Princes Bridge Approach Act 1900 (No. 1681). VESTING ORDER.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirteenth day of November, 1917.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.
Mr. Hagelthorn | Mr. Robinson.

WHEREAS by sub-section (b) of section 4 of the Princes Bridge Approach Act, 1900 (No. 1681), it is provided that when the road and ornamental reserves contemplated by the said Act have (in accordance with plans and specifications submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council) been constructed and formed to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works, the Governor in Council may make an Order vesting the sites of the said reserves (being the lands described in the Second Schedule to the said Act) in the Corporation of the City of Melbourne for the purposes intended and also appoint the Council for the time being of the Corporation to be the trustees of such lands: And whereas the road and ornamental reserves have been constructed and formed in accordance with the plans and specifications submitted and approved as aforesaid and to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works as evidenced by its certificate duly recorded: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers hereinbefore recited doth by this present Order hereby—

Firstly.—Vest the lands set out in the Schedule below (being the same as those described in the Second Schedule to the hereinbefore referred to Act) in the Corporation of the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne as sites for ornamental reserves and for no other purposes whatsoever; and
Secondly.—Appoint the Council for the time being of the Corporation to be the trustees of such lands.

SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF RESERVES FOR PUBLIC RECREATION, PUBLIC PARK, AND PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF MOOROOBARK.

WE, Henry Octavius Allan, George Barber, William Henry Dower, John Dodd, William Henry Hand, Ellis Theobald Jeeves, and Percy Kernot, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserves set forth hereunder (hereinafter called the Reserves), having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915:—

- (i) The land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 23rd December, 1912, as a site for a Public Park in the parish of Mooroolbark (Olinda).

- (v) The Reserve for Public Recreation in the parish of Mooroolbark known as the "Observatory Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

2. No person shall put in the Reserves any cattle, horses, sheep, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

3. No person shall camp in the Reserves nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

4. No person shall stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, or trees, or cut or paint names, letters, or marks on the trees, rocks, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon, or destroy, break, cut, dig up, damage, or injure in any way, or take away any trees, shrubs, scrub, undergrowth, ferns, flowers, or any other vegetation or soil in these Reserves.

5. No person shall light fires in the Reserves except in fireplaces provided for the purpose by the Committee of Management.

6. No person shall shoot, trap or destroy any bird or native game within these Reserves.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force, and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
