PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the *Fisheries Act 1915*, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation repeal the Proclamation dated the 14th day of March, 1917, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 21st March, 1917, page 981, and in lieu thereof prohibit, from the sixteenth day of September in each year to the fifteenth day of May next following (both days inclusive), the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in Bancroft Bay, in the Gippsland Lakes, north of an imaginary line running in a north-easterly direction from Shaving Point to Mosquito Point and thence to Hunter's Jetty.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2744), it is among other things provided that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, may, either absolutely or subject to any regulations, prohibit the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria of any tree, plant, or vegetable which is, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, likely to introduce any disease or insect into Victoria: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, the introduction of potatoes from the State of Tasmania and King Island is likely to introduce disease into Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation

prohibit the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria of potatoes from the State of Tasmania and King Island.

CITY OF RICHMOND.**By-Law No. 80.**

A By-law, of the City of Richmond, made under the *Local Government Act 1915*, for prohibiting the deposit of refuse or rubbish on or requiring the removal of refuse or rubbish from streets, roads, lanes, or passages, or on any land, and for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond order as follows:—

1. No person shall deposit any refuse or rubbish on any street, road, lane, or passage of any kind within the city of Richmond, or on any land within the city of Richmond, except at the refuse destructor or at the rubbish depot established by the Council in Barkly-avenue.

2. Any person who, in contravention of this By-law, shall deposit on any street, road, lane, or passage-way of any kind, or on any land within the city of Richmond, any refuse or rubbish shall, on being so required by the City Inspector or other officer of the Council appointed in that behalf, forthwith clear away and remove the refuse or rubbish so deposited.

3. The owner of land upon which has been deposited any refuse or rubbish shall, after 48 hours' notice given in writing by the City Inspector or other officer of the Council appointed in that behalf as aforesaid, clear away and remove the refuse or rubbish so deposited.

4. The officer in charge for the time being of the Richmond City Council's refuse destructor shall decide whether refuse or rubbish brought to the refuse destructor shall be burnt at the destructor or whether it shall be deposited and covered at the rubbish depot, and the driver of the vehicle containing such refuse or rubbish shall obey the orders of such official as to the disposal of the load, and shall pay the charges hereunder:—

For burning refuse or rubbish, 5s. per ton, with a minimum charge of 1s.

For covering refuse or rubbish at the rubbish depot, 5s. per ton, with a minimum charge of 1s., or such other charges as the Council, by resolution, shall fix from time to time.

5. The officer in charge of the Council's weighbridge shall weigh such refuse or rubbish, and on all occasions give official receipts therefor.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation through the whole of the municipal district of the city of Richmond.

7. Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for such offence to a penalty of not less than 10s. nor more than £5.

1. No driver of any hackney carriage shall suffer the same to stand for hire across any street or alongside of any other hackney carriage, nor cause any unnecessary obstruction to traffic nor obstruct the driver of any other carriage in taking up or setting down any person nor wilfully wrongfully or forcibly prevent or endeavour to prevent the driver of any other carriage from taking a fare.

2. The driver of any licensed carriage taking up or setting down passengers at any place of public worship, public amusement, public meeting, railway station or at any ceremonial, or entertainment causing a large concourse of vehicles public or private or waiting at any such place shall obey the direction of the inspector or of any member of the police force on duty there as to the taking up or setting down or waiting for passengers and as to the order and place in which any such carriages shall stand and every driver shall perform his duty in a careful and quiet manner and shall not push into or get out of the line or position fixed for vehicles so as to endeavour to arrive at his place of destination before any other vehicle, the driver of which from its position would have a prior right to take up or set down passengers.

3. Upon any occasion when any number exceeding five carriages shall be assembled and waiting at any one and the same place the driver of every licensed carriage which shall be of the number shall as to the placing and ordering of his carriage comply with the directions given by any member of the police force placed on duty there for the preservation of safety and order.

4. The driver of every vehicle during the hours after sunset on any day and before sunrise on the following day in any street or public place within the municipality shall carry attached thereto or suspended from the off or right side of such vehicle a lighted lamp so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light visible within a reasonable distance in the direction towards which the vehicle is travelling and such lamp shall also (except in the case of a bicycle) be such and so disposed as to exhibit a red light visible within a reasonable distance at the rear of the vehicle. The word vehicle in this clause shall mean and include every vehicle cart carriage and (except where otherwise specified) bicycle but shall not include a motor car as defined by the *Motor Car Act 1915*.

5. No procession of persons or vehicles or of both for other than funeral purposes shall parade or pass through any of the streets or roads within the municipality unless with the previous consent in writing of the mayor or in his absence the town clerk and then only by the route specified in such consent nor unless or until the recipient of such consent shall have given at the least twenty-four (24) hours' notice with particulars of such consent and route to the member of the police force having charge of the district.

6. For any offence against any provision of this By-law the offender shall upon conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

7. By-law Number 11 of the Shire of Moorabbin is repealed so far as its operation in the Borough of Sandringham is concerned.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

4. That the hours of bathing in the Sandringham Baths shall be as follows:—Gentlemen (denoted by a red flag) from daylight to 8.30 a.m.; from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. and from 5 p.m. till dark. Ladies (denoted by a white flag) from 8.30 a.m. to 1 p.m. and from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m.

5. That the time for bathing for each person shall not exceed forty minutes.

6. That no person shall use obscene language or deface the walls or doors of the said baths by writing or drawing thereon, or damage any part of the baths or commit any nuisance in the baths.

7. That no person shall smoke in the baths except in the apartments set apart for that purpose.

8. That no person shall be admitted to the baths who shall be under the influence of liquor, or who shall have been guilty of disorderly conduct in the said baths.

9. That no dogs shall be allowed within the precinct of the said baths.

10. That no male person exceeding the age of twelve years shall bathe in the said baths except such person shall be clothed with a trunk of close texture.

11. That every person offending against this By-law or any provision thereof shall on conviction forfeit and pay for each and every offence a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
