## DETERMINATION OF THE DRESSMAKERS BOARD.

**NOTE.**—This Determination on the 27th July, 1917, applied to the Metropolitan District, all cities and towns, and the Boroughs of Castlemaine, Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.


IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates of payment to be paid for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing, either inside or outside a factory or work-room, the following articles, that is to say:—Articles of women's, girls', and children's outer clothing or wearing apparel (except indiarubber waterproof garments), such as costumes, dresses, skirts, tea-gowns, wrappers, blouses, jackets, mantles, capes, opera cloaks, and cloaks of every description, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 27th July, 1917, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

Factories and Shops Acts.

## DETERMINATION OF THE NIGHT WATCHMEN'S BOARD.

**NOTE**—(a) This Determination on the 26th day of July, 1917, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong, the Towns of Ballarat East and Warrnambool, and the Boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

(b) Section 217 of the Factories and Shops Act provides that "any person employed as a watchman shall be granted one holiday in every week."

**I**N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the occupation of a night watchman has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 26th July, 1917, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) **OVERTIME**—Any time worked in excess of 72 hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two hours and thereafter time and a half.

(4) **CASUAL LABOUR**—Casual employees, i.e., persons employed during any week for not more than 36 hours, shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(5) **SPECIAL RATES**—Time and a quarter shall be the special rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), and Christmas Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
