### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to declare the Rate of Land Tax for the year ending the thirty-first day of December One thousand nine hundred and eighteen."

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million three hundred and fifty thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and seventeen and One thousand nine hundred and eighteen."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this eleventh day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and in the eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

*Neglected Children's Act 1915.*

PERSONS AUTHORIZED TO MAKE APPLICATIONS TO FIX OR INCREASE THE SUMS PAYABLE BY PARENTS, ETC.

WHEREAS by section 51 of the *Neglected Children's Act 1915*, it is enacted as follows, that is to say:—

#### WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.

##### RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1918.

II. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water shall be supplied by measurement shall be :-

- (a) if for domestic or other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure;
- (b) if for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

III. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1918, commencing on the 1st January, 1918, as also the charges for every steam boiler, and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1918.

IV. All other charges by measurement shall be paid on the 1st day of January, 1918.

V. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rate and charges.

For every occupied or unoccupied allotment or vacant lot situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid, the rate to be paid shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment; provided that in no case shall a less rate than Ten shillings each be payable, except where the municipal valuation is less than Three pounds each, in which case the said rate shall not be less than Seven shillings and sixpence.

(III.) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in the streets or roads in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates; and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

3. The rates herein made are for the year ending 31st December, 1918, and shall be due and payable in advance on the 1st February, 1918.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Urban District of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house, tenement, or allotment under Seventeen pounds sterling annual valuation, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound five shillings sterling per annum.

For every house, tenement, or allotment of the annual value of Seventeen pounds or over, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

For all tenements in the said district in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation by such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rates, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within a mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

The charge for water supplied from and after the first day of January, 1918, shall be as follows:—

(a) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.

(b) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every one thousand gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes solely, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

For water supplied to the Government Departments, police stations, churches, court-house, post-office, State school, show ground, cricket ground, bowling-green, shire hall, sale-yards, and similar properties, shall be charged by measurement or special agreement.

For water supplied to carriages and livery stables, by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings per annum for each stall or loose-box.

In open sheds used for stabling, each space of five feet shall be used as a stall.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1918. Such rates shall be paid by equal instalments, half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July of each year, and such charges shall be payable half-yearly, on the first day of July and the thirty-first day of December of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

All water taps to be fitted with approved self-acting ball taps to prevent overflow.

## SHIRE OF RIPON.

## BY-LAW NO. 20, MAKING AND LEVYING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon do hereby, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the By-law following for the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council:—

## Part I.

1. A rate for the year hereinafter mentioned is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements which are rateable property within the meaning of the *Local Government Act 1915* within the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council according to the valuation for the time being of such land and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district of the said shire within which such lands and tenements are respectively situated for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure, and such rate shall consist of the rates and charges hereinafter specified.

## Part II.—The Beaufort Water Supply.

2. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Beaufort Water Supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

(a) On every house or tenement (including vacant allotments supplied with water) save as hereinafter provided, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the net annual value of such house or tenement, but in no case, save as hereinafter provided, shall such rate be less than the minimum sum of Twenty shillings, and in addition to such rate there shall be payable a further sum of Five shillings for each garden upon a tenement and a further sum of Five shillings for each horse kept or usually watered on such tenement.

(b) On every piece of land not having a building thereon, and to which water-pipes are not laid, but having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any main pipe laid for the supply of water from the Beaufort Water Supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such land or opposite some portion of such frontage, the minimum sum of Ten shillings. Nothing in this sub-section contained shall be deemed to apply to land adjoining and used in connexion with any other tenement.

3. "The Beaufort Water Supply" means and includes the reservoirs (with their respective systems of reticulation) known as Jackson's Reservoir and the Gold-fields Reservoir situate to the north and south respectively of the township of Beaufort and the springs and races which feed such reservoirs.

## Part III.—The Joint Water Supply.

4. The rates and charges hereinafter mentioned are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the joint water supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council, and which is supplied by the Council with water from the joint water supply, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

5. "The joint water supply" means the race running from the springs at Mt. Cole to Jackson's Reservoir.

## Part IV.—The Waterloo Supply.

6. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Waterloo supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council, and having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any pipe laid for the supply of water from the Waterloo supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such house or tenement or opposite some portion of such frontage, the sum of One pound per annum.

7. "The Waterloo Supply" means "The Waterloo Reservoir" (with reticulation therefrom) situated on or near the boundaries of the parishes of Raglan and Beaufort, and being about 5 miles in a northerly direction from the township of Beaufort.

## Part V.

8. Such rate as aforesaid is made, and shall be levied for the year beginning on the 1st day of October, 1917, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1918, and shall be payable at the office of the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon, at the Shire Hall, Beaufort, immediately after the expiration of one month from the publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the notice required by the Water Acts.

9. Such person or persons as the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

## RUTHERGLEN WATERWORKS TRUST.

## BY-LAW MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES FOR THE YEAR 1918.

THE Commissioners of the Rutherglen Waterworks Trust (the Waterworks District of the Trust having been proclaimed an Urban District), do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following rate for the year 1918 upon all lands and tenements within the said Urban District, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes.

On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or allotment of land by which a main passes, the sum equivalent to a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the £1 per annum, with a minimum charge of £1 sterling.

Such rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1918, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and receive the said rate.

The charge for water by measure shall be Two shillings and sixpence per one thousand gallons.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth in the manner following amend the Regulations relating to the election of Commissioners by the Korumburra Waterworks Trust, and dated the nineteenth day of February, 1906.

In Clause 2—after the word "election" there shall be inserted the words "except as hereinafter provided."

