(e) For steam boilers, the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(f) On buildings in course of erection when water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of such work, or by special agreement; wooden houses shall be charged half rate, payment to be made before supply is given.

(g) The supply of water for purposes not specified

given.

(g) The supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust will in each case determine, and preliminary payment must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or

(h) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.

i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourpence per 100 gallons equals the amount of assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

j) The rate hereby made shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, 1915, and the first day of July, 1915.

k) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate and charges.

# RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE GOROKE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cemeteries Act 1915, the Trustees of the Goroke Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government

Gazette.

2. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least six inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

disturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

3. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, comented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

4. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

5. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

6. No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

Coal Mines Regulation Act 1915.

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES TO MINING MANAGERS AND UNDER MAN-AGERS BY THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS FOR MINING MANAGERS UNDER THE ACT.

- 1. Examination for certificates of competency will be conducted by the Board at such time and place as may from time to time be notified by the secretary in the Government Gazette and in a newspaper published or circulated in the locality, and candidates will be examined according to priority of receipt of notice as required by clause 2. Each candidate will be duly notified of the time and place of the examination.
- 2. Any person desiring to present himself for examination shall notify the Secretary for Mines, Melbourne, on an application form, which may be obtained from the secretary to the Board, such notice to be given not less than twenty-one clear days prior to the date of the examination. The notice shall be accompanied by the feet prescribed in regulation 6a or 6b, as the case may be. This fee shall admit to one examination only.
- 3. Should the applicant pass the prescribed examina-tion, the deposit shall in each instance go towards pay-ment of the fee for certificate. In the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination, such amount shall be forfeited to the Consolidated Re-
- 4. No certificate shall be issued until full payment of the additional fee required by regulation 6c or 6d, as the case may be, shall have been made to the Secretary
- 5. The Board will issue certificates of competency as mining manager (1st class) and as under manager (2nd class), and permits to managers of mines employing less than twelve persons underground. Such permit shall remain in force for twelve months, but may be renewed at the entire of the Roard. at the option of the Board.

Every consent must be in writing and on the prescribed form, or to the like effect. The following is the order in which persons are qualified to consent to marriages of minors :-

- 1. The father, if he be within Victoria, and have not forfeited his right.
- 2. A guardian appointed by the father. If there be none .
- 3. The mother (a) if she be within Victoria, and the father is dead or absent from Victoria and has not appointed a guardian; or
  - 4. (b) if the father has forfeited his right and the minor is or has been living with and under the care and control of the mother.
  - 5. A guardian of minors (i.e., any Police Magistrate or any Justice specially so appointed by the Chief Justice), if there be no such parent or guardian in Victoria, or if he or she be incapable of consenting by reason of absence, mental incapacity, or other substantial cause.
  - 6. The secretary to the Department for Neglected Children or Reformatory Schools may consent to the marriage of a ward of the Department.

The law is expressed in the following clauses :-

Act 2691.—Section 37. (1) If either party to any intended marriage not being a widower or a widow\* is under the age of twenty-one years such marriage shall not take place unless and until there is produced to the person about to celebrate the same the written consent-

- (a) of the father of such party if the father is in Victoria; or
- (b) of a guardian appointed by the father, if the father is not in Victoria ;' or
- (c) of the mother of such party, if the mother is in Victoria and if neither the father nor any such guardian is in Victoria;

<sup>\*</sup> A divorce is to be regarded as a widower or widow.

- (d) if there is no such parent or guardian in Victoria, or if he or she is incapable of duly consenting by reason of absence mental incapacity or other substantial cause, then the written consent of a guardian of minors. Such guardian of minors shall before giving his consent make inquiry on oath or solemn affirmation as to the facts and circumstances of the case.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything in this section contained-
  - (e) where either party to any intended marriage is under the age of twenty-one years, and is or has been living with and under the care and control of the mother of such party, such mother having been unlawfully deserted by her husband, or there having been pronounced a decree for the judicial separation nullity of marriage or dissolution of marriage of such mother and her husband, then in such case the marriage of such first-mentioned party may take place with the written consent of the mother of such party or after the death of the mother in any such circumstances with the written consent of a guardian of minors who before giving his consent shall make inquiry as aforesaid; and
- Section 40. Every consent to the marriage of any person who is under the age of twenty-one years shall be in such form as may be prescribed in rules and regulations made pursuant to this Part or to the like effect.

