NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PRESCRIBE MINIMUM LENGTHS FOR CERTAIN SPECIES OF FISH.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a proclamation directing that the species of fish mentioned in the list following shall, from the date of such proclamation, be included in the Second Schedule to the *Fisheries Act 1915*, and that the length less than which it shall be unlawful for any person to take, attempt to take or consign, or have in his possession, house or shop, or under his control, or sell, or expose for sale, fish of such species, shall be the length set opposite the name of each such species of fish in the said list.

List referred to:—

Blackfish (except those in streams flowing north from the Great Dividing Range)	8½ inches.
Butterfish	9 inches.
Flathead	10 inches.
Grayling or Yarra Herring	6 inches.
Mullet, Flat-tail	8½ inches.
Mullet, Sea or Poddy	10 inches.
Mullet, Yellow-eye	8½ inches.
Rough or Roughy	7 inches.
Schnapper	9 inches.
Whiting	10½ inches.

The length of all such fish shall be ascertained by measuring overall, that is, from the tip of the snout to the end of the tail.

BY-LAW No. 696.—GENERAL RATE.—COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following General Rate is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply District, except within any Urban Division thereof:—

For the supply of water for the domestic and ordinary use of persons dwelling upon such lands, and for watering cattle or other stock:—

- (1) Of all lands in the First Division, comprising all lands within the aforesaid district, excepting and excluding all lands set out and described hereunder comprised within the Second Division—a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.
- (2) Of all lands in the Second Division, comprising part of allotment 9 of section E, containing 69 acres, being the holding of C. L. King; part of allotment 9 of section E, containing 17 acres, being the holding of E. W. Y. Milne; and allotment 11 of section E, containing 22 acres, being the holding of C. L. 2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1917, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1918, and shall be payable on the first day of October, 1917, at the office of the Commission, at Bendigo or Castlemaine.

3. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said district, the valuation for the time being of lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rate be determined by a Police Magistrate.

MALLEE LAND AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION AS SELECTION PURCHASE ALLOTMENT.—AVAILABLE FOR RETURNED SOLDIERS ONLY.

THE land is situated about 8 miles south-east of Ouyen.

Contract to 30th June, 1918.

Oils, except where otherwise indicated in the schedule, must be supplied in cases of two 4-gallon tins or in barrels, as ordered, and no extra charge will be allowed for such cases or barrels.

If Oil is required in 1-gallon tins the sum of 9d. per tin will be allowed extra.

If Oils are required in drums, such drums will be charged for by the Contractor at the rate of 3s. and 5s. per drum for 5 and 10-gallon drums respectively, the drums remaining the property of the Government.

The Oils specified herein must in the opinion of the Tender Board be in every respect suitable for the purpose specified, and free from all impurities and foreign matter, objectionable acids, gumminess, and other defects.

Samples may be taken from all Oil delivered, for the purpose of analysis. Should such analysis prove that the Oil is not up to specification, the Contractor must at his own expense replace it with Oil up to specification, otherwise Oil will be purchased at his risk and expense, in accordance with the General Conditions of the Contract. If, after the delivery of the Oils has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, the balance of such Oils may be returned to the Contractor, who will bear the whole cost of replacement.

All Oils will be tested at the Victorian Railways Laboratory.

The Flash test will be determined by a Pensky-Martin close-test instrument, the Fluidity at low temperature by Archbutt and Deeley's method, and the Viscosity by a Redwood Standard Viscometer.

A variation of 7% will be allowed on the figures specified.

INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFICERS ORDERING OILS.

In ordering Oils under this schedule care must be taken by officers requiring same to ascertain for what purpose the Oil is to be applied.

If required, a sample of not less than 2 pints, properly labelled with Item number and purpose for which the Oil is required, must be forwarded to the Tender Board by officers receiving the supply, for analytical and testing purposes.

Where safe storage capacity admits, Oils must be ordered for 12 months, 6 months, or 3 months' supply, as the case may be, so as to reduce the cost of testing to a minimum amount.

Care must be exercised to insure economy with efficiency, and with this object in view, Oils once used on bearings and no longer suitable for the purpose for which it was ordered, where practicable, must be filtered and again used for less important lubrications, and in case such Oil cannot be used again it must be collected and arrangements made with the Tender Board for its sale at reasonable periods.

Should an officer requiring a supply for special purposes find that a suitable Oil is not included in the schedule, he may in such case apply to the Tender Board to purchase such Oil under Clause 4 of the Stores and Transport Regulations, and shall submit to the Board full reasons for so doing.

Special attention is drawn to clauses 7, 9, and 16 of the General Conditions of Contract.