In Clause 4—the word "triennial" shall be omitted, and after the word "following" there shall be inserted the words "One-third of the Commissioners shall retire and be elected annually, and the Commissioners who shall so retire shall be those who have held office for the longest term without re-election; and if by reason of two or more Commissioners having become Commissioners at the same time it is not apparent under the foregoing part of this section which of such last-mentioned Commissioners ought at any one time to go out of office, then such Commissioners as to whom it is so not apparent shall go out of office in the order of the number of votes obtained by each at his election, commencing with the smallest number and proceeding upwards; and in all such cases if the votes given for any Commissioners of whom a number less than the whole are to go out of office at any one time have been equal, or if such Commissioners have been elected without a poll, the Trust fourteen days at least previously to the day hereby appointed for the going out of office, and in their default the Governor in Council, shall for such occasion determine in what order and which of such Commissioners shall go out of office."

In Clause 6—for the words "Section 6 of the Water Act 1900" there shall be substituted the words "Section 117 of the Water Act 1915," and after the words "which shall" there shall be inserted the words "after the first revision."

Clause 8 is hereby repealed, and the following shall be substituted therefor:—

"Returning Officer—The Returning Officer shall be appointed by the Trust or in default of such appointment shall be the Secretary of the Trust."

Clause 9 is hereby repealed, and the following shall be substituted therefor:—

"Notice of Election—Nomination of Candidates—

Second Schedule—Fourteen clear days before any election of Commissioners under these Regulations the Returning Officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the Korumburra township and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said township to be named in such notice in manner hereinafter mentioned between the hours of ten o'clock in the forenoon and four o'clock in the afternoon on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice and named therein and every candidate at any such election shall before four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day lodge with the returning officer at the place aforesaid a nomination paper in the form in the Second Schedule or to the like effect stating therein both his Christian and Surname together with the other particulars required in and by the said Schedule and such nomination paper shall be signed by the candidate and by at least five persons entitled to vote at the election and such candidate shall together with such nomination paper deposit with the returning officer the sum of Five pounds which shall be returned to the candidate if he obtains at the election a number of votes equal to at least one-fifth of the votes given to the person declared elected who received the least number of votes otherwise the said sum shall be paid into and form part of the revenues of the Trust."

"And no person who shall not have been so nominated shall within the provisions of these regulations be deemed to be a candidate at any election of Commissioners."

Clause 20 is hereby repealed and the following shall be substituted therefor:—

"Plumping prohibited—At every such election every voter shall strike out from the ballot-paper the names of the candidates for whom he does not desire to vote and if he suffers to remain on the ballot-paper a greater or less number of names not struck out than the number of Commissioners to be elected the vote given on and by the ballot-paper shall be void and of no effect."

The afore-mentioned amendments shall be and be deemed to be part of the said Regulations.

**W**HEREAS by the 53rd section of the *Explosives Act 1915* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Order define for the purposes of the First Part of the said Act the composition, quality and character of any explosive, and may classify explosives. Now therefore, in pursuance of the above-mentioned provisions of the said Act, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria doth, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, order as follows:—

There shall be added to the list of explosives defined and classified in the Order in Council No. 1 made on the 12th day of October, 1909, the following explosives, the composition, quality and character of which are hereby defined:—

CLASS 3.—NITRO-COMPOUNDS.

Division 1.

**Coal Mine Powder No. 5.**—Consisting of a mixture of nitro-glycerine, di-nitro-toluol, ammonium nitrate, woodmeal, magnesium sulphate and whiting; provided that the proportions of nitro-glycerine, di-nitro-toluol, ammonium nitrate, magnesium sulphate and whiting, do not exceed 10 per cent., 4 per cent., 77 per cent., 3 per cent., and 2 per cent. respectively, and the proportion of woodmeal (dried at 100 deg. C.) be not less than 9 per cent. of the finished explosive. Provided also that the explosive is contained in thoroughly water-proof cartridge wrappers or cases.

**Farm Powder.**—Consisting of a mixture of nitro-glycerine, nitrate of sodium, sawdust, flour and chalk; provided that the proportions of nitro-glycerine, nitrate of sodium and chalk, do not exceed 20 per cent., 62 per cent., and 1 per cent. respectively of the finished explosive, and that the proportion of sawdust and flour combined (dried at 100 deg. C.) be not less than 17 per cent. Provided also that the explosive is contained in thoroughly water-proof cartridge wrappers or cases.

**Gelignite (Giant Powder Co.)**—Consisting of nitro-glycerine thickened by being combined with nitro-cotton, and mixed with nitrate of sodium, wood pulp, flour and chalk; provided that the proportions of nitro-glycerine and chalk do not exceed 50 per cent. and 1 per cent. respectively of the finished explosive, and the proportion of flour and woodmeal combined (dried at 100 deg. C.) amounts to not less than 9 per cent. of the finished explosive.

**Stumping Powder.**—Consisting of a mixture of nitro-glycerine, nitrate of sodium, wood pulp, sawdust and chalk; provided that the proportions of nitro-glycerine, nitrate of sodium and chalk, do not exceed 40 per cent., 46 per cent., and 1 per cent. respectively of the finished explosive, and that the proportion of wood pulp and sawdust combined (dried at 100 deg. C.) amounts to not less than 13 per cent. Provided also that the explosive is contained in thoroughly water-proof wrappers or cases.

**Super Clifite No. 2.**—Consisting of nitro-glycerine thickened by being combined with nitro-cotton and mixed with neutral nitrate of ammonium, chloride of sodium, oxalate of ammonium, and woodmeal; provided that the proportions of nitro-glycerine and nitrate of ammonium

do not exceed 11 per cent. and 61 per cent. respectively of the finished explosive, and the proportions of chloride of sodium, oxalate of ammonium, and woodmeal (dried at 100 deg. C.) amount to not less than 18 per cent., 4 per cent., and 4 per cent. respectively of the finished explosive. Provided also that the explosive is contained in thoroughly water-proof cartridge wrappers or cases.