The penal clauses referring to the marriages of minors are as follow:-

- Section 46. Every person guilty of a misdemeanour within the meaning of this Part shall at the discretion of the court before which he is convicted be liable to—
  - (a) a penalty of not more than Five hundred pounds; or
  - (b) imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term of not more than five years; or
  - (c) both such penalty and imprisonment.
- Section 55. If any minister or the Government Statist or any registrar of marriages celebrates or professes or attempts to celebrate marriage in the case of any person (not being a widower or widow\*) under the age of twenty-one years without some such written consent as aforesaid, knowing him or her to be under that age or knowing that the consent produced is not by the appropriate person, or wilfully celebrates or professes or attempts to celebrate any marriage in any other case contrary to any of the provisions of this Part of this Act or, where any provision of such Part has not been complied with, knowing the same not to have been complied with, every person so offending shall except, as is otherwise by this Act provided be guilty of a misdemeanour.
- Section 56. If any person marries a person (not being a widower or widow\*) under the age of twenty-one years without having previously obtained the appropriate written consent as aforesaid, or induces or endeavours to induce any minister or the Government Statist or any registrar of marriages to celebrate marriage between parties one of whom (not being a widower or widow) is under age, without such consent, or abets or assists in any illegal marriage, every person so offending shall except as is otherwise by this Act provided be guilty of a misdemeanour.

# (3) For Registration of a Birth after Twelve Months and Within Seven Years.

- 1. Before the Government Statist shall authorize the registration of the birth of any child born more than twelve months, but not exceeding seven years, previously to application for registration (unless such child has been born at sea)—
  - (a) Application shall be made to any registrar by the father of the child (if such child was born in wedlock), or if the father be not living, or be absent from the State, or have deserted his wife, or be lunatic, or, if the child was not born in wedlock, by the mother or legal guardian of or by some person in loco parentis to such child.
  - (b) The application shall be in the form of the schedule hereto, or to the like effect, with a solemn declaration stating that a search has been made in the registers of births in the office of the Government Statist, and that no entry has been found of the birth of the child, and stating why the child was not previously registered, and giving the information required by the schedule.
  - (c) If the mother was attended at the time of birth by a medical practitioner or nurse, the date of birth shall be verified by a statement from such medical practitioner or nurse, unless reasons satisfactory to the Government Statist shall be given why such verification cannot be given; in such case the date of birth shall be verified by some inmate of the house, or by such other evidence as the Government Statist may require.

The Government Statist may require the statement (c) to be on oath or solemn declaration, and may require any further evidence he considers necessary in proof of any of the facts mentioned in the declaration or statement to be furnished.

- 2. If the Government Statist considers that the birth may be registered, he shall authorize the registrar in writing to register such birth, on payment of the fee of 10s., the applicant or his solicitor being the informant.
- 3. The registrar shall enter on the register form the words "This registration is made under the written authority of the Government Statist, and in accordance with the rules and regulations made under the Registration of Births Deaths and Marriages Act 1915," and shall affix his signature to such entry.

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY TO MINING MANAGERS, BATTERY MANAGERS, CYANIDE WORKS MANAGERS, AND CHLORINATION WORKS MANAGERS, BY THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS FOR MINING MANAGERS.

