DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1917.

THE Dandenong Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1915*, make the following By-law:—

1st. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1917 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust District, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety, and become due on the 1st day of January, 1917.

2nd. On every house and tenement of an annual municipal value of under Eight pounds sterling (£8), the minimum sum of Ten shillings (10s.).

3rd. On every house and tenement of an annual municipal value of Eight pounds sterling (£8) or upwards, the sum of One shilling in the pound (£1) on the amount of the said valuation.

4th. On warehouses and wholesale stores, not being domiciles or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5th. A rate of One shilling in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation shall be levied on all vacant land fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6th. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8th. For water supplied to charitable institutions for gardens or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9th. For water supplied for cricket or bowling grounds, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10th. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12th. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13th. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brick work, or plastering.

By-law No. 18, making a Rate for 1917.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the district of the Kerang Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house or tenement of the annual value of over Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of One shilling per 1,000 gallons will be charged, except in cases of special agreement.

For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stone-work, brickwork, or plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, on the sum paid for stone-work, brickwork, or plastering; or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement. Minimum charge, One pound.

The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the first day of January and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1917, and shall be due and payable on the first day of March, 1917.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the rates and charges hereby made. Passed this 29th day of December, 1916.

E. eight hundred and eighty-nine links; thence by a line bearing N. 51 deg. 58 min. E. three hundred and twelve links; thence by a road bearing S. 12 deg. 6 min. W. one hundred and fifty-six links; thence by lines bearing respectively S. 51 deg. 58 min. W. one hundred and fifty-six links and S. 12 deg. 6 min. W. eight hundred and fifty-three links; and thence by High-street bearing N. 77 deg. 54 min. W. one hundred links to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria, passed in the sixth year of the reign of His Present Majesty King George V., called the River Murray Waters Act 1915, it is among other things enacted that the said Act shall come into force on a day to be fixed by proclamation by the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette, but that the Governor in Council should not make such proclamation unless he be satisfied that the Parliament of the Commonwealth and each of the States of New South Wales and South Australia respectively had passed an Act ratifying the Agreement, a copy of which is set out in the Schedule to the Act now under recital: And whereas I, as such Governor in Council, am satisfied that the

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE NATIONAL PARK, IN THE PARISHES OF WANDILIGONG, TOWAMBA, DONDANGADALE, AND EURANDELONG.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1915, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations or to rescind any rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following regulations to be observed and enforced in respect of—

2,880 acres reserved by Order in Council of the 31st October, 1898, in the parish of Wandiligong as a site for a National Park; and  
23,100 acres, reserved by Order in Council of the 6th October, 1908, in the parishes of Wandiligong, Towamba, Dondangadale, and Eurandelong, for a National Park, in addition to and adjoining the land temporarily reserved therefor by Order in Council on the 31st October, 1898, both of which are together hereinafter called "The National Park."

2,880 acres, reserved by Order in Council of the 31st October, 1898, in the parish of Wandiligong, as a site for a National Park; and  
23,100 acres, reserved by Order in Council of the 6th October, 1908, in the parishes of Wandiligong, Towamba, Dondangadale, and Eurandelong, for a National Park, in addition to and adjoining the land temporarily reserved therefor by Order in Council of the 31st October, 1898, both of which are together hereinafter called "The National Park."

As regards supplies of articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, no sub-letting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor; and every person engaged in the manufacture, delivery, &c., of the articles contracted for shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by Wages Boards under the Factories and Shops Act, and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted in legible Roman characters in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which supplies are prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

3. Any persons guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty of not more than £5 or less than 10s., for the first offence, and not more than £20, or less than £5, for a second or subsequent offence, and also for any expense incurred by the Council in consequence of such act or default.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district. Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the twenty-third day of October, 1916, and confirmed the twentieth day of November, 1916.
