PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2713), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may) at the places respectively specified, viz.:-

Public Holidays:-

WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF JULY, 1917, throughout the Borough and Tarnagulla Ridings of the Shire of Bet Bet, and within a radius of 15 miles of the Township of Bridgewater, Shire of Marong.

SATURDAY, THE 4TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1917, throughout the Shire of Heytesbury.

WEDNESDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1917, throughout the Shire of Shepparton.

Public Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon:-

WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF JULY, 1917, and THURSDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF JULY, 1917, throughout the Borough of Echuca.*