- 1. The Board will issue first and second class certificates of **competency** as Mining Manager, Battery Manager, Cyanide Works Manager, and Chlorination Works Manager.
- 2. Any person desiring to obtain a certificate shall notify the Secretary for Mines, Melbourne, on an application form, obtainable from the Secretary to the Board, the notice to be accompanied by the fee prescribed in Regulation 11A or 11B as the case may be, such notice to be given not less than 21 clear days prior to the date of the examination. Should the applicant pass the prescribed examination, such fee shall in each instance go towards payment of the full fee for certificate. In the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination, the application fee shall be forfeited to the consolidated revenue.
- 3. Examinations for certificates of competency will be conducted by the Board at such time and place as may from time to time be notified by the Secretary in the Government Gazette, and in a newspaper published or circulated in the locality. Each candidate will be duly notified of the time and place of the examination.
- 4. If a candidate shall fail to pass the examination prescribed, he shall not again present himself until a period of not less than three months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.
- 5. The examinations may be conducted partly by means of written papers and partly viva voce.
- 6. Every candidate for a certificate shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has had experience as follows:—
  - (a) For a first class certificate of competency as mining manager, five years' practical mining experience.
  - (b) For a second class certificate of competency as mining manager, three years' practical mining experience.
  - (c) The Board will accept as evidence of satisfactory practical mining experience under (a) and (b)—

- 12. If in any case the Board does not deem as satisfactory the evidence submitted by a candidate as required by the regulations, it shall refuse to allow such candidate to present himself for examination, or to issue a certificate to such candidate. This will not disqualify him in any later application he may make to the Board.
- 14. The Board shall grant a certificate of competency to any person who has complied with Regulations 6, 7, 10, and 11, and who shall produce to the Board a certificate of having passed the requisite examinations from and under the seal of any School of Mines or educational institution, whose curriculum, training, and subjects for and mode of examination are approved by the said Board, and every such certificate shall state that it is issued on the certificate of a School of Mines or educational institution approved by the Board, and also the name of such school or institution.
- 15. Every holder of a certificate as second class mining manager under these regulations must produce such to the Board previous to his being granted a higher certificate, and such certificate shall be surrendered and delivered up to the Board.
- 16. Whenever any person proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he has, without fault on his part, lost or been deprived of any certificate previously granted to him under these regulations, such Board may, on payment of the fee

specified in Regulation 11 (e), cause a copy of the certificate to which the applicant appears to be entitled to be made out and certified to by the Secretary to the Board and delivered to the applicant, and any copy so made and certified to, as aforesaid shall have the effect of the original certificate. The fee herein referred to shall be paid to the Secretary for Mines in cash or post office order, and shall by him be paid into the consolidated revenue.

17. Any person holding a certificate under these regulations and who is charged with any offence or misconduct likely to be detrimental to the efficient discharge of his duties, may render himself liable to have his certificate altered, suspended, or cancelled by the Board.

# 18. SYLLABUS OF SUBJECTS FOR EXAMINATION.

MINING MANAGERS (First Class Competency).—Candidates for examination for a first class certificate of competency as mining manager must pass in all the following subjects under the heading of Group "A," and also in all the subjects of one at least of Groups "B" and "C," depending upon the certificate applied for and the nature of the practical experience. The details specified are intended to serve merely as a guide to candidates:—

# GROUP "A."-GENERAL.

Arithmetic.—Elementary rules and simple mensuration.

Surveying .- Construction, adjustment and use of instruments, theodolite, dumpy level, miner's dial compass, clinometer, optical square, chain, barometer, and thermometer; ranging of lines; traversing with prismatic compass and theodolite; checking by use of latitude and departure tables and logarithms; reduction and location; computing bearing and distance between two points connected by survey; booking by various methods; plotting the survey; levelling and earthworkreduction of staff readings from levelling book; plotting contour lines; preparing longitudinal and cross sections; measurement of earthwork; calculating areas of squares, rectangles, triangles, circles; obtaining areas of figures with irregular boundaries by planimeter and by plotting and scaling; determination of the true meridian (simple methods), declination of the needle, dip, and local attraction; mine surveying-survey of vertical and inclined shafts and mine workings; connexion of underground and surface survey; mining problems; graphical and trigonometrical solution of problems involving dip, strike, pitch, and intersection of lodes; preparation of plans and sections of mine workings; assay plans; measurement of ore bodies; curves (laying out curves for tram lines with chain, and with theodolite and chain).

Mining Geology.—Methods of testing useful minerals; general principles of geology; knowledge of the more common country rocks; modes of occurrence of lodes, beds, leads, and other mineral deposits; location of shafts; effects of faults.

