachers' Secondary Certificate) with three designs based on the plant, each design being intended for one of three distinct industrial processes.

The process and material for which it is intended must be named on each design.

- (d) A set of not fewer than twelve (12) studies of historic ornament. These studies should, where possible, be from actual objects in museums or elsewhere. They should rather be well-executed sketches than highlyfinished Still Life studies. When possible the relation of the decoration to its immediate surroundings should be shown.
 - The date, style, and origin of each example should, as far as possible, be stated underneath each.
- (e) A design in some Historic style of ornament, in the flat or in the round, as the candidate chooses.
 - The style and period must be clearly stated upon the work.

The design may take the form of a panel or other simple decorative feature.

- (f) A design for some important feature of civil or ecclesiastical architecture, such as a doorway, an entrance hall, wall surface and panelling, a tomb and the like. The design must be made with a view to enrichment with carved or painted decoration and must be accompanied by plans, elevations, sections and details of construction. The design must be not less than 24 inches in its longest dimension.
 - A portion of the ornament, as nearly full size as possible, modelled if intended for relief, and painted if intended for flat decoration, must also accompany the design,
 - or the candidate may submit a design for a small public or private building, such as a Free Library and Reading Room for a country town, or a small school building, or a cottage, giving plans, elevations, sections and constructive details:
 - A sectional elevation to a larger scale must exhibit the proposed decoration of an entrance hall, or fireplace or other important feature.
- (g) A shaded drawing of a complete human figure from the Antique. To be executed on an imperial sheet in black and white without background.
- (h) A shaded drawing of a full length nude figure from life. To be executed on an imperial sheet, in lead pencil, carbon pencil, charcoal, or black chalk, without background.
- (i) A modelled study of a head from life.

The works submitted must be certified to as the unaided production of the candidate, and will be retained by the Department while the candidate remains in Australia.

6. And obtain a pass in the Education Department's examinations in the following subjects:—

Architecture and Architectural Drawing, Grades I., II., and III.

Building Construction, Grades I. and II. Historic Ornament. Part I.

Principles of Decorative Design.
General Design (Advanced Stage, Grade II.)

Drawing the Human Figure from the Cast (Advanced Stage).

Drawing the Human Figure from Life. Human Anatomy.

Painting Ornament.

Composition of Form and Colour. Painting Plant Forms from Nature.

Modelling Ornament.

Modelling Plant Forms from Nature.

Modelling the Head from Life. Principles of Teaching and School management as applied to Art subjects and Schools

7. Finally, the candidate must give satisfactory evidence of his or her qualifications to successfully practice some artistic trade, craft or profession, such as that of a wood or stone carver, book illustrator, designer, architect, painter, lithographer, dressmaker, jeweller, decorative needleworker, modeller, cabinetmaker, &c.

NOTE.—Female candidates will not be required to pass the examinations in Architecture and Architectural Drawing and Building Construction.

Art Teacher's Diploma.

8. The Art Teacher's Diploma will be granted to candidates who possess the Art Teacher's Certificate, and, in addition, submit approved works and pass the prescribed examinations in any one of the following divisions:

I. Architecture.

Satisfactory specimens of the following works must be submitted:

- (a) A design, including plans, elevations, sections, and specifications, for a public building or private residence, in a recognised historic style.
- (b) A drawing of some important feature of the above building—interior or exterior—exhibiting an original decorative treatment in which the human figure is introduced.
- (c) An architectural perspective of the above building, in line, monochrome, or colour.

A pass must be obtained in the Education's Department's Examinations in each of the following sub-

- (d) Historic Ornament, Part II., subjects No. 3
- (e) General Design or Modelled Design-Honours stage.
- (f) Architectural Design.

10. II. Painting.

Satisfactory specimens of the following works must be submitted:

- (a) A full length study of a nude figure from life, in oil colour or water colour.
- (b) Eight time studies of the human figure from life-four studies from the nude, and four studies from the draped model. To be executed in line.
- (c) An original design for a painted decoration in which the human figure is an important feature. This work is to be painted in oil colour, water colour, or tempera, as the candidate chooses, and may consist of a panel for the entrance hall of a theatre, or the wall of a public library; the decoration of a spandril, an over-door, or a page for a book illustration or the like. Where the design is supposed to form part of a scheme of de-coration, a sketch of the larger scheme must accompany the work.

