Factories and Shops Act 1915.

DETERMINATION OF THE BAG MAKERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to persons employed in making or repairing jute, hessian, or cotton bags has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 12th March, 1917, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

DEFINITION OF JUVENILE WORKERS.

Female persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices or improvers) employed in bag-making at—

Machining,
Cutting (except sacking cutting by hand),
Turning,
Folding,
Breaking off; or
Flying.

(3) TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.

Time of beginning—	Time of ending—
7.30 a.m.	12.30 p.m. on the day on which the half-holiday is observed locally.
7.30 a.m.	6.30 p.m. on the other five working days of the week.

(4) OVERTIME.

The following rates shall be paid :—

For all work done within the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work in excess of 48 hours in any week, and	} Making. Repairing.	Time and a third. Time and a half.
For all work done outside the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work ..		

(5) SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

That double time shall be paid for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(6) PIECE-WORK.

The lowest piece-work prices to be paid to any person for doing work of the description referred to in the following Schedule shall be—

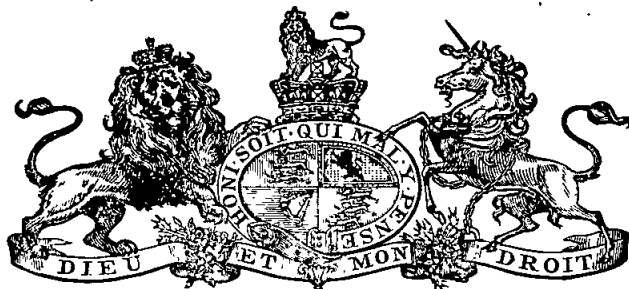
Hand repairing ordinary bags (employee to provide twine) 8½d. per dozen.
Hand repairing mill, coal, lime, or hide bags (employee to provide twine) 1s. 4½d. per dozen.

(7) PIECE-WORK WHICH MAY BE FIXED BY AN EMPLOYER.

The Board determines, under the provisions of Section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at repairing by machine (employer to provide twine), provided that any such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates that are fixed by the Board for such work.