Mining.—Breaking ground—description of tools and their use (pick, shovel, hammer, gad, wedges, plug and feathers, auger, rock-drills, channelers, steam navvy); motive power for tools (steam, compressed air, electricity)—their relative advantages; driving, crosscutting, rising, and sinking; support of excavations; description of timber used in mines; seasoning of timber; dressing of timber; round and square timber; slabs; scantlings; adze; axe; auger; special machinery; timbering in firm, loose, and running ground, of walls, adits, chambers, stopes, junction of roads, and working places, underground lines, false sets, and pillars; the various types of square-set timbering; substitutes for timbering, e.g., masonry, concrete, iron, steel, &c.; precautions to be taken when sinking; construction and use of pent-houses, &c.; special methods of shaft sinking under difficult conditions; exploitation—surface workings, quarrying, sluicing, dredging, well sinking; combined surface and underground methods; the methods of opening up and working narrow and wide lodes, vertical and inclined ore, and

other deposits; overhand, underhand, and combined over and underhand stoping; special methods for large ore bodies; stowing waste material in depleted workings; location of rises, winzes, shoots, passes, main levels, reef drives, plats; boring for lodes, ore beds, and deep leads; shaft pillars to protect shafts and surface buildings; the drainage of mines and construction of underground dams; the tapping of water under pressure.

- Blasting.—Low, high, and permitted explosives, their composition and strength, fuse, detonators, charging, tamping, firing; treatment of miss-fires, electric firing, position of holes, lines of least resistance, drilling holes, giant blasts.
- Ventilation.—The gases met with in mines, determination of quantity and quality of mine air; construction of airways and effect of friction; furnaces and ventilating appliances; theory and practice of the various methods of ventilation; dust suppression; sanitation.
- Machinery.—The principles of action, methods of inspection and testing, and the care of winding and pumping machinery, condensing and non-condensing; air compressors; boilers; electrical appliances; the construction and use of safety cages, detaching hooks, apparatus for preventing overwinding, and other safety appliances; the strength of ropes, chains, timber, and other materials.
- Surface Work.—Erection of mining plant, and laying out and construction of tramways, water-races, and flumes; and generally all subjects connected with surface works.
- Mine Organization and Accounts.—Books and records to be kept; stores; cost sheets; conditions of employment; contracts, tributes, specifications.
- Mining Law.—A knowledge of the regulations under the Mines Act 1915. "First Aid."—Each candidate must be the holder of a "First Aid" certificate, granted by the St. John Ambulance Society or other approved institution.

# GROUP "B."—LODE MINES.

Lode mine workings; sampling of lodes and ore products; principles of ore dressing; construction, erection, use and care of appliances for crushing and concentrating.

# GROUP "C."—ALLUVIAL MINES.

- Alluvial mine workings; construction, erection, use and care of pumping, puddling, sluicing, and other appliances.
- 19. MINING MANAGERS (Second Class Competency).—Candidates for examination for a second class certificate of competency as mining manager must pass in the following subjects under the heading of Group "A":—Arithmetic, surveying, mining, blasting, ventilation, Mining Law, and "First Aid."
- 20. Battery Managers.—Candidates for examination for a certificate of competency as battery manager must pass in the following subjects:—Mineral composition of ores, sampling of ore products, construction, adjustment, use and care of appliances for crushing and concentration, amalgamating, care and treatment of copper plates, cleaning up, retorting, and smelting.
- 21. CYANIDE WORKS MANAGER.—Candidates for examination for a certificate of competency as eyanide works manager must pass in the principles and practice of the process; sampling; assaying; design, erection, and working of plant.
- 22. CHLORINATION WORKS MANAGER.—Candidates for examination for a certificate of competency as chlorination works manager must pass in the principles and practice of the process; sampling; assaying; design, erection, and working of plant.

# Mines Act 1915.

# REGULATIONS.—SCHOLARSHIPS FOR WORKING MINERS.

1. Conditional on moneys being placed by the Legislature at his disposal, twenty scholarships, or less, each not exceeding Ten Pounds value per annum, payable quarterly, may be awarded by the Minister of Mines to working miners employed in mines subject to the provisions of the Mines Act 1915 of Victoria, who desire to qualify themselves for obtaining certificates of competency as Mining Managers.