A pass must be obtained in the Education Department's examinations in each of the following subjects:

- (d) History and methods of painting.
- (e) General Design—Honours stage.
- (f) Painting the human figure from Life.

11. III. Modelling.

Satisfactory specimens of the following works must be submitted:

(a) A full length study of a nude figure from life, modelled in the round.

- (b) A time study of Drapery in high relief, arranged upon a nude figure—antique or life.
- (c) An original design, modelled full size or to a fair scale, for some subject sufficiently important to display the candidate's powers, such as a fountain, the decoration of a spandril, a presentation casket, a mural tablet or the like. The design must include a decorative application of the human The process or material for which the work is intended must be clearly stated.
 - When the design is supposed to form part of a scheme of decoration, a sketch of the larger scheme, drawn or modelled, must accompany the work.

A pass must be obtained in the Education Department's examinations in each of the following subjects:

- (d) History, and Methods of Sculpture.
 (e) Modelled Design—Honours stage.
- Modelling. The human figure from the cast-Advanced stage.
- (g) Modelling. The human figure from life, in the round.

12. IV. Design and Craft.

Satisfactory specimens of the following works must be submitted:-

- (a) A set of sketches or studies illustrating the candidate's preparation for the examination in Historic Ornament below.
- (b) A complete object or article designed and executed by the candidate, and adequately exhibiting his mastery of the craft chosen by him.

The work need not be large or elaborate.

A pass must be obtained in the Education Department's examinations in each of the following subjects:

- (c) Historic Ornament-Part II.-The examination will be upon the section or sections most nearly related to the craft chosen by the candidate.
- (d) A practical test in the craft chosen by the candidate under (b) above.
 - The time allowed for this test will be at the discretion of the examiners, and will vary with the craft and the subject given.
- (e) Candidates in the following crafts must also pass the examination in General Design or Modelled Design. Honours Stage: - Light metal work, iewellery, enamelling, die-sinking, stone carving, wood carving, plastering, potterv, glass painting, tile painting and modelling, embroidery and tapestry. illumination, engraving, lithography, painting and decorating.

All works accepted by the Education Department for the Art Teacher's Certificate or for an Art Teacher's Diploma, will be retained by the Department during the owner's residence in Australia.

(f) Architectural Design.

-Candidates who possess the Architectural Diploma of the Education Department, or are qualified members or associates of any recomised Architectural Institute, such as The Royal Victorian Institute of Architects, and the like. shall be entitled to the Art Teacher's Diploma in Architec-ture, without further examination, subject to the conditions specified in paragraph 8 above, regarding the possession of the Art Teacher's Certificate.

And the Honorable H. S. W. Lawson, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK AND RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE CITY OF FOOTSCRAY KNOWN AS "FOOTSCRAY PARK."

W. AEREAS by section 200 of the Land Act 1901 it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of such Act, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of the section specified: And whereas a Crown grant has issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the city of Footscray, in respect of the Reserve for a Public Park and Recreation purposes in the city of Footscray known as "Footscray Park": Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the

Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the Footscray Park":—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language,

3. No person shall interfere with or damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Park, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

Here be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb upon or jump over the trees, fences, or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut or in any way damage the trees, fences, gates, or seats, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance in the Park, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper; cast-off clothing, or any litter.

any litter.

D. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance or committing any act of indecency in the Park shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom and to prosecution for an offence against these regulations.

against these regulations.

6. No person shall bring into the Park any dog unless led by a chain or cord, and no person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Council, shall put into the Park any vehicles or any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals. The owner of any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals (except dogs led as provided) found in the Park shall be hable to be prosecuted. Stray dogs found in the Park will be destroyed. stroyed.

7. No person shall ride a bicycle in the Park except by permission of the Council.

8. No person shall engage in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, or any other like game in the Park without the authority, in writing, of the Council, unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play therein.

9. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Park any intoxicating liquors, goods, or articles of any description without having previously obtained written permission from the Council.

Every person offending against these regulations shall,

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands; officer, or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds. to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. Every occupier shall cause such receptacles to be placed within 4 feet inside a gateway or doorway of his premises on the days appointed by the council for emptying the same.

4. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds nor less than Five shillings for each such breach.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout such portion of the Township of Colac as the council may from time to time by resolution direct.

6. This By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication, as provided by section 208 of the Local Government Act 1915, in the Government Gazette.
