Factories and Shops Act 1915.

DETERMINATION OF THE COAL AND COKE BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 6th day of August, 1917, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act, the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong, the Towns of Ballarat East and Warrnambool, and the Boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in any business or occupation connected with the sale or distribution of coal or coke by any—

- (a) coal importer, (b) coal-mine owner,
- (c) gas company,

has made the following Determination, namely:-

(6) SPECIAL RATES.—For all work done on Sundays and the undermentioned holidays the rates shall be Coal Trade. Coke Trade. Time and a half. Double time New Year's Day Eight Hours Day (21st April)