2. The scholars will be selected upon competitive examination conducted by the Board of Examiners for Mining Managers during November-December of each year at such centres as may from time to time be notified by the Secretary in the Government Gazette, and in a newspaper published or circulated in the locality. A candidate shall compete for a scholarship allotted to the particular Mining District in which he is employed.

3. Scholarships may be allotted as follows, or as may be determined from time to time by the Board of Examiners for Mining Managers:-

If less than twenty scholarships be awarded in any year, a less number may be allotted to each District in proportion. Should the successful candidates in a District be less in number than the scholarships allotted to such District, the unallotted scholarships may be awarded to meritorious candidates in other Districts.

- 4. A person desiring to present himself for examination shall, not later than the 18th October, notify the Secretary for Mines, Melbourne, on an application form obtainable from the Sccretary to the Board, and no person will be admitted to examination unless he is a working miner in the State of Victoria. The notice shall be accompanied by a fee of two shillings and sixpence, which admits to one examination only.
  - 5. The subjects of examination shall be:-
    - (a) Compulsory Subjects-

Arithmetic and simple mensuration;

English (handwriting, spelling, and composition);

Drawing (simple, plane, and solid geometry, and dimensional sketching);

(b) Optional Subjects (preference will be given to candidates who show knowledge in these subjects)-

Elementary Algebra;

Geometry;

Mechanics;

Geology.

6. No scholarship will be awarded to a candidate unless he complies with all the following: (a) He shall be not less than 18 years of age upon the first day of January

succeeding the examination.

(b) He shall produce satisfactory evidence to the Board that he has at the foregoing date completed at least one year's underground mining experience in mines, under the Mines Act 1915, in the State of Victoria, and that he is likely to proceed with the course of study for Mining Manager.

(c) He shall pass a meritorious examination (the conditions determining a meritorious examination shall be fixed from time to time by the

Board).

- 7. Each scholarship shall be tenable for three years, upon these conditions:
  - (a) The scholar shall, at the commencement of the session following the award of the scholarship and thereafter during the tenure of his scholarship, become a student and follow a course of study for Mining Manager in a School of Mincs or Educational Institution where the curriculum, training, subjects for and mode of examination in such School of Mines or Educational Institution are approved by the
  - (b) The scholar shall, upon making application for the quarterly payments of scholarship, submit to the Board a satisfactory report as to attendance, conduct, and progress, from the principal of the school which he is attending.
- 8. The Minister may at any time cancel the scholarship if the above conditions are not complied with, or if he is satisfied that the conduct of a scholar has been disorderly or immoral. Thereupon such scholarship shall cease and determine.
- 9. On the production of satisfactory medical evidence that the scholar is incapable for the time being of continuing his course of study, or on satisfactory evidence being furnished that exceptional circumstances make it obligatory for him to discontinue his course of study for a time, a scholar may, on the certificate of the Board, have his scholarship suspended by the Minister for the period or periods recommended by the
- 10. On obtaining a certificate of competency as Mining Manager from the approved School of Mines or Educational Institution, the scholar shall, without fee, be entitled, on application to the Board of Examiners for Mining Managers under the Mines Act 1915, to the Board's corresponding certificate of competency as Mining Manager, provided he has attained the age of 23 years for a second-class certificate, or of 25 years for a first-class certificate, and further complies with the Board's regulations for granting certificates to Mining Managers of mines under the Mines Act 1915, as to the nature and length of his practical mining experience.

REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE NATIONAL PARK, IN THE PARISHES OF WANDILIGONG, TO-WAMBA, DONDANGADALE, AND EURANDE-

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the Land Act 1915, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations or to rescind any rules and regulations for the care, protection and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations to be observed and enforced in respect of—

Two thousand eight hundred and eighty acres reserved by Order in Council of the 31st October, 1898, in the parish of Wandiligong, as a site for a National Park; and
